The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote on Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, and polls to close at six P. M., to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town highways.

5. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the Construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$499.30.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Cemeteries.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$940.00 for Street Lighting.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Northwood Public Library.

10. To see if the Town will vote a discount on such part of taxes as paid on or before July 15, 1947.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on temporary loans.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$80.91 (1/100th of one per cent of the Town's valuation based on the 1946 assessment) to the Merrimac Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with the other thirty-seven communities in the Merrimac Valley Region.

13. To see if the Town will elect or appoint a committee of five citizens, one of whom but not more than one of whom shall be a Town officer, to study the problem of the Town roads of Northwood, and if found feasible formulate a long-range program for the construction of durable roads, or otherwise act thereon. (By petition)

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,600.00 for the purpose of building a fire house at East Northwood.

15. To see if the Town will vote to trade the Town truck for a new truck, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 to repair the Town Roller Shed.

17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the Town in order to secure greater equality as between tax payers, and to insure the assessment of all property

in the Town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for same.

18. To see if the Town will vote to create a Recreational Commission as provided by Chapter 51, R. L., as amended by the Laws of 1945. If the Town votes to establish a Recreational Commission, to see if the Town will authorize the moderator to appoint the members of said Commission; the duties of said Commission to be the administration and supervision of all recreational facilities and functions within the Town. (By petition)

19. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Recreation Purposes.

20. To transact any other business to come before said meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Northwood:

Consideration should be given to organizing a third classroom at the Ridge School, similar to the arrangement some years ago.

Last January, a deep well was drilled by the Harvey Company at the Ridge School, to a depth of 122 feet, furnishing thirty gallons of water per minute.

Mr. Roger D. Hutchins died November 20, 1946. He had been a member of the school board for several terms, and also served as secretary of Supervisory Union No. 44. The late Mr. John A. Tasker also had served on the school board and in other district offices. Former state commissioner James N. Pringle also died during the year.

The new state commissioner of education is Doctor Edgar Fuller. Commissioner Fuller has had training in the law as well as education. He has had experience as superintendent of schools, professor of educational administration, and director of aeronautics

education in all states for the federal government. With his encouragement, lay-professional groups have been organized in different parts of the state to study various phases of educational policy. Mrs. Evelyn V. Price, chairman of the school board, was a member of the Rockingham County group. A new New Hampshire School Boards Association has also been organized, which has held a well-attended meeting at the State House. Commissioner Fuller addressed a public meeting in Northwood on November 12th, under the auspices of the Women's Club.

The State Board of Education's plan for increased state aid for school purposes is embodied in House Bill No. 12. The legislative interim commission will also have recommendations, the contents of which are not wholly disclosed. Under the former plan, the state aid to Northwood for the current year, for example, would have been \$10,651.00 instead of \$2,890.56, as actually received. The revenue would come from sources available to the state, rather than from local real estate taxes. New Hampshire is now the only state in the Union that does not give state aid for high school costs and is low on the list in the proportion of all school costs paid by the state. The plan calls for an appropriation of \$2,080,000, to be expended 55 per cent for equalization, at the rate of \$75 per elementary pupil and \$100 per high school pupil, beginning at \$6 on \$1,000 of equalized valuation spent for schools, and extending to a maximum of \$10,000 (instead of \$6,000 as at present). The rest of the state aid, 45 per cent of the appropriation, would be in the form of general aid, granted to all communities, on the basis of pupil membership, at a rate of not over \$37.50 per elementary pupil and \$50 per high school pupil. The cost of administering this state aid would be no more than at present, since the details of the budget would be left more to the discretion of the local school authorities.

The proposed law also provides that should the appropriation be insufficient for the aid contemplated, the pro-rata deduction would operate first on the general aid rather than on the equalization, so that the places having the most need would be the last to be deprived of the full benefits.

Part of this increased aid will need to be used for drastic increases in teachers' salaries, in accordance with action throughout the country in an effort to attract and hold teachers in the profession.

The school lunch has been continued, with a district appropriation and federal aid, both for equipment and food supplies, based on the number of standard lunches served.

Last year the most prevalent communicable disease reported by the nurse was measles. The dental clinic was held for five days under the direction of Doctor Charles Manning of Newmarket, assisted by the school nurse, Miss Myrtle V. Fletcher. Fifty children, a good proportion of the whole enrollment, were given dental treatment. This clinic was sponsored by the Harvey Lake Women's Club, as for many years. The Northwood Red Cross has also made treatment available for various special cases from time to time. This fall as a health precaution, the opening of school in September was postponed for over a week. However, at a later date some cases of poliomyelitis developed. On the advice of the health authorities, the Ridge School was closed for one week following the Thanksgiving recess.

The prevention of forest fires is the most important and difficult part of the work of your forest fire warden who heads a local organization set up primarily for the security of your community's forest property. Appointed by the State Forester, upon recommendation of the Selectmen, he is charged by law with the responsibility of local administration of forest fire laws, fire prevention and suppression. In his work he is aided by deputy forest fire wardens who, in emergency, may assume his power and authority. The warden is guided in his work by instructions received from the State Forester and by the District Fire Chief who represents the State Forester.

The importance and value of the work of the forest fire warden and his deputies is, perhaps, best appreciated during hazardous periods when fire danger is greatest. The public, however, looks to him at all times for speedy and economical suppression of going fires.

To properly fulfill his mission, the warden needs the generous and understanding cooperation of the public at large. He attempts to secure this cooperation by the posting of caution notices, news items and by word of mouth, always carefully explaining the necessity of restrictions imposed. In the matter of giving cooperation, however, the public often fails. The record shows that an average of 7,300 acres of woodland are burned over by forest fires in New Hamp-

shire each year. Analysis of fire causes reveal the fact that more than 98 percent of all forest fires are, consistently, the result of human carelessness and are preventable.

The careless smoker fails to properly extinguish his cigar, cigarette or pipe ashes or thoughtlessly throws them from the car window; the debris burner fails or refuses to consult the warden, as the law requires when the ground is not covered with snow, before attempting to burn; campers fail to properly extinguish their fires or frequently build fires when conditions are unfavorable.

The elimination of human causes from the forest fire problem is the answer. This is not as difficult of accomplishment as it might appear at first glance. Let each one who reads this

1. Use ordinary common sense with fire in and near woodland.

2. Comply with requirements on the use of fire in and near woodland and when the ground is not covered with snow, secure written permission to burn from the forest fire warden.

3. Be careful when smoking in or near woodlands. Don't throw lighted material from moving vehicles.

4. Cooperate with and assist the warden and urge others to do so.

5. **HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PREVENT FIRES**—his efforts are only as effective as is the cooperation you give him!
