




COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

To the Citizens of Belknap County:

In compliance with the laws of the State of New Hampshire, the commissioners of Belknap County herewith present the annual report of the County Commissioners, Treasurer, Superintendent of the Farm and House of Correction, Clerk of Superior Court, Sheriff, Solicitor, Farm Physician, Chaplain and Auditors for the year ending, Decmeber 31, 1924.

COUNTY FARM

For the second time within twelve months it was our misfortune to lose our Superintendent by death. Mr. Freeman S. Parker, who succeeded Mr. A. P. Batchelder, May 15, 1923, passed to the great beyond in February, 1924. Much credit is due to Mr. Parker for his wholehearted interest in everything pertaining to comfort and welfare of the inmates and upkeep of the farm. Mr. Joseph G. Magill, Mr. Parker's efficient assistant, succeeded him by appointment, March first, 1924. Mr. Magill has proven to be a valuable man for the position.

The cost for the care of external poor has increased over the preceeding year because of the larger number of children supported in institutions together with the fact that the heads of many families have been unable to secure sufficient work.

The cost of farm maintainance shows a decided decrease.

We wish to thank the selectmen of the several towns and all others who have assisted in aleveating the needs of the poor and distressed of our county.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT

To the Commissioners of Belknap County:

I beg leave to submit the following report of the office of county solicitor for the year beginning January 1, 1924, and ending December 31, 1924.

At the March term of court, one civil case was pending, which was continued. There were no criminal cases pending. Four criminal appeals were entered from the Laconia Municipal Court, and two from the Meredith Municipal Court. The grand jury returned twelve indictments. Of the eighteen criminal cases five were continued, and thirteen were disposed of. Of the cases disposed of one was marked not to go forward on payment of costs; two were nol-prossed on payment of costs; one was tried by jury, resulting in the acquittal of the respondent; three were continued for sentence; respondents in two cases were given state prison sentences, which were suspended, mittimus to issue at the call of the solicitor; respondents in three

cases were given house of correction sentencs, which were suspended, mittimus to issue at the call of the solicitor; one respondent was given a jail sentence, which was suspended, mittimus to issue at the call of the solicitor.

At the October term of court, one civil case was pending, which was continued, and five criminal cases were pending. Eight criminal appeals were entered from Laconia Municipal Court. Seven indictments were returned by the grand jury, and one information was filed by the solicitor. Of the twenty-one criminal cases at this term of court, five were continued, and sixteen disposed of. Of the cases disposed of, one was nol-prossed on payment of costs; six were marked not to go forward on payment of costs; respondents in five cases were committed to the state prison, and respondents in four cases were sentenced to the house of correction, sentences suspended, mittimusses to issue at the call of the solicitor.

There is at present one civil case pending on the docket, it being an action brought by the county against the County of Strafford, and five criminal cases continued from the last term.

The progress and disposition of all county cases, civil and criminal, are matters of public record, and can be ascertained by any citizen at any time.

We hereby certify that we have carefully examined the accounts of the several county officers for the six months ending June 30th, 1924; that said accounts are properly kept, correct, and well vouched; that the sums charged therein for articles purchased appear to be according to the market value and price; that according to the best of our information knowledge and belief all of such articles have been used for the benefit of the county; and that the charges for services and expenses of the county commissioners appear reasonable.
