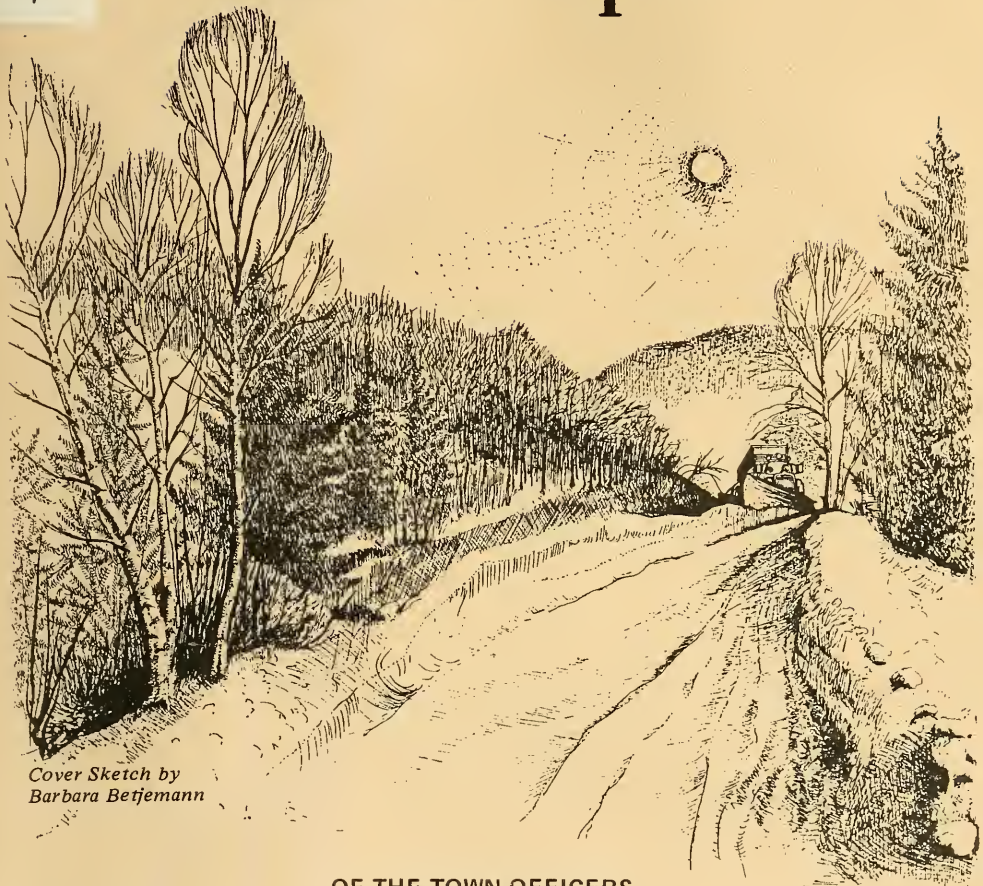

Article:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of the following Town Officers:

  - (f) Collector of Diamond Pond Rents

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday the 10th day of March next, at seven (7) o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

Article:

1. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to appoint all necessary Town Officers not elected by ballot.
2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget made up by the Budget Committee and to raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows:

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise fifteen thousand (\$15,000.00) dollars to be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund for the revaluation of the Town by the Appraisal Division of the Department of Revenue Administration. (By Petition)
5. To see if the Town will vote to approve and enact an ordinance prohibiting any one person from holding two or more elected positions or from serving as an elected official and an employee of the Town at the same time. (By Petition)
6. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board consisting of seven members, one of whom shall be a Selectman, as an ex officio member. The terms of a planning board member shall be three years and the initial terms of members first elected/appointed shall be staggered so that not more than three (3) elections/appointments occur annually. (By Petition)
7. To see if the Town will vote to elect or appoint the members of the Planning Board. (By Petition)
8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Planning Board to approve or disapprove in its discretion, plats, and to approve or disapprove plans showing the extent to which and the manner in which streets within subdivisions shall be graded and improved and to which streets, water, sewer and other utility mains, piping, connections, or other facilities within subdivisions shall be installed, and to authorize the Town Clerk to file with the Coos County Register of Deeds a Certificate of Notice showing that the Planning Board has been so authorized and giving the date of such authorization. (By Petition)

9. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of R.S.A. 72:1-C which authorizes any town or city to elect not to assess, levy and collect a resident tax.
10. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the town's representatives to the General Court to take all necessary measures to insure that no low level radioactive waste from the Seabrook Nuclear Plant shall be stored or disposed within this Town of Stewartstown unless and until the proposed storage or disposal has been approved by the voters of the Town at the annual Town Meeting by written ballot. (By Petition)
11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize for, accept and expend such Federal, State or other governmental unit or private source of funding which becomes available during the year in accordance with R.S.A. 31:95B.
12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of of the municipal year and pay out of the tax monies when received.
13. To see if the Town will vote to retain the building on the so-called Marchand lot or remove it at some future date.
14. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before this meeting.

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# NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL

## ANNUAL REPORT

Calendar year 1986 was a busy and productive year for the North Country Council as it continued to provide a wide range of assistance to towns and cities in the North Country.

The Council is a regional non-profit, public agency chartered under NH RSA 36:45 and is responsible for providing its member communities assistance in local community planning, economic development, solid waste, transportation, and various other community services. Besides the direct assistance the Council provides each member community, it is an advocate for all North Country towns in legislative and funding issues at the state and federal governments.

Growth and development is no longer unique to southern New Hampshire; North Country towns are experiencing similar growth pressures. The Council recognizes the impacts associated with this development to schools, roads, waste disposal, water, etc. The Council is dedicated to assisting town officials with these complicated issues. Because most of the Council member towns do not have a staff of their own to do the research, answer the questions and respond to incoming requests, the Council has revised the way we help member towns. Now, each town has a staff person assigned to assist the local officials of that town with their daily needs. In this way, the Council serves its membership more efficiently.

In Stewartstown, NCC helped develop a Housing Feasibility Study application, and began administering the Study. A Housing Survey was completed to document housing need for a future housing rehabilitation grant. We also provided computerized tax billing services to the community.

Economic Development is an important part of the Council's overall agency mission. This year the Council developed two marketing products: a regional brochure promoting the region and community profiles which the ten growth communities in the region are using to market their industrial development potential. The Council also produced a series of magazine advertisements, along with a display at the Eastern States Exposition, promoting the North Country as the sensible place to do business. The Council is now developing a workshop series on industrial development marketing for local officials in the region who are actively seeking economic development.

This past summer the Council co-sponsored the very successful North Country legislative tour. Over 285 legislators and their guests toured the North Country getting a glimpse of the life, economy, and culture that makes our region unique. A follow-up legislative reception was held in December to develop a legislative agenda for 1987. The tour and reception should have future beneficial legislative impact to the North Country.

The Council again provided information and guidance to several towns on federal and state grant and loan programs. This past year saw the Council administer over \$3.0 million in Community Development Block Grant funds. The funds cover such activities as housing rehabilitation, downtown revitalization, business revolving loan funds, and housing rehabilitation feasibility studies.

Community planning assistance has emphasized master planning and improvement in local land use controls. New state mandates and commercial and residential growth in several towns have created busy work loads for planning boards. The Council's assistance takes many forms: regional workshops, newsletters, regulation review and update, and assistance on a regular or one-time basis for subdivision and site plan applications.

The Council again co-sponsored the Municipal Law Lecture series with the NH Municipal Association. The Law Lecture this year covered such topics as local planning board procedures, administration and enforcement of ordinances and review of recent court cases and state law changes regarding local land use planning.

Overall, the Council's major objective is to work with North Country towns in solving local and regional problems. We rely on and appreciate the involvement of town officials and residents and look forward to assisting your town this coming year.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to return to the North Country after an absence of many years. I welcome the opportunity to serve as your Superintendent of Schools.

I find it interesting to see that the problems of the North Country education have not changed significantly over the years. We are still struggling, not only to maintain programs, but also to find the financial resources to improve in all areas and meet minimum requirements.

In recent years the standards to meet minimum requirements have increased and it is becoming more difficult simply to maintain approved public schools, but it is our collective responsibility to do so. In fact, the task of your elected board members and the school staff is to set the direction and establish the priorities so we can all work together cooperatively to provide educational opportunities for our youth that are better than minimum better than adequate.

To have a good school system, we need good teachers. We must continue to actively recruit, attract, and retain certified, qualified educators to ensure some degree of continuity in our programs. Though it is difficult for the districts of SAU #7 to establish salaries similar to those offered in other communities, we must remain reasonably competitive and consider offering other incentives.

Our school facilities must be such that they are not only safe for our children, but they must be accessible to the handicapped and large enough to accommodate programs, staff, and students simply to at least comply with minimum standards.

It is obvious that Stewartstown does not have the need nor the financial resources to hire full time people in specialized areas nor the facilities to provide for library services, guidance, physical education, etc... It is the task of your elected board members and school personnel to consider various alternatives and present to you, the voters, for your decision, the best cost effective plan to provide a quality education for Stewartstown youngsters.

## COORDINATOR OF SPECIAL SERVICES

Special Education services have not changed during the year. Pittsburg has a self-contained classroom, a resource room, and three days of speech therapy. Stewartstown has a combination self-contained/resource room and two days of speech therapy. Colebrook has three resource rooms, a self-contained classroom and three days of speech therapy. There are several students who received related services such as transportation, occupational therapy and physical therapy.

The special education needs of the students within S A U #7 are quite varied. The resource room is used by those students who need less than 50% of the day in special services. The self-contained classroom is used by students who need special services 50% of the day or more. When students have handicapping conditions which are severe, their needs might not be met within the districts' programs. In these cases, out-of-district placements are sought when all available local resources have been exhausted. Currently there are three students in S A U #7 out-of-district placements.

At both the State and Federal level, heavy emphasis through mandates and legislation is being placed on serving children within the 0-6 year old population. This is not surprising, considering the overwhelming amount of growth, development, learning and acquisition of knowledge that occurs during the first six years of one's life.

In the past, students who were "coded" as educationally handicapped, often remained so throughout their educational lifetime. By providing special services intervention to students before they enter the public schools, there are now students who are discharged within one to three years and require no further need of services. In making special services available to the preschool population, the long-term impact should be a decrease in the over-crowded population within special education classes. As a result, more time and quality services will be available for intervention with those students who remain in special education.

## SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

The purpose of the school health program is to enhance the educational process by the modification or removal of health-related barriers to learning and to promote an optimal level of wellness.

Dr. David Goodman became our new school physician. He replaced Dr. Marjorie Parsons, who has since retired. We welcome him to our school districts.

The school nurses in the area, along with the school physician became members of a multi-disciplinary team which was initially developed by the Division for Children and Youth. These teams have been successfully developed in most areas of the state. The possible goals of such a team are:

- A. To provide a community-based team to assist in the prevention or amelioration of child abuse and neglect in the northern area of Coos County.
- B. To provide a vehicle for the assessment of questionable situations, in order to determine whether a formal referral to the Division for Children and Youth should be made, with the Division representative assuming final responsibility for the decision.
- C. To assist in the assessment and treatment planning for high risk families serviced by community agencies but not yet serviced by the Division for Children and Youth, in an effort to develop a preventive treatment program for those families.
- D. To assist the Division for Children and Youth in assessment and treatment planning for families referred to the Division.
- E. To provide a forum for the sharing of knowledge and information pertaining to the general field of child abuse and neglect.
- F. To explore and support the expansion of community resources that serve abusing and neglecting families.

The school nurse attended many workshops during the year to update her knowledge in health areas such as Missing Children, Child Abuse, and Nutrition.

One of the major health problems encountered this school year was that of lice. Parents are urged to check their children's hair at regular intervals.

As a reminder to all parents of children entering first grade, the State Department of Education requires each youngster to meet the following criteria prior to school entry.

RSA 200:32      Physical examination

RSA 200:38-I    Complete Diptheria, Pertussis, and  
Tetanus

Vaccine series

Complete Oral Polio Vaccine series

Rubella Vaccine (German Measles)

Rubeola Vaccine (Measles)

## STEWARTSTOWN CHAPTER I

The Stewartstown Chapter I Program had another successful year despite cuts in the federal funding of our program. The school district was kind enough to contribute local funds to allow the worthwhile program to continue.

Mrs. Betty Raymond, Chapter I teacher, continued to work on a one-to-one basis with students in Grades 2 through 6 in the three schools in our district. A total of 18 students were served: six at St. Albert; three at the Hollow; and nine at West Side. Every child was given the usual pre and post instructional tests so results showed their growth in all areas.

Mrs. Raymond worked very closely with all the classroom teachers. Once the schedule was approved by all concerned, each child knew his/her assigned work session. These sessions were strictly adhered to. This benefited both the classroom and Chapter I teachers, and students so they could all accomplish what they needed to on each day. Various reading skills were reinforced in conjunction with classroom assignments. For a special interest project each child read, reported, and illustrated two books of their choice.

The Chapter I staff attended various workshops conducted locally by the S A U #7 Staff Development Committee and by the State Department of Education. The State Department workshops and conferences give each program an opportunity to compare materials and view new methods.

A federal ruling did not permit Chapter I staff to teach in a parochial school. Our sincere thanks to Mr. & Mrs. Gilles Lambert who kindly donated the use of their home so that the children at St. Albert might be served.

Also our thanks to parents who have endeavored to give extra time to work with these children at home as well as the faculties, Board, Mr. Dehl and Mr. Davis.


