The Annual Report for 1981 is being dedicated to a Hill man who for the past fifty years has given an untold number of hours of time and service to this community.

In November, 1931, this man came to Hill and purchased a business known as the J. W. Ladd Mfg. Co. This soft-spoken young man was Edward Daggett Amsden. Mr. Amsden soon became known by many folks in Town through his business dealings and his participation in the Tripeak Grange and was called Ed by both young and old.

In November, 1933, Ed took Margaret Tolman as his bride. Ed and Mig, as she was called, rented a home in the Old Village and during the following years became parents of three sons, Henry, Robert and John.

It would take a large book to tell all of the things Ed has done for the Town and the people who have lived in Hill during these past fifty years, so the following are just a few of the highlights.

Ed served as Selectman for many terms and then as Town Auditor. He has prepared the Annual Town Report for about as long as most can remember. When the Old Town had to be evacuated for the Flood Control Dam, Ed became a driving force to move the Town to a new location. Many of the long-time residents feel that if it had not been for Ed and his enthusiasm, the Town would not have been moved and the Town of Hill would not be here today. Ed joined the Fire Department many years ago and was the one everyone would call in the event of a fire or other emergency. Even now Ed is often the first to respond to a fire call or other emergency. Ed is one of four of Hill's registered EMT's.

For many years Ed served as organist for the Hill Village Union Church and served as a member of the building committee.

Ed has served on the Hill Budget Committee for many years and at meetings you will hear someone say "What do you think, Ed?".

In more recent years Ed has completed the Tax Map covering the entire Town, and has been active on the Board of Adjustment.

Ed has never been known to say "No" to anyone who needed help or advice. Therefore, it is most fitting and proper that for 1981, Ed's fiftieth anniversary in Hill, the Annual Town Report be dedicated to this Fine Gentleman.

#### TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hill in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hill on TUESDAY, MARCH 9, 1982, at 10:00 AM to vote on the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #8 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town of Hill Zoning Ordinance as follows:

> This Amendment, in order to comply with Chap. 406, Laws of 1981, would revise Article IV, Section D, to permit by special exception mobile homes in mobile home subdivisions containing at least 25 acres in the Rural Residential District, with the same lot size, frontage requirements, space limitations and other applicable requirements as for conventional single-family housing in said District.

POLLS WILL BE OPEN AT 10:00 AM AND WILL NOT BE CLOSED BEFORE 6:00 PM

THE BUSINESS MEETING to consider the remaining articles of this Warrant will open at the Town Hall, in said Hill on THURSDAY, MARCH 11,<sup>982</sup> 7:00 PM to act upon the following articles:

3. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the general government expenses of the Town for the ensuing year.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on behalf of the Town by the issuance of notes in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act sums in anticipation of taxes for the year 1982, said notes to be payable from taxes within one year from the date of issuance, and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effectuate the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such notes as shall be in the best interest of the Town of Hill. 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate anticipated Revenue Sharing receipts for the calendar year 1982 amounting to \$9,368.00 and place this amount in the Capital Reserve Fund - Replace 1973 GMC Highway Truck.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$2,000.00 from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund and to deposit said sum in Capital Reserve Fund -Replace 1976 Chevrolet Pickup Truck.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$2,000.00 from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund and to deposit said sum in Capital Reserve Fund -Replace Case Loader.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$1,000.00 from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund and to deposit said sum in Capital Reserve Fund -Police Cruiser.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$4,000.00 from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund and to deposit said sum in Capital Reserve Fund -Fire Equipment.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw a sum not to exceed \$1,200.00 from Capital Reserve Revaluation for the purpose of property reappraisals.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to repair and reset broken and fallen headstones in the public cemeteries of the Town and to provide and repair gates and fences for such cemeteries as required by law; and further to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund the sum of \$2,000.00 and apply said sum toward the cost of said repairs referred to above.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$38,260.90 for the purchase of a new or good used highway truck; and to authorize a committee consisting of the Board of Selectmen, the Road Agent, and five other voters to oversee the purchase of said truck, and to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from Capital Reserve Fund for replacement of 1973 GMC truck the sum of \$36,260.90 and to apply said sum toward the cost of the said highway truck. 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell by sealed bid at public auction, or trade in, the 1973 GMC highway truck at a minimum price of \$2,000.00 and to apply said sum toward the cost of the highway truck referred to in Article 12 above.

14. To see if the Town will vote to adopt semiannual Tax Collections as provided by Chapter 76:15b RSA, to become effective on April 1, 1983.

15. "Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:43-f for the adjusted elderly exemptions from property tax? These statutes provide for the following exemptions, based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers: for a person 65 years of age up to 75 years, \$10,000; for a person 75 years of age up to 80 years, \$15,000; for a person 80 years of age or older, \$20,000. To qualify, the person must have been a NH resident for at least 5 years; own the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by his spouse, they must have been married for at least 5 years. In addition, the taxpayers must have a net income of less than \$10,000 or if married a combined net income of less than \$12,000, and own net assets of \$30,000 or less, excluding the value of the person's residence."

16. To see if the Town will vote to approve and accept an addition to the present Fire Station, said addition to be paid for entirely by members of the Hill Volunteer Fire Department. The building of this addition will be done by department members and volunteers.

17. To see if the Town will vote to designate as a scenic road that portion of Murray Hill Road extending easterly from the Danbury line to the easterly boundary of land on Murray Hill Road now owned by Rachel P. Gordon (Tax Map Lot R7-15), this designation being in accordance with the procedure under RSA 253.

18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make application for, accept and expend on behalf of the Town all gifts, advances, grants in aid or other funds as may now or hereafter be available or forthcoming from the United States Government, State of New Hampshire, or any other federal, state or local agency as provided under RSA 31:95B. 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for repairs to bridges.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

This year has been one of upgrading equipment and planning for future growth and demands placed on the department. The repairs on the vehicles are on schedule and all the work planned for, with a few minor exceptions, has been completed.

The trucks are in very good condition, with the exception of Tank 1, which is in running condition but has many major problems.

The department has accomplished all it had set out to do this year and a little extra, thanks to the support of the town's people and the extra effort of the department members. Having had the support of the town has generated a good volunteer spirit within the department.

The members have voted, subject to approval by the town, to raise the necessary funds to put on a much-needed meeting and training room as an addition to the station at no cost to the taxpayers.

Through donations and fund raising events put on by members of the Fire Department and Ladies Auxiliary, several special funds have been established. At present the Sally Bean Memorial Fund has been used to provide the Rescue Squad with equipment and supplies. The Clyde Rounds Memorial Fund has been used for this purpose also.

This past year the Department lost a respected and dedicated member in the passing of Fletcher Forsyth. It was his wish that any who wished should make contributions to a fund for use in purchasing needed medical supplies and equipment for the Rescue Squad. This fund has been named the Fletcher Forsyth Medical Memorial Fund.

From monies earned by the Department members and Ladies Auxiliary a Firemen's Relief Fund has also been established to aid those members who experience more than casual or short-termdisabilities encountered outside Fire Department duties.

This past year also provided the start of the Neighborhood Watch Program and we hope this year will include even more participation from the Hill community.

The members of the Hill Police Department would again like to thank the Hill community for its support of the Department during a very trying year. Chief Anderson would like to take this opportunity to thank Officers Leo Corliss and Lawrence Bucklin for donating their time in checking property on Murray Hill Road and Cass Mill Road.

Chief Anderson would also like to thank Deputy Chief Martin Judd, Officers Douglas Wilcox and Thomas Jacobs for "hanging in there" when we were down in man power and the pressure was grave.

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### ANNUAL SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING MINUTES

Pursuant to the attached Warrant, the Annual School District meeting was held at the Town Hall on Tuesday, March 3, 1981, at 7:30 p.m.

The meeting was opened by Rev. James Quimby, Moderator. The Moderator waived the reading of the warrant and it was not challenged by the assembly.

- Article 1. It was voted that the salaries of School Board and Truant Officer and other officers and agents of the District be fixed according to the printed town report.
- Article 2. It was voted that the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers be accepted as printed.

Article 3. It was voted to accept Article 3 as printed.

- Article 4. It was voted to authorize the school board to contract with a qualified independent auditing firm or the Department of Revenue Administration for the fiscal year financial audit in accordance with RSA 197:14(Supp.).
- Article 5. It was voted to authorize the school board to make application for, accept, and expend during the 1981-1982 school year on behalf of the District all gifts, advances, grants-in-aid, revenue sharing funds or any other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be available or forthcoming from the United States Government, the State of New Hampshire or any of its municipalities or any other state, local or federal agency.
- Article 6. It was voted to authoirze the school board to take such action on behalf of the district as may be required to join as a party plaintiff in a suit against New Hampshire and proper officials thereof to compel the state to provide funds for the school districts for the purposes of more nearly equalizing the opportunities for children to receive a basic education and to see what amount the district will raise and appropriate for this purpose.
- Article 7. It was voted to authorize the school board to transfer \$500 to the Capital Reserve Fund from any unexpended funds from 1980-1981 appropriation if there are unexpended funds.

Article 8. Motion made by George Wilson, seconded by Russell Docteur that the figure of \$275,603.00 be accepted as the budget for the coming year. After a lengthy discussion, an amendment was made by William Cummings that the total figure by \$271,643.00 or \$3,960.00 less than the original figure.

Vote by paper ballot - 27 yes; 20 no.

Voted as amended. Voted to accept \$271,643.00 as the budget for year 1981-1982.

Article 9. A rising vote of thanks was given Frederick Thomson for his many years of service. George Wilson, on behalf of the school board, presented Mr. Thomson with a plaque in appreciation of 13 years of service to school district.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9 P.M.

To the Citizens of Hill:

Maintaining quality education with increasing inflation and decreasing revenues has proven to be the challenge facing educators today. The federal and state regulations have not decreased though revenues have. We have seen changes in special education revenues this past year that directly effect the tax dollars.

For example reimbursement for special education costs under the former laws (RSA 186-A), all amounts in excess of twice the state average tuition were paid back to the local districts. However, the legislature has passed a new Special Education law (RSA 186-C) and now pays Hill a sum of \$5000.00. This figure is based on a fixed number of special needs students and without regard to actual costs. The state does however, permit reimbursement for amounts expended in excess of \$9000.00 per child for special education programs.

Our school district provides special education services for ten (10) students within the District. Learning disabled and mild mentally retarded students are receiving specialized instructional help with the cooperative efforts of the classroom teachers, resource teacher and itinerant specialists within the school district. The related service of occupational therapy is continuing for certain educationally handicapped students, given by Ms. Chamberlain, Certified Occupational Therapy Assistant.

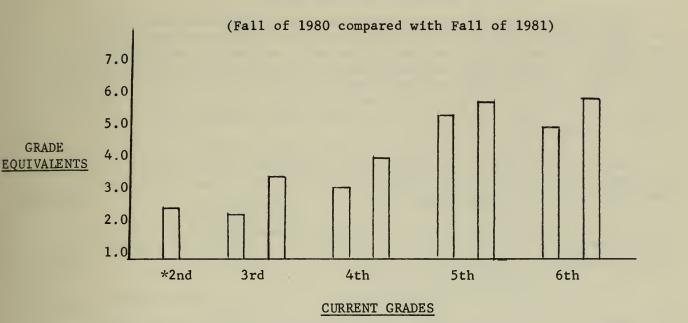
Three of our students are enrolled in Twin-City Special Education Regional Programs. The Hill School District has joined with Franklin and Laconia to provide regional special classes for students of low incidence handicaps. These programs include classes for the emotionally disturbed and for school aged multiply-handicapped students. One of our students is being educated by a program offered in the Laconia School District. No students have been placed in private residential schools.

#### Testing Program

Twice each year we administer the Stanford Diagnostic Reading and Mathematics Test to students in grades two through six.

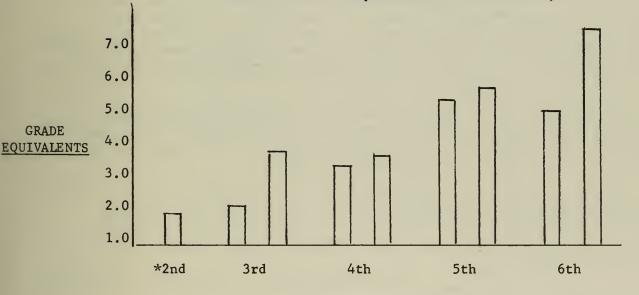
The charts on the following page represent the growth in skills that have occurred over one year by the same students.

#### Accountability Program

Last May the fourth grade students were tested for the first time, on the state-mandate accountability tests. They were tested in the areas of New Hampshire History and Government, United States History and Government, Mathematics, Language Arts and writing. The complete and detailed results of the tests are available to anyone upon request of the Principal. However, we are very pleased with the stated average skills and knowledge of our students. You have every right to be proud of the accomplishments of the Jennie D. Blake School.

It was found that 91% of the students performed at the mastery level on the Language Arts and Reading tests. Ninety percent of the fourth graders demonstrated mastery of writing skills.

Mastery of New Hampshire History and Government as well as mastery of United States History and Government knowledge was achieved by 63% of the fourth graders.

Mastery of Mathematics was achieved by 87% of the fourth graders.

Based on the analysis of the overall results, the Hill School Board, administrators and teachers developed a "plan" (management plan) for improving all areas of the curriculum. The "plan" will detail a method for curriculum improvement.

## Completion of District's Priorities

You may recall the School Board in 1979 adopted a three year plan to revitalize the programs in the Jennie D. Blake School. It called for updating the language arts, mathematics, science, physical education, social studies and study skills program. We are happy to report to you that these programs are now current through hard work by the teachers and your support of inservice programs and related budgetary items.

A second goal was to increase community involvement in the school through an active school volunteer program. Meeting this particular goal has been a real challenge. With the changes in the economy requiring two incomes, volunteers have not been readily available.

However, with funds from the Mott Foundation and dedicated efforts of Mrs. Carolyn Wilson, a volunteer program is a reality and many positive things are happening in our school. We very much appreciate her efforts and that of all school volunteers this past year who have assisted our professional staff.

#### Energy Project

The energy conservation work on the Jennie D. Blake School has been completed. New storm windows, insulation in the ceilings, electronic timing on the heating system and a vestibule will realize a savings in energy costs. We will be able to give you those costs in our report next year. However, preliminary evidence of a savings indicates that an increase in the oil budget for next year is not going to be necessary. We have budgeted the same figure and hope to expend less.

## The Budget

The 1982-83 proposed budget listed near the end of this book reflects no program changes or growth. We have presented a maintenance budget for your consideration and action. The overall budget presented to the Budget Committee reflects a net increase \$43,013.00. The major areas of increase are as follows:

The remaining increase of \$1,160.00 of the total overall \$43,013.00 increase is scattered throughout the budget.

Pride seems to be the key word in summarizing the school year of 1981-82. The Jennie D. Blake School may be a small, rural school but we have accomplished many tasks that we are very proud of.

Our staff consists of four teachers. Susan Brewster, who is our Resource Teacher and also serves as a part-time Title I Tutor, is a native of Hill, having gone to school here and is still residing here. Mrs. JoAnne Petelle teaches the 3rd and 4th grade home room. Mrs. Petelle previously taught in Warren, New Hampshire and currently resides in Tilton. Mrs. Georgette Huckins still holds down the fort in grades 1 and 2. Despite the large size of her class this year (27) she still manages to do a fantastic job of combining both academic and social growth. In addition to serving as Principal, I teach grades 5 and 6. It is my task to get our students ready to enter Junior High School.

Our volunteer program is still going strong. We are currently in our first year of a three year grant that allows us to pay a volunteer coordinator. Our coordinator is Carolyn Wilson. Because of her fine efforts, we have been the recipient of many volunteer hours, and we have also had our cafeteria decorated with a beautiful hand-painted mural. The mural, a rural farm scene, was done entirely by Hill residents with inspirations by our students. It is people like our volunteers who make this a school that we can be proud of.

The Spring will be an exciting time of year for us. Not only will Dudley Laufman be coming to do contra dances with our students, but the New Hampshire Symphony Orchestra will be performing for our students in the Town Hall. Our sixth graders will be getting ready for their class trip to the Boston Museum of science and the New England Aquarium.

As you can see, we have a lot to be proud about. Sharing with us in our pride are Nancy Byers, Marge Wallace, and Irene Rayno- who work in our cafeteria; Mr. Ralph Scholl, our school custodian; Mrs. Priscilla Toshack, P.T.O. President; and the staff at the School Administrative Unit Eighteen office.

We all work hard so that the residents of Hill can be proud of their Jennie D. Blake School.

## POLICY ON NON DISCRIMINATION
