#### TOWN WARRANT

#### The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the Twelfth of March next, at 9:30 A.M., the polls to close not earlier than 5:30 P.M., to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of Highways and Bridges.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$686.44 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute the sum of \$4.576.27.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance and tarring of Class V Roads.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a portion of the Capital Reserve Fund to alter, reconstruct and improve a part of the road leading from Chase Corner. so-called, to the former Fiske School.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for purchase of Forest Fire Equipment.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of Hospitals.

- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Old Cemeteries.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Village Cemetery, and for clearing and grading the land given by Robert Blood for expansion of the cemetery grounds.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds.
- 15. To see what the Town will vote to do in regard to disposing of the Joseph Lachance property.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for improvement of the Gordon Hill Road.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new truck, applying an old truck towards the cost of the new one, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a snow plow for the grader and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,732.50 for payment of principal and interest on the grader note.
- 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to complete the Slide Evasion Road.

- 22. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue, subject to gates and bars, the road being replaced by the Slide Evasion Road.
- 23. To see if the Town desires to make any repairs upon the Town House and raise and appropriate money for the same.

- 25. (By Request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$199.10 for the Lakes Region Association.

### ANNUAL REPORT of the SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of the New Hampton School District:

I herewith submit my third annual report as your Superintendent of Schools:

### Personnel Changes

Mr. Giles Low, Jr. was employed as principal and teacher of grades 6, 7 and 8 replacing Mr. Edmund Sullivan, who left New Hampton to accept a position in the North Adams Teachers College Training School. Mr. Low is a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College and has taken graduate work at Keene Teachers College and the University of New Hampshire. Mr. Low has taught at Epping, and Warren, N.H.

Mrs. Eleanor Hall was employed to teach grades 4 and 5. Mrs. Hall replaces Mrs. Dorothy Eckels. Mrs. Hall is a graduate of Keene Teachers College. She has had several years of experience teaching at Jefferson, and Whitefield, N.H.

At the annual School Meeting last year, it was voted to appropriate funds to employ a half-time assistant to the principal. Mrs. Nancy Lamb was employed to fill this position. She works during the morning hours, during which time the principal is free for the handling of bookkeeping of the School Lunch Program, pupil conferences, health problems, and supervision of teachers. Mrs. Lamb is a graduate of Clark University and attended the New England Conservatory of Music. Mrs. Lamb has taught in Rutland, and Auburn, Mass.

Mrs. Ida Sirrine continues as teacher of grades 1 and 2. Mrs. Doris Tatham continues as teacher of grade 3.

Mrs. Beatrice Nordholm continues as Music Supervisor. Mrs. Helen Bellavance continues as School Nurse.

### School Budget

The School Board's estimate for the 1957 - 58 school year is \$66,809.46. The estimated expenditures for the current year are \$59,529.46.

### Teachers' Salaries

Teachers' salaries continue to increase. The beginning teachers from Keene and Plymouth Teachers Colleges this year were getting salaries of \$3,000. Beginning teachers for September 1957 are now asking for \$3,200. In order to keep experienced teachers in our system, we must continue to give sizeable increases.

### NEW HAMPTON COMMUNITY SCHOOL PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The expected enrollment for the year 1957 - 58 is 103, or an increase of two students. However, if this year has been any indication, it would be well to expect added students during the year as new families take residence in the town.

Perhaps the school's greatest advancement this year has been the addition of a part-time teacher. In so doing, the school has enabled the principal to spend more time than has previously been possible in dealing with the many problems, routine and otherwise, that make up the administrative program. Attempting a full day of teaching and the usual complement of administrative tasks is almost an impossibility. As a usual rule one or the other must suffer. Since the student is of primary importance, the daily classroom activity receives the emphasis of the teaching-principal's time, leaving an unfortunately inadequate period for the amount of attention demanded by an efficient administrative and supervisory program. With a new staff member to relieve him of a certain amount of classroom duties, as has been the case this year, a satisfactory amount of time has been provided for office work and supervision.

The science program has been found sadly lacking or non-existent. In this scientific age, such a course should have major emphasis in our curriculum. A study is now being made to determine how we can best improve this area of learning. One almost feels, in looking at the school day, that there is all too much to be achieved in so short a time. The school does not, at present, appear to hold the scholastic achievement that seems possible. Several years of intensive effort in all areas of study should bring it to a higher scholastic standing.

The overheating problem that has bothered the school since its construction, is still evident. Jacketing the hot water pipes with asbestos undoubtedly would correct building temperatures and lower fuel consumption.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the P.T.A., the Gordon Nash Library, and the many individuals whose interest has contributed so much to the school's well being.
