You are hereby notified to meet at Grafton Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the fifth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same

#### POLLS CLOSE AT 6 P.M.

Business meeting on all other articles to begin at 7:30 P.M.

- 3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums of money for their respective purposes as listed below:

a.	For Old Home Day	\$ 50.00
b.	For Improvement to Huff Beach	50.00
с.	For Tree Removal and Railings	1,000.00
d.	For Patching and Oiling Roads	2,000.00
e.	For an Emergency Highway Appropriation	
	under the control of the Selectmen	1,000.00

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 for the purpose of maintaining highways and bridges.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,161.47 and thereby receive \$7,743.10 from the State for Town Road Aid.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for culverts.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by the Tax Collector's Deed.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to allow the monies accumulated through rental of Town Highway equipment (used in flood disaster) to be used for the purchase of Highway equipment by the Road Agent with the consent of the Selectmen.

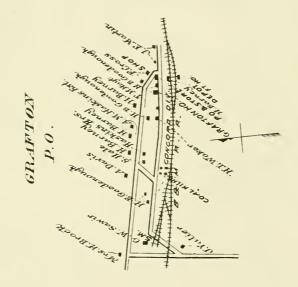

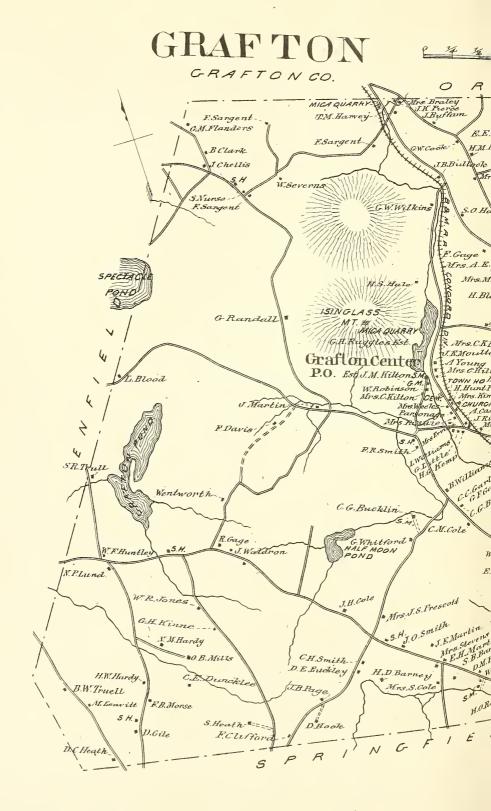

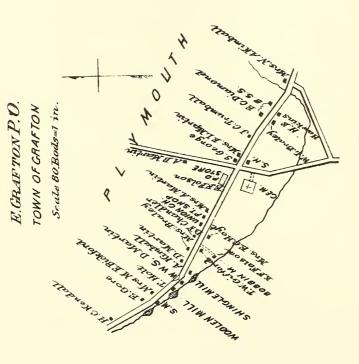

### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE TRUST FUNDS

We are pleased to announce that the interest from the \$25,000.00 Volana Kilton Trust Fund which was established in 1935 for the use of a resident Doctor and which became knows as the "Doctor Fund," was legally released in November, 1973. This fund may now be used for health services other than for a resident Doctor. Legal council has informed the Trustees of the Trust Funds that the accumulated interest amounting to \$52,143.96 (as of January 1, 1974) must be administered by the Trustees.

We have agreed that for the year 1974 Grafton's share of the expenses of the Mascoma Area Health Council amounting to \$840.00 will be paid from this fund. This will eliminate the need for raising this money by means of taxation.

The Trustees are currently in the process of investigating various ideas for using a portion of the money in a way which will be of benefit to everyone. It is a tremendous responsibility, but we will make every effort to arrive at a plan or plans which will carry out as nearly as possible Mrs. Kilton's intent to provide, within limitations, the best available health care for the Town of Grafton.

### REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the forest fire warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the fire warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn or it is raining. The fire warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's job. Fire statistics show the need with 72% of the fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hand is a potential forest fire.

### MASCOMA AREA HEALTH COUNCIL Summary of Services for Town Reports January 1, 1973 to December 31, 1973

Born out of the Town Meetings in 1969, the Council is completing its fifth year of service to Canaan, Enfield, Grafton and Orange. Serving a population of a little more than 5,000, the Council's two nurses (each working half time) provide nursing service in the home and a complete health prevention and health promotion program.

In 1969 the Council began quarterly immunization clinics for all preschoolers. In 1971 this service was expanded to the present monthly Well Child Conferences. An average of 185 preschool children is enrolled in this free program, which is heavily supported by the Bureau of Maternal and Child Health, New Hampshire Division of Public Health. Under this program, each child regularly receives a full physical examination, all necessary immunizations, and tests for vision and hearing. Parents are seen with the children, problems are discussed and if necessary referred for further treatment. The Council's nurses make follow-up visits when needed. For any child who will not see a private physician the Council provides the full physical exam necessary for entrance to kindergarten or first grade. It is also under contract to supervise the health of the children in the Headstart program.

Nutritionists are available at each clinic, and are also available to adults needing help on dietary matters. A representative of Planned Parenthood is also available for counselling when needed.

No funds have become available for the long hoped for dental program, but this past year, with generous financial help from the Lions Clubs of Canaan and Enfield the Council was able to institute a new program of counselling on preventive dentistry.

The Council depends for support on the four towns served, each of which contributes annually on the basis of its population, and on Medicaid and Medicare where it is applicable. While we must of necessity set a charge for services other than the free preschool clinics, the services are available to everyone, regardless of ability to pay that charge.

At present, our nurses are Mrs. Gertrude Clark, R.N. of Grafton and Mrs. Toni Sadowsky of West Lebanon. During the year 1973 they have made almost 1,500 visits to area residents for nursing service, health promotion, counselling or support.

In November of 1973 the Council, in cooperation with local physicians and the American Cancer Society, offered to area women a free clinic testing program for cancer. We hope another such program can be offered in 1974. In addition, plans are now being made with the Council on Aging for an Adult Health Screening program to be held annually in the area.

The Council is governed by a volunteer board of directors elected from the four towns, and its medical policies and practices are supervised by a Medical Advisory Board consisting of area physicians and several volunteers.

The Council maintains its office in the Health Room at Mascoma Valley Regional High School, with its own telephone (632-7234). It is heavily depen-

dent on, and grateful to, the Methodist Churches of Canaan and Enfield and the School, which provide space for its clinics and meetings, and to the School for its office space there. A pamphlet describing the Council and its work and service is available on request. Its monthly meetings (first Monday evenings at the School) are open to the public, and visitors and volunteers are welcomed.
