

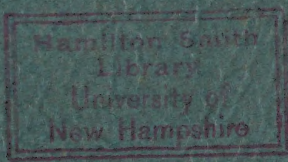
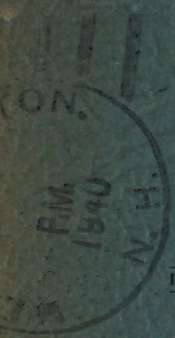
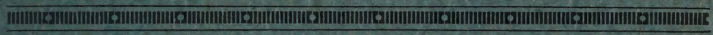

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Thornton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said Thornton on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-Large, Alternate Delegates-at-Large, District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Convention of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice President of the United States.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.
5. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for State Aid Construction road and make appropriations for the same.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Libraries above what the law requires.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to fight the White Pine Blister Rust, and make appropriation for the same.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care of Town Poor and make appropriation for the same.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

11. To see if the Town will vote to allow 3% discount on taxes paid before September 1st.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Improvement of Cemeteries and make appropriation for the same.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$46.00 for the White Mountain Region Association.

14. To see what action the Town will take about widening out the Mill Brook Road.

15. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

16. To see if the Town will vote to eliminate the bridge above the new bridge in Thornton Gore by taking up and filling with rock, and make appropriation for the same.

17. To choose Agents and Committees in relation to any article in the Warrant, and hear any reports of Committees heretofore chosen.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Thornton School District:

I hereby submit my sixth annual report as Superintendent of Schools. The statistical tables for the year 1938-1939 follow this report.

Since the last report, Miss Thelma Wade of Plymouth, a graduate of the Teachers College, was appointed teacher at the West Thornton schools. She is an efficient enthusiastic teacher and the school is motivating in a very satisfactory manner. The enrollment is approximately 24 pupils. The enrollment of the Lyford school is 9 pupils at this writing. Experience shows that in general children get a broader education with more competition in larger schools. In my opinion these children should be transported to West Thornton as heretofore effecting a financial saving to the district and a better preparation for life for these children.

At this writing there are 14 children attending the Mad River school. Seven of these are from Waterville and transients for the most part. The normal enrollment seems to be about 8 pupils. This fall 2 children who formerly attended the Center school were transferred to the Mad River school which helps out on the enrollment of this school. As long as a possibility continues of children coming from Waterville it is probably advisable to operate this school while full state aid is granted for it. Six movable seat units were purchased for this school to take care of the increased enrollment. These units can easily be transferred to other schools if there is need and be another step in eventually equipping the entire district with modern furniture.

Whenever possible the district should gradually wire and equip each school with electricity particularly those schools where the windows are small. The buildings now in use were erected before much was realized about vision and the harmful effects of strained eyesight.
