WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.

March 8, 1966

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of Strafford, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, A. D., 1966, at 8:00 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers:

A town clerk of the ensuing year.

A selectman for the ensuing three years.

A treasurer for the ensuing year.

A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Two auditors for the ensuing year.

A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$327.95 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,186.30 to be contributed by the State.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$2,500.00 for the purpose of making improvements to Nute Road, a Class V road within the Town; such sums to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of chapter 83, laws of 1951 as amended by chapter 31, laws of 1955, and to authorize

the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payments of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Madbury.

- ARTICLE 6. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Seacoast Regional Development Association and the Seacoast Regional Plan.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 to be used in cooperation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, within the confines of the Town.
- ARTICLE 8. To see what action the Town will take to have the State Tax Commission make a reassessment of property in the Town.
- ARTICLE 9. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.
- ARTICLE 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

RECORD OF TOWN MEETING

March 9, 1965

ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

- For Town Clerk for the ensuing year voted the Moderator should cast one vote for Lucile D. Hutchins. This being done, Lucile D. Hutchins was declared elected for the ensuing year.
- For Selectman for the ensuing three years, voted that the Clerk should cast one vote for Joseph Cole, and this being done, Joseph Cole was declared elected for the ensuing three years.
- For Treasurer for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for John W. Printy, and this being done, John W. Printy was declared elected for the ensuing year.
- For Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk cast one ballot for Dorothy S. Dugan and this being done, Dorothy S. Dugan was declared elected for the ensuing year.
- For Auditors for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk cast one ballot for Enid V. James and Barbara Houston and this being done, the two named were declared elected for the ensuing year.
- For Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years by balloting. 60 votes cast—Frank Fenerty was declared elected for the ensuing three years.
- ARTICLE 2. Voted that the Selectmen choose and appoint all other necessary town officers.
- ARTICLE 3. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate of \$20,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year

- and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the town, negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year.
- ARTICLE 4. Approved the article to raise and appropriate the sum of \$315.18 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,101.20 to be contributed by the State.
- ARTICLE 5. Voted in the affirmative for the town to retain the money collected from the government for the Hook Mill Road, as partial payment for a new bridge at Mill Hill.
- ARTICLE 6. Voted in the affirmative that the town will appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 to go with the Hook Mill Road money for a new bridge at Mill Hill Road, such sum to be raised through issuance of bonds or notes.
- ARTICLE 7. This article to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$120.00 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association was passed without action.
- ARTICLE 8. Voted in the affirmative that the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 to be used in cooperation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, within the confines of the town.
- ARTICLE 9. Voted in the affirmative to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to provide registration fee at the University of New Hampshire for one person designated by the Board of Selectmen to enroll in the special course on Regional Development and Economic Growth.

- ARTICLE 10. Voted in the affirmative to authorize the Selectmen to convey to the Public Service Company of New Hampshire an electric transmission line easement 100 feet wide and 188 feet long across the northwesterly end of town land of the Boston & Maine Railroad to the middle of Pudding Hill Road. (\$700.00)
- ARTICLE 11. Voted in the affirmative to authorize the Selectmen to take any means necessary to have the foundation aid money credited to the Town of Madbury.
- ARTICLE 12. The proposed budget for the current year was amended to include an appropriation of \$300.00 for kitchen improvements at the Town Hall, \$50.00 for one Scholarship, \$500.00 for legal expenses for Article 11.

Approved a total budget of \$20,620.18.

Then appeared the above named officers elected under Article 1, and took the oath of office as required by law, before me, Lucile D. Hutchins, Town Clerk.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

To the Citizens of Madbury:

The unusually dry year resulted in several forest fires which were difficult to extinguish.

In the spring, three separate fires were set in the Johnson Creek and Jenkins Road areas at about 10 P. M. Dover and Durham Fire Departments assisted in controlling these fires.

In August, a fire on a peninsula, extending into the resevoir, from the west side, required several trips by boat to extinguish. All access roads were cut off by the water of the reservoir. Two trips were made with the help of the Dover Fire Department rescue boat.

In September a forest fire on Old Stage Road required many hours of work and many gallons of water to extinguish. Dover assisted with several tanks of water.

We gave assistance to Lee for a forest fire, and in December, we assisted Durham for a building fire at the Sieberlick Apartments.

Repairs to the International Truck; a new booster for the brakes, ring and pinion gears in rear end, and new tires, deferred the purchase of new equipment until 1966.

The Radio Alerting System is installed and working satisfactorily. More hose, and self contained breathing masks for the protection of our men at building fires.

In 1966 more men will be needed to enable us to continue, and improve our coverage, especially on week-ends and holidays.

Help reduce the Fire Hazard by: Getting a permit, and burning late in the day. Making your incinerator meet the safety standards of the Madbury Incerator Ordinance. Obtain an Incinerator permit.
