ON THE COVER

The First Congregational Society in Dublin, known as The Public Community Church, was founded on June 10, 1772 when the first minister was ordained. The history of the Church begins with the history of the Town. In the beginning, Town and Church were one. Voters created the Church and supported it by public taxation and their own labors. Although the first settlers were in Dublin in 1752, it was 20 years before the Church came into being.

During the next half century the Town continued to support the Church by public taxation until, in 1819, the state of New Hampshire passed "The Toleration Law", which provided that no town in the state should continue to collect taxes for the support of any church, and from that time on, all churches have been supported by private subscription.

The present meetinghouse was built in 1852, there having been two previous buildings which had been torn down. It was financed by the selling of shares at the cost of \$20.00, each. \$2,770.00 was raised in this manner and "the Committee are of the opinion that the amount of stock actually subscribed, is amply sufficient to carry the work through"!

The Dublin Community Church is open to all people and its membership includes affiliates of many denominations. As it was in its beginnings, it is truly a Town Church. The spiritual and cultural life of a community is its most important product. Its history is recorded in human hearts. Accordingly, we pay tribute to the many, who for 200 years, have kept the faith and given of themselves that we, the inheritors, may have the opportunity to carry on a great tradition.

held at the Town Hall, Dublin, N. H., Tuesday, March 10, 1970

C. Robertson Trowbridge, Acting Moderator, Presiding

Polls open 12:00 noon to 6:00 P.M. as advertised.
Voted in the affirmative to continue voting to 7:00 P.M.

7:00 P.M. Meeting called to order and polls closed.
Motion carried to count Ballots at the end of business meeting.

Invocation by The Reverend Noel Sokoloff.

Citation read and presented to E. Bertell Pierce for 13 years of service as Highway Agent by Selectman Edward F. Whitney.

Resolution Read and adopted unanimously for Robb Sagendorph. A true copy to be presented to him at a later date.

12:30 A.M. results announced, oath of office administered. Meeting adjourned at 12:40 A.M.

Article 1. Officers elected: Town Clerk, Anita J. Crowell; Town Treasurer, Anita J. Crowell; Selectman 3 years, John J. McKenna; Tax Collector, John F. Doscher; Highway Agent 1 year, Clarence Babneau; Trustee Trust Funds 3 years, Philip F. McLellan; Library Trustee 3 years, Nellie A. Crossley; Water Commissioner, 3 years, Elliott S. Allison; Cemetery Committee, 3 years, Elsie R. Pratt; Member Planning Board, 6 years, Anthony Anable, Jr.; Member Board of Adjustment, 5 years, Glen H. Hipple.

Article 2. Officers chosen: Measurer of Wood and Bark, Oscar C. Sewall; Memorial Day Committee, Brian Barden, Ernest L. McLean, P. Albert Rajaniemi.

Article 3. Moved that the reports of agents, auditors, and committees be accepted as printed. Carried.

Article 4. Moved that the town authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Carried.

Article 5. Moved that the town authorize the Selectmen to dispose of real estate by Tax Deed. Carried.

Article 6. Moved that the Town accept the following Trust Funds:

- A. For the perpetual care of Cemetery Lots: Harvey C. Hayes \$200.00; Joseph & Louise Fairbanks \$200.00; Henry W. & Belle F. Gowing \$200.00; Alice M. Gowing \$200.00.
- B. Clarence & Edith Mason Fund \$10,000.00, described as follows: Legacy bequeathed to the Town of Dublin under the will of Belle F. Gowing, "Eleventh: I give and bequeath to the Town of Dublin the sum of \$10,000.00, in trust, however, to be held by said Town as the Clarence & Edith Mason Fund the income only to be used for needy persons. Motion carried.

Article 7. Moved that the Town accept the budget as printed in the 1969 Annual Report and that the Town raise and appropriate the necessary sums for each item. The following related motions were made and disposed of as follows.

a) A motion to table budget regarding Highways and Bridges until March 24, 1970. failed.

b) A motion to add \$2,000.00 to Winter Maintenance failed. A motion to add \$1,000.00 to Summer Maintenance failed.

c) A motion to increase the Police Department budget of \$5,500.00 to \$6,000.00 carried.

A motion to accept the final budget figure of \$284,870.69 which included the increase of \$500 for the Police Department carried.

Article 8. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 to continue the support given in 1969 for the services of the Community Mental Health Clinic of the Monadnock Family Health Service. Carried.

Article 9. Moved that the Town establish a Dublin Conservation Commission as set forth in RSA 36a and authorize the Selectmen to appoint said commission within sixty days from the date of this annual meeting, and appoint a temporary Chairman to call the first meeting of said commission and raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars, \$50.00, to defray the 1970 expenses of said commission. Carried.

Article 10. Moved that the Town authorize the Selectmen to draw from the Heavy Highway Equipment account of the Capital Reserve a sum not to exceed \$8,700 for the purchase of a 2½-3-ton Dump Truck with 9,000 lb. front axle and 27,500 lb. Gross Vehicle Weight. Motion failed.

A motion to reconsider the previous vote was made and carried. Upon reconsideration, a motion was made to amend the original motion so that the motion as amended would read that "the Selectmen be authorized to withdraw up to \$8,700 to purchase a truck and plow suitable to fit Dublin's needs and be satisfactory to both the Selectmen and Highway Agent". Motion to amend carried. Motion to accept the motion as amended also carried.

Article 11. Moved that the Town discontinue the present Harris Road, so called, from its point of junction with the Page Road to Jaffrey Town Line in accordance with RSA 238.1. It was moved to amend the motion as follows: "Subject to Gates and Bars instead of Discontinue". Amendment failed. Original motion carried.

Article 12. Moved that the Town discontinue that portion of the Old Hancock Road still remaining which is situated within the present Allen property, formerly owned by Luke Richardson, from the point where it joins the present Hancock Road on the southerly boundary of the Allen property to the point where it rejoins the present Hancock Road on the northerly boundary of the Allen property, in accordance with RSA 238.1. Motion carried.

Article 13. Moved that the Town discontinue that portion of the former Valley Road abandoned as a result of the relocation of the northerly end of the Valley Road and construction of the Route 101 underpass from the point of its junction with the present Valley Road northerly to its end at the house and barn owned by Richard and Marian Latti in accordance with RSA 238.1. Motion failed.

Article 14. Moved that the Town discontinue the present Town Road located between the northerly boundary of land owned by Stewart and the southerly boundary of land owned by Steinert from its point of junction with the Old Harrisville Road easterly to its end at the Flint Cottage, so called, owned by Sterling, in accordance with RSA 238.1. Motion carried.

Article 15. Moved that the Town discontinue that portion of the former Goldmine Road abandoned as a result of the relocation of the easterly end of the Goldmine Road and the construction of the Route 101 underpass from the present Alden Brunell residence to the underpass, in accordance with RSA 238.1. Motion carried.

Article 16. Moved that the Town discontinue, subject to Gates and Bars, the former Oxbow Road so called, from

the point of its junction with the Upper Jaffrey Road at the present Jamgochian property to its junction with the Page Road at the present Charles Johnson property, in accordance with RSA 238.2. Motion carried.

Article 17. Moved that the Town discontinue, subject to Gates and Bars, the present abandoned extension of the Dooe Road from the point of its junction with the Valley Road southeasterly to the Peterborough Town Line, in accordance with RSA 238.2. Motion carried.

Articel 18. Moved that the Town discontinue, subject to Gates and Bars, that portion of the former Bonds Corner Road abandoned as a result of the reconstruction of the Bonds Corner intersection with Route 101, situated between property now owned by McQuillen and property now owned by Rajaniemi, from the point of its junction with the present Bonds Corner Road southerly to its ending adjacent to the border of the Route 101 right of way, in accordance with RSA 238.2. Motion carried.

Article 19. Moved that the Town discontinue, subject to Gates and Bars, that portion of the former Route 101 located on the easterly boundary of the present Friendly Farm, Inc. from the easterly point of its junction with the present Route 101 westerly to the point of rejoining Route 101 in accordance with RSA 238.2. Motion carried.

Article 20. Moved that the Town abolish the office of Water Commissioner effective on the day of Town Meeting 1971. It was then moved that Article 20 be indefinitely postponed. Motion to indefinitely postpone carried.

Article 21. Moved that the Town adopt an ordinance requiring Building Permits and authorize the Selectmen to appoint a building inspector and raise and appropriate \$25.00 to defray the 1970 expenses of said building inspector.

It was then moved to amend the motion to delete the words "and authorize the Selectmen to appoint a building inspector and raise and appropriate \$25.00 to defray the 1970 expenses of said building inspector" and replace them with the words "raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 to cover cost of printing and handling said permits". It was moved to indefinitely postpone Article 21. Motion to indefinitely postpone Article 21 carried.

Article 22. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$700 for the purchase of an addressograph graphotype unit with which to emboss the metal plates used in the Town's property valuation listing and addressing system. Motion carried.

Article 23. Moved that the Town authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Dublin Recreation Committee with powers to investigate the recreational needs of the Town of Dublin, with specific reference to the establishment of a Town Beach and related recreational facilities, and with the responsibility of reporting to the Town the Committee's recommendations for such facilities at the next annual Town Meeting, and that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for the use of said committee for the purpose noted above. Motion carried.

Article 24. Moved that the Town authorize the Selectmen together with the Cemetery Committee to negotiate and make such transfer of land presently located with the Dublin Cemetery bordering on Route 101 in the vicinity of the Town Cemetery Vault to the State of New Hampshire in return for transfer to the Town of land now laying within the State Highway right of way, in such a manner as to improve the safety of the Highway, provided that no permanent graves shall be affected by such transfer. Motion carried.

Article 25. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be placed in Capital Reserve for Heavy Highway Equipment, and the sum of \$3,000.00 to be placed in Capital Reserve for a solid waste disposal system. Motion carried.

WHEREAS, according to official records MR. ROBB SAGENDORPH has served this town faithfully in one capacity or another for the past twenty-two consecutive years, as Selectman for sixteen years from 1947 to 1963, and for seventeen years as Town Moderator, a post he has held since 1952; and

WHEREAS, under his forceful but always good-humored direction, using Robert's Rules of Parliamentary Procedure as a guideline but often tempered by Robb's rules of Yankee ingenuity and common sense with the result that Dublin Town Meetings were skillfully guided to goals carefully calculated to be in the best interest of the Town and to satisfy the voters assembled; and

WHEREAS, town officials who have served with Selectman Sagendorph have been unanimous in their praise of his abilities; while he was often to be found at the focal point of a controversy, he nevertheless always did his level best to be representative of true democratic process; he was as concerned with the distribution of supplies to the worthy poor as he was willing to take on the State Tax Commission on an issue he deemed beneficial to the Town; now therefore,

WHEREAS the Town of Dublin finds itself greatly indebted to MR. ROBB SAGENDORPH for his guidance during these many years, we ask him to accept our heartfelt thanks, and we extend to him this token of sincere appreciation and high esteem.

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dublin qualified to vote in Town Affairs;

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, March 9, 1971, at seven o'clock in the Evening (polls will be open from 12:00 noon to 7:00 p.m.) to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To bring in your ballots for the following offices for one year terms: Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Highway Agent; for the following offices for three year term: Selectman, Trustees of Trust Funds, Water Commissioner, Library Trustee, Member of the Cemetery Committee, Member of the Conservation Commission (2); Member of Board of Adjustment for five years; Member of the Planning Board for six years.

Article 2. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

Article 3. To hear Reports of agents, auditors, committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of any Real Estate acquired by tax deed.

Article 6. To see if the Town will accept certain Trust Funds as follows: For Perpetual Care of Cemetery Lots: Joseph K. Close Lot, \$200.00; Clifton E. Richardson Lot, \$200.00; F. C. VonStade, Jr., \$200.00; James S. Ward, \$200.00.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to defray Town charges and for other purposes mentioned in the Town Budget.

Article 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$573.00, this amount being based on 70¢ per capita, to support the services of the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurse Association, Inc.

Article 9. To see if the Town will discontinue, subject to gates and bars, the present town road from its point of junction with the Upper Jaffrey Road to the Joseph K. Close house, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:2.

Article 10. To see if the town will discontinue, subject to gates and bars, that portion of Pierce Road from Route 101 to its junction with the Old County Road at the former Dublin Inn, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:2.

Article 11. To see if the Town will discontinue that portion of the former Valley Road, abandoned as a result of the relocation of the northerly end of the Valley Road and construction of the Route 101 underpass, from the points of its junction with the present Valley Road northerly to its end at the house and barn owned by Richard and Marian Latti, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:1.

Article 12. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to designate Frothingham Road as a one-way road running east, from Route 101 to its junction with the Old Common Road, thereby eliminating the dangerous entrance from Frothingham Road onto Route 101 at Wait's corner.

Article 13. To see what sum of money the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Heavy Highway Equipment account of the Capital Reserve for the purchase of a payload loader to replace the present 1958 equipment, and what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to supplement such Capital Reserve Funds withdrawn, for the purchase of said payload loader, such sum to be borrowed by authorizing the Selectmen to issue long term notes payable annually at the rate of \$6600, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept a gift from Lawrence W. Rathbun of land with any improvements thereon, south of Route 101 and east of Charcoal Road, in the vicinity of Howe Reservoir, being that portion of the Bruce Lot, so-called, which is affected by flowage rights.

Article 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to defray the 1971 expenses of the Dublin Conservation Commission and for other purposes as mentioned in the Conservation Commission Report, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to require the issuance by the Selectmen of a Building Permit for any new building

construction, repair or remodeling of existing buildings, the cost of such construction, repair or remodeling would exceed \$300, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1200 for the purchase of four High Band, two-way, four-frequency, police radios, to replace those now operated by the Police Department, as required by the new State-wide police radio communications network, this sum being one-fourth the total cost, the balance being paid by the Federal Government, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 18. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new Police Cruiser, to replace the present 1965 equipment.

Article 19. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint a full-time police officer, and to see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to defray the 1971 salary and expenses of said full-time police officer. (By petition)

Article 20. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to continue the Dublin Recreation Committee with powers to investigate the recreational needs of the Town of Dublin, with specific reference to the establishment of a Town beach and related recreational facilities, and with the responsibility of reporting to the Town the Committee's recommendations for such facilities at the next annual Town Meeting, or Special Meeting called for this purpose, and to see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the use of said Committee for the purposes noted above, or take any other action related thereto.

Article 21. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and any other person or persons they deem necessary to investigate, appraise, and arrange for the acquisition of a minimum of ~~350~~ Lake frontage feet with an adjoining four (4) acres of land on Dublin Lake to be used for recreational purposes by the residents of Dublin and to submit a proposal at the next annual Town Meeting and to see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to meet this objective. (By petition)

Article 22. To see what sum of money the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Bridge Construction and/or Repair account of the Capital Reserve for the repair of the bridge on the Old Chesham Road, and what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to supplement such Capital Reserve Funds withdrawn, for repair of said bridge.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to arrange with the N. H. Dept. of Public Works and Highways for the relocation and re-setting up of the face of the Cemetery Vault, to be dismantled in the summer of 1971 due to the widening of Route 101, against the new cemetery property line grade, as close to its present position as possible, at no additional cost to the Town.

Article 24. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the purpose of a ^{one 1/2 ton} 3/4 ton utility truck, equipped with a 3,500 ft. capacity hose reel and a 750 gal. per minute pump, for the Dublin Fire Department, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 25. As your Chief of Police for the full year of 1970 I find it to be a very time consuming duty, but with the help of my fellow officers we are very proud to hold such an office.

Like last year I am requesting you to call 352-1100, the Southwestern New Hampshire Mutual Aid System, should an emergency arise. They, in turn, will notify a Police Officer who will immediately respond.

Last year the circulating of the Police Cruiser has been a deterrent to crime and lawlessness in the Dublin area. With your continued support, we wish to continue and pledge a response and satisfaction to all.

We have responded to several bona fide emergencies this past year, from attempted suicide, domestic complaints in which life was threatened, to personal injuries received from automobile accidents; also the apprehension of thieves by whom this town has been plagued.

Malicious destruction, the shooting out of 59 street, traffic, and home lights, is one of the many pursuits in which your cruiser and radio equipment have participated.

Sixteen persons were arrested for various crimes, other than motor vehicle, committed in Dublin, ranging from Larceny, Malicious Destruction to property, Breaking and Entering to Assault. These persons all appeared in court to answer to charges brought against them.

In addition, I would like the citizens of Dublin to know that your cruiser is now equipped with an oxygen unit for asthma conditions, heart attacks and for the seriously injured, rope for possible rescue, chain to remove doors of vehicles if needed, jumper cables for vehicles in distress, flares to protect accident scenes, and blankets to keep the injured warm.

We would like to thank Mr. Elliott Allison who watches our children morning and afternoon at the school crossing and all who have assisted and co-operated with the Department in any way.

REPORT OF THE DUBLIN FIRE DEPARTMENT, 1970

The Dublin Fire Department has had another busy year. The number of calls and seriousness of their nature has been alarming to the department as well as the citizens of Dublin. This same type of situation faces every community throughout the country. Losses of life and property have been greater this past year than ever before. It is imperative that everyone be aware of this problem, and do their best to put a curb on the rising fire toll. This can only be done by renewing one's respect for fire, eliminating potential fire hazards, and being prepared to cope with a disaster, should one occur. The problem of arson is still with us, and is most difficult to deal with. Please report any suspicious acts to the local police or fire departments.

These problems and hazards mean that the fire departments must be better trained, and better equipped than ever before. I believe that we have done everything within our capabilities to provide the Town with the necessary ingredients to cope with this. We have done extensive training, and have always asked for the necessary funds to keep our department at top level. These have been provided. However, our task still remains a difficult one. To provide such services, there is no just monetary compensation. The reward to a fireman is a job well done.

During 1970, we were called upon 50 times.

There were 12 oil burner permits issued and one fireworks permit.

We received Mutual Aid seven times from other departments. This help was from Harrisville, Jaffrey, Peterborough, Marlboro, Rindge, Hancock and Meadowood. They covered our station while our trucks were out (in case of another fire), and to assist us at serious building fires. This help is sent automatically through the dispatch center in Keene. The departments sent in are chosen from a "pre-plan running card". This is a file card listing all of the streets in Dublin, and all of the large buildings where fire could be an extreme hazard. Following these locations is the radio call number of the departments nearest that section of town. These departments are then dispatched automatically for any building fire. This system is in operation within seconds after the initial report of fire is received. There is no charge to the town receiving help under this arrangement. We received help seven times this past year. On one occasion (Parker-Elder fire), we received help from six departments at one fire! We were in turn dispatched to Chesham, Harrisville, Peterborough, Jaffrey and Marlboro during the year to assist them at fires. Several times this year, we sent more than one truck to the next town for the same fire. We had three units at the Peterborough fire Christmas Day. Our total number of alarms in 1970 increased by 16 over 1969 alarms.

Many training sessions were held during the year. The department is now well trained in the use of our new large diameter hose, and also on the front-count 500 gallon per minute pump installed on our forestry tanker this year. The large diameter hose is as helpful to the fireman as the power lawnmower is to the homeowner. Our only regret is that we hadn't purchased the new hose before the Parker-Elder fire, (although we would have been a few hundred feet short anyhow). This fire was finally put under control through the use of this hose brought in from other towns. Had it not been for

the water available after this hose was set up, more houses would have been destroyed by the flames. This is one important lesson about having the necessary equipment in your own station! The delay while hose is coming from another town can be costly.

However, the Dublin Fire Company raised enough money to purchase 1100 feet of this hose already. We are in hopes of doubling that figure in 1971. The Fire Company also raised enough money to purchase a used 500 GPM pump for the forestry tanker. This was installed on the truck by the firemen. Spare time was also used to "wire up" the station with a battery charging system. This system keeps the truck batteries at full charge, and eliminates the chance of a "dead battery". This has happened in the past on several occasions.

The fire hole project fell a little short of its goal this year due to the early snow. The Dublin Lake hydrant at the West End has been installed, but the Davis and Hammond Pond hydrants will have to be done in the spring. To our advantage, the cost of installing the lake hydrant is being paid by the landowners on that end of the lake at their request. Many thanks. The remainder of the Fire Hole Special funds this year was put towards next year's hydrants. These hydrants are available through the State of New Hampshire for \$120.00 each.

I would like to thank the firemen of the Town of Dublin who have given so much of their time to provide us with a first class Fire Department. The spirit of these men is surpassed by none. Only when I look back through the year's records do I realize how much work has been done by this group. It almost seems as if there were nothing left to do for 1971, but there is always plenty. The number of emergencies which were handled without incident, the monthly meetings and training sessions, the Sunday morning radio and truck checks, the various projects such as installing pumps and wiring up battery chargers, painting the fire station, and last but not least, the Christmas decorations. One look at this list and it's no wonder that a few of the wives get upset! Well, we're all in it by choice, so there aren't any complaints.

We regret the unfortunate accident which resulted in Glen Scribner breaking both wrists plus other injuries. After several long months of recuperation, Mr. Scribner has returned to his regular work at the Post Office.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1970 forest fire season was a quiet one in this area, quiet in part because of your continued cooperation and favorable weather conditions.

Fires that did occur were, for the most part, caused by debris burning, children and smokers.

The elimination of these three causes of forest fires would drastically change this picture – to bring about this change we make the following suggestions:

1. When the ground is not covered with snow a permit to burn must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden. This permit covers waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, as well as garden trash and brush burning, such burning is restricted by regulation to prior to 9:00 A.M. and after 5:00 P.M. with the following exceptions:

Commercial or industrial burning is permissible at any time under normal conditions but only with the approval of the District Chief and a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.

2. Fires caused by children can be prevented only with the complete cooperation of parents in the supervision of their children, keep matches out of reach of children, this action will help to prevent fires and may save a life, the life of your child. Try to explain this to your child, won't you?
3. Forest fires caused by smokers can be reduced in number by the exercise of more care in the discarding of matches and smoking material whether from a vehicle or by a hiker. In all cases, make sure that the butt or match you discard is out, dead out. Smokey says, "Thanks for your help", and invites you to join with him in setting a good example for others in the prevention of fires and the protection of our environment.

HIGHWAY REPORT

Summer Maintenance

All dirt roads were graded and maintainer used at least twice. Overhead limbs were cut and hauled to dump. Several old culverts were replaced by new ones; some of the old culverts were dug up and relaid.

The Valley Rd., Marlboro Rd., Old Harrisville Rd., Monument Rd., south and west sides of lake, and part of the Bond's Corner Rd., were ditched, with many more black top roads left to be ditched for the first time, I believe, in the history of Dublin. By ditching these roads, it not only makes the road wider, but lets the water run more freely and protects the road against frost heaves.

With summer well on the way we had to quit ditching as we could no longer see the ditches because of brush.

Brush was cut on the Old Harrisville Rd., Valley Rd., Mossey's Rd., East Harrisville Rd., Golf Club to Lake, west side of Lake, and part of the Bond's Corner Rd., and hauled to the dump.

New Construction

Under new construction the Bond's Corner Rd., by Mr. Nelson's residence was finished. More ledge was moved and the gravel and tar was mixed in place.

Town Road Aid

From the corner of Windmill Hill Rd., to the Dublin Christian Academy, trees were cut and wood hauled to the land owner, and stumps and stones hauled to the stump dump. A total of 1750 feet of road was widened and graveled, culverts put in, and pipe added to the one in the brook. I feel that this road should be tarred next year. There is some cleaning up left to do.

Town Dump

The dump was burned every day this past summer, raked back whenever needed, which was most every day, and pushed back nearly every week. The Brush Dump was pushed back and burned when needed, which was done almost every week.

I believe that the town of Dublin should set up some kind of restriction for the dump to stop the flow of out-of-town people from dumping.

Winter Maintenance

With the fear and worries of our old equipment

breaking down, I feel my men did very well in keeping the roads open from March until winter was finally over.

Plows were repaired and painted, ready for December when snow arrived. Again the men have done very well. With the new truck in operation there is less worry of keeping the roads open.

*Please note: This new truck does a fine job both Winter and Summer, very much needed by this department.

Also needed in the very near future are two tail-board sanders or similar sanders.

Bridges

Bridges were checked for damaged planks, beams and guardrails. We find that we have two bad bridges that need to be replaced or remodelled. Load limit signs were posted on the bad bridges.

Signs

The largest problem we had with signs was vandalism and theft. Signs were replaced because of this cause. Paint was bought for painting sign posts next year.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF THE CEMETERY

There were 9 burials and 5 lots were sold this year.

My assistant again this year was Russell Chase. Dan Pratt and Kerry Moody were the two high school boys who helped greatly.

There are two special projects that should be reported on:

1. The Selectmen, authorized by the 1970 town meeting, and officials of the State Public Works Department have negotiated and entered into an agreement whereby the State can purchase approximately 1,750 square feet of cemetery land for the sum of \$400 for the widening of Route 101. No graves will be disturbed, however the vault will have to go. (It has not been used for many years.) An article will appear in this year's warrant as to what the voters' wishes are concerning the disposition of this vault.
2. The Sewall Company (concern that made the town tax maps) have been hired to undertake the task of making a master map and plan of the cemetery showing location of all the lots, which ones have perpetual care and other pertinent information. About half of of the work was completed in 1970 and hopefully the remainder will be finished in 1971. This is being paid out of regular cemetery appropriations, perpetual care income and from state purchase of cemetery land (\$400).

The cemetery realized \$1,122 64 in income from perpetual care funds invested wisely by the Trustees of the Trust Fund.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT, 1970

Planning Board activities for the year have been concerned mainly with minor property transactions. The only large subdivision to come before the Board is the Norman Davis housing development on Bonds Corner Road, which is progressing slowly.

Meetings during the year have demonstrated a definite interest in some kind of zoning for the Town. Planning Board member Anthony Anable has been working with the Department of Economic Development in Concord to design a plan which will be suitable for our Town. Up to now Dublin has zoned itself naturally. Business, civic and recreation areas have fallen into place very well. However, as the Town grows a well planned zoning ordinance would ensure that it will be kept this way.

In order for those who plan to build in Dublin to be aware of our subdivision ordinance and of the State of New Hampshire's anti-pollution laws it is very necessary that the Town require that a building permit be issued. This could be a simple procedure where the prospective builder could apply to the Town Clerk, or to the Planning Board, for a permit. In this way the Planning Board would be aware of the proposed building, and the builder would be given a copy of the Town's ordinance, and would be briefed on the State's anti-pollution laws. The Planning Board will ask the Town to consider the issuance of building permits at the next Town Meeting as the Board believes this will be very helpful to builders and possibly save them unnecessary expense.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

February 11, 1971

Board of Selectmen
Dublin, New Hampshire

Gentlemen:

We have examined the balance sheet of the Town of Dublin, New Hampshire as of December 31, 1970 and the related statements of revenues and appropriations and expenditures for the year then ended. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

SCOPE OF THE EXAMINATION

Explanatory comments on the major balance sheet items follow.

Cash on hand and in bank-treasurer—\$103,514.89. Cash in bank was reconciled with the treasurer's books and the balance per bank statement was confirmed by corresponding directly with the depository.

Taxes receivable—\$15,111.30. The uncollected taxes agreed with the collector's detailed listing. The outstanding property taxes were verified by corresponding directly with the taxpayers.

Capital reserve fund—\$10,913.59. Interest received amounted to \$518.62. This fund is in the custody of the Trustees of Trust Funds.

Due to school department—\$107,117.93. The balance due to the school department was computed as follows:

The loan from the Indian Head National Bank in connection with the construction of the fire station and the purchase of equipment was reduced from \$31,420.00 to \$27,490.00 during the year. The loan is payable at the rate of \$3,930.00 per year plus interest at 3% per annum.

Excess of liabilities over assets—\$17,204.39. This balance represents the net liabilities of the general fund as reflected by the books and as ascertained from other sources.

REVENUES AND APPROPRIATIONS

The receipts as shown by the records were verified with the remitter insofar as practicable. The total receipts and disbursements as reflected in the Selectmen's books agreed with those recorded in the Treasurer's books. An inspection of vouchers and cancelled checks indicated that the disbursements were supported by invoices or other documents and were being properly recorded.

TRUST FUNDS

The balance of cash on deposit in the checking account and in the various savings accounts was confirmed to us directly by the depositories. Securities on hand were inspected or accounted for by us. We verified the dividends and interest received during the year.

The income received during the year on common fund investments was distributed to the various funds included in the common fund on a proportionate basis. Disbursements were made to various beneficiaries of the trusts.

The town was paid \$1,215.18 as a reimbursement for wages paid on cemetery work for 1970.

DUBLIN PUBLIC LIBRARY FUND

We inspected securities on hand and confirmed the balance in the various savings accounts by direct correspondence with the banks.

DUBLIN CONSERVATION COMMISSION, 1970

The Dublin Conservation Commission was established at Town Meeting on March 10, 1970 with an appropriation of \$50.00 to defray expenses for 1970. The first of twelve meetings was held May 19th.

The Commission is indebted to the Selectmen and Planning Board of Dublin, to members of other Conservation Commissions, to the Soil Conservation Service of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, to the Society For The Protection of New Hampshire Forests and others for help in determining its goals.

These goals were stated in a letter sent to all Dublin residents in December with an enclosed questionnaire asking each to indicate primary interest in the activities listed. Of replies so far received, Water Pollution, Bottle and Paper Collection, Solid Waste Disposal and Acquisition of Land for Open Space Preservation were among topics the interests revealed.

At the last meeting in December, it was decided that the Commission needed another member who, if and when appointed, will bring the membership to seven which is the maximum provided under RSA 36-A:3.

The Commission hopes that 1971 will see more tangible progress than the year just closed and that it may count on active interest from Dublin residents; whether by letter or by possible service on committees for special projects.

RECREATION COMMITTEE REPORT

At the last Town Meeting, the Town voted to establish a Recreation Committee and authorized \$1,000 to be spent on a study of possible sites for a Town Beach facility and recreational area on Dublin Lake.

It was determined that the first order of business would be to hire a professional planner to make a study of the land areas around the lake, and to report back to the Committee with a list of possible sites. After due study and consideration the Committee voted to hire the Allen Organization from Bennington, Vermont. Mr. Allen met with and briefed the Committee on many similar recreational areas which his organization had developed, and offered many recommendations as to what could be done. The Allen Organization was instructed to ignore political and economic considerations in their original site analysis.

The Committee continued to search for land that would be available to the Town through negotiation, and found this to be very limited and what was available was located in the area encompassing the Dublin Women's Club Beach. In due time the Allen Organization made their site analysis report available to our Committee, and the task of selecting a site was ours.

- A) The first site was the Dublin Lake Club. The site was not available.
- B) Second choice was the Spencer & Clark site. This also was not available.
- C) The third site was the area surrounding the Dublin Women's Club Beach. The Allen Organization stated that it would be necessary to expand the beach area, as well as obtain more land in the rear to allow for parking and play areas in order to make this site adequate for a long range plan.

Although no negotiations are possible without the approval of the Town, most of the landowners abutting the Women's Club Beach have stated their intentions of cooperating to make this site adequate, if the Recreation Committee recommends, and the Town votes to accept this area as the Town Beach facility. Louise Kelly has made a most thoughtful and generous offer to make her beach property a gift to the Town of Dublin if this area is developed as a Town beach. The Dublin Women's Club, whose outstanding management of the beach facility has served so many people for these many years,

has voted to let the Town of Dublin consider its site as a portion of the Town facility, if the Women's Club area is selected and approved by the Town. For all these years the Women's Club facility has been the only swimming area on Dublin Lake available to most of the town's residents. The Dublin Lake Club has been equally generous and helpful, and its Board of Directors has unanimously endorsed the principle of cooperating with our Committee in its efforts to develop a plan for enlarging the beach facilities for the Town. The Directors agreed that a tract of land along Route 101 should be made available on some mutually agreeable basis to be negotiated, and that this tract must be adequate to provide parking facilities, a leaching bed, and a general play area, etc. Such an area of the Lake Club land would extend about 125 feet back from the new edge of the State highway sidewalk line. The Lake Club has already given approximately 18 feet of land along Route 101 to the State to widen 101 and allow for a sidewalk which will permit people to walk to the beach area without traveling on the State highway.

I wish I could say that the Buffam property was as available, but as of now we have only received a "no", and though many of us feel that it will eventually fall into place we can't honestly set forth any time table.

Although progress has been slow and our problems many, it has been more than gratifying to see and sense the spirit of cooperation and good will prevalent in the overall endeavor to make this general area adequate for a Town facility. We would be the first to say that this area as a short-range plan would be something less than ideal. However, it could offer much more space and facilities than is presently possible at the limited area now available through the Women's Club Beach alone. As a long-range plan this location lends itself to a greater potential as expansion would be possible, as the Town grows, and one cannot overlook the fact that as long as the two beach facilities are adjacent there may some day be just one beach for all Dublin residents. Certainly the cost to the Town would be less in this area, and at a time when there are so many other requirements and expenses, this consideration should be a prime factor.

In our attempt to develop a possible site plan which could be presented to the Town in March, our Committee voted "That until the March 1971 Town Meeting not to consider a site which wasn't available and might necessitate eminent domain action by the Town". We would

like to have the best plan possible, short of eminent domain action, and thus give the Town voters a chance to review the site plans and determine the adequacy thereof, and if not suitable see what action the Town would direct the Committee and Selectmen to take.

Because work and negotiations are still in progress, this can only serve as an interim report. The final report will be available to the voters prior to the March Meeting. This will include the Committee's recommendations on a site as well as the "Ways and Means" of construction, operation and management.

While all of our meetings are open to the public we still plan to have sufficient open meetings to present our final plans prior to the Town Meeting. Please make an attempt to be there with us.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the members of our Recreation Committee, and a special appreciation to Chickie Loranger, our Secretary, Noel Sokoloff, our vice-chairman, and Mitch Wenigmann, Chairman of our site committee.

**PROCEDURE COVERING USE OF
DUBLIN TOWN HALL**

- 1) **PERMISSION FOR USE** Permission to use any part of the Town Hall building for any purpose must be obtained from the Board of Selectmen.
- 2) **JANITOR SERVICE** The Selectmen will keep the Janitor advised of the schedule of authorized activities, so that the rooms to be used can be properly prepared, heat turned on sufficiently in advance, if required, and clean-up after the event provided for.
- 3) **POLICE ATTENDANCE** Any public function held in the upper hall, such as a dance, auction, etc., requires the presence of a member of the Police Department. The Selectmen will arrange for such police attendance with the Police Chief.
- 4) **SUPERVISION REQUIRED** Every activity held in the Town Hall must have proper supervision. Minimum supervision requirements are described as follows:
 - a) Adult-organized activities—Permission to use the hall will be based, in part, on the Selectmen's understanding that the group involved is responsible and that necessary supervision at the event will be provided.
 - b) Youth activities, organized by adults, such as Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, church groups, etc. — The adult group leader must be on hand at all times during the activity.
 - c) Youth-managed activities, organized by Dublin resident (under 21 yrs. old) — At least two adult chaperones, provided by the organizing group must be on hand at all times during the activity.
 - d) Youth-managed activities, whose organizers are not Dublin residents — The organizing group must provide an adult Dublin resident as sponsor, as the party responsible for any damage caused, in addition to the chaperons required under c) above.
- 5) **FEES** The following charges for the use of the Town Hall are effective at once.
