Town Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Exeter, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs: [L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Exeter on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose by ballot and plurality vote a town clerk.
- 2d. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one selectman for three years.
- 3d. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one trustee of the Robinson Female Seminary for the term of seven years.
- 4th. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one trustee of the trust funds held by the town of Exeter, to hold office for three years.
- 5th. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one trustee of the Swasey Parkway for three years.
- 6th. To choose all other necessary town officers, auditors, or committees for the ensuing year.
- 7th. To see what sums of money the town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the poor, for repairing highways, for repairing and building bridges, for repairing and building sidewalks, for building drains and sewers, for oiling streets, for payment of the town debt, for lighting streets, for defraying expenses of decorating the graves of soldiers, for preventing the spread of insect pests within the town, for the control of the white pine blister disease, for the payment of firemen for the ensuing year, and for other charges arising within the town.
- 8th. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, and other officers and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote arising therefrom.
- 9th. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer, with the approval of the selectmen, to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

10th. To see if the town will vote to authorize the water commissioners, with the approval of the selectmen, to borrow money in anticipation of revenue.

11th. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter to call attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town and to assist on planning and development for the benefit of the town in cooperation with other towns coordinated in the Seacoast Regional Development Association the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350.00).

12th. To see if the town will vote to make an ordinance respecting the use and equipment of bicycles on its highways and to authorize the selectmen to adopt by-laws or regulations in respect to the same under the provisions of Chapter 154, Laws of 1953, and to appropriate the sum of six hundred and fifty dollars (\$650.00) for the same.

13th. On petition of Harold E. Carbonneau and seventeen others to see if the town will vote to adopt the Town Manager plan as provided by Chapter 55 of the Revised Laws as amended.

14th. On petition of Harold E. Carbonneau and seventeen others to see if the town will vote to transfer the powers and duties of the Tax Collector to the Town Manager as provided in Section 16 of Chapter 55, Revised Laws, as amended by Chapter 236, Laws of 1947, said transfer to take place if and when the office of Town Manager is established within the town.

15th. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) to have the masonry on the Town Hall waterproofed and repaired.

16th. On petition of Edward J. Campbell and 12 others to see if the town will vote, in accordance with the Laws of 1943, Chapter 153, Section 11, to install emergency lighting in the Town and Legion Halls, and also to install emergency lighting and power for the Police radio in the Police Station, and the Selectmen shall be authorized to expend a sum not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for this purpose.

17th. On petition of Renfrew A. Thomson and eleven others to see if the town will vote to move the Bandstand from its present location at the intersection of Front and Water Streets to such location on the Swasey Parkway as

the Selectmen and the Trustees of the Swasey Parkway shall designate and to raise and appropriate the sum of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) for the same.

18th. On petition of Gordon A. Ray and 18 others to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for the purchase of Two (2) suitable trucks for the Highway Department to replace two (2) old trucks in the department.

19th. On petition of Daniel Herlihy and ten others to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for the purpose of eight concerts to be played in the Swasey Pavilion by the Exeter Brass Band during the summer of 1954.

20th. To see if the town will vote to replace the small 1936 International truck used by the Fire Department with a new truck equipped with a fire alarm service body with extension ladder and appropriate the sum of four thousand and twenty-five dollars (\$4,025.00) for same.

21st. On petition of Sylvio E. LaPerle and thirtyeight others to see if the town will vote to increase the pay of the 43 call firemen from one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per year to one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) per year and appropriate \$2,150.00 for same.

22d. To see if the town will vote to adopt the following as an ordinance for zoning purposes:

ZONING ORDINANCE Town of Exeter, New Hampshire

To promote the health, safety, convenience, and general welfare of two for Exeter, to secure efficiency and economy in the process of developing the Town, and to keep it an attractive place in which to live and do business, the following Ordinance is hereby conferred by Chapter 51 and Chapter 53 of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, 1942, or any amendments thereto.

ARTICLE I Definition of Zones


Section 1. For the purpose of this Ordinance, the Town of Exeter is divided into three (3) zones, namely: ZONE 1, to be known as the BUSINESS ZONE; ZONE 2, to be known as the RESIDENTIAL ZONE; and ZONE 3, to be known as the RURAL ZONE.

Section 2. The boundaries of these districts are shown on the Zoning Map of Exeter, filed with the Town Clerk of said Exeter, and are further described on a copy of said Map attached hereto and made a part thereof.

Section 3. Where uncertainty exists with respect to the boundaries of the various zones as shown on the zoning map, the following rules shall apply:

a. Where the zone boundaries are indicated on said map as streets, roads, highways, waterways, or other similar convenient landmark, such

streets, roads, highways, waterways or similar landmark shall be con-strued to be the boundary of such zone.



b. Where the zone boundaries are not indicated on said Map as above, such measurements as are indicated on said map shall govern.
c. Where the zone boundaries are not indicated as in (a.) or (b.)

above, they shall be determined by use of the scale on said zoning map.

ARTICLE II

General Provisions

The provisions of Article II shall apply to all zones

Section 2. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed as preventing the continuance of any existing use of land or buildings, but when any non-conforming use is discontinued for not less than one year, the property upon which it is situated shall be subject to the Building Provisions of this Ordinance as set forth in Article III. Section 3. For the purposes of this Ordinance, a non-conforming use

is defined as follows:

a. In the Business Zone and the Rural Zone, those specified uses for the establishment of which a permit must be obtained as appears in Articles IV and VI, respectively.

Articles IV and VI, respectively.

b. In the Residential Zone, all uses other than residential.

Section 4. The provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to such farm structures as small dairy rooms, root cellars, poultry houses, or other similar small structures necessary to farming; nor shall they apply other similar small structures necessary to tarming; nor shall they apply to small outbuildings customarily erected as accessory to dwelling houses, provided the same do not exceed ten (10) per cent of the total ground floor area of the main dwelling house upon the premises.

ARTICLE III

Building Provisions

Section 1. The provisions of Article III shall apply to all Zones, but shall not apply to the alteration, repair, or replacement of the interiors of buildings or structures, providing a non-conforming use of such build-

ings or structures is not intended.

Section 2. Buildings or structures used for dwellings, in existence at the time of passage of this Ordinance, in the process of construction at the time of passage of this Ordinance, or erected after the passage of this Ordinance, may be altered at a cost of twenty-five (25) per cent of the assessed valuation of the premises prior to such alteration, and buildings or structures used for business prior to such attention, and buildings or structures used for business purposes, in existence at the time of passage of this Ordinance, in the process of construction at the time of passage of this Ordinance, or erected after the passage of this Ordinance, may be altered at a cost of twenty (20) per cent of the assessed valuation of the premises prior to such alteration, without the approval of the

Selectmen as hereinafter provided.

Section 3. All new buildings or structures to be used for dwellings or business purposes, and all alterations or construction, the cost of which will exceed the limits set forth in Section 2, must receive the approval

of the Selectimen, to whom adequate plans and specifications of the proposed buildings, structures, or alterations must be submitted.

The term "Cost" as used in the preceding sections shall be reckoned as actual expenditures to be made with relation to the proposed alteration.

ations.

Section 4. Buildings destroyed by fire, lightning, or otherwise, or damaged to an extent whereby the cost at the time of undertaking repairs or replacement exceeds (50) per cent of the assessed valuation at the time of such destruction, shall also be subject to the approval of the Selectmen as provided in Articles III and VII. Buildings so damaged or destroyed, the repairs or replacement of which are not undertaken for two (2) years thereafter, shall be subject to the approval of the Selectmen as aforesaid.

as aforesaid.
Section 5. The Selectmen shall base their approval or disapproval of the proposed plans upon the effect such operations or construction are likely to have upon the value and use of other property in the vicinity, and upon the following schedule of requirements.

a. Foundations shall be constructed of concrete, brick, cement block, or stone; Provided, however, that private garages, whether attached to the main dwelling house or business building or not, need not conform to the provisions of this Sub-section (a.). By special permit of the Selectmen, where soil conditions may require, timber post may be used as foundation. as foundation.

Chimneys shall be constructed of concrete, brick, or stone, and b.

lined with standard flue linings for chimneys from the ground; all chimney entrances shall be of fireproof construction.

c. Buildings shall be framed according to good building practice, and outside walls shall be covered with fire resistant or wood shingles, siding, clapboards, stucco, or brick; buildings of material customarily painted shall be painted.

Pitch roofs shall be constructed according to good building practice and covered with wood, tile, asphalt, slate, or cement asbestos

shingles.

Nothing herein shall be construed as preventing the use in con-

e. Nothing herein shall be construed as preventing the use in construction of materials generally accepted as being equivalent in quality and attractiveness to those hereinabove set forth.

f. All dwelling houses or public buildings shall connect with public sewer systems where available, provided no unreasonable expense or hardship is involved. All sewage disposal systems shall comply with the standards of the Town Health Officer and the State Department of Health, and with all state statutes and town ordinances.

g. All dwellings and buildings when wired for electricity shall conform to the National Electric Code.

form to the National Electric Code.

h. All dwellings and buildings as completed shall conform to the Fire Ordinances of the Town and all State statutes.

l. New buildings, structures and accessory buildings, whether attached to existing buildings or structures upon the premises or not, shall be erected not closer than twenty (20) feet from the front lot line of the land upon which they are to be located: Provided, however, that if a building, structure or accessory building located upon an abutting lot is situated nearer than twenty (20) feet from its front lot line, such new building, structure or accessory building may be located equally as close

building, structure or accessory building may be located equally as close to its front lot line.

The provisions of this Sub-section (i.) shall not apply to porches and entry-ways, whether open or enclosed, nor to sunparlors and bay windows, to be attached to present dwelling houses or business structures; nor shall this Sub-section apply to bay windows and open entry-ways to be attached to new dwelling houses and business structures.

j. When any tract or parcel of land is divided into two or more separate lots, it shall be considered a Sub-division, and the following regulations shall apply to the erection of buildings and structures to be need for dwellings or husiness: used for dwellings or business:

used for dwellings or business:

(1) New buildings, structures, and accessory buildings, whether attached to existing buildings and structures upon the premises or not, shall be erected not closer than six (6) feet from the side lot lines of the land upon which they are to be located.

The provisions of this Sub-section (j. [1]) shall not apply to bay windows and open entry-ways, whether to be attached to new dwelling houses and business structures or to be added to existing buildings and structures.

ARTICLE IV

Provisions for Zone 1 - The Business Zone

Section 1. No use shall be permitted that is injurious, noxious, or offensive to the neighborhood by reason of the emission of odor, fumes, dust, smoke, vibration, noise, or other similar cause.

Section 2. The following types of uses shall be permitted:
a, All dwellings or structures used for dwellings, whether in single-

residence or multi-residence units. b. All stores and offices for the sale or servicing of articles customarily sold or serviced in a community, except as hereinafter provided in

Sub-section (g.). c. Offices for the handling of administrative functions and the per-

formance of professional services.

d. The manufacture or processing of all goods or products customarily manufactured or processed in a community, except as hereinafter provided in Sub-section (g.).

e. Miscellaneous uses such as: Athletic clubs or gymnasiums, billiard

parlors and pool halls, bowling alleys, radio broadcasting and receiving stations, dance halls, halls and auditoriums used primarily for entertainment or recreation, exhibition halls, skatting rinks, swimming pools. g. A permit must be obtained from the Selectmen before the estab-

lishment og businesses or other uses as follows:

(1) Gasoline stations, garages, or service stations.(2) The renting or leasing of land, or the furnishing of facilities for

the accommodation, for hire, of one or more trailers or similar vehicles. (3) Commercialized amusement parks, including outdoor motion picture theatres.

(4) Junk Yards, dumps, or the accumulation of three or more unregistered motor vehicles which are unfit for re-conditioning for use on the highway

(5) Slaughter houses or poultry dressing plants.

(6) Establishments for the sale for consumption on the premises of beer or other al'oholic beverages; specifically excluding from the operation of this Sub-section (g.) hotels and service clubs.

ARTICLE V

Provisions for Zone 2 - The Residential Zone

Section 1. No use shall be permitted that is injurious, noxious, or

section 1. No use shall be permitted that is injurious, noxious, or offensive to the neighborhood by reason of the emission of odor, fumes, dust, smoke, vibration, noises, or other similar cause.

Section 2. The Selectmen, or their agent, shall ascertain, before acting upon an application for a permit for the construction or alteration of any building or structure, whether or not the intended use of such buildany building or structure, whether or not the intended use of such building or structure will in any manner be detrimental to the neighborhood in which it is located. Should any question exist in the opinion of the Selectmen regarding the effect of such intended use in the neighborhood, they shall, before acting upon such application, submit the case to the Board of Adjustment for review. The Board of Adjustment shall hold a public hearing to determine the reaction of property owners or occupants in the neighborhood, and grant or refuse a permit on the basis of their findings.

ARTICLE VI

Provisions for Zone 3 - The Rural Zone

Section 1. No use shall be permitted that is injurious, noxious, or offensive to the neighborhood by reason of the emission of odor, fumes, dust, smoke, vibration, noises, or other similar cause.

Section 2. All uses permitted in the Business Zone and the Residential Zone shall be permitted in the Rural Zone, except as follows: A permit shall be obtained from the Selectmen before the establishment of business control of the second section. shall be obtained from the Selection between the establishment of nesses or other uses as follows:

a. The renting or leasing of land or the furnishing of facilities for the accommodation, for hire, of one or more trailers or similar vehicles.

b. Commercialized amusement parks, including outdoor motion picture

theatres. c. Junk yards, dumps, or the accumulation of three or more unregistered motor vehicles which are unfit for reconditioning for use on the

highway.

d. Commercialized slaughter houses, engaged in the slaughtering and dressing of livestock not raised on the premises.

Section 3. The building provisions set forth in Article III shall apply Rural Zone, shall read as follows:
Rurl Zone, shall read as follows:

a. Buildings or structures used for dwellings, in existence at the time of passage of this Ordinance, in the process of construction at the time of passage of this Ordinance, or erected after the passage of this Ordinance, may be altered at a cost of forty (40) per cent of the assessed valuation of the premises prior to such alteration, and buildings or strucvariation of the premises prior to such atteration, and buildings or structures used for business purposes, in existence at the time of passage of this Ordinance, in the process of construction at the time of passage of this Ordinance, or erected after the passage of this Ordinance, may be altered at a cost of twenty (20) per cent of the assessed valuation of the premises prior to such alteration, without the approval of the Selectmen as hereinafter provided.

ARTICLE VII

Administration

The Selectmen of the Town are the administrative and en-Section 1. forcement officers of this Ordinance. If they deem it expedient, they may delegate their duties of investigation and inspection to an agent of their own choosing, whose duties it shall be to make the proper investigation and inspection as herein required, and to report his findings to the Selectmen, for their decision.

Section 2. Any person contemplating construction of new buildings or structures, and any person contemplating an alteration to an existing

building or structure so as to come within the terms of this Ordinance must first obtain a permit from the Selectmen. Applications shall be made upon forms to be furnished by the Selectmen.

a. Upon the filing of an application in proper form, the Selectmen or their agent shall make inspection of the premises, and of the plans and specifications to be followed in such construction. Such plans and specifications to be followed in such construction. fications need not be drawn by an architect, nor need they be precisely to scale, but they must be in such form as to be readily clear to the Selectmen or their agent. b. A fee not to

men or their agent.

b. A fee not to exceed Two Dollars (\$2.00) for new construction or One Dollar (\$1.00) for major altertions may be required by the Selectmen upon the filing of applications. In the event, however, of the denial of an application, the aforesaid fee shall be returned to the applicant. All fees retained shall be applied towards the expenses of administering this

Ordinance.

c. Such agent as may be chosen by the Selectmen shall be paid on the basis of each application he is requested by said Selectmen to investigate and inspect, without regard to the number of calls he may see fit to make

to the premises.

to the premises.

Section 3. Upon the filing of an application, the Selectmen shall take positive action within seven (7) days. In the event of no action being taken within seven (7) days, approval shall be presumed, and a permit shall issue upon request of the applicant.

a. Upon the granting of a permit the Selectmen shall cause the same to be published in the earlist possible edition of The Exeter News-Letter, b. Construction for which a permit has been issued by the Selectmen may be commenced no earlier than seven (7) days following the publicative of mathematics of the earlier servers of the se

lication of such permit as aforesaid.

c. Upon the petition of five (5) or more persons, either owners or occupants of five (5) separate pieces of land in the immediate neighborhood, not more than one of whom shall be from one household or business establishment, made within seven (7) days of the publication of such permits, the Selectmen shall call a public hearing upon the question thus raised before the Board of Adjustment.

d. If the Selectmen are in doubt as to whether a permit should be issued, they may call a public hearing before the Board of Adjustment, at which time all interested parties may be heard.

- Notice of all public hearings shall be published in The Exeter News-Letter not less than three (3) days nor more than ten (10) days prior to the date of such hearings. All public hearings shall be called not more than twenty-eight (28) days following the date of the original application of the such as the cation

- f. Notice of the denial of a permit or of a petition of citizens brought under Sub-section (c.) hereof must be furnished to an applicant within twenty-four (24) hours of such denial or the filing of such petition. The posting of a letter shall constitute notice as herein required.
- g. An applicant whose permit has been denied by the Selectmen may file a petition for review before the Board of Adjustment within ten (19) days following such denial, such petition for review to be filed in the Office of the Selectmen.

Section 4. At least once during the course of construction, the Select-men or their agent shall make inspection of the premises to ascertain whether or not the provisions of this Ordinance are being compiled with. This inspection shall be certified on the application as filed in each case.

Section 5. If the Selectmen discover, upon inspection, information, or any other means, that the terms of this Ordinance have been or are being violated, they may, in the alternative, call a public hearing before the Board of Adjustment, at which time all interested parties may be heard upon the issue raised, or they may, on their own initiative, commence action in the courts of Law or Equity to enforce compliance with, or rectify such violation of, this Ordinance.

Section 6. Offenders who are found intentionally or wilfully to have disregarded the terms of this Ordinance may be fined a sum not to exceed Five Dollars (\$5.00) per day, such fines to be reckoned from the date of a Court's finding of such wilful or intentional violation, and to continue, at the Court's discretion, at the aforesaid rate of Five Dollars (\$5.00) per day until such violation has been rectified.

ARTICLE VIII

Board of Adjustment

Section 1 The Board of Adjustment shall consist of five (5) citizens to be appointed by the Selectmen, not more than one of whom may be a member of the Exeter Planning Board. Its functions and duties shall a. To aid the Selectmen in arriving at a decision as to the granting of a permit, when so required by the Selectmen.

b. To review a decision of the Selectmen granting a permit, when so

required by the filing of a petition by citizens as aforesaid.

c. To review, upon petition of an applicant, the denial of a permit by

c. To review, upon petition of an approximate the Selection.

Section 2. The Board of Adjustment shall render their decision only following a public hearing, at which time all interested parties have had opportunity to be heard.

Section 3. In rendering their decision, the Board of Adjustment may, the state discretion grant a variance from the terms of this Ordinance.

within their discretion, grant a variance from the terms of this Ordinance, in the interests of preventing hardship or injustice to an applicant. Section 4. A quorum of the Board of Adjustment shall be three (3) members thereof sitting at a particular hearing, subject to the following qualification: The concurring vote of three (3) members of the Board shall be necessary to reverse any action of the Selectmen, or to decide in favor of the applicant or petitioners on any matter upon which it is required to

pass, or to effect any variation in this Ordinance.

Section 5. A person who feels that his rights have been infringed by the decision of the Board of Adjustment may make due appeal to the Superior Court for Rockingham County.

ARTICLE IX

Conflicting Provisions

Section 1. Whenever the regulations made under this Ordinance differ from any statute, ordinance, or other regulation, that provision which imposes the higher standard shall govern.

ARTICLE X

Amendment

This Ordinance and the boundaries of zones shown or described on the Zoning Map may be amended at any annual, special, or adjourned Town Meeting in accordance with the Provisions of Chapter 51 and Chapter 53 of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, 1942, or any

amendments thereto.

ARTICLE XII

Effective Date

Section 1. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

ARTICLE XIII Validity

Section 1. If any Article, Section, Sub-section, or portion thereof, or any portion of the Zoning Map is declared invalid or unconstitutional, it shall not be held to impair or invalidate the force, effect, or validity of any other portion of this Ordinance or Map.

Report of the State Tax Commission

DIVISION OF MUNICIPAL ACCOUNTING

CONCORD, NEW HAMPSHIRE, January 19, 1954.

Board of Selectmen, Exeter, New Hampshire Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Exeter for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

Scope of Audit

Included in the audit and examination were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Road Agent, Library Treasurer, Clerk of the Municipal Court, Trustee of Trust Funds and Water Department.

 $Financial\ Statements$

Comparative Balance Sheets — December 31, 1952 -

December 31, 1953: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1952 and December 31, 1953, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$22,106.36 during the year 1953.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition:

(Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expen-

ditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues:

(Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$9,598.41, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$4,921.16, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$4,677.25.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance, as of December 31, 1953, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Bonded Debt: (Exhibit J-1)

A statement of bonded indebtedness, (Town and Water Department) as of December 31, 1953, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit J-1.

Water Department: (Exhibits K-1 to K-3, Inclusive)

The Water Department section of the report, including Water Department balance sheet of December 31, 1953, is included in Exhibits K-1 to K-3, inclusive.

Audit Procedure

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

General Comments

Conclusion:

The accounts of all town officials and departments which we examined were found in good condition and the accounting procedure conformed to the prescribed methods.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next an-

nual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Exeter for their assistance during the course of the audit.

Public Library Report

Since a number of patrons of the library have inquired about the method of selecting books an explana-

tion in the town report would seem in order.

There is a book committee consisting of five members of the library committee and the librarian. It meets once a month except during July and August. Each person brings a list of books to the meeting. A discussion is held concerning the books and a list is made out for the librarian to order.

These are purchased with the understanding that

they may be returned if not deemed desirable.

A large number of the fiction books are read, before circulation, by members of the book committee and several patrons. If a book is rejected by one person it is passed on to another reader; if he or she accepts it, it is given to a third one to assist in making the final decision.

Non-fiction as a general rule is not read before being placed on the shelves for circulation; if a doubt exists

it is carefully examined.

The librarian is willing to accept recommendations for books and the committee will consider them for purchase. Naturally all requests cannot be granted because funds are limited.

Exeter is extremely fortunate in having the three Merrill funds which are to be used for non-fiction. Many worthwhile books have been purchased from this in-

come

This fall the Junior Woman's Club offered to supply readers for the Children's Story Hours. It was decided to start having them every other Saturday afternoon. So far attendance has been quite satisfactory. This opportunity is taken to express sincere appreciation to the ladies for their kindness and cooperation.

Two more bays of steel shelves for magazines and newspapers have been purchased this year. These will provide more adequate space to store back numbers in excellent order and to make them easily accessible.

Since increased circulation is the aim of every library staff the citizens of Exeter are urged to take full advantage of the services provided by the local library.

A borrower is limited to one copy of new fiction (7 day books) but may take any reasonable number of non-

fiction or older fiction books.

Children seven years old may have their own cards and enjoy the many volumes available in the attractive children's room. They may take any reasonable number of books.

One of the highlights of the past year was the redecoration of the library, which added much to the neat-

ness and attractiveness of the building.

For the loyal support and cooperation of the staff and library committee the librarian is grateful indeed.

Report of Water Commissioners

Your Board of Water Commissionrs wishes to point out to the citizens of Exeter that improvement in service and equipment are continually being made to the water system. New mains in various parts of town are providing better fire protection, and entrance pipe renewals are improving the service to individual customers.

For another year the only water pumped into the mains has been from the new well in Gilman Park. although stand-by equipment of most modern design is ready at the old station in case of need. The water from the well is tested frequently by the N. H. Board of Health and reports show that it is of excellent quality. Also, the amount of water pumped during the summer drought proved the adequacy of the supply.

The attached report of Superintendent Bean shows the amount of water pumped during the year as well as the lengths of mains and services laid in order to

keep up with increased demands.


