

TOWN MEETING WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Monroe in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Monroe on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what action the town will take in regard to the report of the Budget Committee as submitted.
- 4. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time they appraise the property to be taxed.
- 5. To see what action the town will take in regard to real estate taken over for non-payment of taxes.
- 6. To see if the voters will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding \$90,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name and on the credit of the town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year from taxes collected within the current municipal year.

- 7. To see what action the town will take in regard to keeping a physician in town.
- 8. To see what action the town will take in regard to keeping a recreational director in town.
- 9. To see what action the town will take to appoint a committee to make a study of a water system.
- 10. To hear reports of all committees and officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Bookmobile from the N. H. State Library continues to make regular trips to our Library, but because of the cut in State appropriations it carries only children's books. For that reason we have not bought as many children's books as some years.

We wish to thank all the people who have given books and magazines to the Library during the past year.

The adult classes sponsored by the Library have been very well attended. The sewing classes, beginners being taught by Mrs. Kaye and advanced students by Mrs. Sargent of Woodsville, have been completed, and other craft classes are in progress. A woodcarving class is held every Monday night at the school house. Last August this group was asked by the League of N. H. Arts & Crafts to demonstrate their work at their annual fair at the Belknap Recreation Area in Gilford. A market is opening for woodcarved articles.

Classes in weaving, with Miss Lily Hoffman as teacher, rug hooking, taught by Mrs. Madelaine Wells, and stencilling, with Mrs. Lois Greer as teacher, are held twice a month and will continue through the Spring. There are still openings for new members in these classes.

The new library table and six new chairs for the children's part of the Library are a decided addition.

- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

TEACHERS AND PUPILS:

Several changes have occurred, since last June, in the teaching staff of the Monroe Consolidated School.

Miss Connolly, after many years of service in Monroe, resigned to accept the principalship of a much larger school in Milford, New Hampshire. Miss Leota Whitcomb resigned to take a position in Milford, also. These resignations caused vacancies, not only in the positions of principal and teacher in grades VII and VIII, but also in shop, art, home economics, and lunch supervisor.

Mr. Eugene W. Carver of Raymond, Maine, a graduate of Cortland Teachers College, New York, was employed as principal, and teacher of social studies, art and shop in the upper grades. Mr. Carver taught last year at Eliot Junior High School in Eliot, Maine.

Mrs. Mildred Daniell, previously teaching grades V and VI in Monroe, accepted the VII and VIII grade position, as well as the work of Supervisor of the school lunch program and home economics instructor. Mrs. Daniell has also developed a class in craft work for the girls which has proven both instructive and popular.

Miss Margaret Downing of West Franklin, New Hampshire, was selected to replace Mrs. Daniell in grades V and VI. She is a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, class of 1949.

The enrollment of pupils remains quite constant, there having been a total of 101 in the combined grades of the elementary and secondary schools last year, while for the present school year, 97 are enrolled. A slight change in the time schedule of the elementary school has greatly relieved a long period of waiting between bus arrival and school opening, with the added convenience of the pupils reaching home earlier at night.

BUILDING AND GROUNDS:

A long range repair program was started by sanding and refinishing the auditorium floor. The same type of work is planned for the floors throughout the building, to be accomplished at the rate of two rooms per year. These floors were left undone during the war years, and are badly in need of refinishing. New sewer pipe was laid to relieve the clogged condition existing last year. As this is sealed iron, it should permanently prevent the ingrowth of tree roots which had caused much trouble in the past.

It was with regret that the Board accepted the resignation of Mr. Lewis Wright as janitor of the Monroe Consolidated School building. Because of ill health, Mr. Wright felt that he should give up this work. I would like to add a word of praise for the efficient and loyal manner in which Mr. Wright did his work. He was a part of the system and the system was also a part of his life.

Mr. Frank Gibson was employed to replace Mr. Wright and is efficiently continuing to do the work of school custodian.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

The loss of Lottie M. B. Underhill, R. N., who was taken from our school system by death last March, was keenly felt by the administration. Only expressions of praise are written in the files of Superintendents Page, Janes, Martin, Douglass, and myself, all of whom she served during the years of her active service in this Union.

Miss Helen D. Latulippe, a graduate of Mary Hitchcock School of Nursing, and of Simmons College School of Public Nursing was obtained to fill the position left vacant. Miss Latulippe is a resident of Plymouth, New Hampshire. The efficient manner in which she has taken over the work of School Nurse is commendable. The Union is fortunate in securing one with such qualifications and experience.

The loss of State Aid, in the several school districts of this Union, has made it necessary for the districts to curtail any immediate plans for a cooperative secondary school, as such plans depend somewhat upon both building aid and transportation aid from either the state or federal level, or both.

CONCLUSION:

My personal appreciation of the sincere interest of the members of the School Board in promoting the pupils' welfare and progress; of the professional integrity and loyalty of the teachers, and of the assistance and cooperation of the citizens of the district in general is hereby gratefully acknowledged.
