

TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hebron in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Hall in said Hebron on Tuesday, the fourteenth (14) day of March, next at five o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Polls open from 5:00 to 9:00 p.m. Business meeting will open at 7:00 p.m. A supper will be served at 5:30 for those who wish it.

2. To hear the reports of any standing and/or other committees.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to allow two percent cash discount on property taxes if paid within thirty days from date of tax bill.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

6. To see if the Town will vote to accept such unused Bicentennial Funds from the Newfound Area Bicentennial Committee as may be available, to be held by the Trustees of the Trust Funds, invested and reinvested with the avowed purpose of being made available to the Town for the National Tercentennial in the year 2076.

7. To see if the Town will vote to have the Cemetery Trust Funds reported annually in summary.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000 to be added to the established Tax Mapping Capital Reserve Fund.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum

of \$350.00, the Town's share, for the purchase of a police mobile communications receiver granted to the Town by the Governor's Commission on Crime and Delinquency, and authorize the withdrawal of this sum for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500, for the purchase of fire hose, and authorize the withdrawal of this sum for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal of \$1,874.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as a setoff against the 1977 Fire Truck note and interest.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept from William J. Crane et ux, on behalf of the Town, a warranty deed to property described as roads and turn around on property of said Cranes and described in a deed prepared pursuant there to.

13. To vote on the following proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance as recommended by the Planning Board:

Amendment #1. Article IV: General Provisions, Section K - To insert organized summer camps and planned unit and cluster housing developments only by a special exception granted by the Board of Adjustment.

Amendment #2. Article IV: General Provision, Section O - To insert planned unit developments with less than the required (road) frontage where some land is owned in common.

Amendment #3. Article VII: B. 7 - To specify for light industry 1) a minimum lot area of one (1) acre, 2) adequate off street parking space with no parking area located within the required frontage set back and 3) the maximum combined ground area coverage of buildings, parking space and driveways shall not exceed fifty (50) per cent of the lot area.

Amendment #4. General Provisions. Insert new Section R - To require owners of real estate who propose plans for buildings or structures subject to the Zoning Ordinance to file a Notice of Intent with the Selectmen which clearly indicates the nature of such plans. If the plans appear to involve any violation of the Zoning Ordinance, the owner is so notified. Ordinary maintenance and repairs to existing buildings and structures are exempt from filing.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 to build a three bay Town Shed to house Town equipment.

15. To see if the Town will vote to change the annual fees for plowing driveways from \$25.00 for driveways of less than 500 feet and \$50.00 for driveways over 500 feet, to \$40.00 for driveways up to 500 feet and \$80.00 for those driveways over 500 feet.

REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

HEBRON POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT 1977 ·

This year has been busier than ever; indicative, we believe, of the trend in smaller New Hampshire towns toward increased reliance on local police services.

Three areas concern us most at this time: a sharp increase in accidents, the cost incidence of animal calls (particularly dogs), and house breaks.

Hebron had 17 accidents this year. Though these are something which we must accept along with the ever-increasing amount of traffic, we are concerned when we note a larger proportion of traffic exceeding our speed limits. We are hopeful to have the facility to reduce speeding offenses in the coming year. We would mention that we have not had serious injuries, so far, as a result of accidents; we note, too, that neither alcohol nor drugs were directly involved in most of our accidents, but this does not mean that these offenders are not on our roads.

Hebron had 13 animal calls in 1977. While the number appears small, a large portion of the budget is spent here, especially when animals need to be transported to the pound, usually the N.H. Humane Society shelter in Laconia. Of the calls this year, only one was a true "nuisance" call regarding a neighbor's dog; the remainder were cat, horse and stray dog calls. All things considered, however, this is an excellent record for Hebron residents' regard for their neighbors.

We are most concerned about an upward trend toward house breaks. Though Hebron did not contribute heavily toward the 1977 statistics, we nevertheless encourage our residents, particularly our seasonal ones away from continuous view, to consider the installation of surveillance systems. These have been greatly improved and are surprisingly low cost protection. We ask folks to continue keeping a sharp eye for strange persons or vehicles, jotting down registration numbers and other pertinent information and letting us know. It is well to ask a neighbor to keep an eye on your place if you plan to be away in addition to letting us know.

We are pleased to report that Hebron has received a federal grant through LEAA for a new radio; being in a fringe area of the county, a higher wattage output should make our equipment much more reliant, as well as now having scanning capability.

We especially thank Sheriff Herb Ash for his continued support and the assistance of his department. Though Hebron is off the "beaten path", his deputies are through here frequently, often unobserved, and without a proper "thanks."

Finally, my appreciation to our special officers, David Albert, Gerry Griffin, and Al Lennox.

REPORT OF HEBRON FIRE DEPARTMENT

During the calendar year 1977 the Hebron Fire Department responded to 36 calls for fires and other emergencies. This compares to 40 calls in 1976 and 19 calls in 1975. The trend is clear - the fire department is being called upon more frequently by the public for a variety of situations. And this is how it should be, for the department is owned and supported by the people of the town and its purpose is to serve.

Of course, the big news for 1977 was the fact that a year ago the town voted to purchase its first new fire engine. Having the people approve the article was only the beginning. Chassis specifications had to be written and bids sent out. Pump and body specifications had to be written and a second set of bids sent out. Contracts were awarded in April to Fred's Auto in Bristol and Middlesex Fire Equipment in Montpelier, Vt. After five production delays Ford finally delivered the chassis to Bristol in mid-December and we delivered it to Middlesex in Montpelier on December 19th. Since fire apparatus is all custom built, many phone calls (at the companies expense) and several trips were made to Middlesex to go over details on the body and equipment furnished with the truck. As of this writing, delivery of the completed truck is expected in late February and we hope to have it "in service" by town meeting.

With the new engine the department's fire supression capability will be greatly increased. The new engine will serve at the "first in attack piece" with the Tanker and Engine 1 as support pieces supplying additional water. The Tanker will continue to be our mutual aid unit which will be sent to the surrounding towns when help is requested.

One final note. By far the largest majority of fires in our town and in the surrounding towns are the result of improper installation or use of wood burning appliances (fireplaces and stoves). Wood heat is safe, but all the rules of safety must be followed or you are courting potential fire danger. The department is happy to inspect any wood burning appliances for safety and make recommendations for new installations. Don't hesitate to call. REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF AND TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Forest fire control in New Hampshire is a joint state and town/city responsibility (RSA 224).

The Director, Division of Forest and Lands (State Forester) appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town/city upon the recommendation of local authorities.

The local forest fire warden is responsible for forest fire prevention and suppression activities in his town. He regulates the kindling of outside fires when the ground is not covered with snow by the issuance of written permits only when conditions are safe. He is responsible for suppression with the town/city and state sharing the cost. Suppression costs in excess of $\frac{1}{4}$ of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town are assumed by the state.

The state provides training for the local fire organization and helps coordinate activities between towns/cities. The state also supports local forces with backup personnel, equipment, and supplies for suppression and prevention.

This combination of state and local cooperation, started in 1893, works well, for New Hampshire has enjoyed one of the smallest acreage losses due to forest fires in the United States for the past 25 years.
