# TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Durham in the County of Strafford, in said State qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said New Durham on Tuesday, the twelfth (12th) day of March, next at twelve of the clock, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

And you are hereby further notified to meet at said Town Hall in said New Durham at seventhirty o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 2. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the town will adopt N. H. RSA 149-3 of the State Water Pollution Control Law. This Law to be administered by the Health Officer whenever the State control may terminate.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove in its discretion new subdivisions and plots thereof showing streets, or the widening thereof, or parks, and upon the adoption of this Article, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Strafford County Register of Deeds a certificate or note showing that the said Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of authorization, as provided in Section 19, and Sections 20-29 inclusive, Chapter 36 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. If this Article is adopted, it shall further be the duty of the Town Clerk to issue all certificates of failure when the Planning Board shall fail to take action as provided in Chapter 36: Sections 19, 20-29 inclusive.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint an Inspector of Buildings who shall hold office for a term of one year, and by vote fix and regulate his compensation as authorized by Section 1, Chapter 156, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will vote to increase the Town Officers' Expenses by \$100.00 to pay mileage of the Building Inspector.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will vote to adopt the Building Regulations as authorized under Sections 2-5 inclusive, Chapter 156, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. (Copy of which is published in current Town Report.)

ARTICLE 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to let the old School building to the "200" Youth Club. (By Request)

ARTICLE 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to lease the old School building to the Alton Veterans of Foreign Wars. (By Request)

ARTICLE 10. To see if the town will vote to discontinue winter plowing on Cameron Road.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the town will vote to trade the International truck and raise and appropriate \$3500.00 - \$2500.00 of which will be on serial notes payable \$1000.00 in 1969; \$1000.00 in 1970 and \$500.00 in 1971.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as are necessary to defray the expenses of town government for the ensuing year in accordance with the recommendations of the Budget Committee.

ARTICLE 13. To hear reports of any standing committees.

ARTICLE 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

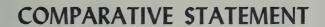

During 1967, in the performance of their duties, the officers worked 811 hours and traveled 7,315 miles. They answered 121 complaints, made 12 criminal investigations, covered 11 accidents, and rendered 52 aids to individuals and other departments.

They logged 464 hours on patrol, 59 hours in office, 23 hours in Court, 23 hours on training, 54 hours on special details, 27 hours on aid rendered, 99 hours on complaint investigations, 49 hours on criminal investigations, and 13 hours on accident investigations.

They made 2 arrests, issued 13 summons, 166 warnings, made 66 checkups, and recommended 4 license suspensions. They also checked 590 buildings while on duty.

# REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

After several successive years of drought, the rains of 1967 came as a welcome change. Our record of the past fire season is good. Our thanks to all who contributed to achieve this good record. Continued improvement in the matter of accurate, prompt detection and rapid effective suppression action can help to maintain this good, worthwhile record even though we do not have an abundance of rain as in the fire season of 1967.

It will help if we follow these simple suggestions:

- 1. No burning of debris and waste between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. and then only with a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.
- 2. Take debris and waste to the town dump.
- 3. Maintain a clean, safe dump.
- 4. Keep matches away from young children.
- 5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.
- 6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.

# BUILDING REGULATIONS FOR ADOPTION BY 1968 TOWN MEETING AS PREPARED BY NEW DURHAM PLANNING BOARD

- The Inspector of Buildings shall be appointed by the Selectmen annually and shall be administrative officer of this ordinance. He shall receive applications and fees for the erection or alteration of buildings and electric wiring thereof as provided in this ordinance; shall keep complete records of all applications and his action on the applications; promptly survey and inspect all buildings, alterations or uses proposed, accept and deposit with the Town Treasurer all fees collected by him under this ordinance, and may issue permits for erection, alteration, or remodeling of all buildings, and the use of land, if in his opinion the proposal complies with the law of the State, this ordinance, and other town ordinances and by-laws. provided that in any instance where license or permit fees for uses are required his permits shall constitute only an approval on which the proper authority may issue a license on payment of required fees; any other duties prescribed by law, shall act in cooperation with the fire warden in any matter in which their duties as prescribed by law may coincide or conflict; and shall take such action in the enforcement of this ordinance as may be directed by the Selectmen.
- 2. No building construction shall be started; no alterations of existing buildings of an estimated value of more than \$300 undertaken, and no buildings shall be put to any different use than on the day of enactment of this ordinance until a permit thereof has been issued under the terms of this ordinance.
- 3. No application for a permit required by this ordinance shall receive action by the Building Inspector unless made in writing. All applications for a permit to build, construct, alter or remodel any building shall be accompanied by a sketch or plan of the proposed building or alterations, and a statement of its intended use when built, constructed, altered or remodeled. Fees for each permit issued are as follows:

Alterations and new structure construction valued between \$301 and \$2,000 — \$1.00 fee.

Alterations and new structure construction valued \$2,001 and up — \$5.00 per unit.

A building permit shall become void unless operations are commenced within six (6) months from date of approval, unless such time is extended by the building official.

- 4. The Building Inspector shall receive the above fees plus  $10\phi$  per mile, from General Funds, for necessary travel.
- 5. Upon receiving such application the Building Inspector shall promptly take such action as may be indicated in the way of investigation or public hearings and acquaint himself with the merits of the application. He may, without judging the application on its merits, refer the application to the Board of Adjustment. If, however, he finds the proposed building, alteration, or use of buildings to conform with the law and this ordinance he may at once issue the permit in writing over his signature. If he finds the proposal in any conflict with the law or this ordinance, he shall fix whatever restrictions or conditions on the proposed construction or use as may be in his best judgment, right and proper, or for reasonable cause refuse the permit.
- 6. No building or structure shall be erected, altered, rebuilt, substantially repaired, or remodeled unless in compliance with the following:
- a. Commercial Building. No building intended or designed to be used for industrial, commercial, or other public use shall be erected, altered, or used for any purpose which does not provide non-combustible walls and partitions between its component parts.
- b. *Exits*. No building intended or designed for any public use or congregation of people shall be erected, altered, or used for any purpose which does not provide adequate exits, as described in Chapter 156 and Chapter 155, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, and in the regulations of N. H. Fire Marshal's office.\* All inhabitable buildings must have at least two exits.

c. Garages. No public garage for the storage of five (5) or more automobiles, or having any service or repair enterprises connected therewith, shall be erected, altered, or enlarged unless the building is so constructed, or the proposed alterations, enlargements or extension shall be of slow-burning or non-combustible material, except that

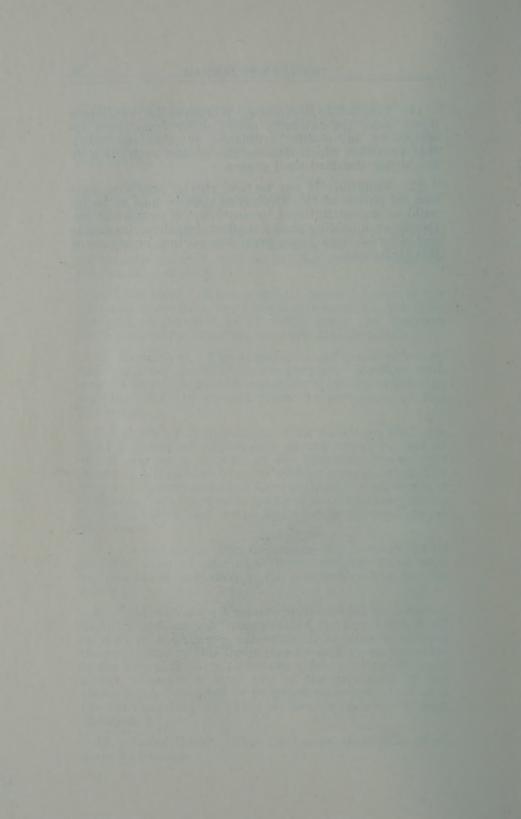
use of automatic sprinklers may obviate the use of such slow-burning or non-combustible materials.

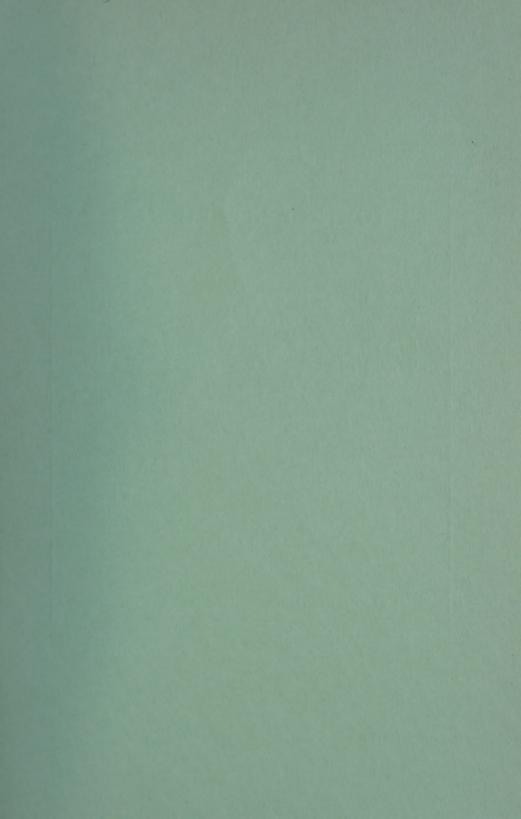
- d. *Roofs*. No roof of any building shall be covered or recovered in whole or in part save with non-combustible or fire resistant roofing materials.
- e. *Fire-stops*. No building of wood or other combustible material shall be erected, altered, remodeled, or enlarged without providing fire-stops in every combustible wall or partition, at every floor and between floor joints at every partition.
- f. Chimney Construction. Chimneys shall extend at least 3 feet above the highest point where it passes through the roof of a building and at least 2 feet higher than any portion of the building within 10 feet. No chimney shall be built, erected, or altered below the roof unless containing a tile or brick lining, or Underwriters Laboratory approved material and with an iron clean-out door at or near its base. If chimney is altered or rebuilt chimney shall have tile or brick lining or Underwriters Laboratory approved material from point of alteration upward. No chimney or fireplace shall have its base rest on any floor or beam of combustible material.
- g. Thimbles. No wall paper or other combustible material shall be laid over any thimble or thimble hole in any chimney.
- h. Smoke Pipes. No smoke pipes shall be installed or erected so as to be within 16 inches of any combustible floor or ceiling, unless amply protected with non-combustible material. No smoke pipe shall be installed or erected which passes into or through partitions or walls of combustible material except when guarded by a double collar of metal with air space of at least 5 inches of brick or other non-combustible material between the pipe and the combustible material.
- i. *Electric Wiring*. All electrical wiring shall conform with approved methods and practices for safety to life and property. Compliance with the National Electrical Code, as published by the National Board of Underwriters, shall be *prima facie* evidence of such approved methods and practices.
- j. Foundations. All structures shall be set on cement, brick, stone, or other acceptable masonry on suitable footing, except that in special cases where buildings are to be used for camp or accessory use the Building Inspector may waive the requirements of this section and permit the use

of wood, metal or masonry piers with suitable footing. All buildings and mobile homes used as dwellings will be enclosed at base. The Building Inspector may waiver this provision if, in his opinion, safety and an orderly appearance results.

- k. *Minimum Building Area*. Every dwelling unit to be used by a single family shall have a minimum floor area of 500 square feet.
- l. Outside Walls. Shall be constructed of material commonly used for outside construction and materials customarily painted shall be painted within 3 years of construction of walls.
- m. Sewerage. When a public sewer system is not available a private sewage disposal is required. The type, size and construction of all septic tanks and drainage fields shall be approved by the town Health Officer.
- n. *Exceptions*. The construction of small accessory buildings not used for living purposes, together with minor alterations, repairs and general upkeep of existing buildings shall be exempt from the provisions of this Ordinance.
- 7. Board of Adjustment. The Selectmen shall appoint a Board of Adjustment of five members, one of whom may be a member of the Planning Board, said Board of Adjustment to serve without compensation. The Board of Adjustment shall have authority to allow slight variances from the specific terms of the Ordinance, where it can be shown that unnecessary hardship would otherwise result.
- 8. Amendment. This Ordinance may be amended by majority vote of any legal town meeting when such amendment is published in the warrant calling for the meeting.
- 9. Enforcement. Upon any well-founded information that this Ordinance is being violated, the Selectmen, shall, on their own initiative, take immediate steps to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance by seeking an injuction in the Superior Court or by any other appropriate legal action. Whoever violates any of the provisions of the above regulations shall be punished upon conviction by a fine not exceeding ten (\$10) dollars for each day of each violation.
- 10. Takes Effect. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

- 11. Conflicting Provisions. Whenever the regulations made under the authority hereof differ from those described by any statute, ordinance, or other regulation, that provision which imposes the greater restriction or the higher standard shall govern.
- 12. Validity. If any section, clause, provision, portion, or phrase of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent authority such holding shall not effect, impair or invalidate any other section, clause, provision, portion, or phrase of this Ordinance.
