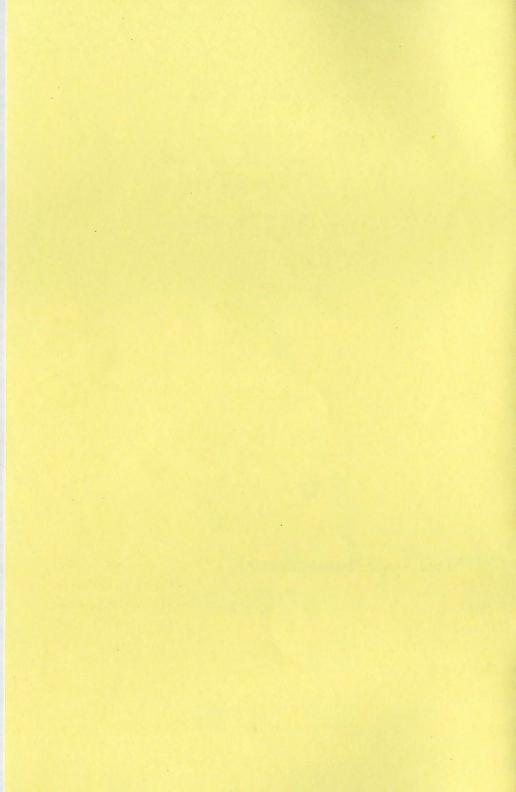

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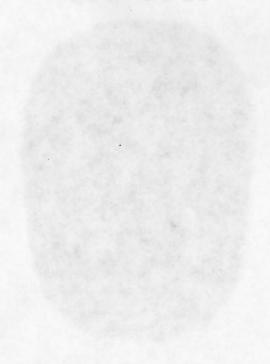
In Memory of Edith "Dee" Atkins 1944-1999

7) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for the upkeep of the Town cemeteries and Town Hall grounds, or to take any action relative thereto.

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Dept. & State Forest Ranger, contact your local Warden or F.D. to find out if a permit is required before doing any open burning. Violations of RSA 227-L:17, permit and burning laws, are misdemeanors punishable by fines up to \$2000.00 and/or a year

in jail, plus all fire suppression costs.

There are 10 Forest Rangers, plus 2400 Forest Fire Wardens and Deputies within the NH Div. of Forests, Forest Protection Bureau. Rangers are available to assist communities with forest fire suppression, prevention and training programs as well as the enforcement of forest fire and timber harvest laws. If you have any questions regarding forest fire or timber

harvest laws please call our office at 271-2217.

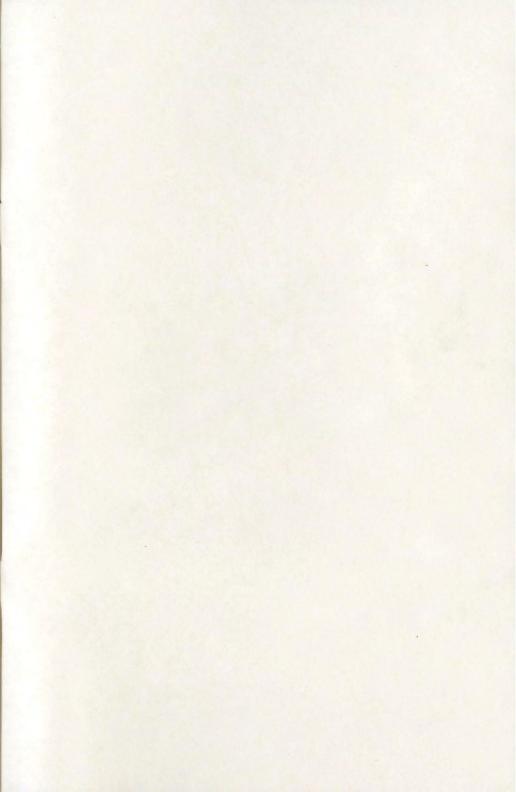
