#### REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1969 fire season was a quiet one in this area. Frequent rains kept the danger to a minimum and there were few violations. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

#### Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a. m. and after 5:00 p.m.

#### Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

#### Penalties

- 1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- 2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
- 3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in [1] above.
- 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland maximum fine of \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.

#### ON THE COVER

"Fifty years ago, Dublin men cut considerable ice."

"Cutting Ice on Dublin Lake" was taken about the year 1900 by Henry D. Allison.

In 1952 Mr. Allison wrote of this picture: "Dublin men cut considerable ice fifty years ago. Charles W. Fiske pulls out, Willard H. Pierce rests momentarily, Clifford Gowing saws, while Dr. Henry H. Smith looks on."

Of the outer garment worn by Dr. Smith in the picture, Mr. Allison said:—"The doctor was given a gray bathrobe, trimmed with blue, by a friendly summer resident. But instead of wearing the garment at home, he used it as a topcoat and could occasionally be seen climbing the village hill, wearing the gray coat and carrying one of his many self-made canes."

During the Civil War Dr. Smith served aboard the naval vessel "Freeborn" on the Potomac River, as Acting Assistant Surgeon, U.S.N. He later practiced medicine in Dublin and was considered an excellent physician.

7:00 P.M. Meeting called to order and polls closed. Motion carried to count Ballots at the end of the business meeting.

Invocation Rev. Noel Sokoloff.

Citation presented to retiring Town Clerk, Treasurer and Cemetery Superintendent by Selectman Edward F. Whitney.

Article 1. Officers elected: Town Clerk, Anita J. Crowell; Town Treasurer, Anita J. Crowell; Selectman 3 years, Edward F. Whitney; Tax Collector 1 year, John F. Doscher; Highway Agent 1 year, E. Bertell Pierce; Trustee Trust Funds 3 years, Fred C. Brening; Library Trustee 3 years, Andrew S. Elder; Water Commissioner 3 years, Russell F. Eaves; Cemetery Committee 3 years, Richard B. Scribner; Member Planning Board 6 years, Charles E. McKeen; Member Board Adjustment 5 years, P. Albert Rajaniemi; Member Board Adjustment 4 years, Stephen G. Avery.

Article 2. Officers Chosen, Measurer Wood and Bark, Oscar C. Sewall; Memorial Day Committee, Stephen G. Avery, David E. Elder and James Haddock.

Article 3. Reports of agents, auditors and committee accepted as printed.

Article 4. Voted to authorize Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Carried.

Article 5. Selectmen authorized to dispose of real estate acquired by tax deed.

Article 6. Move that the Town accept the following Trust Funds: A: For the perpetual care of cemetery lots, C. Richard MacGrath, \$200. Kustaa Saari, \$200; B: Elva A. Moore Fund \$23,225.81.

Described as follows: "All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, I give and bequeath to the selectmen of the Town of Dublin, N. H., in trust nevertheless, the income to be used by the selectmen for assisting residents of the Town of Dublin who may be poor, sick or incapacitated by accident. This trust fund shall be called the Elva A. Moore Fund." Motion carried.

Article 7. Move that the Town accept the budget as printed in the 1968 annual report, except that the following correction be made in the item noted below:

Page 10Amount to be Raised by Change From Change To

Property Taxes 1969 \$255,626 75 \$225,626 75 And that the Town raise and appropriate the necessary sums for each item.

Article 7. A motion to decrease Police Department budget by \$2,000 was lost. A motion to decrease Town Maintenance Winter budget to \$9,000 was lost. Moved by Clarence Babneau, and seconded, an Amendment to Town Maintenance Summer, as follows:

1) To have the outlet pipe put back on the dam at Wood's Pond.

2) To have post markers along the meadow on Monument Road, and at bridge on Bond's Corner Road.

3) To have Bond's Corner Road widened 300 feet on both sides of N. Davis' new house.

4) When ditches are cleaned have all waste picked up, NOT plowed on everyone's lawn.

5) To increase Town Maintenance Summer budget from \$11,000 to \$12,000. Mr. Davis offered to pay half the cost of widening the road noted above. Offer declined by the Town. Amendment carried. Motion, as corrected above, and as amended by Mr. Babneau's Amendment, carried.

Article 8. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of three thousand four hundred [\$3,400.] dollars for necessary repairs to the Public Library Building. Motion carried.

Article 9. Move that the Town vote to change the method of selecting the Highway Agent from present election by ballot to appointment by the Board of Selectmen. Motion defeated. Standing vote Yes 58, No 64.

Article 10. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars [\$5,000.] to purchase additional equipment for the Fire Department to cover equipment listed in article 10 in the annual report or any variations thereof. Moved by Allan Fox to amend motion to read \$2,500.00 was defeated motion carried to raise \$5,000.00.

Article 11. Voted to support the services of the community mental health clinic, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00. Motion carried.

Article 12. Voted to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for six meter antenna Civil Defense. Carried.

Article 13. Voted to raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 to be placed in CAPITAL RESERVE for major highway equipment. Carried.

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## TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dublin qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, March 10, 1970, at seven o'clock in the Evening (polls will be open from 12:00 noon to 6:00 p.m.), to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To bring in your ballots for the following offices for one year terms: Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Highway Agent; for the following offices for three year terms: Selectman, Trustee of Trust Funds, Water Commissioner, Library Trustee, Cemetery Committee; Member of Board of Adjustment for five years; Member of the Planning Board for six years.

Article 2. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

Article 3. To hear Reports of agents, auditors, committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of any Real Estate acquired by tax deed.

Article 6. To see if the Town will accept certain Trust Funds, as follows:

For Perpetual Care of Cemetery Lots:

Joseph and Louise Fairbanks	200 00
Henry W. and Belle F. Gowing Lot	200 00
Alice M. Gowing Lot	200 00

Clarence and Edith Mason Fund 10,000 00 Legacy bequeathed to the Town of Dublin under the will of Belle F. Gowing "ELEVENTH: I give and bequeath to the Town of Dublin the sum of \$10,000.00, in trust, however, to be held by said Town as the Clarence and Edith Mason Fund the income only to be used for needy persons in the Town." Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to defray Town charges and for other purposes mentioned in the Town Budget.

Article 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to continue the support given in 1969 for the services of the Community Mental Health Clinic of the Monadnock Family Health Service.

Article 9. To see if the Town will establish a Dublin Conservation Commission as set forth in R.S.A. 36-a, and will authorize the Selectmen to appoint said Commission within sixty days from the date of this annual meeting and to appoint a temporary chairman to call the first meeting of said Commission, and to see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to defray the 1970 expenses of said Commission.

Article 10. To see what sum of money the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Heavy Highway Equipment account of the Capital Reserve for the purchase of a truck for the Highway Department, and what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to supplement such Capital Reserve funds withdrawn, for the purchase of said truck.

Article 11. To see if the Town will discontinue the present Harris Road, so called, from its point of junction with the Page Road to Jaffrey town line, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:1.

Article 12. To see if the Town will discontinue that portion of the old Hancock Road, still remaining, which is situated within the present Allen property, formerly owned by Luke Richardson, from the point where it joins the present Hancock Road on the southerly boundary of the Allen property to the point where it rejoins the present Hancock Road on the northerly boundary of the Allen property, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:1.

Article 13. To see if the Town will discontinue that portion of the former Valley Road, abandoned as a result of the relocation of the northerly end of the Valley Road and construction of the Route 101 underpass, from the point of its junction with the present Valley Road northerly to its end at the house and barn owned by Richard and Marian Latti, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:1.

Article 14. To see if the Town will discontinue the present town road located between the northerly boundary of land owned by Stewart and the southerly boundary of land owned by Steinert from its point of junction with the Old Harrisville Road easterly to its end at the Flint Cottage, so called, owned by Sterling, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:1. Article 15. To see if the Town will discontinue that portion of the former Goldmine Road, abandoned as a result of the relocation of the easterly end of the Goldmine Road and construction of the Route 101 underpass, from the present Alden Brunell residence to the underpass, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:1.

Article 16. To see if the Town will discontinue, subject to gates and bars the former Oxbow Road, so called, from the point of its junction with the Upper Jaffrey Road at the present Jamgochian property to its junction with the Page Road at the present Charles Johnson property, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:2.

Article 17. To see if the Town will discontinue, subject to gates and bars, the present abandoned extension of the Dooe Road from the point of its junction with the Valley Road southeasterly to the Peterborough town line, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:2.

Article 18. To see if the Town will discontinue, subject to gates and bars, that portion of the former Bond's Corner Road abandoned as a result of the reconstruction of the Bond's Corner intersection with Route 101, situated between property now owned by McQuillen and property now owned by Rajaniemi, from the point of its junction with the present Bond's Corner Road southerly to its ending adjacent to the border of the Route 101 right of way, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:2.

Article 19. To see if the Town will discontinue, subject to gates and bars, that portion of the former Route 101 located on the easterly boundary of the present Friendly Farm, Inc. from the easterly point of its junction with the present Route 101 westerly to the point of rejoining Route 101, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:2.

Article 20. To see if the Town will abolish the office of Water Commissioner effective on the day of Town Meeting 1971, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to adopt an Ordinance requiring Building Permits and authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Building Inspector, and to see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to defray the 1970 expenses of said Building nspector, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 22. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for the purchase of an Addressograph Graphotype unit with which to emboss the metal plates used in the Town's property valuation listing and addressing system. Article 23. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Dublin Recreation Committee with powers to investigate the recreational needs of the Town of Dublin, with specific reference to the establishment of a Town beach and related recreational facilities, and with the responsibility of reporting to the Town the Committee's recommendations for such facilities at the next annual Town Meeting, and to see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the use of said Committee for the purpose noted above, or take any other action related thereto.

Article 24. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen, together with the Cemetery Committee, to negotiate and make such transfer of land presently located within the Dublin cemetery bordering on Route 101 in the vicinity of the Town Cemetery Vault to the State of New Hampshire, in return for transfer to the Town of land now lying within the State highway right of way, in such a manner as to improve the safety of the highway, provided that no permanent graves shall be affected by such transfer.

Article 25. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Capital Reserve.

### REPORT OF THE DUBLIN FIRE DEPARTMENT, 1969

The Dublin Fire Dept. enjoyed a relatively quiet year compared with 1968 experiences. However, there were 34 times that we were called upon for various emergencies.

Also, there were sixteen oil burner permits issued.	

The two barn fires were both at the same location; arson is listed as the cause. The State Fire Marshall's Office, police and Fire Dept. could never locate the guilty party. However, there is still a threat to our community. Last year we lost a cottage at Dublin Lake under the same circumstances.

Many training sessions were held during fair weather. We are fortunate to have such a group of reliable firemen in a small town.

The International Pumper was used at the Meadowood Drill Yard in Fitzwilliam at its training session last summer. This school was attended by several of our men. We have eight men signed up for the 1970 school.

The first maintainence of the year was on our fire siren on the roof of the fire station. During January the motor burned out, requiring its removal from the roof and complete rebuilding at an electric motor shop. New tires were installed on the International Tanker.

All special equipment was purchased and installed on trucks. Brackets and hangers for the new coats and boots were made by the firemen during spare evenings. Equipment of the five trucks has been rearranged to facilitate its use in an emergency. The attack lines on the two front line trucks have been changed from 1½ inch hose with threaded couplings to modern 2 inch hose with quarter turn couplings. This arrangement has changed hose laying and pick-up time by 70%. The changing of these lines required considerable plumbing changes to update our 1949 Ford pumper. Except for a little expert help from our local plumber, the labor was done by the firemen. All trucks were thoroughly cleaned, and running boards, steps and bumpers painted.

The Fire Company drive for fire extinguishers has resulted in the sale of 150 units. We're still selling these extinguishers at 1969 prices.

I was especially proud of our station during the holiday season. We have received many compliments on the tree and decorations. This work was done by the Fire Company, and will continue in future years.

The Fire Hole Special appropriation was used to purchase three additional hydrants. Repairs to the dry line from the bottom of Church St. to the rear of the Town Hall were also made. During 1970 the three hydrants will be installed at the Davis pond on Valley Road, Dublin Lake, and Hammond's Pond on the Upper Jaffrey Road.

My Thanks to the men of the Dublin Fire Co. for their support and willingness to provide fellow citizens with an efficient fire department. Also, I would like to thank the taxpayers for providing us with additional funds to equip our department properly, which has now been done. I am in hopes that the regular fire appropriation can be increased by 15 percent. This will enable us to maintain our present level of maintainence of equipment, replacement of equipment, and operation of department at its present level. This is necessary due to the increase in the cost of living which affects all of us.

### REPORT OF HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

### Summer Highway Maintenance

The dirt roads were scraped and maintained several times, culverts and turnouts cleaned, leaves removed. Brush was cut on Lake Rd, Old Harrisville Rd, Upper Jaffrey Rd, Dooe Rd, Monument Rd, East Harrisville Rd, also corners where needed; brush burned or carted to dump.

Gravelled Old Marlboro Rd, Parsons Rd, Pierce Rd, Page Rd, Cobb Meadow Rd, Old County Rd, Old Troy Rd, Cook Rd, Windmill Hill. Filled washouts on several roads. Picked up rubbish on roadsides, carted to dump.

Repaired library fence; tarred roof to Town Shed.

Removed beaver damage from culverts on Monument Rd, Golf Club, Old Troy Rd, Gerry Rd, Niemela Brook. Mr. Warren also assisted in clearing trees and limbs from culverts.

All tar roads tar patched where needed, holes filled etc. Due to a strike by tar companies could not get tar until too late to do tarring of roads which will have to be done another year.

### Winter Maintenance

This expenditure covers installation and removal of snow fence, purchase of new snow fence which was badly needed, plowing roads and sidewalks, sanding and salting, general care of equipment. Removing fallen trees and limbs caused by ice storms. This winter was an exceptionally severe one, therefore necessitating longer working hours for men and equipment, with some breakdowns which was unavoidable.

### Town Road Aid

These funds were expended on extension of road of last year from Route 137 to corner Page Rd and Windmill Hill. Trees were cut,wood removed, brush burned, road widened, culverts installed, road gravelled and tarred. Road will need seal coating in spring as too late to complete last fall. Markers will also need to be installed.

### Town Dump

The dump was burned over frequently and brush also burned in . upper dump, rubbish cleaned up and dump pushed back at intervals, and covered with sand.

### New Construction

Repaired rails on Goldmine Road bridge, painted same. New culverts installed on Monument Road, Old Learned Road. Upper Jaffrey Road dug up and relaid culvert. Snow Hill dug up old cement culvert and replaced with galvanized culvert. Old Learned Road, filled washouts, cleaned ditches, removed stones and stumps from roadside. Gravelled road.

### Signs

Replaced several signs, straightened posts, installed several new signs as requested on Bonds Corner road.

Note:

As many already know I am retiring this year as Highway Agent, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Towns People for their support and cooperation these past years, with the hope that the next Highway Agent will receive the same support. Again many thanks to all and to the men who have worked with me.

He was very willing and without his assistance it would have been a very difficult job. I am very grateful to him.

I would like to thank the other people who made the job easier. Bert Pierce and his men, especially Henry Knight who helped with the spring clean-up; The Boy Scouts for their help on Memorial Day; Russell Chase, Tom Fox, and Dave Woodward who were the people responsible for keeping the grounds in shape during the summer and fall.

If anyone is interested in being Superintendent or working on the grounds this coming summer, especially high school boys, please contact me or the Selectmen.

In 1970 I would like to look into the possibility of having a master plan or map made of all cemetery lots to be kept in duplicate. If this turns out to be practical and not too costly, it would simplify the system and it would be relatively easy for the Superintendent to keep the records up to date. Also, if our records were ever lost for any reason, it would not be a great catastrophe. Anyone who has any ideas or would like to help with this please contact me.

There were 9 burials this year and 5 lots were sold.

Thanks to the wise investments made by the Trustees of the Trust Funds of the Perpetual Care money, the cemetery realized \$1,139.54 in interest.

Many people, particularly non-residents, comment on what a beautiful cemetery location Dublin has. I know it is very easy for us to take the natural beauty of Dublin for granted, so I would like to invite everyone to take a few minutes occasionally to visit your cemetery and appreciate the beauty. Incidentally, while you are there, pick out a lot if you think you might need one sometime.

Gentlemen:

We have examined the balance sheet of the Town of Dublin, New Hampshire as of December 31, 1969 and the related statements of revenues and appropriations and expenditures for the year then ended. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstance.

### SCOPE OF THE EXAMINATION

Explanatory comments on the major balance sheet items follow.

Cash on hand and in bank-treasurer — \$68,830.61. Cash in bank was reconciled with the treasurer's books and the balance

per bank statement was confirmed by corresponding directly with the depository.

Taxes receivable — \$18,376.00. The uncollected taxes agreed with the collector's detailed listing. Approximately 98% of the outstanding property taxes were verified by corresponding directly with the taxpayers.

Capital reserve fund — \$12,848.60. Interest received amounted to \$523.69. This fund is in the custody of the Trustees of Trust Funds.

Due to school department — \$75,883.98. The balance due to the school department was computed as follows: Owed to school department—Dec. 31, 1968 \$73,867 27 Appropriated 1969 172,543 98

Paid to school district treasurer—1969 \$246,411 25 170,527 27

Due to school department-Dec. 31, 1969

\$75,883.98

The loan from the Indian Head National Bank in connection with the construction of the fire station and the purchase of equipment was reduced from \$35,350.00 to \$31,420.00 during the year. The loan is payable at the rate of \$3,930.00 per year plus interest at 3% per annum.

*Excess of liabilities over assets* — \$19,190.36. This balance represents the net liabilities of the general fund as reflected by the books and as ascertained from other sources.

# REVENUES AND APPROPRIATIONS

The receipts as shown by the records were verified with the remitter insofar as practicable. The total receipts and disbursements as reflected in the Selectmen's books agreed with those recorded in the Treasurer's books. An inspection of vouchers and cancelled checks indicated that the disbursements were supported by invoices or other documents and were being properly recorded.

### TRUST FUNDS

The balance of cash on deposit in the checking account and in the various savings accounts was confined to us directly by the depositories. Securities on hand were inspected or accounted for by us. We verified the dividends and interest received during the year.

The income received during the year on common fund investments was distributed to the various funds included in the common fund on a proportionate basis. Disbursements were made to various beneficiaries of the trusts.

### LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

Renovations to the library basement and refurbishing the main floor with carpeting, new furniture and a charging desk unit, were completed in the spring. By a unanimous vote of the trustees the basement area has been named and a bronze plaque placed on the entrance wall inscribed as follows:

### Gowing Memorial Room 1968

The first program to be initiated in the room was held in late July under the indefatigable leadership of Mrs. James Mayo. It was a working exhibit of weaving where interested persons had the opportunity to try their hand at weaving with seven looms available and four highly trained teachers. Numerous exhibits adorned the walls to give a striking effect to this colorful room. As a result of this event fifteen children signed up for a weaving class held in November and December under the tutelage of Mrs. William Link and Mrs. Alexander James, Jr.

On exhibit in the Gowing Memorial room for the winter months is a self portrait of Alexander James and a sculpture by Michael James. The community is enriched by the courtesy and loan of this talented family.

Mr. Elliott Allison has given the library many photographic prints of early Dublin scenes and people. He has also allowed negatives to be made from singular prints he owns so that the library may have copies. These photographs were taken by the late Henry D. Allison, father of the donor, and author of *Dublin Days*, *Old and New*. An album of these prints is being compiled with notations by Mr. Allison. This is a precious and unique gift to add to the history of Dublin through Mr. Allison's thoughtfulness and generosity. It will be a "best seller" but will not be allowed to circulate outside the library.

By affiliation with the Library Development program these past five years our library has been State-Grant-In-Aid funded by one hundred dollars a year to build up its reference collection. Over sixty families with children in grades seven through twelve were sent mimeographed lists of these books owned by our library.

Early in the summer of 1970 the implementation of the Statewide Library card will go into effect. It will be issued only to responsible patrons with strict adherence to regulations. This means that Dublin patrons may borrow free, books from any affiliated library within the State and the same token patrons from other towns may use our library.

Your librarian was chosen as a representative and attended the Waterville Conference held by the State Library Commission in October. Its purpose was to reevaluate the past five years and make recommendations for the future of this program. The District Advisory Councils have been asked to study carefully major questions as a result of this conference so that ideas can be incorporated in the State Library's budgetary request for the next biennium.

# SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL

All towns were provided with extensive information on various methods of solid waste disposal. The MRA has kept in close touch with the current study on open pit incineration. The Phase I report has been sent to all towns. The Phase II report will be sent to the towns after its completion which is scheduled for April.

Testimony at public hearing conducted by Air Pollution Control Commission resulted in open dump burning deadlines being extended.

### PLANNING

Extensive planning information was distributed to all towns after the Regional Town Meeting attended by over 150 area officials.

### SNOWMOBILES

Executive Secretary appointed to Governor's snowmobile committee to study the potentials and problems of this growing sport.

### INSECT CONTROL

Results of a three-month study were presented at public hearing before Pesticides Control Board recommending eventual elimination of hydrocarbons except where essential in insect control, in agriculture, and/or health areas.

### EAST-WEST HIGHWAY

Executive Secretary member of three-state committee to encourage development of southerly route for an East-West highway. Meetings included a session with John A. Volpe, Secretary of Transportation.

### AIR SERVICE

Attended a number of meetings with Northeast, Mohawk and Executive Airline officials striving to improve east-west air service as well as service to Boston and New York City. Have worked very closely with Captain John R. Sweeney, Director of the N. H. Aeronautics Commission.

Worked with Park Department to improve vistas at Miller State Park.

### MOUNT MONADNOCK

Executive Secretary on committee to preserve attractiveness of Mt. Monadnock. Office facilities being used during a study currently being conducted.

Working very closely with Park Department during progress of land acquisition in the Pisgah area. Informational Meeting is scheduled for January 30 for all officials and interested parties to discuss present status and future plans.

### REPORT OF 1969 DUBLIN CIVIL DEFENSE

This year saw the completion of a number of projects for the Town of Dublin. As noted in Article 12 on last year's warrant, C. D. installed a 6 meter radio beam antenna on the Fire Station roof. This was completed earlier in the year and works reasonably well. I'm very pleased with this addition for it will tie in the C.D. 6 meter radio system with the Fire Department radio network in case of emergency.

A Mutual Aid call was placed to Peterborough during the search for two young people lost on the mountain last spring. Peterborough loaned their portable warning siren for our use. We appreciate their cooperation.

After a number of years of malfunction, the air horn fire alarm-C.D. warning system on Gilman's garage is working again. A rebuilt solenoid valve and new air line piping did the trick. Many thanks to Larry Gilman for his assistance on this matter.

One man in our community constantly contributes his time to the C.D. system. Mr. Glen Scribner, Communications Officer for Dublin, carries out the RACES radio duties every Tuesday night. I greatly appreciate his time and interest and I know the Town does also.

I hope to continue to serve you in the year to come.
