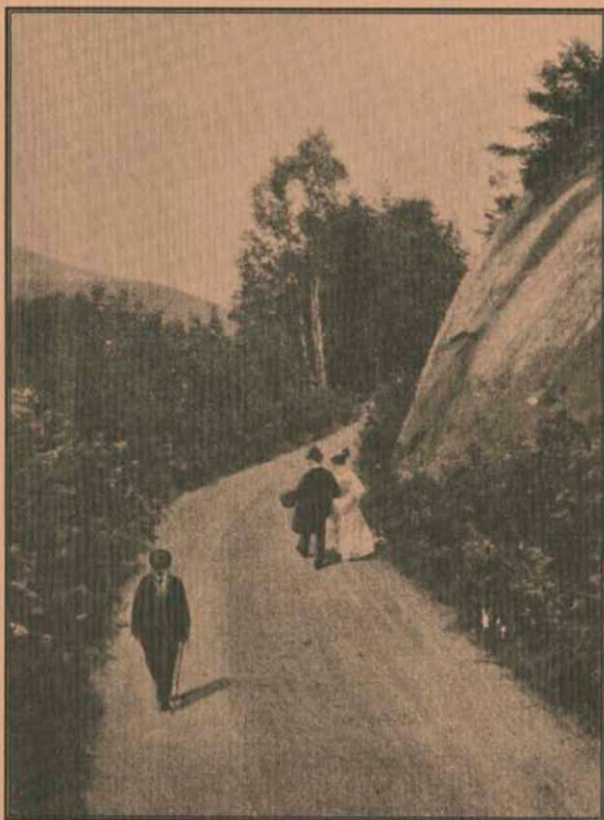

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

The polls will be open from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hart's Location in the County of Carroll, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Varney residence in said Hart's Location on Tuesday, March 10, 1998 at 5:15 P.M. to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

The selectmen submit and recommend Articles 2 through 6 be done by ballot vote.

Article 2. To see if the Town will approve to exchange the section of Burke Road which crosses through the LeBosquet property (Lot #36) for a 75' by 75' portion of the same LeBosquet lot to be used for the purpose of establishing a "T"-type turnaround. This will mean that the section of the road through the LeBosquet property will be discontinued as a public highway. The new "T-type" turnaround, when completed, will become accepted as a town road."

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) to be added to the Burke Road Capital Reserve Fund previously established.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) to be added to the Town Hall Capital Reserve Fund previously established.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to be added to the Revaluation Capital Reserve Fund previously established.

Article 6. To approve the Town Budget for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

MINUTES OF HART'S LOCATION TOWN MEETING

March 11, 1997

Moderator Margaret R. McAllister called the meeting to order at 5:15 P.M. with 17 voters and 3 visitors in attendance. The moderator requested a motion be made to waive the reading of the complete warrant at the beginning of the meeting. Motion: Moe Varney, second: Leslie Schoof. All in favor. The following articles were read and voted on in order.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Ballots were counted at close of meeting with the following results:

Selectman (3 yrs) Paul Schurman	Treasurer (3 yrs) F. Maurice Varney
Town Clerk/Tax Coll. (3 yrs) Marion L. Varney	Auditor (1 yr) Donna Tiedeman
Trustee of Funds (1 yr) Carolyn S. King	Road Agent (1 yr) Robert H. Dowler

The selectmen submit and recommend Articles 2 through 8.

The moderator asked for a motion to read Article 4 after Article 8. Motion: Ed Butler, second: Tom McAllister.

Article 2. That the Bemis Road be discontinued per RSA 231.43. Bemis Road is located between Bemis Brook and Camp Onion Road.

Motion: Nancy Ritger, second: Ed Butler, No discussion. All in favor.

Article 3. That the Amsden Trail Road be discontinued per RSA 231.43.

Motion: Paul Schurman, second Tom McAllister. Short discussion on what the town's right of use would be if this were discontinued. The Amsden Trail sign would have to be taken down. The abutters, Verland Ohlson and the U.S. Forest Service would have control and responsibility for the road. Ed Butler read letter from Mr. Ohlson who is agreeable with proposal. Ed Butler made a motion to call the question, second: Mark Dindorf. 13 in favor, 2 opposed.

Article 4. That the discontinuance of Burke Road be discussed at the March, 1997 town meeting in preparation for a vote at town meeting in March 1998.

Motion: Jack Caunter, second: Marilyn Dowler. Article was proposed because of questions on how town has been handling plowing and maintenance of Burke Road. At future meeting the town would have to vote not to maintain road for 5 years and then discontinue it. Ed Butler read three letters from concerned residents. all were opposed to turning the road over to the abutters. George Holmes, a Burke Road resident also spoke in opposition to the article. He also stated that the town should be plowing the road. Don Connors questioned whether state appropriated funds have been misappropriated. Ed Butler commented that it seemed incongruous to discuss money for Burke Road but not for Bemis Bridge. Tom Lebosque commented on the safety of the road and the town's liability. Perhaps speed limit signs would cover liability. Several years ago cost to repave was \$12,000. A petition with concerns was submitted by George Holmes and the Connors.

Article 5. That the town supports the effort being made to replace the Bemis Bridge. Support in theory but not monetarily.

Motion to accept: Paul Schurman, second: Ed Butler. Mark Dindorf immediately made a motion to have the second sentence of the article deleted. Robert Dowler asked if that made the town liable for funds: answer "No". Beth Schurman moved to vote on the amendment: second Nancy Ritger. The town would only act as a conduit to receive grants if they vote to support. Jack Caunter moved to ask the question: second: Marilyn Dowler. Article passed.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) to be added to the Burke Road Capital Reserve Fund previously established.

Motion: Nancy Ritger, second: Les Schoof. No discussion. Article passed.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) to be added to the Town Hall Capital Reserve Fund previously established.

Motion: Kath Harris, second: Moe Varney. No discussion. Article passed.

Article 8. To approve the Town Budget for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Motion: Paul Schurman, second: Bob Dowler. Tom McAllister asked for an explanation of the d. e. f. sums. If Bartlett Police come in response to a 911 call because the sheriff's department or State Police are not near enough to give proper response, the town can expect to be billed by Bartlett. Article passed.

On the advice of counsel, Selectmen recommend a Ballot Vote to readopt all amendments to the Land Use Ordinance (LUO). There was no comment at the Public Hearing held on January 20. Those amendments are as follows:

Article 9. To readopt Article X of the LUO. At Town Meeting on March 8, 1977, it was voted to adopt the BOCA Building Code (to be used for inspection) as the official reference guide of the building inspectors, who are the Selectmen. Yes 16 No 2

Article 10. To readopt Article XI of the LUO. At the State Election Meeting on November 4, 1980, the town voted to adopt the provisions of RSA 466:30a which makes it unlawful for an owner of any dog, licensed or unlicensed, to allow said dog to run at large except when accompanied by the owner or custodian and when used for hunting, herding, supervised by competition and exhibition or training for such. This law took effect January 3, 1981. Yes 16 No 2

Article 11. To readopt Article XII of the LUO. Passed at Town Meeting on March 13, 1989. That the abandoned section of highway Route 302, presently designated Class VI, from the Nancy Pond Trail and new Route 302 to the north, up to and including the designated road beyond the State sand pit and the intersection of the Maine Central Rail Line and be prohibited for use by all motorized vehicular traffic, both on and off road use. Emergency and maintenance vehicles excepted. Glenn passed away on 9-7-88 and Gloria on 3-13-89. Delete Article 11

Article 12. To readopt Article XIII of the LUO. At the special Town Meeting held on September 19, 1989, it was voted that all land owners with driveways entering onto the Burke Road pay a pro-rated share of 50% of the cost of snowplowing and sanding the road, the remaining 50% to be borne by the town. Yes 16 No 2

Article 13. To readopt Article XIV of the LUO. At the Town Meeting March 13, 1990 it was voted that building permits issued by the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Hart's Location shall be considered active for a period of two years from the date of issue. After this period any incomplete projects would require renewal of the permit. An additional two year permit would be issued by the Selectmen provided no substantial changes in the original plans occur. Projects incomplete after four years from the original date of issue would be subject to a review by the Selectmen where any Municipal and/or State Ordinances affecting building construction enacted after the original permit date could be imposed at that time. Yes 15 No 1

Article 14. To readopt Article XIV of the LUO. At the Town Meeting March 14, 1995 it was voted to add the following: No parcels of property in Hart's Location shall have more than two building permits at any given time. The selectmen may grant additional permits if, upon inspection, the existing permit is substantially complete or is otherwise canceled or voided and recorded as such. Yes 18 No 0

Article 15. To readopt Article XV of the LUO. At the Town Meeting March 13, 1990, the following was voted: The Town of Hart's Location has adopted the "Wetlands" and the "Flood Plain" Conservation District Ordinances as proposed by the Soil Conservation Service of the United States Department of Agriculture Survey of Carroll County, December 1977. Yes 16 No 0

Article 16. To readopt Article IV of the LUO. At the Town Meeting on March 14, 1995 the following sentence was replaced: Any piece of land subdivided into two or more lots for dwellings shall be utilized in accordance with all other provisions of this ordinance. It was replaced with the following sentence: Any piece of land subdivided into two or more lots for dwellings shall be utilized in accordance with the subdivision regulations adopted by the planning board of Hart's Location. Yes 13 No 3

The selectmen further submit and recommend these new amendments to the LUO.

Article 17. Amend Article IV of the LUO. Currently this Article states that "No land in Hart's Location of lesser area than 65,340 sq. ft (one & one half acres) may be used as habitation or business establishment of any kind ...". The Selectmen recommend that the area size be increased to 108,900 sq. ft. (two & one-half acres). Yes 13 No 3

Article 18. Amend Article XIV of the LUO. Currently this Article states that "No parcels of property in Hart's Location shall have more than two building permits at any given time." The Selectmen, on advice of counsel, recommend that this amendment be deleted, as it is not possible to restrict the number of building permits unless the current town services are unable to support such applications. Yes 18 No 2

The selectmen further submit and recommend the following new article to the LUO.

Article 19. Add Article XVI to the LUO. The Board of Selectmen, or designated inspector, must sign an Occupancy/Ready for Use Permit on completion of construction before said building may be put into use. Yes 15 No 3

Article 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Motion to adjourn at 6:56: Marilyn Dowler, second: Mark Dindorf. Meeting adjourned. Officers sworn.
