## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

---

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sutton, N. H., in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Pillsbury Memorial Hall, in said Sutton, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

Art. 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to repair highways and bridges.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid and raise and appropriate money for the same.

Art. 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of State highways.

Art. 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

Art. 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the control of White Pine Blister.

Art. 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

Art. 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to purchase a piece of land to be used as a public dumping ground.

Art. 11. To see if the town will accept the fifty foot bathing beach and land between Louis Thayer's and John Vanetta's, and lay out a public road from the state highway to land of Charles Lovett, Blaisdell Lake.

Art. 12. To see if the town will appoint a committee to investigate the merits of a town forest.

Art. 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

It will be noted that 61 of the 72 pupils examined have defective teeth. This amounts to over 84%. We would recommend that as soon as suitable weather conditions prevail a clinic be held, so that all who wish to do so may have their defective teeth filled or extracted.

In June a class of seventeen was graduated from the eighth grade. Of this class twelve are attending Simonds High School as follows: Clifford Ayer, George Butterfield, Lillian Butterfield, Eleanor Chadwick, Gordon Davis, Allen Deno, Mildred Hazen, Anna Stoddard, Annie Wiggins, Lottie Wiggins, Beth Willey, Grace Woodward.



The remainder, Bernice Presby, Edwin Smart, Marjorie Seace, Howard Hazen, and John Merrill are employed at home.

During the year several standard tests were made to ascertain the standing of the pupils in fundamentals, and steps taken to remedy the weaknesses found. We believe that considerable improvement was made in this way. Several sets of textbooks were purchased particularly for the use of the pupils in the upper grades.

At the South school there is need of considerable improvement in the toilets. The installation of a chemical toilet would do away with the bad conditions now existing. The blackboards there are also very unsatisfactory. There is also need of improvement in the toilets at the North school.

The textbooks now in use in arithmetic and language are mostly old and worn out. We would recommend that these be replaced with new and more recent series.

In conclusion we wish to express our deep appreciation of the excellent co-operation and support of the Board in the interests of the schools.
