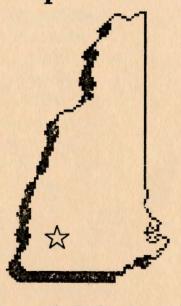
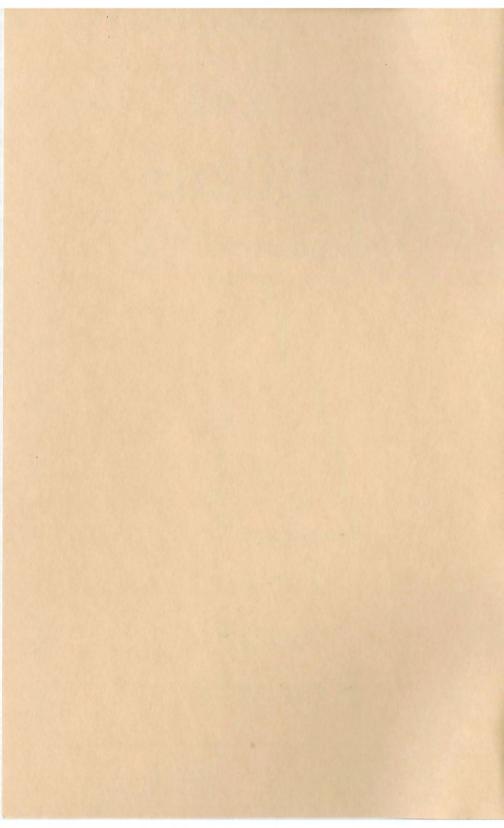

FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND RANGER REPORT

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Dept. & State Forest Ranger, contact your local Warden or F.D. to find out if a permit is required before doing any open burning. Violations of RSA 227-L:17, permit and burning laws, are misdemeanors punishable by fines up to \$2000.00 and/or a year in jail, plus all fire suppression costs.

There are 10 Forest Rangers who work for the NH Div. of Forests, Forest Protection Bureau. Rangers are available to assist communities with forest fire suppression, prevention and training programs as well as the enforcement of forest fire and timber harvest laws. If you have any questions regarding forest fire or timber harvest laws please call our office at 271-2217.

The State of NH operates 15 fire towers, 2 mobile patrols and 3 contract aircraft patrols. This early detection and reports from citizens aid in the quick response from local fire departments.
