You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Boscawen on Tuesday, the 10th day of March,*** next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

3. To see if the Town will vote to empower the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expense of the Town until the taxes are paid to the Treasurer.

***Business meeting for Appropriations only will be called for 7:00 o'clock in the evening.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Concord Hospital.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Franklin Hospital.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nurse.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for playground equipment at Rolfe Park.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Penacook Youth Center.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Community Park.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. for the White Pine Blister Rust Control Program.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to improve the heating system in the Town Hall.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a new heating system at the Torrent Engine House.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for replacement of the Highway Department's White Truck.

14. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to sell or convey by deed, property taken by Town in default of redemption from Tax Sales. 15. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to transfer any unexpended balance of money from one appropriation to another.

16. BOSCAWEN PLANNING BOARD

Monthly meetings of the Boscawen Planning Board have been held at the Town Library, on the second Tuesday of each month for the past year, with the exception of the summer months of July and August, when meetings were suspended.

Primary efforts during the past year have been directed toward the establishment of a comprehensive Master Plan for the Town of Boscawen, to serve as a basis for the development of future land use and development planning.

Progress toward this goal has been very slow, due primarily to reasons over which we have had no control, but at the present time it appears that most of our difficulties have been overcome, and that the immediate future will bring definite accomplishments.

At the 1963 Town Meeting, funds were appropriated to be used, with available federal funds, for the engagement of professional planning assistance, and the development of a Master Plan for Boscawen. After several interviews with representatives of consulting firms, the board selected the firm of Edwards & Kelcey to work with us in the preparation of the Master Plan. Following the selection of a consultant, the Planning Board proceeded in the matter of applying for federal funds to match town money in preparing our Plan.

The application was prepared by Mr. Eliot Hanson, of the N.H. State Department of Resources, Planning Division, but before the application was completed for submission, Mr. Hanson passed away very suddenly. His passing was a great shock and sadness to the board, and each felt keenly the loss of a good friend.

In addition to the personal loss felt in this situation, the state planning agency was left with no one available that was capable of carrying out Mr. Hanson's work, and so our application for federal funds was delayed until a competent successor could be appointed. Our application was finally submitted to Washington in September, only to be returned for resubmission with revisions required by policy changes at the federal level.

It was anticipated that approval would be forthcoming in December, 1963, but after waiting until the first of February without receiving any word, the Planning Board, at its February meeting, voted to inquire of Congressman James Cleveland if he could offer us any word on our application. On the day following the mailing of the Board's request, a telegram was received from Mr. Cleveland stating that the grant had been approved, and that we would shortly receive official notification of it.

During the period of our trials and tribulations with the application to Washington, many phases of our projected plans have been discussed, and we are most grateful for the services, during the past six months, of Mr. John Grogan, of the firm of Edwards & Kelcey, who has worked with us and attended the meetings of the board. Inasmuch as these services have been rendered by Mr. Grogran, and his employers, in the absence of any firm contract for services, we feel that we have indeed been fortunate in our selection of a planning consultant who will work for our best interests.

The board has spent considerable time in discussion and investigation relative to the development of mobile home parks, and control of junk yard activities, and had considered proposing preliminary ordinances in these two areas to the 1964 Town Meeting. However, it was felt that action on these might not be in the best interests of the town, and that any premature action might have adverse effects on the future development of a more comprehensive plan for Boscawen. Several members of the Planning Board are also serving on the preliminary committee studying the area school project, and the effect of the establishment of such a school on the future development of our town is a consideration in our plans.

It is hoped that before another town meeting has been held that a complete survey of the town will have been made, and that the formulation of the comprehensive Master Plan will have progressed to the point where some definite action can be taken in establishing the basic ordinances for future town development and planning.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personel rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience — a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

- 1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
- Carry your rubbish to the public dump its safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
- 3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.

4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

REPORT OF COMMISSIONERS

During the 1963 season we installed 4200 feet of six inch main on Route 3 north to a housing development north of Goodhue Road. 1600 feet of new six inch main was installed on Goodhue Road to eliminate a ³/₄." copperline which was inadequate. Two new six inch hydrants were installed in this area.

The new main on Ehm Street was completed. 500 ft. of new six inch main was installed and two 4" obsolete hydrants were replaced with new six inch hydrants.

250 ft. of galvanized pipe on Gage Street was replaced with 1" copper.

A diver was employed to inspect and clean strainer on the suction line from pond during our trouble with the pump in July.

During 1964 we plan to install a new six inch line on Queen Street to replace a small line which is now inadequate. A request has been made for a sprinkler service to Merrimack Mfg. Co. This will require boring under Route 4.

Under our present system, there is a great waste of water, especially during the summer months. This puts a great strain on our capacity to deliver the water from Walker Pond. We believe our supply is adequate for many years to come but our pumping and transmission capacity is showing the strain.

To conserve our water supply and extend the use of our pumping and transmission capacity for the greatest number of years, we believe we should start a program of changing all customers to meters in 1965.

SCHOOL WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Boscawen, New Hampshire qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Main Street School in said district on the 14th day of March 1964, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will create a cooperative school district planning committee and to elect the members thereof or determine that they shall be appointed by the moderator.

10. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to enclose the Main Street school grounds with a wire fence and raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000. for this purpose.

11. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to use any gifts, special State Aid or special Federal Aid received, for the general improvement of the school system.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

To the Superintendent of Schools:

I herewith submit my sixth annual report on the school health services of the Boscawen School District.

The majority of first grade students enrolled last spring and at that time had vision and hearing tests to determine whether or not there were any handicapped children. By early examination, these children can be referred to their family doctors and prophylaxis started immediately.

Early in October, Dr. J. K. McLeod and Dr. P. S. Shaw examined eyes, ears, nose, throat and heart of the first graders, as well as pupils in grades 4 and 7. All defects were reported to parents by the nurse or the doctors themselves and follow-up done as needed.

The Main St. School has had an unusually large amount of absenteeism due to the communicable disease incidence and "current viruses".

The annual T. B. Patch tests will again be done by the tuberculosis office in Concord. This program includes pupils in grades 1, 4, and 7 and all new entrants. Positive results will be reported to parents.

REPORT OF THE SUPERVISOR OF MUSIC

To the Superintendent of Schools:

Music has remained a pleasant experience for the children and their participation and interest continues to grow.

We now have a well balanced music program of rudiments of sight reading, two and three-part singing, records to accompany the more difficult songs, and a musical library started of famous composers.

I am also grateful to every parent who is interested in music and encourages music in the home and school.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Boscawen:

Again it is necessary to remind you that enrollments in all the grades at the Boscawen School continue to increase rapidly. Your school board feels that an additional teacher is necessary for next year so that grade four may be divided into two sections.

Parents should be concerned with the fact that this new division of grade four will occupy the last available classroom in the Main Street School. If enrollments continue to increase larger classes and eventual crowding will occur — unless more space is made available.

Increases in enrollment are reflected in increased costs; not only for additional teachers but for books, supplies, and equipment, as well as maintenance. It will be necessary to meet these increased costs if we are to continue providing the type and quality of education which is desirable for Boscawen children.

Members of the school board, along with other interested citizens of Boscawen, are participating in a study of the regional school as a possible solution to some of the educational problems common to all districts in the area.

Such interest and effort are very necessary if our school system is to continue to develop and if we are to continue to offer the quality of education which we feel is desirable and necessary for success in high school and college.

CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTORS REPORT

It is becoming more and more difficult to meet all the requirements demanded of us by the Defense Department. Changes, as they occur, always require increasing amounts of paper work. However, all units of our local organization were kept intact and most were active.

The statewide Civil Defense Auxiliary Police pistol match was held in Boscawen on September 8. We are grateful to the Congregational Church for allowing us the use of Community Park for the match. The State Police conducted the match on a prescribed F. B. I. course built and set up by the Boscawen unit. Although the Boscawen team did not take first place, they deserve all the credit for this match, which is still drawing favorable comment from all over the state.

Perhaps the most noteworthy accomplishment of the year was our acquisition of a ten wheel drive Reo truck at no cost, which was converted to a fire tank and emergency vehicle for the highway crew. When the truck was acquired, it was equipped with a heavy crane. By special permission the crane was sold by public bid and this money was used to equip the truck. We now have a truck with an 1,800 gallon tank, which was donated; a new portable pump, 30 feet of 21/3 in. suction hose, 100 feet of new 11/2 in. fire hose, a good fog nozzle and a new Johnson two-way radio. The truck is also equipped with a winch and a giant V-plow and a wing box to accommodate a wing plow. In addition, it may be used by the highway department for any emergency purpose. The truck is housed at the town garage. We are extremely grateful to Harvey Hollins, Bud Merrill and to those members of Much-I-Do Fire Department who spent so many hours preparing this truck for service. We also give credit

to the N. H. Dept. of Resources and Economic Development, Division of Resources Development, Forest Fire Control Section, for donating used parts for this truck. This vehicle is valued at several thousand dollars and cost the town approximately one hundred dollars in tax money.

The Defense Department still places a priority on home shelters and communications. Boscawen has no public shelter facilities so it is important for each family to develop a home shelter for fallout protection. Your local Civil Defense organization cannot protect you during a fallout emergency. A fallout shelter, in this area, could save your life, if it were needed. Don't wait any longer to provide your family with this cheap protection.
