Any person found shoveling snow into a town road or plowing snow across the road, so as to impeded normal plowing operations, will be subject to a penalty not to exceed \$25.00 for each offense.

Burning Regulations

TO REPORT A FIRE DIAL 483-2521

The State of New Hampshire requires that written permits be obtained for all open fires at all times when the ground is not snow covered.

Permits may be obtained from the Auburn Volunteer Fire Department for grass, brush, campfires, etc. Permits must be obtained on the day burning is to be accomplished. Burn when there is no wind, on rainy days, in a safe place and in accordance with the term of the permit. Burn before 9:00 am and after 5:00 pm. Keep some buckets of water close by; if wind develops, promptly extinguish the fire. All fires must be extinguished before you depart the scene.

Parking During Snow Storm

A. From November 2 to April 1 of each year no person shall park any motor vehicle on any public highway between the hours of 11:00 pm and 8:00 am or at any time in such manner as to impede snow removal operations.

B. Any vehicle parked in violation of section A hereof may be towed by the road agent, the chief of police or their agents or by independent contractors engaged by the road agent or the chief of police; any vehicles so towed shall be stored and released to the owner only upon payment of the cost of towing and storage by the owner.

C. Any person violating section A hereof shall be subject to a penalty not to exceed twenty-five dollars for each offense.

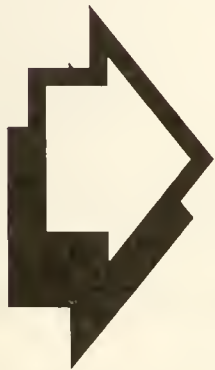
Dog Ordinance

A. RESTRAINT: All dogs shall be restrained from running at large within the limits of the town, except when they are on the owner's or keeper's property or being used for hunting or training purposes.

B. PENALTY: Any person or persons, firm or corporation violating any provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each offense.



The Planning Board has been working to clarify our rules and ordinances. The Zoning Board has been acting as arbiter in the cases of disagreement over some of those rules and ordinances. And the staff of the Auburn Village Crier has given us a way to tell you all about it.


Yes, things could be better. However, the Town of Auburn is in strong financial condition, with little long term debt, and is a "rich" community because of the abundance of caring, dedicated individuals who devote their time to the pursuits that make a Town worth living in.


We would like to thank all those who have given of their time over the past year and in past years to help us build a better Town.

Town Warrant

To the inhabitants of the Town of Auburn, in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the gymnasium in the Auburn Village School in said Auburn on Tuesday, March the ninth of next, at seven of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

SECOND: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 2 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend Article 7 Building Code and Building Permits, Section 7.01 General, to add the requirement that all construction be in compliance with BOCA Code 1990 edition and CABO Single Family and Two Family Residential Construction Code, 1992. (Recommended by the Planning Board)

THIRD: Are you in favor of Warrant Article No. 3 as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Readopt and re-approve Article 3 Section 3.09 Growth Management as written in the Ordinance, with Section E-8 reworded to read "Unused total annual allocations may be carried over for only one year." (Recommended by the Planning Board)

FOURTH: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 4 as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend the Zoning Map to rezone the parcel of land beginning at the intersection of Raymond Road and Chester Road; proceeding along Chester Road, southeasterly to Bunker Hill Road to a point which is the easterly boundary of Map 7, Lot 12; along the eastern most boundary of said lot, and Map 7, Lot 10 and Map 7, Lot 4 to a point on the south side of Eaton Hill Road; then westerly along Eaton Hill Road to the intersection of Raymond Road; then along Raymond Road to the point of the beginning; changing the current Zoning from a Commercial 2 and Residential 2 District to a Commercial 2 Zone in its entirety. (Recommended by the Planning Board)

FIFTH: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 5 as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend Article 2, Definitions, Section 2.02 Words and Terms to include a definition of Accessory Dwelling Unit.

ACCESSORY DWELLING UNIT: One (1) or more rooms

attached to a dwelling unit which provide living facilities for a use which is secondary and subordinate to and customarily incidental to the use of a single family detached dwelling. An accessory dwelling unit shall have no more than one (1) bedroom, shall not exceed five hundred (500) square feet in total floor area and shall be attached to a single family detached dwelling. An accessory dwelling unit must have permanent provisions for living and sleeping and may have sanitary and cooking provisions as well as separate electrical and heating systems. An accessory dwelling unit must be accessible from the single family detached dwelling and may have separate exterior exits. The unit shall have a fire wall separating it from the detached dwelling and shall have interconnecting smoke and/or fire alarms with exterior audio visual effects. The septic system shall be shown to meet the loading requirements of the detached dwelling unit plus the accessory dwelling unit. An accessory dwelling unit shall meet all zoning setbacks and all applicable building codes. An accessory dwelling unit is meant to include such uses as housing for immediate family members, live-in nurses, nannies, or caretakers and is not intended to be a rental unit.

Amend Article 4, District Regulations and Appendix A Zoning Matrix of Uses and Districts to allow an accessory dwelling unit as a permitted use in the "R" (Rural), "R1" (Residential-1), "R2" (Residential-2), and "C2" (Commercial-2) Zoning Districts. (Recommended by the Planning Board)

SIXTH: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 6 as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinances as follows:

Amend Article 4, District Regulations and Appendix A, Zoning Matrix of Uses and Districts to eliminate "Industrial Repair Garage" as a Permitted Use in the "C1" (Commercial-1) Zoning District. (Recommended by the Planning Board)

Polls will be open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 7:00 p.m.

You are also notified to meet on Saturday March the thirteenth next, at 1:00 p.m., at the Auburn Village School to consider the following articles:

SEVENTH: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a five (5) year payment agreement with New Hampshire Electric Co-Op for the purpose of installing electrical service to the Les Emery Building located at the Sandy Acres Recreation Area and to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Six Hundred Eighty and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,680.00) for the fiscal year 1993. The balance of Five Thousand One Hundred Nineteen and 20/100 Dollars (\$5,119.20) will be paid in forty-eight (48) monthly installments of One Hundred Six and 65/100 Dollars (106.65) beginning January 1994 commencing forty-eight (48) months hence. (Recommended by the Board of Selectmen) (Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Amount Included in the Budget)

EIGHTH: We, the undersigned registered voters petition the Town of Auburn, NH to see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$500.00) for the support of the MASSABESIC SENIOR CITIZEN CLUB.

NINTH: To see if the Town will vote to accept such Trust Funds as may come during the year and Trust Funds as have not been previously accepted.

TENTH: To see if the Town will vote to use the income of the H.B. Burnham Fund for the schools or library.

ELEVENTH: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts, for the use of the Town as may now or hereafter be forthcoming.

TWELFTH: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

THIRTEENTH: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the board of selectmen to accept the dedication of any street shown on a sub-division plat approved by the planning board, provided that such street has been constructed to applicable town specifications as determined by the board of selectmen or their agent. (Recommended by the Planning Board) (Recommended by the Board of Selectmen)

FOURTEENTH: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of any or all property acquired by tax deed, by public auction or sealed bid, with right to reject all bids.

FIFTEENTH: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make application for and to receive and spend such advances, grants-in-aid, or other funds for Town purposes as may now, or hereafter be forthcoming from Federal, State, local or private agencies.

SIXTEENTH: To hear the report of the Budget Committee and to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town charges and legal obligations for the ensuing year.

SEVENTEENTH: To transact any other business tha may legally come before the meeting.

After reading the Warrant, the Moderator displayed the empty ballot box and voting proceeded until 7:00 P.M., with the absentee ballots being cast at 11:00 A.M.

The Business Meeting of the Town was adjourned to Saturday, March 14, 1992 at 1:00 P.M. to take up Articles Four through Fifteen.

Articles One through Three were decided on the written ballot on March 10, 1992 with the following results. A total of 726 voted. Number of registered voters: 2,067.

ARTICLE TWO: Are you in favor of increasing the Board of Selectmen to a five member board? (By petition) YES 239 NO 469

ARTICLE THREE: Will the Town authorize the Selectmen to sell at current assessed value a 3,658 square foot lot of land owned by the Town on Wellington Road to the record owner of the abutting parcel at tax map 25, lot 39? (By petition) YES 486 NO 175

The adjourned Business Meeting was called to order by the Moderator, C. Donald Stritch, at 1:00 PM on Saturday, March 14, 1992. The Moderator read the results of the ballot voting on Tuesday. Persons elected on Tuesday were sworn in by the Town Clerk.

Chairman of the Board of Selectmen, Frank Edelmann, explained that there is \$848,734 in uncollected taxes. If all money articles are passed, the tax rate will increase approximately \$3.04 which breaks down to School - \$1.88, Town - \$.98 and County - \$.18.

ARTICLE FOUR: To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty-Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) for the purpose of creating a building dedicated to the storing and mixing of salt and sand for our highway needs and the storage of the loader. This building will be erected on Town property. (Recommended by the Board of Selectmen) (Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Amount Included in the Budget)

Frank Edelmann moved to adopt Article Four as printed. Paul Sanford seconded. Discussion followed. Leonard Laventure moved to amend Article Four to read \$35,000. Seconded by Bruce Mason. After discussion, Bruce Mason moved to vote on the amendment. Seconded. Vote was in the affirmative and vote on the amendment was taken. Vote on amendment to change Article Four to read \$35,000 did not pass. Amendment failed.

Paul Sanford moved to vote on the Article. Seconded by Bruce Mason. Vote was affirmative and vote on Article Four was taken. Handcount vote: YES on Article Four: 77. NO on Article Four: 86. Article Four was defeated.

Larry Gould asked that we reconsider Article Four. Mitchell Henley seconded. The Moderator explained that a 2/3 vote is needed to reconsider an article. Handcount vote: YES to reconsider: 95. NO to reconsider: 70. Article Four will not be reconsidered.

ARTICLE FIVE: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Ten-Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) to be used to create a revocable and expendable Retention Trust Fund in accordance with the provisions of RSA 31:19-a. The purpose of this retention fund is to reimburse each department of the Town that has insurance (NHMA) Property/Liability Trust for its self insured portion of each covered claim. This would include any covered claim with a value of less than One-Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) which would not be reimbursable by the NHMA Trust due to the Town's One-Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) self insured level.

Claims will be submitted to the Selectmen's Office and the Board of Selectmen will determine the validity of such claims and will determine the amount to be paid in accordance with the provisions set forth in the Town's Insurance Claim Fund.

The monies for the Trust will be appropriated by vote at Town Meeting and principal as well as interest can be expended. (Recommended by the Board of Selectmen) (Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Amount Included in the Budget)

James Headd moved the Article as written. Paula Marzloff seconded. James Headd explained that a committee of four, all in the insurance business, had studied the Town's insurance and by eliminating duplication had saved \$11,000 on insurance premiums.

Gerald Lacourse moved to vote on the question. Seconded by Nancy Mayland. Vote was affirmative and vote was taken on Article Five. Article Five was passed.

ARTICLE SIX: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Fifteen-Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) for the Solid Waste Commission to purchase a wood chipper. (Recommended by the Board of Selectmen)

Michael Logue moved to accept Article Six as written. Bruce Mason seconded. Mike Logue explained the need for the chipper.

Steve Vanni moved to vote on the question. Veneta Cleary seconded. Vote was affirmative. Vote on Article Six: NO. Article Six was defeated.

ARTICLE SEVEN: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a five (5) year lease/purchase agreement for the purpose of leasing a new fire truck for the Town of Auburn for use by the Auburn Volunteer Fire Department and to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty-Three Thousand Six Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$33,600.00) for the fiscal year 1992-93 lease payment, or to take any other action relative thereto. (Recommended by the Board of Selectmen) (Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Amount Included in the Budget)

Martin Sullivan moved to accept Article Seven as written. Charles Worster seconded. Marty Sullivan explained that this would be replacing a 1956 truck which is not now operable.

Kurt Cameron moved to vote on Article Seven. Seconded by A. Roswell Landry. Vote was in the affirmative to vote on Article Seven.

The Moderator received a written request from six registered voters who wanted a written ballot on this article. Written ballot results: YES: 134. Article Seven passed.

At this point in the meeting, Mary Griffin and Nancy Gagnon presented the Moderator, C. Donald Stritch, with a plaque in appreciation of 20 years service to the Town of Auburn as Moderator, 1972 - 1992. He was also presented with an envelope of money from his friends in Auburn. Don received a standing ovation. Never will a town meeting ever be the same without Don's own special style. He will be greatly missed.

ARTICLE EIGHT: To see if the Town will vote to accept such Trust Funds as may come during the year and Trust Funds as have not been previously accepted.

Charles Kellett moved to accept Article Eight. Seconded by Mitchell Henley. Vote on Article Eight was in the affirmative and Article Eight passed.

ARTICLE NINE: To see if the Town will vote to use the income of the H.B. Burnham Fund for the schools or library.

David Griffin moved that the income from the H.B. Burnham Fund be used for the library. Seconded by Janice Marks. Vote on Article Nine as moved was in the affirmative and income from the H.B. Burnham Fund will be used for the library.

ARTICLE TEN: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts, for the use of the Town as may now or hereafter be forthcoming.

Louis Gamache moved Article Ten be adopted as printed. Seconded by Mary Griffin. Vote on Article Ten was in the affirmative and Article Ten passed.

ARTICLE ELEVEN: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Frank Edelmann moved Article Eleven as printed. Seconded by Paula Marzloff.

Mr. Edelmann explained that we are now in the need of borrowing money because of unpaid taxes. We will need approximately \$800,000 before June. It is hoped that some sort of credit line can be set up so that we borrow as we need, rather than borrowing one large sum.

John Davis moved to vote on the question. Seconded. Vote was affirmative to vote on this Article. Vote on Article Eleven was in the affirmative and Article passed.

Martin Sullivan, Auburn Fire Chief, presented a plaque to Ron Geoffrey for Outstanding Fire Service Award for 1991. Ron was not present to accept this award.

ARTICLE TWELVE: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of any or all property acquired by tax deed, by public auction or sealed bid, with right to reject all bids.

Charles Kellett moved Article Twelve as written in Town Warrant. Mitchell Henley seconded. Eva Lunnie, Tax Collector, reported that for 1991 13.1% of the taxes remain uncollected and will be going on tax lien. Vote on Article Twelve was in the affirmative and Article passed.

ARTICLE THIRTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make application for and to receive and spend such advances, grant-in-aid, or other funds for Town purposes as may now, or hereafter be forthcoming from Federal, State, local or private agencies.

Louis Gamache moved to adopt Article Thirteen as printed. Janice Marks seconded. Vote on Article Thirteen was in the affirmative and Article Thirteen passed.

ARTICLE FOURTEEN: To hear the report of the Budget Committee and to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town charges and legal obligations for the ensuing year.

James Headd, Chairman of the Budget Committee, moved the amount of One Million One Hundred and Eleven Thousand Two Hundred and Seventy-Two Dollars (\$1,111,272.00). Seconded by Susan Jenkins.

Steve Vanni moved to add \$25,000.00 for the purpose of a salt barn or beginning of site construction. The Moderator explained that stipulations on use of monies cannot be stated in this Article. The wish of the people can be expressed to the Board of Selectmen, but they are not bound as they would be in a separate warrant article. Amendment was seconded to read \$35,000.00. Mr. Rinker, who had seconded the amendment, agreed.

Mr. Rinker moved to vote on the amendment. Seconded by Bruce Mason. Motion to vote on the amendment passed. Vote on amendment to increase the budget by \$35,000.00 (Thirty-Five Thousand); Yes, and amendment passed. Article Fourteen amount now \$1,146,272.00.

Theobald Therrien moved to increase budget by \$500.00. Seconded by Rene Desfosses. This amount would be for the Massabesic Senior Citizens. Mr. Therrien explained that this group is for the benefit of all seniors, not just Club members. Richard Vinson of the Auburn Lions Club stated that if Mr. Therrien would withdraw his amendment that the Auburn Lions Club would donate \$500.00 to the Massabesic Senior Citizens. Mr. Therrien and Mr. Desfosses withdrew the amendment.

James Headd, Chairman of the Budget Committee, explained that the \$500.00 for the seniors had been increased to \$2,000.00 and moved to recreation for the benefit of all town seniors.

Walter Dehart moved to amend the budget by adding \$7,000.00 in order to bring electricity and telephone to the Auburn Recreation Area. Seconded by Gary Schmidtchen. After discussion, Mr. Dehart moved to vote on the proposed amendment. Seconded. Vote was in the affirmative and amendment was voted on.

Handcount vote to add \$7,000.00 to budget: YES 58. NO 72. Amendment was defeated. Article Fourteen is now \$1,146,272.00.

Bruce Phillips moved to vote on the question. Alex Komaridis seconded. Affirmative vote brought Article Fourteen to a vote.

Vote on Article Fourteen with an amount of One Million One Hundred Forty-Six Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-Two Dollars (\$1,146,272.00) was in the affirmative.

\$1,146,272.00 was appropriated to defray Town charges and legal obligations for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE FIFTEEN: To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

John Davis made a motion to adjourn. Seconded. Meeting adjourned at 5:05 PM.

Report of the Librarian Griffin Free Public Library

The Griffin Free Public Library has undergone many changes and improvements during calendar year 1992. We would particularly like to thank the volunteers and Friends of the Library who have helped with many projects.

The following improvements have also been completed: repairing the front and side doors, adding dead bolts; remodeling shelves in the library; jacking up the floors in all the rooms; painting the building; repairing the sills; removing the granite millstone from beneath the side door, replacing the step, and placing the old granite millstone outside as a decorative piece; cleaning the attic of vermin; insulating the building; updating of the interior lighting -- to be completed in 1993; building and installing an exterior book drop. We would especially like to thank Louise Logue for her instrumental help in completing this body of work.

A computer was also purchased and installed, allowing not only for the library to begin cataloging its collection (to be completed in 1993) but also for electronic access to the statewide InterLibrary Loan system.

The Friends of the Library were formed in 1992, headed by Brenda Selinga as their president. A building committee, headed by Gail Butler Christensen was also formed, in order to plan for future improvements and construction at the library.

In November, we accepted the resignation of the librarian, Carrie Iwans, who had then completed her MLS from Rhode Island State and moved on to work with computer installations in libraries. We would like to express our appreciation for her unflagging enthusiasm and expertise in improving the library and its collection.

An interim librarian, Auburn resident Nancy Hanger, who holds a Masters degree in Children's Literature, filled in from early November until a new librarian was selected in late December.

We are very pleased to introduce our new librarian, Edie Cummings, who comes to us with a great deal of library experience and enthusiasm. We look forward to working with her in the future as the library continues to be improved.

The Auburn School District Meeting was called to order at 8 PM on March 13, 1992 by C. Donald Stritch, Moderator.

Article 1: To hear the report of agents, auditors and committees or officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

David Canedy moved Article 1 be adopted as printed in the Warrant. Second by William Wood. Vote was taken and Article 1 passed.

Article 2: To see if the district will vote to accept the provisions of RSA 198:20-B providing that any school district at an annual meeting may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific recession of such authority, the School Board to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by the school district, money from a state, federal or other governmental unit or private source which becomes available during the fiscal year.

J. Herbert Tardiff moved that Article 2 be adopted as printed in the Warrant. Second by Earl Rinker. Vote was taken and Article 2 passed.

Article 3: To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$5,550.00) to fund the cost items related to an increase in the reimbursement rate for workshops and conferences, as negotiated in the 1992-93 contract agreement being entered into by the Auburn School Board and the Auburn Education Association for the 1992-93 fiscal year.

Mitchell Henley moved that Article 3 be adopted as printed in the Warrant. Second by Ed Wilusz. Vote was taken and Article 3 passed.

Article 4: To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries and benefits for School District officials and agents other than benefit and salary increases to teachers, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.

Chairman of Budget Committee, James Headd, made motion to accept the budget figure of \$4,123,413.00. Second by Richard Miller. Bruce Mason asked why figure voting on was different from figure in Town book. The difference is from Article 3, \$5,550 which was already passed.

Steve Menard made a motion to amend the budget figure to \$3,972,887.00. Bruce Mason seconded the motion on the amendment. Much discussion followed. The School Board explained the need to beef up library services, computer equipment. They explained the Special Education Area would increase this year. They explained that they are trying their very best to save as much as possible but do not feel the budget can be cut further.

Bruce Mason moved the vote on the amendment. The vote to vote on the amendment was taken and passed. A vote on the amendment \$3,972,887.00 was called and the Amendment on Article 4 did not pass.

Mr. McJuary made motion to vote on Article 4. Bruce Mason seconded. Vote on Article 4 was taken in the amount of \$4,123,413.00. Article 4 passed.

The School Board thanked the town for its support and commended C. Donald Stritch for his 23 years of service to the Town as Moderator and presented him with a plaque. A round of applause from the townspeople was given to "Don."

James Headd made motion to adjourn meeting. Meeting adjourned at 9:15 PM.

Department Awards went to Cynthia Krohn, Social Studies; Erica Benson, Science; Corinne Potvin, English; and Aaron Johnston, Mathematics. The Honor Student Award was presented to Aaron Johnston. The PTA Most Improved Award went to Jessica Harnum, and the Millie Preston Service Award was presented to Corinne Potvin. The Hooksett Rotary Club Award was given to Julia Allen, and the Auburn School Board Citizenship Award was given to Heather Lemay. The American Legion School Medal Awards were presented to Eric Poulin and Kristen Chenoweth. The Auburn Education Association Teacher Appreciation Award was given to Katherine Singer.

Superintendent's Report

AUBURN

On completion of my first year as Superintendent of the Auburn School District, I would like to take occasion to thank the school staff and community for the open welcome that was extended to me and also to commend my predecessor, Mr. David R. Cawley, for the many fine years of service that he provided in helping to bring the school system to the fine level of operation that it is at.

1991-1992 school year was one of continuing progress despite the difficult economic conditions that prevailed. The classroom teachers continued to develop and apply their skills in the 4MAT approach to lesson planning, an approach focused on the different learning styles of children and the different kinds of teaching strategies needed to reach youngsters operating in these different styles. The faculty has also continued to move forward in utilizing the "whole language" approach to the teaching of reading/language arts, an approach that seeks to provide greater integration of the different subject skills taught and to make the work more meaningful and relevant for the youngsters involved. Both of the instructional initiatives are on the leading edge of what is considered to be the best of modern practice; and the faculty, including the principal, Mr. Bourque, are to be commended for the extra time, energy, and effort it has taken to plan and put these approaches into place.

In the area of special needs, the Auburn School District during the year provided special education services to 87 students and Chapter I support instruction in reading and math to an additional 37 students. It also provided a specially designed adventure-based activity/counseling program for certain youngsters felt to need some extra assistance in developing effective academic and interpersonal relation skills. Two of the special education students were preschool programs, three attended specialized private schools, and 16 attended high school in either Manchester or Pinkerton. The remaining 64 students were educated with the aid of local resource services in the Auburn Village School itself. The Chapter I federal funding supported a part-time teacher and an aide who worked with students individually and in small groups. In all cases of special programming, there was an active attempt to coordinate the efforts of all those involved for the maximum benefit of each student served.

Also given special attention during the year was the question of how best to follow-up on the progress and success of Auburn students attending local area high schools. A variety of informational data was collected but proved frustrating to analyze without local resource staff to follow-through on questions to be raised. A workable solution to this concern continues under study.

In regard to the Auburn School building itself, several improvements were undertaken, either for health/safety reasons or for the general esthetics of the plant. Primary among these was the installation of an improved air circulation system, with other related modifications, to address an increasing concern for the air quality and health related factors that existed in a number of the lower grade classrooms. I am pleased to be able to report that the problem appears to have been resolved and that the school now provides a much more satisfactory environment for the students and staff of concern.

In all, the year was a positive one for Auburn with the above referenced upgrades to the physical plant, with continuing development of the school's instructional program, with enhancement of its technological and other teaching resources, and with a continuing level of effective leadership on the part of the Board, the principal, Mr. Raymond Bourque, and the faculty overall. My sincere appreciation is extended to all those who worked so hard to make the year as successful as it was.

SCHOOL BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

It's hard to believe that it's time to sit down and recap the last year. Another year has gone by so quickly!

Herb Tardiff left the Board in July, due to a change of employment. Herb had several years as an Auburn Board Member prior to his most recent term. His experience and knowledge were a valuable asset to the school. Thanks Herb! With a little arm twisting, Ken Rhodes agreed to accept the vacant Board position. Ken hit the ground running and hasn't stopped. Mitch Henley and I thank him for stepping forward.

The school staff was not without change. This year we were joined by Brian Goss (Industrial Arts), Jean Fitzpatrick (Resource Room), Peter Dizoglio (Guidance) and David Swanney (Custodian). Welcome to Auburn Village. Overall Auburn has a history of long and dedicated service by its staff. We have eight teachers with over 14 years with our school.

What does not show up in most of our statistics, are the hundreds of hours donated by the many volunteers that assist in the classrooms, the library and throughout the school. Their efforts are invaluable. Auburn is also very fortunate to have an exceptional PTA that has been responsible for a variety of activities and projects. Through their community fund raisers, they contribute approximately \$10,000 each year to school related projects.

Ray Bourque and Bill Estey didn't let any grass grow under their feet either. Ray was quite successful in obtaining grants for a variety of things from computers to long distance learning equipment. Bill and Ray along with Sue Gannon, Chris Farrah, Tom Hayward and others have worked with the Daniel Webster Council to develop an Adventure Based Program that has been extremely successful. This program has provided some alternative programming for certain students. It has resulted in higher grades, greater teamwork, lower absenteeism and lower discipline.

Ray and John Ciempa worked many hours to proactively address building issues. They have installed air exchange units in the primary area and a water purifier. I think we can all agree the appearance and cleanliness of the school has improved.

The administration and staff have been very busy reviewing curriculum. Each year the teachers and administration review curriculum so that over a 6 year period each major subject area is updated for course content and materials, at each grade level. Last year marked the first year of full implementation of the whole language program. The focus of whole language is to integrate all functions such as reading, spelling, grammar, sentence structure and the likes into a single program rather than being taught a individual units. The math curriculum is the current subject area being focused on.

We are pleased to announce that negotiations between the Auburn Education Association and the School Board have been completed for a two year contract. There will be salary increases, however, the teachers have agreed to a change in health benefits that will reduce the expected rise in costs.

There have been some rather hot topics on the State level. This year the State Board of Education made significant changes in the minimum educational standards. There was significant opposition from parents, teachers and school boards. It appeared that it was a monetary issue and the State Board was reacting to a suit by property poor towns seeking funding from the State to be able to provide a better educational opportunity for their children. As Board members, we rely on the standards as a guide. They are basically common sense, have been reasonable, and were developed over an extensive period of time. It's a shame that the politics were the most important issue.

SCHOOL BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT (Continued)

The overall school population appears to have stabilized. We started the year with 534 students at AVS. This has grown to 536 at the end of the December. With a few transfers both in and out, we expect to end at about the same level. There is a bubble going through the school which will result in substantially higher levels of students in high school beginning in the 94/95 school year. There will be 51 graduating from AVS this year. They are expected to be replaced by about 66 new students. The high school population is presently 193. A recent survey indicated that we have 50 of Auburn's children attending private schools. Of these 38 are of elementary or junior high age.

I am sure most of you have had the opportunity to walk through the school and notice a gratifying change with the planters on the second floor and the decorations throughout. Hopefully, you have all had the pleasure of attending some of the many functions both during and after school. The classroom exhibits, art shows, concerts, plays, gymnastic exhibitions and Christmas musicals are a real delight to attend. They really show the spirit and enthusiasm of the students, staff and administration.

All dues-paying members of the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission are offered a wide range of services, resources and technical assistance by a professional planning staff who, from time-to-time, are assisted by specialized consultants on an as-needed basis. With the concurrence of your representatives, each year the staff develops and carries out regional planning programs that are mandated under the state and federal laws, as well as those planning activities which pertain more directly to your community.

Local planning assistance is provided upon receiving a request from your Planning Board and/or the Board of Selectmen. Certain general studies that are of common interest to all members municipalities are conducted, notifications made and training workshops held on an as-needed basis.

Services that were performed for the Town of Auburn during the past year are as follows:

1. Co-sponsored the Municipal Law Lecture meetings. These meetings were attended by Auburn officials.
2. Conducted a six-hour training workshop for the planning board members. The Auburn Planning and Zoning Boards were invited to that workshop.
3. Staff prepared a computerized census block map for the town, using the U.S. Census TIGER files. It will be forwarded to the Planning Board shortly.
4. Prepared a handbook on impact fee development and provided a copy to the Planning Board for its use.
5. Conducted traffic counts on several locations in the Town of Auburn.

Visiting Nurse Association of Manchester & Southern New Hampshire, Inc.

The Visiting Nurse Association has been providing the residents of Auburn with a full range of home health services since 1965. The VNA Board of Trustees and staff take this opportunity to reaffirm their commitment to excellence in health care, and to the provision of services designed to ensure that being cared for at home is safe, comfortable and convenient.

Due to the significant growth and expansion in all of its community-based and home health care services, the VNA felt the need to increase its physical space. The relocation of its offices in March 1992 to 1850 Elm Street, Manchester, provides more office space, conference rooms, training labs, and increased parking to enable the field and administrative staff to operate more efficiently under one roof.

The formal partnership of the Visiting Nurse Association of Manchester & Southern New Hampshire, Inc. and Fidelity Health Alliance announced in November 1992 will allow the coordination of resources and care among all members affiliated under this agreement. This relationship will further enhance the continuity and excellence of care the VNA provides to its clients.

The VNA Child Care Center, licensed to serve 185, provides a safe, secure environment for children ages six weeks to 12 years. In response to the overwhelming need for affordable, high quality child care, construction is currently underway to add a 7,500 square foot addition to our 435 South Main Street facility, with completion of the building scheduled for Spring, 1993.

Home care and community health services are provided through the following VNA affiliates:

VNA Home Health & Hospice Services, Inc. is Medicare and Medicaid certified, providing intravenous and enteral therapies; skilled nursing care; physical, occupational and speech/language therapies; nutrition counseling and medical social services; certified home health aides; hospice care for the terminally ill; long-term care for the elderly and handicapped; and volunteers. Medical equipment, such as beds and wheelchairs, are also available.

VNA Personal Services, Inc. provides private duty nurses, certified home health aides, homemakers, companions, personal care assistants, and child care in the home.

VNA Community Services, Inc. provides free monthly Immunization Clinics for all age groups as well as Free Blood Pressure Screenings. Watch your local newspaper for dates and locations. Foot Care Clinics are held monthly at our 1850 Elm Street office by appointment and Blood Pressure checks are held weekdays from 1:30 - 4:00 p.m. Occupational Health programs are conducted on site for business and industry. Parent-Child Health Services include the Teenage Pregnancy Program, Parent-Baby (ad) Venture Program for children at risk of abuse and neglect, and the Child Care Connection for child care providers.

VNA Child Care Center provides a full range of state-licensed child care, tailored to meet each child's needs. Programs include Infant/Toddler (ages 6 weeks to 36 months); Preschool (ages 3-5); and Kindergarten (age 5). The Center also provides before and after

school programs for children grades 1 through 6 with special full day programs during holidays or school closings. As needed, the VNA also offers families a continuum of coordinated health and social services, both directly from the VNA and through working arrangements with other community resources.

Town appropriations, grants, United Way allocation, and donations are a vital part of the funds that help to defray the cost of unpaid services. Representative of the town of Auburn serving on the VNA Board of Trustees is Robert N. Lord, MD.

The Auburn Police Department has started a neighborhood watch program in which meetings are held at the Auburn Village School. Officer Henley, who is in charge of the program, explains ways in which all residents can help reduce burglaries in Auburn. If you are interested in starting the program in your neighborhood, contact Officer Henley at 483-2134 or watch the Auburn Village Crier for the dates of the next meeting. House checks are also available to all residents by calling this department.

In 1992, Auburn was the Town in which the State will test the new law of Second Degree Assault because of the death of a 7 1/2 month fetus. The case is expected to come to trial in March of 1993 and lawmakers will be watching to see if this sets a precedent in the State of New Hampshire.

The Auburn Police also saw a negligent homicide case as a result of a motor vehicle accident in which the passenger was killed. This case is also expected to go to trial in 1993.

Officer Sanford attended and graduated the D.A.R.E. program in the fall and has started this program for the fifth graders in the Auburn Village School.

The Auburn Police Department received two grants in 1992 totaling \$1,900.00. One was a DWI grant and one was a training grant which Chief Picard attended Babson College for a three week course in Command Training. The department also collected about \$800.00 in insurance requests for 1992.

In late November about 29 trailers were burglarized at Calef Lake Campground. Within weeks, six juveniles were arrested and brought to Auburn District Court to answer to these charges.

All in all, the Auburn Police Department had a very productive year. We welcome any and all comments from Auburn residents and urge each resident who is interested to attend the Police Commission meetings which are held on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:00 P.M. upstairs in the station. It is with the participation of concerned residents that the Auburn Police Department can strive to be the best department possible and continue to serve the residents of Auburn in a courteous and professional manner.

Report of the Auburn Volunteer Fire Department

There were 183 emergency calls for 1992. FIRES: 4 structure fires, 13 brush fires, 2 automobile fires, 8 chimney fires, 6 electrical fires; RESCUES: 62 medical calls, 28 motor vehicle accidents, 5 water rescues; OTHER CALLS: 1 haz. mat. call, 15 good intents, 5 service calls, 2 false alarms, 12 alarm acti., 20 mutual aid calls.

When reporting an emergency, remain calm, speak clearly and remain on the telephone until the dispatcher has all the necessary information. Remembering to follow this advice can make the difference for rapid response to your emergency.

It was again a busy year for the Auburn Volunteer Fire Department. Fund-raising activities throughout the year included the May Letter and Olde Home Days. These monies and those received through donations, went to purchase fire-fighting items not included in the budget. New equipment purchased in 1992 included quartz lights, a port-a-tank, a dry suit, snorkel and goggles and ice rescue tools, tool boxes, SCBA motion alarm devices and fire extinguishers. The remainder of the protective gear was also ordered.

The fire department needed to upgrade its computer system so it could be used for fire dispatching. The new system is faster and has more memory and will be used effectively with an address data base, second alarm program and record information for department information and State reporting.

Training for the year included such topics as hazardous materials, Emergency Medical Technician (basic and refresher), CPR, Forest fire suppression, defibrillator course, EDA course, vehicle extrication, fire fighter career course and ice and water rescue courses. Eight firemen attended programs at the National Fire Academy.

The fire department has set up the program for tot/elder finders. Information is available at the fire station. CPR classes are presented twice a year. Auburn is represented at parades, the ice skating rink gets flooded, pools and wells get filled, chimneys and wood stoves get inspected through the fire department. Chimney brushes are available to the townspeople to clean their chimneys. The fire department is always on call to help Auburn citizens.

Fire Prevention Week was in October and department members were busy with demonstrations, tours, fire drills at the school and Open House at Station One.

The new fire truck, an International 1250 gallon pumper with a hose reel, arrived on December 16th to replace the 32 year old Engine 6. The new truck went to its first emergency call four days later.

Ron Geoffroy was the 1992 Firefighter of the Year.

In November, a new regime took the reins of the fire department. The membership is ready to respond to the new leadership, to keep the department progressing.

All apparatus and equipment, buildings and grounds are maintained by the firemen. Smooth operation of departmental matters and policies are conducted by fire department officers. The volunteers are dedicated, well qualified and well trained.

The members of the Auburn Volunteer Fire Department thank the citizens of Auburn for their continued financial and moral support and for the confidence showed the firemen.

Report of the Town Forest Fire Warden

Fire lookout towers reported 289 fires in 1992 that burned a total of 136 acres, the major causes of these fires were fires kindled without permits and children playing with matches.

Local fire departments are responsible for suppressing fires. The small average fire size of .47 acre per fire is a tribute to early detection from the fire tower system and quick response of trained fire personnel. It is important that all residents request and obtain fire permits before kindling a fire.

The number of wildfires reported in New Hampshire in 1992 was below average. The largest fire was in Rumney, of suspicious nature, burned 150 acres and cost \$30,000 to suppress. The New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands assist communities extinguishing fires and sponsor grants for fire fighter safety items and suppression equipment. Specialized training is provided each year to keep the skill level and knowledge of forest fire laws up to date.

Local Wardens and Deputy Wardens are responsible for issuing burning permits in N.H. communities. In New Hampshire, any open burning, except when the ground is snow covered, requires a written permit prior to ignition. Any person violating the permit law (RSA 224:27) shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Punishment is a fine of up to \$1,000.00 and/or one year in jail and liability of the cost for fire suppression.

Questions regarding the forest fire laws can be directed to local Wardens, State Forest Rangers and the Division of Forests and Lands.

Report of the Solid Waste Commission

The Town of Auburn continued its aggressive recycling efforts during 1992. Thanks to the cooperation and support of residents and businesses, the following materials continued to be removed from the Town's waste stream and recycled:

metal cans	aluminum cans	tires
waste oil	glass	light, heavy metals
appliances	newspapers	corrugated paper
glass	batteries	plastic milk jugs, soda bottles

Please remember that source recycling (separation of refuse at your home or business) is mandatory in Auburn. The Solid Waste Commission strongly recommends the use of clear plastic bags for refuse intended for the incinerator. Commission members or facility attendants will be happy to answer residents' questions regarding the use of the facility.

In previous years, residents were urged to recycle as much as possible so the Town would have to incinerate as little as possible. This reduction in burning would extend the life of the incinerator. While the longevity of the incinerator is still of major concern to the commission, we now have another major reason to aggressively recycle: the less material is burned, the less ash is produced. Auburn entered into a contract with BFI to haul incinerator ash off site, in order to comply with State regulations. (We may no longer landfill ash at the facility.) Since the Town is charged for ash removal "by the load," the less loads hauled, the less the Town pays.

The Commission recommended to the Board of Selectmen that fees be enacted for the following activities:

1. Disposal of tires by commercial entities, and heavy truck and equipment users
2. Disposal of freon-charged appliances (e.g. refrigerators, a/c units)

The BOS accepted the Commission's recommendations and enacted fees according to the following schedule:

Item	\$
motorcycle tires	1.00
auto/light truck tires	2.00
heavy truck/equipment tires	5.00
freon-charged appliances	10.00

Residents must not vent the freon from appliances themselves in an attempt to avoid the disposal fee. Not only is this action harmful to the environment, but the fee must be imposed anyway. Auburn must pay a vendor to certify the appliance is purged of freon. Once again, it is a State regulation which requires the freon extraction and certification.

The Solid Waste Commission did not have a full complement of members during any part of the year. Therefore the group's focus was mostly on recycling efforts, the facility, and budget. The Commission was not active in either Education or Public Relations efforts, as it was in 1991. This is unfortunate when one considers the Commission's successful reach to the Town and school during 1991. The Commission needs a complete membership in order to sustain a strong waste management effort in the Town. Please contact the Selectmen's Office if you'd like to become a member. We need your help!

During 1993, the Commission will begin work on the following projects:

1. Existing Facility Limited Permit: This is a lengthy permit and certification process required by the State.
2. Conversion from incinerator to transfer station: The incinerator is operating on borrowed time and cannot be replaced; the Town must plan now for different waste handling procedures.
3. Update the Waste Management rules brochure.

Waste Management meetings are open to all residents. Your input is encouraged and appreciated.

Recreation Commission Report

THE YEAR 1992 IN REVIEW

The year 1992 has been a year of successful achievements for the Recreation Commission. The Commission sponsored several different programs, such as the Summer Program, the After-School Ski Program, the Senior Trips, the continued improvement to the Sandy Acres Recreation Area and Appletree Park, the completion of the ice rink in Town as well as the restructuring of the Commission itself.

The Summer Program ran for five weeks beginning July 13th through August 14th. There were 230 happy campers, ages 6-12, who participated in the summer camp. This year, a Junior Counselor (4 participants) and a Counselor-in-Training (8 participants) Program were incorporated for Auburn teens. Both the programs provided the teens with on-the-job training under the supervision of two experienced program directors. Each week, the camp operated from Monday to Wednesday in the school, with the morning divided between arts, crafts, and sports. Every Thursday the campers and staff boarded a bus for a field trip. Thanks to the generosity and support of Bill Cooper the week ended with swimming and relaxing at Calef Lake.

"Olde Home Days" was thoroughly enjoyed by all who attended. A big "thank you" is due the Lions Club and especially Dick Vinson who organized, coordinated, and ran the event. We are very fortunate that Dick has consented to take care of this task again in 1993.

The Senior Citizens took a spring trip to Enfield and Shaker Village, where a delicious lunch was served. The trip continued to Quechee Gorge and south along the Connecticut River, back to Auburn. In the fall, the Seniors took a foliage trip to Loon Mountain. For lunch, the Seniors enjoyed the exclusive use of Rachel's Restaurant at the Mountain Club. After leaving the Mountain Club they travelled the Kancamagus Highway and stopped at the factory outlets in North Conway.

The Recreation Commission continued the improvements at the Sandy Acres Recreation Area. Additional basketball hoops were installed and the court lined; all equipment as well as the playground were checked for safety; the inside wiring in the Les Emery Building was completed and the fire extinguishers bought; the Les Emery Building was painted inside and outside with generous donations of paint and volunteer help; a flagpole and flag were installed, and the Concession stand was brought up to the standards of the Health Department. A warrant was drawn up to be presented at the next Town Meeting (March 1993), to bring electricity to the Recreation Area. The soil of the Area was tested and analyzed and recommendations as to fertilizers, lime, and other maintenance procedures, received.

The Recreation Commission sponsored the soccer instructional program run by the YMCA, for the children of Auburn. The program ran for seven weeks ending November 7th. The condition of the soccer field has improved due to the recommendations for proper maintenance and mowing.

Improvements of Appletree Park are ongoing. The Park was mowed several times and the brushwood cut back. A clean-up day is scheduled for the coming spring. Two parking places with signs will be readied. Further improvements and a long-range plan, involving the Lions Club, are in progress.

Work on the ice rink has been completed and the rink is in full use. Three granite benches, handmade by Mark Sanford, have been installed and the lighting improved.

The Recreation Commission was restructured in order to have the work load divided more evenly and to make it easier for the residents of Auburn to contact the right person. Each of the Commissioners is now heading a committee as follows:

Commissioner Gale Christensen - Facilities, which include the care and improvement of the basketball court, the playground, the soccer field, the baseball field, the Les Emery Building, Appletree Park, Town Hall Park and the Ice Rink.

Commissioner Eileen McDonald - Entertainment, which includes the Summer Program, the After-School Ski Program, the Senior Trips, and "Olde Home Days."

Commissioner Bill McCrory - Programs, which include athletic programs scheduling of the facilities, soccer program, and new program development for teens and adults.

Bill McCrory has already set up a basketball camp for next summer and is working on a Community Aerobics Program.

The After-School Ski Program at Pat's Peak in Henniker, NH was again sponsored and organized by the Recreation Commission. Fifty-two students and 13 chaperones registered and will enjoy ski lessons and skiing for five Wednesdays in January and February.

The Recreation Commission is looking forward to sponsor programs and activities for all residents of Auburn. Please contact one of the Commissioners with your interests. The Commission always enjoys new ideas as well as volunteers for the different activities to be set up.

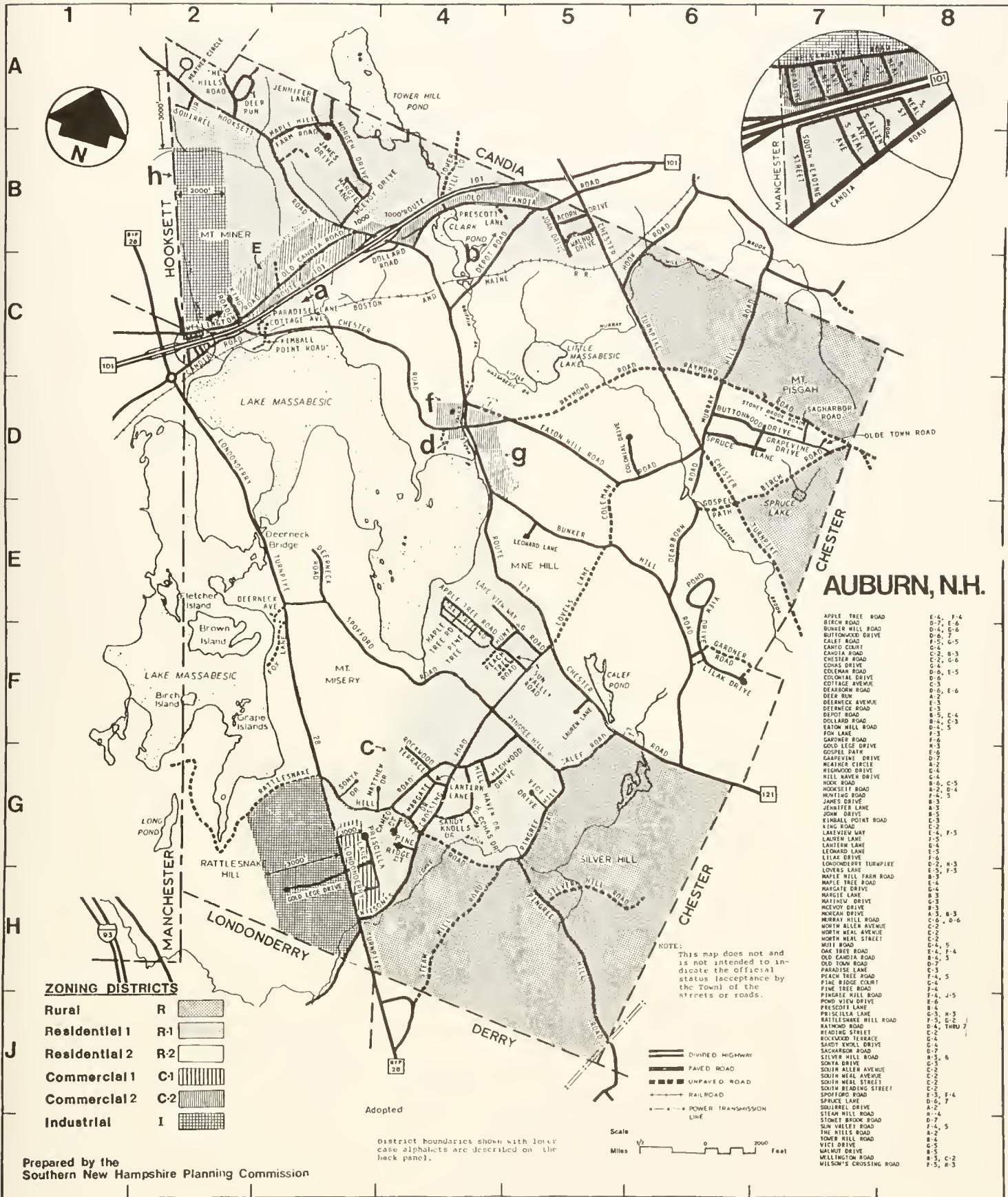
