THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Landaff in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Landaff on Tuesday the eighth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for T. R. A. highways, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

5. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

6. To see if the town will vote a discount of two per cent on taxes paid on or before July 1, and one per cent September 1.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for control of white pine blister rust in Landaff. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate to the White Mountains Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of our town, together with other towns in the region, a sum not to exceed 10 cents per \$1000. of the assessed valuation of the town for 1948.

9. To see what action the town will take in regard to buying a new truck and finance the same.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of the School Board

To the Landaff School District:

In accordance with a resolution passed at the District Meeting, March 9, 1948, the School Board investigated the possibilities of having a five grade school at the Blue School with other grades going to Lisbon. When we discovered that it would not increase the expenses of the District, we decided to try this plan. On the whole, we feel that the experiment has been a success. The group at Blue is more homogeneous and with fewer classes, the teacher can devote more time to them.

Due to the distances involved, transportation has not been entirely satisfactory. However we are fortunate to have two new buses which are safe and comfortable and drivers who are careful and responsible.

We have granted the use of the Center School house to the Sunrise 4-H Club for its meetings. We feel that the purposes of the 4-H Club are truly educational and that no better use could be made of the schoolhouse while it is not being used for a school. We hope that the District will approve this action.

Codliver oil has been supplied to the children at Blue School since early in the fall. Under the direction of Mrs. Robert Poore, the school lunch program is functioning successfully. She is giving a great deal of time and effort which is to be appreciated. Donations of food and money by people of the town have been helpful. Dr. Clark has examined the teeth of the children and remedial work will start in February.

There is a decrease in the amount required for the budget this year. Expenses are not decreasing but there is a surplus which can be used. Although the Blue Schoolhouse needs shingling, no other major improvements are necessary. More playground equipment will be set up in the spring.

Two of your members have visited Blue School and one has visited the elementary grades at Lisbon. For the most part we found conditions satisfactory and students making progress according to their abilities.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Landaff:

I herewith submit my sixth annual report as Superintendent of Schools:

The total enrollment in your schools last year was 32. The average membership was 27.36 and the percentage of attendance was 90.40. There were 11 pupils attending Lisbon High School. Twelve pupils attended Lisbon Elementary School.

This year the total enrollment in the Blue School is 24. Fifteen pupils are attending Lisbon Elementary School and six are attending Lisbon High School.

This is Mrs. Veda Aiken's fourth year as teacher at the Blue School. This year we have the first five grades in the Blue School. Mrs. Aiken is able to concentrate all of her energy on primary work. I believe that your children are getting a better foundation in their school work.

Miss Blanchard has visited the school every three weeks for music.

The new busses seem to be working out well. Mr. Bronson and Mr. Daniels are careful and considerate drivers.

A new toilet was purchased and installed in the school. Seats were moved to the light side of the room allowing space for a library table and other activities. The interior of the building is newly painted and redecorated.

Your school board is to be commended for its interest and effort to give each Landaff child a good education.

I appreciate the cooperation shown by your school officials, the teacher and the community of Landaff.
