SELECTMEN'S REPORT

Once again we submit our annual report of some of the projects that have been completed during the year, some that have not yet reached completion, and our reasons for the delay, also our thoughts on some of the things that might be accomplished in the future.

We were able to have both sides of the Town Hall shingled for very little more than was appropriated to shingle one side, as this would have had to be done in the very near future, we were of the opinion that it could all be done at one time cheaper than in two jobs.

We were unable to complete the water hole at the Center Village due to the fact that the best estimate of the cost we were able to obtain was nearly twice the amount appropriated, however all the material has been purchased, and a man hired to complete the job, on an hourly basis who is to start early in April, at this time we are not sure if there is money enough left in the appropriation to complete the project or not, so are therefore inserting an article in the warrant to appropriate more if needed, we hope to have this information by Town Meeting.

The T.R.A. project on Shedd Hill was completed except for the black top and some last minute cleaning up, Mr. Eaton assures us this will be done this spring and that there is ample money left in the fund for this purpose.

It is our opinion that the third member of the board of Selectmen's salary should be more in line with the other two, we are asking you to consider this at Town Meeting.

In 1964 we were able to keep the tax rate the same as in 1963 due to the fact that we had considerable road construction

machinery which was taxable in Town, even with the same appropriation's we see a sizable rise in the rate in 1965.

We still see need in the very near future, to have the entire town reappraised, in order to keep the assessment on an equal basis, as assessments are bound to get out of line over the years, no matter whom the assessing officials are, there is also a great need to establish a more modern method of keeping the property records. With our growing tax list this need becomes greater every year.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at seven of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To vote on the following question: Shall the provisions of Chapter 171A of the revised Laws relative to playing games of beano be adopted in this town in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 292 of the Session Laws of 1949.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Snow Removal for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the Highway Department.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Seventy Five Dollars and Ninety Four Cents for T.R.A. so called, (\$275.94). 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of public landings.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general maintenance of the Fire Department.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Twenty Seven Dollars (\$127.00) in support of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital for the year 1965.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Sixty Four Dollars and Eighty Eight Cents (\$164.88) to advertise the Town, said money to be paid to the Monadnock Region Association for this purpose.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Public Library.

14. To hear reports of Committees and take any action thereon.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any sum of money to complete the water hole at the Center Village.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Police Department.

18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Town dump.

19. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the following sections of Highways, Old Route 9: between Station 194. and Station 198. also Old Route 9: between 248. and Station 264: also Old Route 123: Between Station 250. (Route 9) and Station 69 plus 50. (Route 123).

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for fighting forest fires, (by request).

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to pave six hundred feet of the Old Antrim Road, beginning at the east side of the Shedd Hill Road. (by request)

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to appoint a Deputy Collector. This vote to remain in force until rescinded by some future Town Meeting.

23. To see if the Town will vote to fix the salary of the third member of the board of Selectmen at Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

24. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

25. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of land and buildings within the Town to equalize valuation in accordance with the law, and raise money for this purpose.

26. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

During the summer of 1964, the Davis Public Library was opened on Saturday evenings from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., at which time from thirty to forty books were drawn each week, including fiction, non-fiction and juvenile, by residents and non-residents.

During the winter months, the opening was shortened from 7:00 p.m to 8.:00 p.m., due to the fact that the Bookmobile stops at the school, and to winter weather conditions.

The Bookmobile comes to the Library approximately every six weeks, in order to exchange older books for newer reading material.

The Library is in the process of being catalogued. As of this date, all fiction and juvenile books are filed according to author. All books donated by societies and individuals are now on the shelves for our readers, and in the future we are planning to have a complete filing system of all books.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Stoddard:

It is a pleasure for me to present my eleventh annual report for your consideration.

Federal

It certainly is obvious to any property owner living in the State of New Hampshire, that the efforts of local school districts to provide educational opportunities to their children comparable to the demands of modern civilization, that education is an expensive commodity.

Education is no longer a little red school house operation as it was at the turn of the century. On the national level, expenditures for education are second only to the Department of Defense with highways running a close third. Defense has always been a responsibility of the federal government. Since 1956 it has assumed 90% of the cost of the nation's major highway construction program. Is it time for state and local governmental units to look to the federal government for financial support for education in an attempt to ease the local tax burden? I know that some who read this will rise in horror at the thought and your judgments are respected, but this report is not an attempt to gather support for federal aid to education but rather to advise you that it is already here in a small way and is destined to increase. Schools in this supervisory union are now receiving federal aid to: (1) support home economics teachers' salaries, (2) subsidize the noon lunch program, (3) to support the guidance program and (4) to provide equipment for the teaching of science, math and modern foreign languages.

During the school year of 1964-65 this aid will be extended to the teaching of English, reading, civics, geography and history.

It would not be surprising to see the Congress at the next session break through the impass between the public and parochial schools to enact legislation which will provide fededal funds for school house construction, teachers' salaries and curriculum improvements. These are some of the things that President Johnson was talking about when he recently said, "I intend to put education at the top of America's agenda."

State

For the school year 1964-65 the State of New Hampshire expects to spend 56 million dollars for public school education. The State Department of Education asked the legislature to reduce this expenditure by local tax payers by 10 million dollars in aid. Including the sweepstakes, this was reduced $7\frac{1}{4}$ million or 12.9% of the total needed.

For the school year 1965-66 it is estimated that 60 million dollars will be needed for public school education and the State Department of Education is asking that the legislature appropriate 13 million dollars or 22.9% of the local effort. When you read this I am guessing that it will have been established that the state contribution to the local effort will be less than 10 million dollars and equal to less than 15% of the need, and this will include the estimated four million from sweepstakes.

It is obvious that the State's effort is not keeping up with the expanding cost. The four million received from the sweepstakes will be less than the increased expenditures in the next fiscal year and what happens when the expected expenditures go from 60 to 65 million in the second year of the biennium?

There are those who feel that the state has no alternative but to find some new sources of income to more nearly accept its obligations to education as well as other state services. The state has the right and obligation to set standards by which the schools within its boundaries shall operate but with it also goes the obligation to be more realistic in its financial support of its programs.

Each year the State Department of Education establishes the tuition rates that may be charged by local school districts based on the state average per pupil cost of the previous year. I submit these as an indication that a continuation of such growth would seem prohibitive for real estate revenues to support.

The above figures do not include transportation costs or that for capital outlay (debt service and new equipment). Therefore between 75 and 100 dollars should be added to each of the above figures to obtain a more accurate picture. Yeseducation is expensive, but if there is a salvation of our country, education is going to be the cause of it.

Local

Two years ago when the citizens of Stoddard voted to send its seventh and eighth grade pupils outside of the district for their education, it was expected that the smaller number of pupils would make it possible for the teacher to be more effective. Today the pupil registration in the Stoddard Centraí School in six grades is equal to that we had in eight grades.

Stoddard is now one of six one room schools in the state housing six or more grades. In terms of today's education standards, I am not happy with what we are able to accomplish under this system. It may be again time for the eitizens of Stoddard to examine its educational potential and investigate the feasibility of joining some of its neighbors for educational purposes. However, I have said before and I say it again, "The Stoddard Central School should remain operative until such time as the eitizens themselves feel a change should be made." I would, though, be derelict in my duty as superintendent and educational advisor if I did not point out our inability to provide educational opportunities equal to that of some of our neighbors.

I am submitting an account of the school nursing program for the year 1963-64.

Last spring the children received the T.B. patch test and chest x-ray. All findings were negative. This test will be scheduled again in 1966 since it is usually given every two years.

All first graders registered in September of 1964 have received smallpox vaccinations.

This fall the children were given a physical examination by a physician. The need of dental care was evidenced and the students were urged to seek dental attention. Frequent inspections are made throughout the school year.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy - both industrial and recreational is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area - 4,350,000 acres - is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

- 1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
- 2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
- 3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our perventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your very fine cooperation during the past fire season and with your continued cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.
