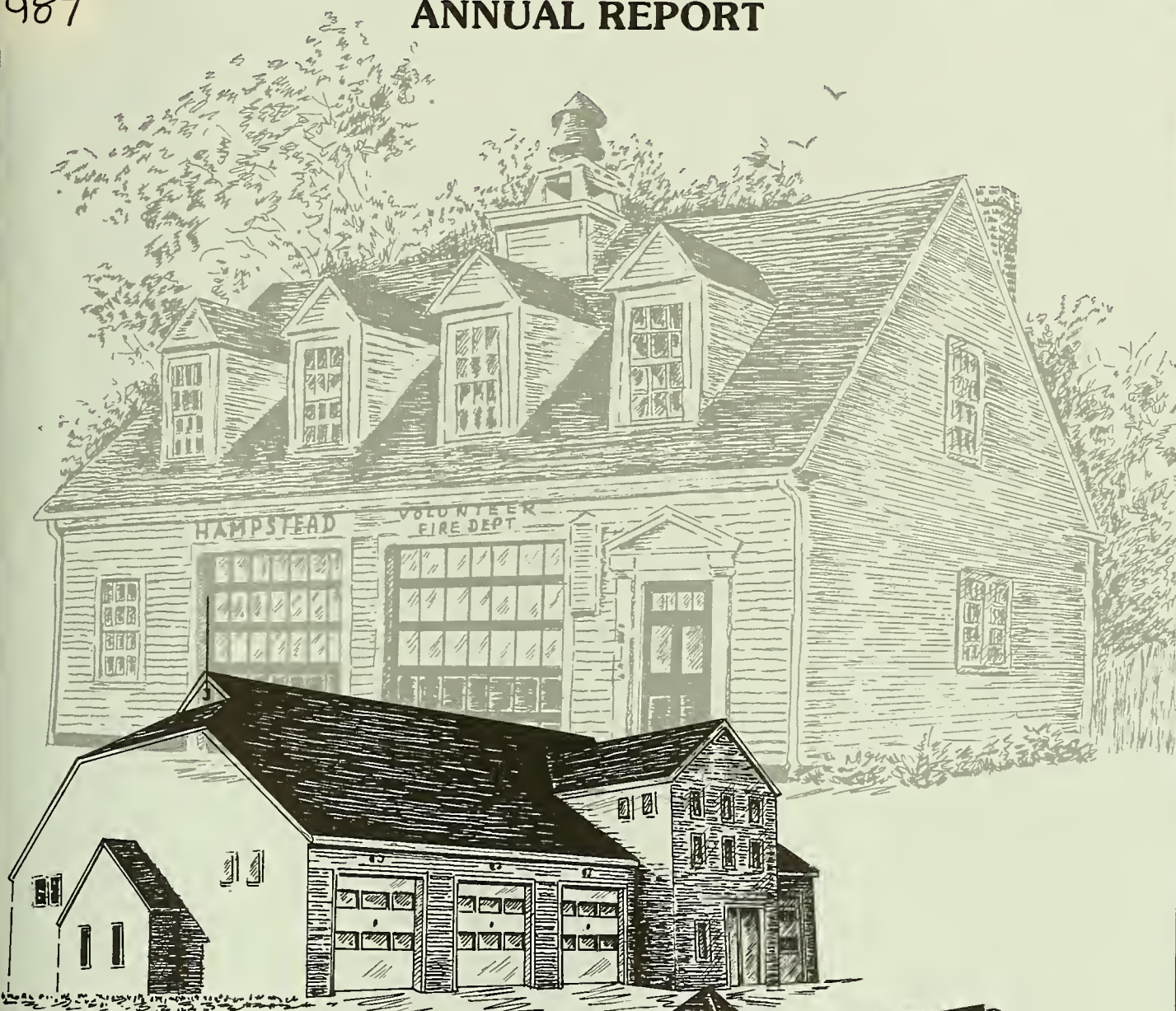

We have examined the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Hampstead, New Hampshire, as of and for the year ended December 31, 1986, as listed in the table of contents. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and included such tests of the accounting records as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

The general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the financial statements of the General Fixed Assets Account Group, which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles. The amount that should be recorded in the general fixed assets account group is not known.

As described in Note 1, the Town has recognized tax revenues in its General and Property Tax Fund which may not meet the sixty day received in cash revenue recognition requirements of generally accepted accounting principles (GASB Interpretation 3). Town officials believe, and we concur, that application of this accounting principle, which would reduce undesignated General Fund balance by an amount which is indeterminable due to the timing of this engagement, might mislead the user about the Town's ability to meet its current and future obligations at December 31, 1986.

In our opinion, except for the effect on the financial statements of the omission described in the second paragraph, the general purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly the financial position of the Town of Hampstead, New Hampshire, at December 31, 1986, and the results of its operations and changes in financial position of its non-expendable trust funds for the year then ended, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with the preceding year except for the change, with which we concur, in reporting the library fund, as more fully described in Note 8.

Our examination was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole. The supplemental schedules are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Hampstead, New Hampshire. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the examination of the general purpose financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole.

Building Inspector's Report — 1987

It is a pleasure to submit the annual report of the Building Inspection/Code Enforcement/Assessor Departments to the residents of the Town of Hampstead.

During 1987 this office processed a total of 309 building permits, of which 31 were not completed and nine consisted of foundation permits only. As this office is responsible for all such permits, which are serial numbered, we urge residents who remove permits from this office to return them even though they may not be completed, for accounting purposes. The stated total value of these permits issued was \$17,021,800 for the year which represents a decline of about a million dollars from the previous year.

During 1987 the assessing department located and processed an increase in building valuation of approximately sixteen million dollars. This represents an increase of slightly more than nine percent over the previous year. In 1987 we issued the first of many anticipated residential condominium permits. It is my opinion that such buildings have a positive impact on the tax base and at the same time have little impact on the tax burden.

At the forthcoming town meeting in March this department is proposing an increase in the price of building permits. This proposal will not exceed ten dollars on residential permits. We are also proposing the implementation of a system of electrical and plumbing permits. These permits have not been required in the past and this has been viewed as a positive step. This is the only community in the area that does not have such requirements and we are often met with disbelief by contractors who appear at this office and are advised that such permits are not required. It is the opinion of the State of New Hampshire Electricians' Board and Plumbing Board that a community that does not require such permits does not care about the quality of the work being done or who is performing the work. Besides being a positive step to ensure that work is being done properly, it will also make this department more self-supporting.

During the year we have, with the concurrence of the Board of Selectmen, implemented a bed-bottom inspection of new and replacement septic systems. This came about as a result of investigating many failed disposal systems, and resulted in the conclusion that there was little or no concern for home owners or potential buyers, during their construction. Our sympathy is extended to residents who spend the amount of dollars necessary at today's costs to acquire property and who are, shortly thereafter, faced with a failing system. We have and will continue to ensure home owners that their systems are the best possible and will continue to pursue that goal.

Last year I attended numerous educational courses on the subject of property valuation. These included programs sponsored by the New Hampshire Department of Revenue Administration on the subjects of the Appraisal of Condominiums, the Appraisal of Commercial Property and Building Appraisal. In June I attended a one week course at Plymouth State College Sponsored by the International Association of Assessing Officials on the subject of Property Valuation. In November, I attended a course of instruction at Cromwell, Connecticut sponsored by Marshall & Swift Valuation Service on the subjects of the Residential Cost Handbook and the Marshall & Swift Valuation, Calculator Method of Appraisal. These programs are intended to enhance the efficiency of the Assessing Department and it is my intention to further pursue such programs as they become available.

As indicated in last year's report, we continue to require inspections of new and replacement heating systems and wood stove installations. This will ensure a safer community in which to reside. The cooperation of Fire Chief Walter "Chip" Hastings and fire department inspector Walter Eaton, with this office, leaves little to be desired. We extend our heartfelt thanks.

I would be remiss to submit this report without passing a bouquet to Dawn Shaw, my able assistant. Dawn addresses her responsibilities in an efficient and timely manner. She is an invaluable asset to the Assessing/Building Inspection/Code Enforcement departments.

Selectmen's Report

This year has brought a significant number of changes to Hampstead and the town meeting warrant for next year reflects the pressures that continued growth and expansion is bringing to bear on our town in the areas of capital needs, department expenses, personnel staffing, procedures, and policies.

We would like to welcome all new residents to Hampstead, and take this opportunity to invite all of you to participate in your town government through volunteer service on one of the many town committees or boards, or simply by attending the public meetings to learn more about Hampstead. The Board of Selectmen meets on the second and fourth Monday of each month in the Town Office Building at 7:30 PM, and thanks to the efforts of the Cable Television Advisory Board our meetings are telecast live on cable channel 38.

We have a number of positions (both appointed and elected) that are open and need interested and qualified people who are willing to devote a few hours each month in service to our community. Please approach one of the Selectmen if you have any questions or interest.

Early in 1987 we hired Kenneth H. Clark as code enforcement officer and building inspector, creating an opening on the Board of Selectmen. We appointed Dean C. Howard to fill this opening until town meeting last year, and would like to thank Dean for his valuable contributions of time and expertise in filling this urgent short term need.

Raymond D. Flaherty was elected to the Board in March, and has contributed many hours of effort in coming up to speed quickly in a complex, demanding, and sometimes thankless job. Also during this year, William E. Beane resigned and created another opening on the Board. Neil E. Emerson was appointed to fill this opening until the next town meeting, and again has worked diligently to pick up his share of the responsibilities of the Board of Selectmen.

One of our more difficult decisions during the year was to appoint Edward Nadworney to fill an opening on the School Board created by the resignation of Maurice Randall, Jr. While trying to work in close cooperation with the School Board, we felt compelled by the requirements of state statutes to make the appointment in a timely manner.

A committee to review the Hampstead zoning ordinances and make improvement recommendations to the Planning Board was formed during 1987, and has spent many hours in codifying the current ordinance and clarifying the procedures for citizens to use in approaching town boards. This committee is continuing to work to propose clarifications and changes to our zoning, and we would like to thank them for their efforts.

Town meeting last year voted to fund a roads assessment study to evaluate the capital needs of the town road system. The study was completed during November, and this year we have requested a warrant article to fund the repairs identified as having the highest priority. Our expectation would be to continue funding this plan through the budget process beginning in 1989 if the initial warrant article is approved this year.

We have proposed an addition to the Town Office Building to accomplish two major purposes: first, to provide for handicapped access to all public meetings in the town as required by federal law (since 1984); second, to provide a fireproof vault for storage of town records which are now stacked in wooden cabinets in the current building. In addition, the enlargement of the Town Clerk and Tax Collectors office approved (and funded) last year could be accomplished without destroying the character of the front hallway in the existing building. We think the planned addition addresses both the needs of the town and the heritage of our current structure.

This year we are also recommending the beginning of a two year program to accomplish revaluation of all taxable real property, with the expectation of implementing the new assessments by the 1989 tax year. We would also plan to continue funding this program through the budget process next year if the warrant article is passed.

Finally, you are being asked to vote on a proposed code of ethics which was presented by petition to the Selectmen to be included in the town meeting warrant. While we agree that anyone serving the public in an official capacity should be expected to act in an appropriate manner, there are many serious flaws in the proposed code. While it is extremely severe in excluding what is considered normal business activity and very broad in scope, there are also some obvious inappropriate situations which are not covered. As a whole, however, our biggest concern is that this proposal, if adopted as written, could add administrative burden and expense and hinder the operation of our still small and efficient town. Our recommendation is to defeat this proposal.

Planning Board Report — 1987

The Planning Board had a busy year reviewing fifty-six proposals involving land development in the Town. There were seventeen residential subdivisions of land approved and two commercial subdivisions approved. Eleven residential subdivisions were conditionally approved. This means if the conditions are met within the required time the plans will be approved. The Board reviewed and approved five commercial site plans and ten plans have conditional approval. Two proposals for multi-family housing were approved this year. Seven plans for lot line adjustments were reviewed and approved. Two excavation permits were issued. There was a conversion of four apartments to condominium units. One site plan was submitted and jurisdiction not taken for a lack of information. Seven proposals are still under consideration.

The Planning Board has been consulting with the firm of Rivers Engineering to insure that all the technical aspects of the zoning and subdivision regulations are met. Rivers also has taken over the job of road inspections. Their expertise and professionalism has been an asset to the Town.

Police Department Report — 1987

The year 1987 was one of hard work, long hours and much frustration caused by the deaths of seven persons on our roadways. We realize that two were due to "accidents" while the remaining five were due directly to excessive speed; in most cases double the posted speed limit, which no amount of visibility would have prevented. We still feel a sense of responsibility and will do our utmost to prevent such a reoccurrence. Radar patrols and visibility patrols have been increased. A new radar unit has been purchased and an unmarked cruiser has been utilized in an all out effort to control traffic problems, this resulted in an increase of court cases from 308 last year to 468 and DWI arrests up from 15 to 20. A group of concerned townspeople have organized "CITIZENS FOR A SAFER HAMPSTEAD." Your Police Department is cooperating with them 100% and ask that you all join our efforts to make Hampstead roadways safer for ourselves and our children.

Your department recently completed the building of a Firing Range thanks to a generous donation of land use by Roger Sanborn. This Range allows us the freedom to practice at any time and to have the luxury of our own qualification schedule. A class in Firearms will already be underway as you are reading this report and is being taught by officers of this department and is available for any resident. Future classes will be scheduled as needed.

To further our goals of having the best trained officers to serve you we gratefully accepted the donation of a TV and VCR from Donald Roberts and Ram Printing. These will allow the use of many training films which will implement our scheduled classes by instructors from Police Standards and Training Council.

Office hours at the Police Station have been doubled, being open Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 9AM to 4PM. Thursday will be added shortly for your convenience. The clerks are your neighbors and are trained to assist in any emergency or to give advice if needed. Please feel free to call or stop in at any time for a tour of the station. We are proud of our station and want you to share our enthusiasm. If you need to come by the station other than the above mentioned hours simply dial 329-5700 and our officer would be glad to meet you there.

Major crime (burglary, theft, assault, motor vehicle theft, etc) showed an increase of 6% in the State of N. H. while our town showed a 32% decrease overall. This we feel is a direct result of added patrols and increased visibility. Our biggest problem in this area is criminal mischief and although there was a slight decrease during the past year we feel there is still room for improvement. For this to happen we need to solicit the help of all of you. Please watch your property and your neighbors and report anything that seems suspicious to us immediately. We are available twenty four hours a day. PARENTS --- KNOW WHERE YOUR CHILDREN ARE AND WHAT THEY ARE DOING.

In April, Officer Kenneth Owen and Kevin Torre (a resident) were cited for their efforts in saving the life of a person who was drowning at Sunset Lake. It is cooperation like this between Police and Citizen that we are striving for in all facets of Law Enforcement. This cooperation is exemplified at our town level where the working together between Town Officials and Town Departments is second to none in this area. If we all considered this a priority it would make our Town the safest and best.

To all members of the department, I as Chief of Police extend my heartfelt thanks for all of the afore mentioned frustrations, sadness and difficult jobs which you so willingly accepted. I am sure I speak for each and every member of your Police Department when we promise to continue our efforts through 1988 for the benefit of OUR TOWN, HAMPSTEAD, N. H.

Fire Department Report — 1987

This year has been very busy for the Hampstead Fire Department and Rescue Squad. Structure fires were down which is encouraging, however traffic accidents were increased significantly. This is indicative of the much higher population in and around our area. The several traffic fatalities we experienced can be drastically reduced if each and every driver in Hampstead would drive with respect for the lives of his or her family in their minds at all times. Next year at this time we should be able to report no traffic fatalities for the year.

April saw the Fire Department literally up to our armpits in water for three days. The State was declared a federal disaster area. This made us eligible for federal aid which we applied for. This money helped to defray the costs of more than 45 calls for assistance during this period. We pumped cellars, cleared roads and assisted the community as best we could. At this time it would be appropriate to state that every resident who has a yearly water problem is responsible to provide his own pumping equipment and have it installed in his home. If, due to extreme conditions or extenuating circumstances, he needs help, the fire department will respond and assist.

The diesel powered generator has been installed at the Central Fire Station and works well. This enables us to function at 100 percent even under power outage conditions and this is important to the community.

Training continues to be one of our most important non-emergency functions. Six members of the department have completed the New Hampshire Certified Fire Fighter course this year. We also have a good interest in a Career Level certified course which is scheduled to start in early spring.

The highlight of the years events has to be the annual Christmas Parade which was without a doubt the best ever. There were more marching bands and floats, not to mention a very impressive line of fire apparatus.

Looking to the future, we are asking the townspeople to improve the Town's fire suppression capabilities and detection equipment. We would welcome your participation by attending Town Meeting to voice your opinion on the purchase of a new fire truck and the installation of fire alarm systems in Town Buildings.

In closing, we would like to express our sincere appreciation to the members and their families for the volunteered time it takes to provide the level of services provided by the Fire Department and Rescue Squad to the Town.

At this time we would like to thank Bob Webster for 41 years of service to the people of Hampstead as a member of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad. Mere words can not do justice to the man. The number of missed night's sleep, missed meals and missed time with loved ones over the last 41 years certainly has earned him retirement. His service will be missed, but we expect to see him around the station providing moral support and good humor. We all wish you well Bob.

Hampstead Public Library Report — 1987

"All that mankind has done, thought, gained or been: it is lying as in magic preservation in the pages of books." - Thomas Carlyle

The Board of Trustees, Building Committee and staff continue to serve the community as best they can with continued lack of space and increased usage. Circulation was 28,775 items in 1987, an increase of 14% over 1986 and a 26% increase over 1985. In-house use, or people using the library amounted to 17,938, an increase of 29% over 1986 and a 52% increase over 1985. Reference questions, a time consuming and an important part of staff time, increased 33% over 1986 and 60% over 1985. All this with the same amount of space and number of staff has left the library in a position of not offering some services that should be offered. We have continued to be as accommodating as possible.

One major concern with the current building is that we are unable to meet recommended standards of libraries of towns of our size. Should the new library building be passed, handicapped access would be available. Much of the paperwork toward accreditation has been completed. The state recommends, according to population, the number of hours open, number of full time employees, levels of service, etc. By not meeting these requirements, services we now enjoy will no longer be available to us such as: free consultation service; free cataloguing service (which also puts our holdings on statewide computer). statewide inter-library loan, and the state library van route.

We are pleased that the students are availing themselves of our reference room and the many reference books there. We are also participating more in state wide inter-library loan activity. As our collection grows, we are lending to other libraries as well as borrowing from them. Inter-library loan is increasingly important to all the libraries in the state. 47

Communication and cooperation with area schools continues. Mrs. Crowley volunteers at the Middle School Library twice a month. Classes from several area schools and pre-schools have also visited the library during the year.

The Trustees and staff appreciate all the support given to us by the town organizations. The Mother's Club continues to conduct a story hour and they have donated books, magazine subscriptions and books on tape. The Lioness Talking Book shelf has grown as has its popularity with all ages. The Garden Club continues to beautify our exterior with our window boxes. Memorial books were given in memory of Branden Sarbanis, Frank Child, and Abbie Randall. We also appreciate the gifts of books and magazines from many townspeople. Without this continued support, the library would not have as fine a collection as it does. The generous gift of a word processor by Mr. and Mrs. Fleming Stevens to help in our work is most gratefully acknowledged.

Our children's craft workshops were conducted this year by Kathy Hootman. Adult book discussions were held by the staff members, and the Bearded Iris conducted adult craft workshops.

The Friends of the Library, under the direction of President Gail Lapham, were instrumental in the hiring of a Library Consultant to work with the Building Committee. Mr. James Kennedy, Director of the Geisel Library at St. Anselm's College was selected. Another successful Thrift Shop was held under the direction of Janet Thiboutot and Becky Rooney. We appreciate all those who donated clothes and helped with the running of the shop. The Friends also supported the summer reading program, purchased the pass to the Boston Fine Arts Museum, and the model for the proposed library. The Friends were happy to win a trophy for their "Pioneer Library" at the Fireman's Christmas Parade. Without this dedicated group,

1987 Town Warrant — Town of Hampstead, NH

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hampstead in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Hampstead Middle School in said Hampstead on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To choose all necessary School Officers for the year ensuing.
3. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the 1987 BOCA National Building Code as follows:

1987 BOCA NATIONAL BUILDING CODE

An ordinance establishing minimum regulations governing the design, construction, alteration, enlargement, repair, demolition, removal, maintenance, and use of all buildings and structures; providing for the issuance of permits, collection of fees, making of inspections; providing penalties for the violation thereof; known as the building code; and repealing existing ordinance Article XX of the Town of Hampstead Zoning Ordinance, State of New Hampshire.

Be it ordained by the vote of Town Meeting of the Town of Hampstead as follows:

SECTION 1. ADOPTION OF BUILDING CODE.

That a certain document, three (3) copies of which are on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Hampstead, New Hampshire being marked and designated as "The BOCA National Building Code, Tenth Edition, 1987" as published by the Building Officials and Code Administrators International, Inc. be and is hereby adopted as the Building Code of the Town of Hampstead in the State of New Hampshire; for the control of buildings and structures as herein provided; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said BOCA National Building Code, are hereby referred to, adopted and made a part hereof as if fully set out in this Ordinance, with the additions, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 3 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES REPEALED.

That Article XX of the Town of Hampstead Zoning Ordinances and Districts entitled BOCA and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. ADDITIONS, INSERTIONS AND CHANGES.

Section 118.2 (page 13, fourth and fifth lines). Insert: an amount not less than \$1000.00 per day or more than an amount commensurate with the value of work, such amount to be determined by the Code Enforcement Officer.

Section 123.3 (page 17, second line). Insert: at the rate of \$75.00 per hour.

Section 2906.1 (page 438, first, second and third lines). Insert: delete filing of an approved bond, \$500,000.00 (per accident), \$100,000.00 (property damage).

SECTION 4. SAVING CLAUSE.

That nothing in this Ordinance or in the Building Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in Section 2 of this Ordinance; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. DATE OF EFFECT.

That the Town Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and cause the same to be published as required by law; and this Ordinance shall take full force and effect immediately after this date of final passage and approval.

Recommended by the Planning Board.

4. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article VI, Commercial Zone C-3 to read:

Section I

Permitted Uses: Commercial businesses such as:

1. Establishments for storage of materials.
2. Shops for use of carpenter, cabinet maker, electrician, painter, upholster or plumber.
3. Manufacturing, fabricating or conversion facility.
4. Research, experimental, or testing laboratory.

Excepting:

1. Uses permitted in Zone D (Mobile Homes) are prohibited.

Section II:

Restrictions and Special Provisions:

1. There shall be no residential housing.
2. Building lots for businesses shall have a minimum of 45,000 square feet based on the lot size by soil type, Table 1A.
3. Building lots shall have a minimum frontage of 150 feet continuous frontage on the access side of the lot on an approved street.
4. The percent of lot coverage may be up to 50% based on use. This shall include all buildings, structures, or accessory structures.
5. All buildings shall be set back a minimum of 30 feet from the street side of the lot. The minimum set back from the side lot lines and rear lot lines shall be 15 feet.
6. The maximum building height shall be no more than 35 feet.
7. The setback from abutting zones shall be 50 feet.
8. The setback from an existing street shall be 30 feet.
9. The paving width shall be a minimum of 24 feet.
10. The width of the road right-of-way shall be 50 feet.
11. The maximum sign size shall be 80 square feet.
12. All proposals, changes in use or changes in the sign shall be subject to Site Plan Review.

Recommended by the Planning Board.

5. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article I, Commercial Zone C-1 to read:

"9. That part of the Town of Hampstead bounded:

Northwesterly: by the southeasterly line of New Hampshire Route 111
Northeasterly: by the southeasterly line of New Hampshire Route 121-A (East Main Street)
Southeasterly: by a line 500 feet from and parallel to the southeasterly line of New Hampshire Route 111
Southwesterly: by the northerly line of Central Street"

(This describes the land between Route 111 and Webber Road and portions of land which falls within 500 feet of Route 111 on the south side of Webber Road between Central Street and East Main Street.)

Not recommended by the Planning Board.

6. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article XIV, Section III to read:

"Provided that said changes are within the spirit and intent of the Ordinance, the Board of Adjustment may grant as a Special Exception the following changes:"

Recommended by the Planning Board.

7. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article XIV, Section III to read:

"5. The alteration or enlargement of a structure on a non-conforming lot so long as there is no diminution of surrounding property values."

Recommended by the Planning Board.

8. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article XIV, Section IV by adding the following:

"A permit from the Code Enforcement Officer of the Town of Hampstead shall be obtained to insure compliance with appropriate codes such as the electrical code, the plumbing code and the heating system inspection, and gas inspection before any occupancy permit shall be issued."

Recommended by the Planning Board.

9. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article XVI to read: *(changes are underlined)*

The Board of Adjustment shall consist of five (5) members, and three (3) alternates, each member or alternate to be appointed annually...

Recommended by the Planning Board.

10. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article XVI, Section II to read: *(changes are underlined)*

3. To authorize upon appeal in specific cases such variances from the terms of the Ordinance as will not be contrary to the public interest, where, owing to special conditions, a literal enforcement of the provisions of the Ordinance will result in unnecessary hardship, and so that the spirit of the Ordinance shall be observed and substantial justice done, and granting the variance will cause no diminution of surrounding property values.

Recommended by the Planning Board.

11. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning by adding the following:

FLOODPLAIN DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE

The following regulations shall apply to all lands designated as special flood hazard areas by the Federal Emergency Management Agency in its "Flood Insurance Study for the Town of Hampstead, New Hampshire" together with the associated Flood Insurance Rate Maps and Flood Boundary and Floodway maps of the Town of Hampstead, NH dated February 28, 1975 which are declared to be a part of this Ordinance.

Item I. Definition of Terms:

Area of Shallow Flooding: means a designated AO, AH, or VO zone on a community's Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) with a one percent or greater annual chance of flooding to an average depth of one to three feet where a clearly defined channel does not exist, where the path of flooding is unpredictable and where velocity flow may be evident. Such flooding is characterized by ponding or sheet flow.

Area of Special Flood Hazard: is the land in the flood plain within a community subject to a one percent or greater chance of flooding in any given year. The area may be designated as Zone A on the FHBM. After detailed ratemaking has been completed in preparation for publication of the FIRM, Zone A usually is refined into Zones A, AO, AH, A1-30, AE, A99, VO, or V1-30, VE, or V.

Base Flood: means the flood having a one percent chance of being equalled or exceeded in any given year.

Basement: means any area of the building having its floor subgrade (below ground level) on all sides.

Building: see Structure

Breakaway Wall: means a wall that is not part of the structural support of the building and is intended through its design and construction to collapse under specific lateral loading forces without causing damage to the elevated portion of the building or supporting foundation.

Coastal High Hazard Area: means the area subject to high velocity waters, including but not limited to hurricane wave wash or tsunamis. The area is designated on a FIRM as Zone V1-30, VE, or V.

Development: means any man-made change to improved or unimproved real estate, including but not limited to buildings or other structures, mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation or drilling operations.

Flood or Flooding: means a general and temporary condition of partial or complete inundation of normally dry land areas from:

(1) The overflow of inland or tidal waters.

(2) The unusual and rapid accumulation or runoff of surface waters from any source.

Flood Boundary and Floodway Map (FLOODWAY): is an official map of the community, on which the Federal Emergency Management Agency has delineated the "Regulatory Floodway." This map should not be used to determine the correct flood hazard zone or base flood elevation, the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) will be used to make determinations of flood base hazard zones and base flood elevations.

Flood Elevation Study: means an examination evaluation and determination of flood hazards and, if appropriate, corresponding water surface elevations, or an examination, evaluation and determination of mudslide (i.e., mudflow) and/or flood-related erosion hazards.

Flood Hazard Boundary Map (FHBM): means an official map of a community, issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, where the boundaries of the flood, mudslide (i.e., mudflow) related erosion areas having special hazards have been designated as Zones A, M, and/or E.

Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM): means an official map of a community, on which the Federal Emergency Management Agency has delineated both the special hazard areas and the risk premium zones applicable to the community.

Flood Insurance Study: see Flood Elevation Study.

Flood Plain or Flood-Prone Area: means any land area susceptible to being inundated by water from any source (see definition of Flooding).

Flood Proofing: means any combination of structural and non-structural additions, changes, or adjustments to structures which reduce or eliminate flood damage to real estate or improved real property, water and sanitary facilities, structures and their contents.

Floodway: see Regulatory Floodway

Functional Dependent Use: means a use which cannot perform its intended purpose unless it is located or carried out in close proximity to water. The term includes only docking facilities, port facilities that are necessary for the loading and unloading of cargo or passengers, and ship building and ship repair facilities, but does not include long-term storage or related manufacturing facilities.

Highest Adjacent Grade: means the highest natural elevation of the ground surface prior to construction next to the proposed walls of a structure.

Lowest Floor: means the lowest floor of the lowest enclosed area (including basement). An unfinished or flood resistant enclosure usable solely for parking vehicles, building access or storage in an area other than a basement area is not considered a building's lowest floor: Provided, that such enclosure is not built so as to render the structure in violation of the applicable non-elevation design requirements of this ordinance.

Mean Sea Level: means, for purposes of the National Flood Insurance Program, the National Geodetic Vertical Datum (NGVD) of 1929 or other datum, to which base flood elevations shown on a community's Flood Insurance Rate Map are referred to.

Manufactured Home: means a structure, transportable in one or more sections, which is built upon a permanent chassis and is designed for use with or without permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities. For flood plain management purposes the term "manufactured home" also includes park trailers, travel trailers, and other similar vehicles placed on a site for greater than 180 consecutive days. For insurance purposes the term "manufactured home" does not include park trailers, travel trailers, and other similar vehicles.

Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision: means a parcel (or contiguous parcels) of land divided into two or more manufactured home lots for rent or sale.

100-Year Flood: see Base Flood.

Regulatory Floodway: means the channel of a river or other watercourse and the adjacent land areas that must be reserved in order to discharge the base flood without cumulatively increasing the water surface elevation more than one foot at any point. These areas are designated as floodways on the Flood Boundary and Floodway Maps.

Riverine: means relating to, formed by or resembling a river (including tributaries), stream, brook, etc.

Special Flood Hazard Area: means an area having special flood, mudslide (i.e., mudflow) and/or flood related erosion hazards, and shown on an FHBM or FIRM as Zone A, AO, A1-30, AE, A99, AH, VO, V1-30, VE, V, M, or E. (See Area of Special Flood Hazard)

Structure: means for floodplain management purposes, a walled and roofed building, including a gas or liquid storage tank, that is principally above ground, as well as a manufactured home.

Start of Construction: includes substantial improvement, and means the date the building permit was issued, provided the actual start of construction, repair, reconstruction, placement, or other improvement was within 180 days of the permit date. The actual start means whether the first placement of permanent construction of a structure on a site, such as the pouring of slab or footings, the installation of piles, the construction of columns, or any work beyond the stage of excavation; or the placement of a manufactured home on a foundation. Permanent construction does not include land preparation, such as clearing, grading and filling; nor does it include the installation of street and/or walkways; nor does it include excavation for a basement, footings, piers, or foundations or the erection of temporary forms; nor does it include the installation on the property of accessory buildings, such as garages or sheds not occupied as dwelling units or nor part of the main structure.

Substantial Improvement: means any combination of repairs, reconstruction, alteration, or improvements to a structure in which the cumulative cost equals or exceeds fifty percent of the market value of the structure. The market value of the structure should be (1) the appraised value of the structure prior to the start of the initial repair or improvement, or (2) in the case of damage, the value of the structure prior to the damage occurring. For the purposes of this definition, "substantial improvement" is considered to occur when the first alteration of any wall, ceiling, floor, or other structural part of the building commences, whether or not that alteration affects the external dimensions of the structure. The term does not, however, include any project for improvement of a structure required to comply with existing health, sanitary, or safety code specifications which are solely necessary to assure safe living conditions or any alteration of a structure listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

V-Zone: see Coastal High Hazard Area.

Water Surface Elevation: means the height, in relation to the National Geodetic Vertical Datum (NGVD) of 1929 (or other datum, where specified), of floods of various magnitudes and frequencies in the flood plains of coastal or riverine areas.

Item II.

All proposed development in any special flood hazard areas shall require a permit.

Item III.

The Building Inspector shall review all building permit applications for new construction or substantial improvements to determine whether proposed building site will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is in a flood-prone area, all new construction and substantial improvements shall (i) be designed (or modified) and adequately anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure resulting from hydrodynamic and hydrostatic loads, including the effects of buoyancy, (ii) be constructed with materials resistant to flood damage, (iii) be constructed by methods and practices that minimize flood damages, and (iv) be constructed with electrical, heating, ventilation, plumbing, and air conditioning equipment and other service facilities that are designed and/or located so as to prevent water from entering or accumulating within the components during conditions of flooding.

Item IV.

Where new and replacement water and sewer systems (including on-site systems) are proposed in flood-prone areas the applicant shall provide the Code Enforcement Officer with assurance that new and replacement sanitary sewage systems will be designed to

minimize infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters, and on-site waste disposal systems will be located to avoid impairment to them or contamination from them during periods of flooding.

Item V.

The Code Enforcement Officer shall maintain for public inspection, and furnish upon request, any certification of flood-proofing and the as built elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basement) or all new or substantially improved structures, and include whether or not such structures contain a basement. If the structure has been floodproofed, the as built elevation (in relation to mean sea level) to which the structure was floodproofed. This information must be furnished by the applicant.

Item VI.

The Code Enforcement Officer shall review proposed developments to assure that all necessary permits have been received from those governmental agencies from which approval is required by Federal or State law, including Section 404 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972, 33 U.S.C. 1334. It shall be the responsibility of the applicant to certify these assurances to the Code Enforcement Officer.

Item VII.

In riverine situations, prior to the alteration or relocation of a watercourse, the applicant for such authorization shall notify the Wetlands Board of the New Hampshire Environmental Services Department and submit copies of such notification to the Code Enforcement Officer. Further, the applicant shall be required to submit copies of said notification to adjacent communities as determined by the Code Enforcement Officer.

Within the altered or relocated portion of any watercourse, the applicant shall submit to the Code Enforcement Officer, certification provided by a registered professional engineer, assuring that the flood carrying capacity of the watercourse has been maintained.

Along watercourses that have a designated Regulatory Floodway no encroachments, including fill, new construction, substantial improvements, and other development are allowed within the designated Regulatory Floodway that would result in any increase in flood levels within the community during the base flood discharge. In Zone A the Code Enforcement Officer shall obtain, review, and reasonably utilize any floodway data available from a Federal, State, or other source as criteria for requiring that development meet the floodway requirements of this section.

Along watercourses that have not had a regulatory floodway designated, no new construction, substantial improvements or other development (including fill) shall be permitted within Zones A1-30 and AE on the FIRM, unless it is demonstrated that the cumulative effect of the proposed development, will not increase the water surface elevation of the base flood more than one foot at any point within the community.

Item VIII.

1. In special flood hazard areas the Code Enforcement Officer shall determine the 100 year flood elevation in the following order of precedence according to the data available:

a. In Zones A1-30, AH, AE, V1-30 and VE refer to the elevation provided in the communities Flood Insurance Study and accompanying FIRM or FHBM.

b. In unnumbered A zones the Code Enforcement Officer shall obtain, review, and reasonably utilize any 100 year flood elevation data available from Federal, State, development proposals submitted to the community (example sub-divisions, site approvals, etc.) or other source.

c. In Zone AO the 100 year flood elevation is determined by adding the elevation of the highest adjacent grade to the depth number specified on the FIRM or if no depth number is specified on the FIRM at least two feet.

2. The Code Enforcement Officer's 100 year flood elevation determination will be used as criteria for requiring in Zones A1-30, AE, AH, AO and A that:

a. all new construction and substantial improvements of residential structures have the lowest floor (including basement) elevated to or above the 100 year flood level;

b. that all new construction and substantial improvements of non-residential structures have the lowest floor (including basement) elevated to or above the 100 year flood level; or together with attendant utility and sanitary facilities, shall:

(i) be floodproofed so that below the 100 flood elevation the structure is watertight with walls substantially impermeable to the passage of water;

(ii) have structural components capable of resisting hydrostatic and hydrodynamic loads and the effects of buoyancy; and

(iii) be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect that the design and methods of construction are in accordance with accepted standards of practice for meeting the provisions of this section;

c. all manufactured homes to be placed or substantially improved within special flood hazard areas shall be elevated on a permanent foundation such that the lowest floor of the manufactured home is at or above the base flood level; and be securely anchored to resist flotation, collapse, or lateral movement. Methods of anchoring may include, but are not limited to, use of over-the-top or frame ties to ground anchors. This requirement is in addition to applicable state and local anchoring requirements for resisting wind forces;

d. for all new construction and substantial improvements, fully enclosed areas below the lowest floor that are subject to flooding are permitted providing the enclosed areas meet the following requirements: (1) the enclosed area is unfinished or flood resistant, useable solely for parking of vehicles, building access or storage; (2) the area is not a basement; (3) shall be designed to automatically equalize hydrostatic flood forces on exterior walls by allowing for the entry and exit of floodwaters. Designs for meeting this requirement must either be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect or must meet or exceed the following minimum criteria: A minimum of two openings having a total net area of not less than one square inch for every square foot of enclosed area subject to flooding shall be provided. The bottom of all opening shall be no higher than one foot above grade. Openings may be equipped with screens, louvers, or other coverings or devices provided that they permit the automatic entry and exit of floodwaters;

e. proposed structures to be located on slopes in Special Flood Hazard Areas, Zones AH and AD, shall include adequate drainage paths to guide flood waters around and away from the proposed structures.

Recommended by the Planning Board.

12. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by expanding Zone C-1 to include all of that parcel of land situated on the Southerly side of Stage Road and on the Westerly side of Route 111, which Parcel is known as Tax Map 6, Parcel 32.

"The purpose of this Amendment is to include all of said Tax Map 6, Parcel 32 in Zone C-1."

BY PETITION — Not recommended by the Planning Board

13. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Article XI, Section III of the Zoning Ordinance by adding the following provisions to the existing article:

"However, internally illuminated signs are permitted in Zone C-2 provided that the following conditions are met:

1. The business is located within a shopping mall or a cluster complex and
2. The sign meets all size and location requirements for Zone C-2, and
3. The internal illumination is incandescent or fluorescent. Neon illumination is specifically prohibited."

BY PETITION — Not recommended by the Planning Board

14. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Hampstead Zoning Ordinance as follows:

I. Article X. Repeal the existing multiple unit dwelling section of the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Hampstead, Article X.

15. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by expanding Zone C-1 to include those parcels of land situated on the Westerly side of Webber Road, bounded by Webber Road and Route 111, known as Tax Map 17, Parcel 4, Tax Map 18, Parcel 138, Tax Map 18, Parcel 45, Tax Map 18, Parcel 98, and further to include Tax Map 18, Parcel 134, in that part of Hampstead bounded: Beginning at the intersection of Route 111 and Webber Road at Central Street and thence by the Westerly side of Webber Road to Route 111 and thence by the Easterly side of Route 111 back to the beginning.

The above described parcel encompasses Tax Map 17, Parcel 4, Tax Map 18, Parcel 138, Tax Map 18, Parcel 45, and Tax Map 18, Parcel 98.

Also that parcel bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point on the Southeasterly side of Route 111 at a stone wall and at land now or formerly of one Furze and thence running Southwest-erly along said Route 111 a distance of 210 feet, more or less, to a point at other land of Wendell B. Wyatt; thence turning and running Southeasterly along land of said Wyatt 250 feet, more or less to land now or formerly of Hoyt and Strout; thence turning and running Northeasterly along land of said Hoyt and Strout 240 feet, more or less, to a point at the stone wall at land of said Furze; thence turning and running Northwesterly along land of said Furze 245 feet, more or less, to Route 111 at the point of beginning.

The above described is Tax Map 18, Parcel 134.

To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by expanding Zone C-1 to include those parcels of land situated on the easterly side of Webber Road, bounded generally by Central Street and Webber Road and Webber Road to Route 111, known as Tax Map 17, Parcel 64, Tax Map 17, Parcel 100, Tax Map 17, Parcel 55, Tax Map 17, Parcel 14, Tax Map 17, Parcel 56, Tax Map 17, Parcel 61, Tax Map 17, Parcel 31, Tax Map 18, Parcel 148, Tax Map 18, Parcel 139, Tax Map 18, Parcel 109, Tax Map 18, Parcel 24.

To see if the Town will vote to construct and furnish a new town Public Library; and authorize the town to issue bonds or notes pursuant to NH RSA 33 in the amount of Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$950,000.00) to pay for said facilities, site work and road improvements, such bonds to be payable over a six year period; and to accept, receive and apply grants and gifts and interest received from said bond funds toward such construction and furnishing.

36. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing land on Holiday Lane for additional ball fields and parking for the existing fields.

Not recommended by the Budget Committee

37. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 to install a bathroom and septic system at the Town garage.

Not recommended by the Budget Committee

38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of upgrading a field camera for Cable TV studio use.

Recommended by the Budget Committee

39. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Fifty Dollars (\$2,050.00) for the purpose of implementing a two-year pilot program establishing a basic, controlled, trail network in the Town, said program to be conducted under the direction of the Recreation Commission of this Town, and said program to be extended or terminated by vote of the 1990 Town Meeting.

Not recommended by the Budget Committee

40. To see if the Town will vote to permit Class V and Class VI highways, Town right-of-ways, and Town-owned lands to be used as connecting links in a controlled local trails network, subject to the approval of the Recreation Commission, the Conservation Commission or the Board of Selectmen as applicable, such permission to continue or terminate by vote of the 1990 Town Meeting.

41. To see if the Town will vote to join the Southeast Regional Refuse Disposal District in accordance with the provisions of the Southeast Regional Refuse Disposal District Agreement, a copy of which Agreement has been filed with the Selectmen, and the provisions of RSA Chapter 53-B, which together provide for construction, maintenance, and operation of regional refuse disposal facilities by said District, provided that the District is formed by the towns of Brentwood, Danville, East Kingston, Exeter, Fremont, Hampton, Hampton Falls, Kensington, New Castle, Newton, North Hampton, Rye, Sandown and South Hampton, and the city of Portsmouth in accordance the provision of RSA Chapter 53-B.

42. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty Two Thousand One Hundred Six Dollars (\$42,106.00) for the payment of the Town's share of the budget of the Southeast Regional Refuse Disposal District for the fiscal year of said district ending March 31, 1989; to authorize the Treasurer to pay the appropriated amount to said district in four (4) quarterly installments commencing on April 1 and continuing on or before the first day of each successive calendar quarter; and to take action relative thereto.

43. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,393.99 for membership dues in the Southeast Regional Refuse Disposal Planning Board for 1987 and 1988.

Recommended by the Budget Committee

44. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 for the purpose of installing a fire pond and fencing on Fire Department property, Map 7, Parcel 101 and 102.

Not recommended by the Budget Committee

45. To see if the Town will vote to grant a permanent right and ground water easement to the Hampstead School District over Map 7, Parcel 101.

46. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following Code of Ethics Ordinance pursuant to RSA 31:39-a:

HAMPSTEAD TOWN CODE OF ETHICS ORDINANCE

1. Title

This ordinance shall be known and referred to as the "Hampstead Town Code of Ethics."

2. Declaration of Policy

A. Where government is based on the consent of the governed, every citizen is entitled to have complete confidence in the integrity of that government. Each local Officer/Employee of the Town, whether elected or appointed, paid or unpaid, including members of Town boards, commissions, committees or agencies (hereinafter referred to as "Town Officer"), must earn and honor that trust by his or her conduct in all official actions. The purpose of this ordinance is to (a) ensure fair consideration of any application or matter to be voted upon, and also to ensure the appearance of fair consideration so as to maintain public confidence in the integrity of Town government, and (b) ensure that Town Office not be used for personal gain or advantage.

B. In recognition of these principles, there is hereby established a Code of Ethics Ordinance for all Town Officers/Employees.

3. Definitions—As used in this ordinance, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

Abutter—Any person who owns land adjacent to or within 200 feet of a parcel of real property under consideration.

Employee—Each and every person employed by the Town of Hampstead in any capacity whether permanent or temporary, on a contractual basis, full-time or part-time, intermittent, or consultant basis.

Employment Relationship—Exists when a Town Officer/Employee, or a member of his family is employed and compensated by the person or business requesting action or opposing action on the matter before the Town board.

Family—A spouse, children, parents, grandparents, grandchildren, brothers, sisters, aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, and the parents, grandparents, brothers, sisters, aunts, and uncles of the Town Officers'/Employee's spouse.

Financial Interest—Any financial interest, direct or indirect on the part of any Town Officer/Employee which is not common to the interest of other citizens of the Town. Such interests include, but is not limited to an ownership interest, a mortgage interest, and a creditor or debtor interest.

Personal Interest—An interest which shall affect or benefit the Town Officer/Employee or his family which is not common to the interest of other citizens of the Town. Personal interest need not be financial.

Town Officer—Each and every person holding an office or position whether by election or appointment, whether serving with or without compensation.

4. Conflict of Interest

No Town Officer/Employee shall engage in any business or transaction or have a financial or personal interest, directly or indirectly, which is in conflict with or incompatible with the proper discharge of his official duties or would tend to influence or impair his judgment and action in the performance of his official duties. A conflict of interest or incompatibility exists: (a) if the Town Officer/Employee has a financial and or personal interest in the outcome of any matter under consideration before him or his department; (b) if the Town Officer/Employee has reason to believe or expects that he will derive a direct financial and or personal gain or suffer a direct financial and/or personal loss, as the case may be, by reason of his official activity.

5. Eligibility To Participate

A. No Town Officer/Employee shall introduce, discuss as a member, approve, act upon, or vote upon any motion, resolution, permit or other matter in which he or a member of his family has a financial and/or personal interest.

B. No Town Officer/Employee shall introduce, discuss as a member, approve, act upon, or vote upon any motion, resolution, permit, or other matter in which he or a member of his immediate family has an employment relationship as defined in Section 3 of this Ordinance.

C. If the matter to be introduced, discussed, approved, or voted upon relates to real property owned by a Town Officer/Employee of a member of his family, or if the Town Officer/Employee or a member of his family is an abutter to such real property, the Town Officer/Employee shall be deemed to have a financial and/or personal interest in the matter and shall not debate the matter and shall disqualify himself from voting or acting upon such matter.

6. Disclosure of Interest

Any Town Officer/Employee who has, knows he will have or later acquires a financial and/or personal interest, directly or indirectly, in any matter under consideration before him or his department in his or its official capacity shall disclose (as soon as he has knowledge of such actual or prospective interest) in writing, the nature and extent of such interest to the chairman of his board (or in the case of an employee, his appointing board or the board he is accountable to). Such Town Officer/Employee as a member shall not debate the matter and shall disqualify himself from voting or acting on such matter.

7. Confidential Information

Except as may be required by law, no Town Officer/Employee shall willfully and knowingly disclose for financial and/or personal gain, to any other person confidential information acquired by him in the course of and by reason of his official duties or employment. Furthermore, he shall not use such information for the purpose of financial and/or personal gain for himself, his family, or any other person or business with which he is associated.

8. Accepting Gifts and Favors

No Town Officer/Employee shall accept any gifts, favors or something of value, directly or indirectly, from any person, organization, or business/corporation having a direct interest in a particular matter under consideration or interested in any manner whatsoever in business dealings with the Town of Hampstead.

9. Standards of Conduct

(a) A Town Officer/Employee while in the performance of his official duties shall conduct himself at all times in a manner which shall reflect creditably on his position.

(b) A Town Officer/Employee shall adhere to the spirit and letter of any and all rules governing his official position, including, but not limited to the contents of this Ordinance.

(c) No Town Officer/Employee shall knowingly or with reason to know use or attempt to use his official position to secure for himself or for others unwarranted privileges or exemptions which are not available to the other citizens of Hampstead.

(d) No Town Officer/Employee shall claim to at any time act on behalf of any board or department without prior written authorization from the remaining members of the board or department.

(e) No Town Officer/Employee shall use Town property or Town labor for personal purposes.

10. Challenge Procedure

(a) Any resident-voter of the Town of Hampstead may inquire into a possible violation of this Ordinance on the part of any Town Officer/Employee. Inquiries shall be in writing and shall state the grounds for the inquiry. A copy of the inquiry shall be directed to the challenged individual and to his presiding officer.

(b) Such challenged Town Officer/Employee shall be obligated to respond in writing, within seven (7) business days, to the person making the inquiry, to advise whether or not a violation of this Ordinance has occurred or shall occur if the challenged individual acts on a particular matter.

(c) If the resident-voter making the inquiry is not satisfied with the challenged individual's response, he may require the presiding officer of the Town board (in the case of an Employee, his appointing board or the board he reports to) to call for a vote as to whether or not the challenged Town Officer/Employee has violated or shall violate this Ordinance if he acts on a particular matter.

11. Appeal Proceedings

Appeals under this Ordinance shall be governed by RSA 31:39-a.

12. Effective Date

This code of Ethics Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption by the resident-voters of the Town of Hampstead.

13. Compliance

Each and every person who is in violation of any section of this Ordinance on the date it becomes effective, shall within sixty (60) days from the effective date remedy his situation so as to comply with this Ordinance.

14. Ordinance Provided to Town Officer/Employee

Each and every Town Officer/Employee shall be furnished by the Town Clerk with a copy of this Ordinance. Each such person shall sign a written acknowledgement that he has received such a copy. The acknowledgement shall be filed by the Town Clerk with the Town Officer's/Employee's appointment/personnel papers.

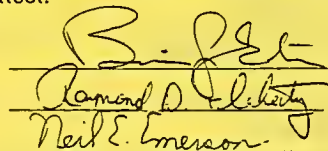

Mrs. Crowley, Asst. Librarian serves on the program committee. The Coop now provides video tapes on a rotating basis throughout the year and serves as a vehicle for inter-library loan.

Special thanks go to the members of the Building Committee for their many hours of time in developing the current proposal. The need for this building is great so as to continue adequate library service. Although we have tried to serve the community in many areas, there is much we are unable to do. A major concern is limited study space for the students to study in the afternoon. Much money has been spent to have a good reference room but it must be accessible to the students. The handicapped are unable to use our resources, and we cannot offer space for the Illiteracy programs. The library celebrates its 100th birthday in March 1988. Please support your library for the next 100 years!

The Board of Trustees and the Staff were sorry for the resignation of Warren Trested, Chrm., who has devoted so much time and energy to the library and its future. We are grateful to Mrs. Catherine Robbins, former Trustee, for serving until the March

election. and for the work done by Trustees Pamela Hartung and Lincoln Palmer.

Special thanks go to Elsie Miller, Margaret Noonan, and Elaine David for their continued efforts as volunteers. Also to my husband, Ralph, for all his volunteer time in helping with the maintenance of the building. We also welcomed Janet Thiboutot and Kathy Crowley to the staff.

Again, services for the forthcoming year will be dictated by space and staff-time limitations. Mrs. Hennessey, Mrs. Thiboutot, Mrs. Crowley and I will do our utmost to continue meeting your needs. We hope you will continue to stand behind and support the library in such a way that it will ever be worthy of those farsighted men who one hundred years ago brought it into being.

Public Library Building Committee Report — 1987

The Hampsted Public Library Building Committee has worked steadily throughout the year on the town's directive from the 1987 town meeting to "begin development of a new town Public Library, including preliminary site engineering and architectural work".

The site that we have selected for the proposed new library is the parcel on Emerson Ave, centrally located in the town core, which is being donated to the town by Mildred and Mable Emerson. Our formal site selection report was presented to the Selectmen in July. Our decision was based on advice of a natural resource specialist who we had hired. Additional advantages, such as an increased town asset, contiguous parcel and appropriate size for future flexibility, available with this site, also contributed to our selection.

We have worked closely with our architect firm, Ingram & Wallace of Manchester, to produce a building proposal which is a very simple, basic facility whose design blends nicely with the homes and other buildings in the area. It is a traditional design consisting of three similarly constructed modules which provide the approximately 9000 square feet of space that is recommended. We feel this proposal addresses the critical problem of adequate space for books, workshops and exhibits, access for the handicap, expanded areas for study and reading, and improved space for research and reference.

Site engineering work, prepared by Paul Carideo of Hampstead, is proceeding through both local planning board and state approvals, where required. Much detail and planning has been given to providing for excellent separation from the neighboring homes, while still conforming to the site configuration. This has been augmented by the use of green spaces and buffer screens.

We strongly believe that this new building proposal will be in the best long term interest of the town and will be a rewarding investment for the future of our library.

During the year, the board held hearings for 32 variance requests. A total of 26 variances were granted and 6 were denied. Hearings were held for 34 special exceptions requests. Thirty special exceptions were granted and four were denied.

Eight home occupation requests in the residential zone were approved. None were denied.

In addition to the regular hearings, five appeals were brought to the Superior Court level by various petitioners from within the town. At this time, two appeals are still pending, while all others have been decided in the Town's favor. The cost to defend these appeals was \$5,910, and is the reason that the board overspent its budget. The board anticipates that 1988 will show a marked decrease in the number of court appearances required by the board.

Conservation Commission Annual Report — 1987

This year saw the passage of the revised Wetlands Ordinance at the Town Meeting. This Ordinance will help to protect water supplies as well as wetlands as the Town struggles to cope with the rapid growth. Thanks to Jim Hayden, formerly of the SCS and to Sarah Campbell of the Rockingham County Planning Commission for their help in drafting this Ordinance. A special thanks to the Planning Board for their support and assistance.

The Commission processed 22 dredge and fill applications, about the same as in 1986. These involved on site inspections and reports to the N.H. Wetlands Board and the Hampstead Planning Board. Four violations were noted and were referred to the Wetlands Board for further action.

The Arbor Day tree distribution tradition was revived this year with 1000 Douglas Fir seedlings distributed to the Town residents. This event is scheduled to be repeated again in April, 1988.

Two Hampstead youths were sponsored by the Commission for a week at the Youth Conservation Camp on the basis of essays submitted.. There were only two applicants this year.

The Commission again co-sponsored the Fishing Derby at Shop Pond with the Civic and the Mother's Club.

An application for a Federal Outdoor Grant was submitted. This application was for federal matching funds for the acquisition of a twenty-five acre tract of land on Stage Road.. Adding protected land will be a priority in 1988.

The Commission regretfully accepted the resignation of Kathe Cussen, who has been a dynamic force on the Commission for the past seven years. Her expertise and professional approach will be greatly missed.

This year Kathe again led the Public Walks through the Conservation Area and also conducted Project-Learning Tree, a nature experience for elementary teachers.

Thanks also to former members Joel Saren and Cleo Hurley for their valuable contributions over the past year.

Our appreciation also to Peter LaPointe and the Greater Derry JayCees for the maintenance work performed on the trails and bridges in the Conservation Area.

The Conservation Commission extends an invitation to all residents to serve on its subcommittees. Numerous projects for the upcoming year require only time and enthusiasm.

Rockingham Planning Commission Report — 1987

The Rockingham Planning Commission provided the Town of Hampstead with a variety of assistance during 1987.

Most significant was the aid rendered the Planning Board in recodifying the Town's Zoning Ordinance. The ordinance was entered into the RPC computer so that future amendments and copies can be made easily.

Other assistance rendered during 1987 included:

1. Submission of a proposal for updating the Town's Master Plan and Capital Improvements Program.
2. Provided commissioner with copies of model regulations.
3. Provided model ordinances concerning mobile home parks and cluster development.
4. Attended a public hearing regarding traffic concerns along N.H. Route 121.

As a member of the Rockingham Planning Commission, Hampstead also benefited from a variety of planning services provided region-wide. During 1987 these included:

1. Continued to provide administrative, organizational and planning assistance to the Southeast Regional Solid Waste District. The District is a 21 town organization created to plan for and develop long term solid waste disposal solutions in Southeastern Rockingham County.
2. Initiated work on a multi-year effort to develop a regional land use plan for use in supporting local master planning efforts and local applications for open space land aquisition.
3. Organized and hosted the 4th annual National Resources Lecture Series in cooperation with the Rockingham County Conservation District and Cooperative Extension Service. Topics included land protection techniques, soils planning and water resource protection.
4. Assisted in the organization of and hosted the 12th annual Municipal Law Lecture Series for town officials involved with land-use decision-making.
5. Prepared and distributed our annual zoning and building code amendment calendar informing town officials of the required timing of events associated with proposed zoning and building code amendments.
6. Prepared and distributed advisory memo to town officials regarding the final Carol Soares &a. and Lewis Builders, Inc. V. Town of Atkinson decision and its implications on local land use regulation.
7. Participated in the organization of a Water Supply Task Force for the purposes of studying water resources and distribution systems in southern New Hampshire.
8. Organized 3rd annual Rockingham County Household Hazardous Waste Collection Project providing County residents with environmentally safe disposal of unwanted hazardous household products.
9. Continued to assist in the organization and direction of COAST -- the Cooperative Alliance for Seacoast Transportation -- an organization of public transit providers in Rockingham County, Strafford County and Southern Maine.

10. Continued to assist in Federal, State, and local coordination of Highway improvement planning and public transit planning; provided technical assistance to local highway safety committees and performed numerous traffic analyses; continued work with committees on special transportation needs.
11. Developed pavement management program to assist communities in taking structured inventories of roadway surface conditions; provided technical assistance on highway corridor and signal analyses.
12. Continued to maintain and update our collection of model ordinances, subdivision regulations and other local land use regulations.
13. Produced and distributed a report identifying zoning conflicts along town boundaries for towns in the region and towns bordering the region.
14. Participated as an active member of the Seacoast United Way's Task Force on Affordable Housing, which produced a report outlining methods for providing more affordable housing.
15. Organized and held 4th annual "Legislative Get-Together" to provide a forum for discussion of local regional and state-wide land use planning issues, and related legislative initiatives.
16. Testified in support of several legislative initiatives, including a bill to permit towns and cities to charge developers for off-site costs resulting from development -- so called "impact fees."
17. Prepared and distributed a report entitled "A Local Officials Guide to Impact Fees" which outlines how to implement an impact fee system and highlights examples from across the country.
18. Conducted a survey of recreation directors in each town to gather information on recreation facilities, issues, and future needs. Survey results were sent to the State for use in a state-wide recreation plan.
19. Prepared and distributed an analysis of two important land use court cases, Roncort v. Barnstead and First Evangelical Lutheran Church of Glendale v. County of Los Angeles, CA.
20. Prepared a video tape presentation which explains a variety of techniques for guiding growth to best suit a community's needs.
21. Worked closely with local land agent for the Trust for New Hampshire Lands to publicize the program and organize assistance for preparing applications for funding.
22. Prepared and distributed an issue of "Rockingham Notes", the newsletter of the Rockingham Planning Commission.
23. Prepared an updated version of "Regional Facts", a compilation of interesting and informative facts about our region.
24. Prepared and distributed our annual report outlining and explaining RSA amendments made during this year's legislative session.

Lamprey Health Care Report — 1987

Lamprey Health Care will mark seventeen years of providing services in 1988.

Two medical offices, one in Newmarket and one in Raymond, provide general medical care, preventive health services, community outreach, social services and short term counseling with referral to mental health agencies.

Services also offered by Lamprey Health Care include Senior Citizen Transportation and Information and Referral Services for Rockingham County.

Lamprey Health Care's medical team consists of six physicians: Sarah Oxnard, MD, Pediatrician; Cynthia Rasmussen, MD, Obstetrician-Gynecologist; and four Family Practitioners, Edward Benoit, MD; Karen Brainard, MD; Paul Friedrichs, MD; and our newest member, Micki Kantrowitz, MD. Also on staff at Lamprey Health Care are Michael Lewis, Certified Physician's Assistant; Barbara Janeway, Nurse Practitioner; Anne Fawcett, Nurse Practitioner; and John Mark Blowen, Nurse Practitioner. Registered and Licensed Practical Nurses round out the Medical Team.

The addition of physicians in recent years allows Lamprey Health Care to respond to the growing demand for services.

Under the direction of Dr. Rasmussen, Lamprey Health Care operates a prenatal program which includes prenatal, delivery and postpartum care along with nutritional counseling, prenatal and parenting classes and social services and/or referral.

Lamprey Health Care continues to operate the Senior Citizen Transportation Program. The transportation service enables senior citizens to remain independent, self-sufficient and active by providing the means to needed services, including medical, food shopping and recreational trips. Three of the five busses operated by Lamprey Health Care are equipped with hydraulic lifts to provide services to the handicapped. For further information, call 659-2424 or toll-free 1-800-582-7279.

Lamprey Health Care also operates The Rockingham County Info-Center which provides information and referral services to the residents of the county. Information is available to callers through a toll-free number on a wide range of subjects. The toll free number is 1-800-582-7214.

Tel-Med is a taped library of "non-diagnostic" health information designed to provide basic facts about certain diseases, conditions or health issues. The library contains 200 taped messages which are accessible 24 hours per day seven days a week by households with touch tone phones and Monday - Friday from 8am to 4pm by households with rotary dial. The numbers to reach Tel-Med are 433-3232 and 433-3242 and 659-7514 and 659-7516. The Tel-Med program is funded by The Foundation for Seacoast Health of Portsmouth. Ordinance Committee Report — 1987

The Ordinance Committee was established in April of 1987 and has held regular meetings throughout the year. The committee is comprised of a group of citizens, one selectman, one Board of Adjustment member, and one representative of the Planning Board. The committee was appointed by the selectmen for two purposes. The first purpose is to respond to a request for a citizens commission to redraft the Hampstead Zoning Ordinance. The second purpose of the committee is to investigate issues concerning property owners in zone B.

The primary effort of the Ordinance Committee this past year has been an extensive review of the Hampstead Zoning Ordinance. The approach that was taken was to address the ordinance effort in two phases. The objective of phase I was to reformat the present zoning ordinance into a document with a more formal structure, making the document easier for the citizens to understand, and simpler for town officials to administer. The first step contains all of the exact wording which is in the current ordinance. The phase I document was completed following a tremendous effort, and has been submitted to the Planning Board and the Board of Adjustment for review.

The phase II ordinance effort is now underway, but a large amount of work remains to be completed. The goal of phase II is to include proposed changes and additions which are generated during committee meetings. The resulting document will be presented to the Planning Board as recommended by the Ordinance Committee. The Ordinance Committee will work with the Planning Board to bring the completed ordinance to the voters.

The committee discussed and researched some of the common difficulties in applying to the Board of Adjustment for a variance or special exception. A guideline for application was found and adapted to suit Hampstead. These instructions were then forwarded to the Board of Adjustment, and are now available to all applicants. By following the instructions, a first time applicant will be better prepared with all the information the board may require. Other obstacles to home improvements and additions were discussed.

Alternative septic systems were researched. There are a number of options which can be considered when existing house lots do not conform the current standards for installation of a conventional leach field. Some of the options are, chambered leach bed, community septic or community water supply, composting and also aeration treatment systems.

Replacement of aging septic systems is an important issue. Dye tablets to test septic systems are available at the building inspectors office and have been advertised by the Sunset Lake Association and the Island Pond Association through efforts by the Ordinance Committee. We must protect the lakes, the wetlands and the ground water supply from pollution.

Water quality of the three lakes in town has been researched. I am pleased to report that the health of the lakes is generally good. Sunset Lake Association has been very successful in educating residents about ways to protect water quality. Island Pond improves water quality by dropping the water level each autumn which allows a fresh fill each spring and controls weed growth. The water quality is monitored by testing performed by several different groups.

In 1988, the Ordinance Committee will work in cooperation with the Planning Board and other town departments to complete the phase II ordinance effort.

THE RECREATION COMMISSION IS MADE UP OF AN ALL VOLUNTEER FIVE(5) MEMBER COMMITTEE; PHIL TORRE-CHAIRMAN, JOYCE OMERSO-SECRETARY, NELSON CURRIN, MARILYN MOSLEY, AND TERRY FAVLINI. THE SELECTMAN LIASON IS RAY FLAHERTY. THE RECREATION COMMISSION MEETS TWICE A MONTH ON THE 2nd AND 4th WEDNESDAY AT 7:00pm IN THE TOWN OFFICE BUILDING. THE PUBLIC IS INVITED AND ENCOURAGED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PLANNING AND RUNNING OF THE PROGRAM.

1987 WAS A FAST-PACED AND REWARDING YEAR FOR THE RECREATION COMMISSION. PARTICIPATION IN OUR SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMS NEARLY DOUBLED FROM THAT OF PREVIOUS YEARS. APPROXIMATELY 130 TO 160 CHILDREN ON A DAILY BASIS ATTENDED THE SUMMER WORKSHOPS OFFERED AT THE MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM. THIS TREMENDOUS RESPONSE NECESSITATED THE HIRING OF AN ADDITIONAL RECREATION ASSISTANT DURING THE PROGRAM TO HELP MONITOR THE CHILDREN. SUMMER BUS TRIPS WERE OFFERED AND INCLUDED SUCH ACTIVITIES AS; BOWLING AND SWIMMING AND HIKING AT WEIRS BEACH, N.H.,. THESE PLUS ADDITIONAL TRIPS ARE CURRENTLY BEING PLANNED FOR THE COMING SUMMER. THE LITTLE RED WAGON, A TRAVELING PUPPET SHOW, MADE TWO(2) APPEARANCES DURING THE SUMMER. THESE SHOWS PROVIDED MUCH ENJOYMENT FOR THE CHILDREN.

THE MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM WHICH IS UNDER THE RECREATION COMMISSION CONTROL EXPERIENCED MORE USE DURING 1987 THAN ANY OTHER TOWN BUILDING OR FACILITY. EVENTS HELD AT THE GYMNASIUM WERE MANY AND VARIED. THEY INCLUDED THE TOWN MEETING AND VOTING, BASKETBALL PROGRAMS RANGING FROM 8 AND 9 YEAR-OLD CHILDREN TO A PROGRAM FOR 40 YEAR-OLDS AND UP, EXERCISE PROGRAMS AND DANCE CLASSES, VARIOUS BOY SCOUT SPORTING ACTIVITIES, FLEAMARKETS, WEDDING RECEPTIONS, JUNIOR HIGH DANCES, CRAFT FAIRS, AND MANY MANY MORE. THE GYMNASIUM UNDERWENT SOME WELCOME CHANGES BOTH INSIDE AND OUT DURING 1987. INSIDE THE GREATER HAMPSTEAD CIVIC CLUB DONATED THEIR TIME AND LABOR TO PAINT THE WALLS UPSTAIRS WHICH BRIGHTENED AND IMPROVED THE OVERALL APPEARANCE OF THE GYMNASIUM AS WELL AS ADDING AN ARTISTIC TOUCH. THE MEN'S BASKETBALL LEAGUE PAINTED THE BACKBOARDS AND ADDED A THREE POINT LINE. DOWNSTAIRS THE CUSTODIAN PAINTED THE WALLS AND FLOOR. OUTSIDE THE PARKING AREA WAS EXPANDED ALONG WEST ROAD AND A SIGN IDENTIFYING THE BUILDING WAS INSTALLED. FURTHER RENOVATION IS PLANNED FOR 1988 BOTH INSIDE AND OUT. BOY AND GIRL WINNERS IN EACH OF THE VARIOUS AGE CATEGORIES RECEIVED A TEN(10) DOLLAR GIFT CERTIFICATE DONATED BY EAST COAST LUMBER. ALL OF THE YOUNG ANGLERS FOR THEIR PARTICIPATION RECEIVED A TWO(2) DOLLAR GIFT CERTIFICATE FROM EAST COAST LUMBER AS WELL AS A SMALL PRIZE. OUR THANKS GO TO EAST COAST LUMBER, THE MOTHER'S CLUB AND THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION FOR THEIR ASSISTANCE.

Derry Visiting Nurse Association Report — 1987

Derry VNA strongly believes that the overall health of any community springs from the health of each individual, family, and group within that community. As your community home health care agency, Derry VNA is committed to working with you to address the continuum of human health concerns in Hampstead from early childhood health promotion, to helping people recuperate at home after an acute episode of illness, to caring for the elderly and handicapped in their homes. Our services are designed to build upon individual, family and community strengths.

We are always looking for new ways to integrate our traditional community values with continuing changes in human need and services. No other home care agency has these ties with your community. We would be delighted to talk with you about your ideas or your needs. We currently provide the following services.

ACUTE CARE SERVICES including nursing, physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, home health aide services, and other specialized services such as intravenous therapy.

DAILY SUPPORT SERVICES including maintenance nursing, home health aide, homemaker, respite care, chore services, in home day care, and other specialized services.

HEALTH PROMOTION SERVICES including well child clinics, immunizations, expectant parent classes, new born visits, senior health clinics, public screening services, worker health, health promotion education, home visits, and other community services.

The total value of all services delivered by Derry VNA in Hampstead last year was \$62,977. For every dollar allocated by your town to DVNA, town residents received \$4.75 worth of service. This is one of the highest ratios of allocation to services in our service area. Town allocations are used in the following ways.

1. Most funding sources (including Medicare, Medicaid, Title XX, state funding, insurance, etc) are restricted to specific categories of illness, age, income, home bound status, time periods, or other restrictions. Increasingly, people who need home care services simply do not fit those specific eligibility categories throughout the entire period of need. Town funds are used to match with private fees to extend services beyond the restrictions of those payment sources.

2. Some funding sources (especially Medicare, Medicaid, Title XX and state grants) pay only a portion of the total cost of the service. Town funding, along with United Way and other grants are used to subsidize these payment sources.

3. There are services for which the only payment source is Town allocations or a combination of Town funding with special grant funds such as Senior Screening Clinics. Sometimes Town funding is used as seed money to get a new service started.

The Role of the Board

by Henri Eastman, Chairperson

"It shall be the duty of the school board to provide, at district expense, elementary and secondary education to all pupils...", "In accordance with policies adopted by the board." So goes the directive under state law.

The Hampstead School District has a policy manual that is two inches thick and a budget for 1988-89 that is up over thirty percent and just barely under five million dollars. Given that this will educate 1,000 plus students, includes a building program at Hampstead Central and Pinkerton Academy, and addresses the growth factors, hopefully makes the figures less frightening.

Inherent in the board-setting policy is to question to what budgetary length do we ask the community to go to in the name of education. The priority concern must (continue to) be with the product we are producing. We can feel pride in what our schools have done as a whole, as exemplified through student performance. The task at hand is always to maintain quality by making prudent choices.

The time available to prepare our children to be literate is precious and the money is limited only by our own constraints. Inasmuch as we have the student in his formative years here in Hampstead, our focus must stay on learning skills and basic subject matter. We can best safeguard the students' educational future if our energy, time, and discretionary tax dollars are devoted to this goal.

The Challenge of Growth

Terrance F. Holmes, Supt. of Schools

A recent publication cited Hampstead as the fourth fastest-growing town in the State of New Hampshire since 1980. The 47.3% growth in population in the town over that period has presented both challenge and opportunity for those of us involved in educating the town's young people. In 1980, we had 204 students at the Central School. We are projecting to have 409 in September, 1988.

The challenge of this 100% student growth is much more than space. Program expansion with art, music, physical education, special education, gifted education, computer education, health education, substance abuse education, and the like, will significantly impact our ability to deliver it all without sacrificing the time we need to spend on the "3-R's."

Our test scores on the basics continue to be among the very best in the state. This speaks well of the strength of the staff to deliver all that the community demands of us. The most satisfying aspect of all this is that the community continues to provide the resources which are necessary to deliver the kind of quality education that we all want for our children.

We see similar demands for program expansion and facilities upgrade coming from Pinkerton Academy. These, too, will have significant impact on next year's and future budgets.

My first eight months in the Superintendency have provided great challenge, not the least of which is the construction of the Central School addition. The citizens' support to build this addition is greatly appreciated, but I regret that the project has not gone more smoothly. The good news is that we are still on target for a September, 1988 opening.

The best part of these challenges is that the people of Hampstead have given us the clear message that they want good education for their children. They are not only willing to give their dollars to that effort, but are also willing to give their time, energy, and commitment in other forms.

It is an honor to be a part of such a growing and challenging system. Just think, next year's first-graders will graduate in the year 2000.

Report of the Principal

The national media suggests that our society is changing. Young people are no longer being identified as the "Me" generation. The "Yuppies" are on their way out.

I see a similar trend in our schools. The Middle School students seem to be somewhat different. This has been a very good year from the point of view of student behavior and attendance. The Middle School staff has implemented a computer-assisted discipline program that has enabled us to better track behavior trends.

Comparing this year to past years at the Central School is difficult. Due to the lack of core facilities and crowded conditions, the business of educating children is not "business as usual." The teachers are working under difficult circumstances, but they are doing it with a smile.

In summary form, I submit the following:

Things that are new:

1. Substance abuse programs at the Central School :
 Readiness through Grade 2 - Project Charlie
 Readiness through Grade 4 - Aardy's Army
 Grades 3 & 4 - Here's Looking At You - 2,000
2. At the Middle School a revitalized substance abuse program at Grades 5 and 6
3. Changes in the grading system at the Middle School that enable us to be consistent with Pinkerton Academy
4. Establishment of a Principal's List at the Middle School to recognize Middle School students who have demonstrated good behavior and effort each marking period
5. We are well into the construction phase of the 30,000 square foot addition to the Central School.
6. The construction of a staff parking lot at the Central School
7. The construction and use of two Readiness classrooms
8. The use of a portable classroom at the Central School

Things for the future:

1. The opening of the Central School addition in September of 1988
2. The School Board has committees reviewing:
 1. Evaluation of school board, staff, and administration
 2. The transportation system
 3. Long-range maintenance programs
 4. The special education program
 5. Various school programs on a monthly basis
3. A three-year computer education program that will provide every teacher, administrator, and student in the district with a program that will be very comprehensive.

School Warrant — State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the School District of the Town of Hampstead, New Hampshire qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hampstead Middle School in Hampstead, New Hampshire on the seventh day of March, 1988 at 7:30 in the evening to act upon the following articles.

1. To see if the District will vote to raise, appropriate, and authorize the School Board to expend up to Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) for the purpose of constructing and equipping a fire pond on the site of the Hampstead Fire House.

2. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of salaries of school district officials and the support of schools and agents and for payment of the statutory obligations of the District.

3. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by the School District Meeting, money from the state, federal, or other governmental unit, or a private source, or donations in other forms (land, equipment, etc.), which becomes available during the 1988-89 school fiscal year, provided that such expenditure be made for purposes for which a school district may appropriate money and that such expenditure not require the expenditure of other school district funds.

4. To see if the District will accept reports of agents, auditors, and committees.

5. To see if the District wishes to take any other action which may legally come before the meeting.

Auditor's Report on Financial Presentation

We have examined the general purpose financial statements of the Hampstead School District as of and for the year ended June 30, 1987, as listed in the table of contents. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

As described in Note 1B, the general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the General Fixed Asset Group of Accounts, which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles. The amount that should be recorded in the General Fixed Assets Account Group is not known.

In our opinion, except that omission of the General Fixed Asset Group of Accounts results in an incomplete presentation, as explained in the above paragraph, the general purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly the financial position of the Hampstead School District at June 30, 1987, and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Our examination was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole. The combining and individual fund financial statements listed in the table of contents are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the general purpose financial statements of the Hampstead School District. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the examination of the general purpose financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole.

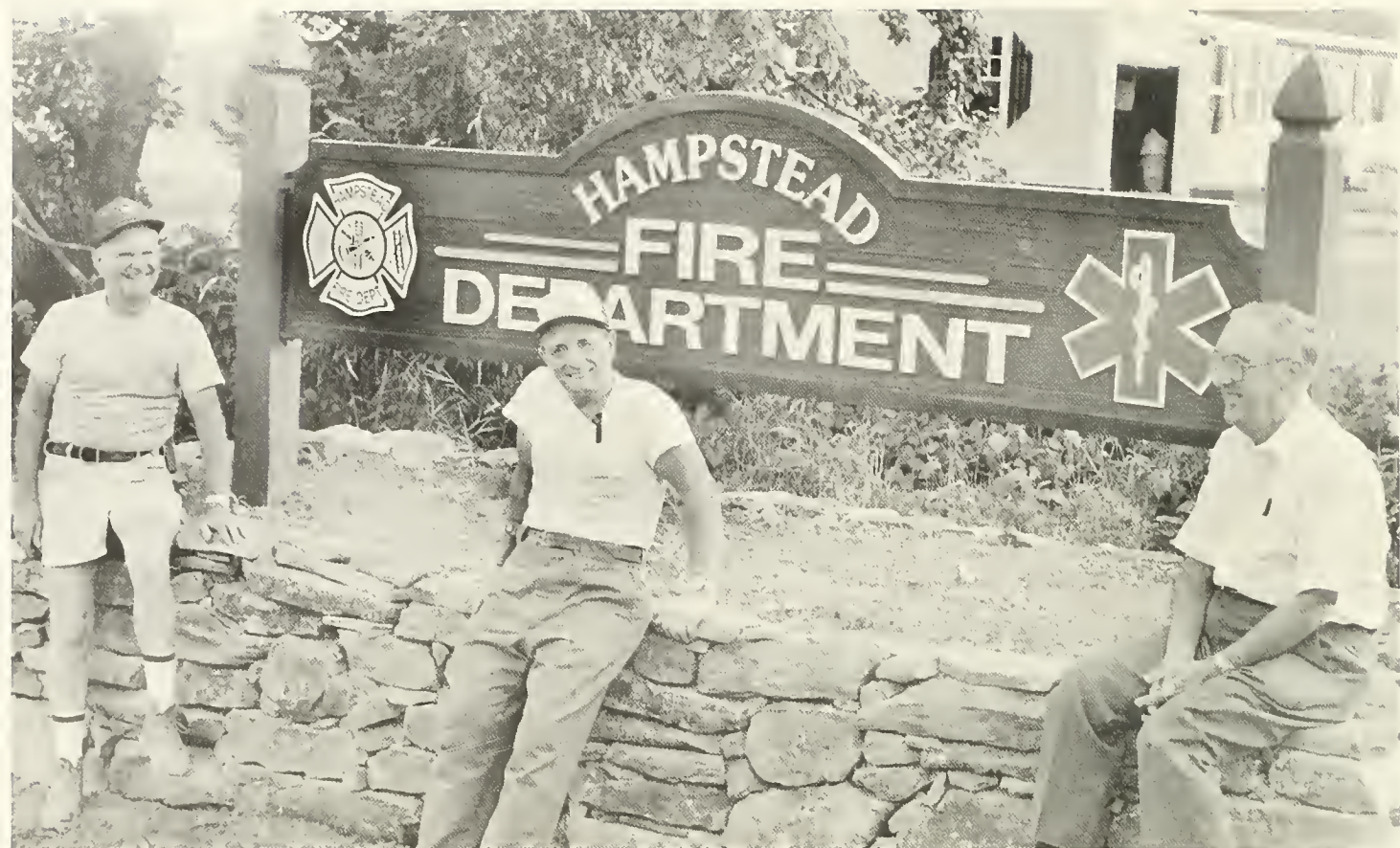

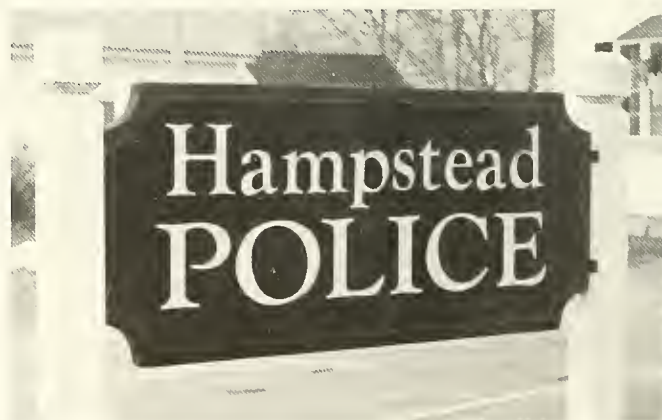
