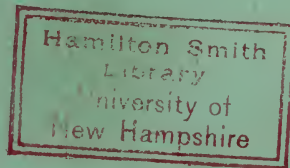

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lee, in the County of
Strafford, in said State, qualified to vote in Town
Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Lee, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways, State aid and Trunk Line roads.

4. To raise one thousand and fifty (\$1,050) dollars for payment on Trunk Line notes.

5. To raise two hundred (\$200) dollars for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

6. To raise two thousand (\$2,000) dollars necessary to secure State Aid on Stage Road, so called.

7. To see if the Town will vote to reconstruct Allen's bridge and make appropriations for same.

8. To bring in your ballots for delegates to the Presidential conventions.

Given under our hands and seal, this twentieth day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty-two.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Lee:

This is a year of celebrations. Our schools have co-operated with the United States George Washington Bicentennial Commission by planting evergreen trees and by special exercises, and have also participated in the activities of the New Hampshire Daniel Webster Commission by distributing commemorative medals.

The South Lee schoolhouse has been shingled and the three buildings kept in good repair. All have been provided with hanging globes during the last three years. The only change in our staff is the coming of Miss Margaret McDonald, R. N., as school nurse, replacing Miss Patten, who went to another position. Our school nurse now works wholly within the Union, which is an obvious advantage.

In times like the present, our schools have an increased responsibility:

1. To practice unusual economy in the purchase, distribution, and use of supplies and services. Every pupil, teacher, and official can help in this direction, and the public as well.
2. To preserve the health and happiness of the children from physical impairment and mental depression.

3. To keep the boys and girls in school as long as possible.
4. To emphasize the ideals of creative work and craftsmanship through the fine and practical arts. We may have an over-production of machine-made goods, but there will always be a demand for the creative work of real artists and handicraftsmen.
5. To prepare for the return of prosperity by keeping the efficiency of the schools unimpaired.

If our country is ever to arrive at a stable condition of constant and moderate growth in prosperity, it must be not by accident or prejudice but by intelligent, far-sighted, co-ordinated planning in industry and social affairs on a world-wide scale. The solution of our social problems is the major work for which we are educating the rising generation.
