The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote on Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, and polls to close at six P. M., to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To choose a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.
- 6. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the Construction of Class II roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,273.50.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$94.00 for the Cemeteries.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$940.00 for Street Lighting.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$94.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Northwood Public Library.

- 11. To see if the Town will vote a discount on such part of taxes as paid on or before July 15, 1948.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Interest on Temporary Loans.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$84.93 (1/100 of one per cent of the Town valuation based on the 1947 assessment) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with the other thirty-seven communities in the Merrimack Valley Region.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to buy a truck and plow, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,350.00.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to establish a recreational commission according to Chapter 51, Section 37, Revised Laws of N. H., 1945, and raise and appropriate money for their use.
- 16. To transact any other business to come before said meeting.

LAWS RELATING TO TRUST FUNDS

Chapter 51, Revised Laws of N. H.

19. In General. Towns may take and hold in trust gifts, legacies and devises made to them for the establishment, maintenance and care of libraries, reading-rooms, schools and other educational facilities, parks, cemeteries and burial lots, the planting and care of shade and ornamental trees upon their highways and other public places, and for any other public purpose that is not foreign to their institution or incompatible with the objects of their organization.

We would suggest that persons desiring to leave a sum of money, the income of which is to be used for the care of cemetery lots, should deposit at least \$200.00.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Northwood:

As forecast a year ago, it has become necessary to re-organize a third classroom at the Ridge School. All classrooms were made attractive during the summer by redecorating and other improvements. At the Ridge, a movable partition separates the upstairs classroom from the assembly hall. At the Narrows, a new hot-air automatic oil heating plant and flush toilets were installed. The present organization of the schools is as follows:

Coe-Brown Northwood Academy opened with an enrollment of 83 pupils, of which 56 were local residents.

The program of legislation anticipated a year ago has been enacted and is in operation. Northwood will receive this year in state aid \$10,095.97, or an increase of \$7,205.41 over last year. Besides the new equalization act, which increased state aid in New Hampshire by about 400%, the following laws were passed by the General Court:

To permit the establishment of cooperative school districts.

Increasing the school district debt limit from 2%

of the valuation to 5%, or 8% by special permission of the governor and council on recommendation of an investigation board.

Enabling districts to accumulate a capital reserve fund for improvements.

Improving the teachers' retirement act and admitting school nurses and teachers of approved public academies. Coe-Brown Northwood Academy has accepted the provisions of the latter act, which also provides that the superintendent of schools shall visit such academies regularly and make a written report to the trustees twice a year. Transfers between the different state retirement systems are also possible now.

An irksome provision requiring repayment of tuition to the teachers colleges for graduates not teaching in the state a specified length of time has been repealed. Provision is made for scholarships to be granted by the State Board of Education to high school graduates desiring to become teachers and otherwise unable to attend.

Providing for the examination and treatment of problem children temporarily in a receiving home.

Establishes a Director of Nursing Education.

Fostering vocational education through a program of apprenticeship in industry.

This legislation is set forth in full in Institute Circular No. 174 entitled "Educational Legislation of 1947" (State Board of Education, Concord, N. H.).

Further regulations have been made by the State Board of Education as follows:

Minimum Standards for Teachers' Salaries

1. Less than four years' college preparation and less than five years of experience, \$1,700.

- 2. Regularly certified with less than four years' college preparation but with five years' experience, \$1,800.
- 3. Regularly certified, with four years' college preparation, but less than three years of experience, \$1,800.
- 4. Regularly certified, with four years of college preparation and three years of experience, \$2,000.

The effect of the above regulation is already beginning to be felt in the supply of available teachers and candidates for teacher-training.

The regulations governing the approval of superintendents, headmasters, principals, teachers, and other educational personnel in the public schools of New Hampshire have been revised, with the establishment of an advisory board on certification problems. Certificates hereafter will be for a period of seven years, instead of for life, and will depend for their renewal on the completion of six semester hours of professional study (the equivalent of three extension courses or one full summer school).

Another state regulation provides that schools shall hereafter be actually in session 180 days per year, less five days of an intensive professional "workshop" (if offered locally). Such week long institutes would give opportunity for teachers to satisfy the credit requirements of the foregoing paragraph. The additional requirements in regard to certification and length of school year should be borne in mind in connection with the minimum salary regulation.

The legislature provided for special district meetings in the summer to make revised appropriations necessitated by the new laws and regulations.

Dr. Gertrude M. Lewis, state supervisor of ele-

mentary education, has visited the grade schools in Northwood both years since her appointment.

Included in the equipment donated last year to Northwood by the national school lunch program were two electric refrigerators and two kitchen cabinets with sinks. During the present year, a federally aided school milk program is being carried on, from September to June, as well as the usual district hot lunch program through the winter months. With the increased cost of food and services, it is likely that an increased district appropriation should be made, or a moderate charge be made for each meal, or both, especially if the federal requirements for a balanced meal warranting cash aid are to be met.

The school nurse, Miss Myrtle Fletcher, made 121 examinations covering the principal features of school health, also 500 briefer inspections, 143 visits to homes, 92 school visits, administered the Audiometer Test and retest for hearing, also organized and assisted Dr. Manning of Newmarket at the dental clinic (sponsored by the Harvey Lake Women's Club), at which 51 children had dental care. She also accompanied 17 children to physicians and other clinics. This is besides her work in five other towns.

The School Board has adopted the following regulation, effective August 19, 1947: "No child shall be admitted to the first grade in September who is actually less than five years and eight months of age September first; provided that any parent may apply to the Superintendent of Schools in advance of the opening of school, for the admission by examination of a child not less than five years and six months of age." It is not to be expected that children who are about average in development will qualify under this regulation.
