

## THE PRIMARIES.

The new houses were completed in season for the last Spring term, and the Primary Schools now occupy six rooms, convenient and pleasant. During the present winter term, sickness has caused a great falling off in attendance; but in the summer term all these rooms without exception were full, and most of them excessively crowded. Of course in these large schools good government is a principal thing. A lax and inefficient management educates a rebellious spirit in children, which makes them troublesome pupils in after years. Few can safely make their first venture as teachers in these large schools: and the School Board is naturally averse to placing an untried teacher in charge of 60 or 70 pupils. We say this in consequence of numerous applications from those, whose superior claims only need the support of a short experience in smaller schools, to be favorably considered by the Board.

The Primary schools, as a general thing, have been very satisfactory and compare well with those of former years. The neatness, and the gentle and respectful manners of the children, in some of them, lead us to remark that much more might be done by Primary teachers in forming the manners of children, if attention should be turned in that direction. In some of the rooms we have seen very neat drawings, and in one, a class of twelve came out with their slates on the last day and passed a very creditable examination in linear drawing.

#### THE SECONDARIES.

In these four schools, which we have sometimes called the Upper Primary, the great work is to perfect the classes in the four fundamental

rules of Arithmetic. Unless pupils are very perfect in these rules, they are a hindrance and a drag in the grade above, because these rules are not there taught. None but experienced teachers are aware how much drill is necessary to make pupils proficient in these rules. It is not enough for a teacher to say "my class can do all the examples in Multiplication and Division," but she should be able to say "my class can do any examples" in those rules.

Some of the schools of this grade have been models of order and discipline; in only one has there been serious disorder, which was promptly

attended to by the committee having it in charge.

The annual examination for the advancement of pupils into the higher classes has been made this year earlier than usual; and we are able to state the result, which is the usual practice in other places. The committee having it in charge have made written examinations, convinced that this is the method most likely to satisfy themselves and all others. In School St. the committee examined 17, admitted 13, or 76.4 per cent. In the Main St. school, examined 13, admitted 8, or 61.5 per cent. In Lincoln St. examined 9, admitted 7, or 77.7 per cent. In Washington St. examined 9, admitted 2, or 22.2 per cent. In the Fuller school which is mainly a Primary school, admitted 1, or 25 per cent. In all 31 pupils were admitted.

Complaint has been made by some of the intermediate teachers, and we think justly, that the classes of last year were imperfectly drilled in the fundamental rules. The Grading Committee have reason to think, that the classes of the present year are much better prepared than those of the preceding; and that a proper attention on the part of sub-com-

mittees will hereafter secure the requisite thoroughness.

#### THE INTERMEDIATES.

The annual examination for admission to the Grammar School gave the following result: In the Church St. school, examined 16, admitted 14, or 87.5 per cent. In School St. examined 15, admitted 13, or 80.6; in all 27 pupils.

These schools have both been very successful and satisfactory. Much of the hard work in Arithmetic is done in this grade, and it is believed better done this year than the preceding. In one of these, great excellence was attained in Guyot's method of map drawing; in the other we have seen at various times miscellaneous drawing of great excellence.

#### GRAMMAR SCHOOL.

This school has enjoyed another year of uninterrupted prosperity under the same teacher as the year before. In age, stature, maturity of mind, and amount of work done, this school is not very different from the lower department of the High School five years ago. With scarcely an exception the pupils of the first class are 13 years of age. Greenleaf's Arithmetic, with some less important rules omitted, has been finished. The first class have gone through the Elementary Grammar and commenced analysis and parsing. The requirements of this grade seem to be met. and the standard sufficiently high for admission to the High School. Examined for promotion, 26; admitted to High School 21, or 80.7 per cent.

#### THE HIGH SCHOOL.

The past year began with new teachers in both departments of the High School. This change necessarily implied new regulations, and to some extent new methods of teaching. The little difficulties of a new order of things being happily overcome, the school has been very successful and prosperous. Although there has been but one period of admission during the year, yet the number of pupils has averaged from 80 to 90; many former members having renewed their attendance.

With the advice and aid of Mr. Brackett, a course of study has been adopted which embraces a period of four years. Under this arrangement the first class of 17 will graduate at the close of the present term. It is not supposed that this plan will in any way affect unfavorably, those who have not time to complete the course, as such pupils will be allowed to recite with higher classes, in such studies as parents may elect.

We are gratified in stating that Drawing, about which much has been said, is now being properly taught in this department, by Mr. Brackett.

During the past year, and heretofore, there have been pupils in our schools, who do not belong to the district, but come from a distance and pay tuition. It is but justice to say of them, that, with one exception, they have been exemplary in their conduct and industrious and worthy members of the school.

COURSE OF STUDY FOR THE HIGH SCHOOL.

4th Class. first year.—Algebra, Davies' Elementary, English or Latin Grammar, Harkness' Latin Grammer, Physical Geography, and U.S. Geography reviewed.

3d Class, second year.—Geometry, Davies', Latin or French, Harkness' Reader, Otto's French Grammar, National Philosophy, National History, Hooker's.

2d Class, third year.—Latin or French, Hanson's Latin Prose, Physiology, Botany, Gray's Lessons and Manual, Chemistry, Porter's.

1st Class, fourth year.—Latin or French, English Literature, Astronomy, Geology. Compositions and declamations throughout the course.

Surveying if desired. Arithmetic will be reviewed in the latter part of the course, as it is believed, that a portion of this difficult study requires a maturity of mind not attained until the last year of the course

MEMORANDA.—The High, Grammar and Intermediate schools will begin on the second Monday, and all others on the third Monday in April, and all finish on the Friday before July 4th. In the Summer term, all will begin on the Monday nearest the first day of September, and finish on the Friday before Thanksgiving. In the Winter term, all will begin on the Monday after Thanksgiving, the High School continuing 14, the Grammar and Intermediate 12 weeks, and others, according to amount of appropriation. The committee for examination will be present at the High School building, on the last Saturday of vacation at nine o'clock, A. M., for the purpose of examining all pupils in the several grades that for any reason have not been examined.

In compliance with the Laws of the State, the Supermitenting School Committee of Keene, submit the following report of schools for the year ending March 9th. 1869.

The sum raised by the Town for the support of schools at its last annual meeting was \$5,240,00. The amount of Literary Fund received by the Town was \$142,95. Surplus of Dog Fund, distributed \$463,50. The amount raised by Union District for Ligh School &c. \$1,500,00; for rent of rooms \$200,00; debt and interest \$2500,00; repairing School houses \$600,00; in addition to this there has been paid for instruction in private schools about \$300.00, making the amount expended in town for the purposes of education \$10,946,45.

#### SCHOOL STATISTICS.

- Dr. I. F. Prouty visited the schools in District Nos. 2, 3, 5, 6, and the winter term of No. 4.
- J. H. Spalter visited schools Nos. 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and the summer term of No 4.
- No 2. First term ten weeks; whole number of scholars 25; average attendance 22; one instance of tardiness, and nine of disures al; corporeal punishment none. Second term eleven weeks; whole number of scholars 32; average attendance 26; three instances of tardiness, and nine of dismissal; corporeal punishment none. This school has made very good progress, particularly the younger classes.
- No. 3. First term 9 weeks; whole number of scholars 21; average attendance 18; instances of tardiness 10; dismissals none; not absent one half day 4; corporeal punishment none; number of visitors 11; This is the teacher's first attempt at teaching, and the school has profited by her good work. A change of teachers for the second term; length of school 12 weeks; whole number of scholars 20; average 18; tardiness none; dismissals 12; number of visitors 18; not absent one half

day 6; corporeal punishment none. This teacher has had considerable experience in teaching, and appears to have profited by that experience. The recitations indicate that she has labored faithfully.

No. 4. The summer term was of 10 weeks; whole number of scholars 10. This school was kept by a young teacher, and this her first school. Miss Robbins possesses in an eminent degree the qualification requisite for a successful teacher; quickness of apprehension to discern the wants of her scholars, and tact in imparting knowledge. In the general management of her school, and advancement of the interests of her scholars, she was successful.

Second term 14 weeks; whole number of scholars 16; average 13; instances of tardiness 19, and 5 of dismissal; not absent one half day 3; corporeal punishment none; number visitors 11. This is the second term this teacher has had charge of a school; and has done remarkably well for one of her experience. We were shown a few beautiful specimens of map drawing.

No. 5. First term 10 weeks; whole number of scholars 14; average attendance 12; instances of tardiness 9, and of dismissals none; not absent one half day 6; corporeal punishment none. Second term, length of school 14 weeks; whole number of scholars 14; average attendance 12; instances of tardiness 13; and of dismissals none; not absent one half day 1; corporeal punishment 2. For one of her experience, this teacher has done well. At the close of the second term, we regret to say, we did not visit this school, by reason of an error of our own, mistaking the day.

No. 6. First term 6 weeks; whole number of scholars 6; average attendance 5; tardiness 3; dismissal 1; number of visitors 6; number of scholars not absent one half day 1; corporeal punishment none; Second term 10 weeks; whole number of scholars 13; average 10; tardiness 6; dismissals 4; number of visitors 26; These are the first schools this teacher has taught; she has shown herself industrious and successful.

No. 7. First and second term of 16 weeks, with a vacation of about 2 weeks; whole number of scholars 6 the first term, and 8 the second term. Miss Ellis has had considerable experience in teaching, and her reputation as a teacher is of the highest order. I am happy to say that her usual success attended her efforts in this school. The appearance of the school during our visit, was quiet and studious, and it was apparent that she had the love and respect of the scholars and parents. This school was remarkably successful.

No. 8. Had no summer term. The winter term was of 18 weeks; with 6 scholars in all. This school was kept by Miss Robbins who taught No. 4 during the Summer; we were much pleased with her first school, this being her second effort. We cheerfully bear witness to the

faithfulness and tact evinced by this teacher in the management of this school. The exercises in Arithmetic, Geography, Reading &c., and the appearance of the school generally, were all that could be desired. It was evident that she had secured the esteem of scholars and parents.

No. 9. Summer term of only 5 weeks with 16 scholars. This school was short on account of sickness in the teacher's family. It closed before the committee was aware of it, and no opportunity was had to make a report. Nevertheless, the parents speak well of her success while it kept.

Winter term of 12 weeks; whole number of scholars 25; the gentleman who taught this school, Mr. Gilbert, came with a good record, as a faithful and energetic teacher. I thought at the commencement of the school, that the district was fortunate in securing the services of a teacher of experience, and so good a reputation. I am happy to say that the closing examination fully sustained my first impression. It was apparent that the teacher had spared no labor in advancing the interests in the school. A good proficiency was made by the scholars generally.

No. 10. Summer term of 12 weeks, winter term of 12 weeks, and 26 scholars in all. This school was taught by a conscientious and faithful teacher, who labored assiduously to advance the interests of the school. She had had no previous experience in teaching, this being her first school. I think good progress was made by the scholars, generally, and I think that it is the impression of the parents that their children have been well attended to and feel satisfied with its result.

Winter term of 12 weeks; 26 scholars was under the same teacher; with the same satisfactory result.

No. 11. No summer term. Winter term of 17 weeks, with 10 scholars. This school was also taught by one of our young teachers, who could claim but little experience, this being her second effort at teaching. This teacher possesses a peculiar aptness in teaching, apprehending quickly the wants of her scholars. The school at its close was in excellent condition, exhibiting industry and per everance on the teacher's part, and diligence on that of the scholars. It gives us great pleasure to bear witness to her eminent success.

We are happy to say that a very good corps of teachers have been employed the present year. The scholars have made good progress in all of their studies. The younger scholars have done quite as well as the older ones. We attribute this to the more thorough dicipline practiced by the teachers to day than in former years. They have been quite successful in opening to the understanding of the scholars, the more difficult questions, particularly the fundamental rules of arithmetic. We are of opinion that, say ten years ago, the young scholars

then were allowed to pass important questions, without being able to make explanations, hence a habit of carelessness encouraged, which the scholar is in danger of practicing later in life.

That our schools may be carried on successfully, much talk, and much labor is needed; first the districts should not be careless in selection of prudential committees; these committees should also be careful in the selection of teachers. It is far better that a teacher should not have any prejudices to contend with in the district. Superintending committees should be appointed with care. Men who may have an interest and willing to work for the cause of education.

Book education is not all that is required for a successful teacher. They should be correct in deportment, correct in language, exacting, yet kind, and have method in their demonstrations; they should be punctual, and require the same of those in their charge.

There is a work which neither committees nor teachers can do. can only be done by parents. The registers say that many visits have been made during the year, but in a few of the districts, the number is small. Parents, your part in this matter is an important one; and could you see it in the light that both committees and teachers view it, you would make your visits more frequent than you now do. We say, go to the school often; make general observations in the room, observe the care of the teacher for the scholar, and the scholar for the teacher. the care of books, maps, furniture &c , even a suggestion by you might be of great value.

Permit us to say here one word to teachers. Do not allow yourselves to recite for the scholar, for by so doing, you are sure to make poor scholars, to show a poor examination. Labor to inspire the scholar with a confidence in themselves. Only two instances of corporcal punishment are reported, and we hope that the time is not far distant, whon this method will not be known.

At the last annual meeting the town voted to raise two thousand dollars to build a Soldiers' Monument, and five hundred dollars to build a new road at South Keene, which money has not been used for either purpose. We have expended about twenty-three hundred dollars of that amount for a Hook and Ladder Carriage, for building a new road near Ashley Jones', and for widening Spring St. (as authorized by vote of the town but for which no appropriation was made.) The balance, with the overlay, Railroad and Savings' Bank tax, and money refunded for U. S. bounties, we have applied to paying town notes, and should have paid more if we could have found the notes.

The estimates for the next year we think will be sufficient; that for highways is more than we have expended the past year, although the seasons have been very favorable, both summer and winter; that for the fire department will depend upon the number of men in the companies, the amount the town pays them, and the disposition made of the fire department after the water from Goose Pond is brought into the village; that for paupers is less than has been expended this year. There has always been quite a loss on County paupers by the Commissioners refusing to allow what we had to pay which difficulty we hope will be obviated by removing paupers to the County farm. At the farm we have expended considerable for bedding and other articles in the house; the stock of provisions and the amount of hay is much larger and in better condition than we found them a year ago; also the farm stock. We think the amount will be sufficient. The amount for schools is what is required by law under the new apportionment.

#### THE CHIEF ENGINEER'S REPORT.

To the Selectmen, Gentlemen—I beg to submit the following report of the condition of the fire apparatus of the town, and such matters as pertain to the Fire Department:—

There have been four fires only in this town during the past year, as follows:

March 14th, 1868, alarm of fire about 6 o'clock, A. M., caused by a defect in the chimney of Col. N. Hart's house on Pearl St. Damage \$50. Insured. Firemen out promptly.

July 29th, alarm of fire about 8 o'clock, A. M., caused by a pipe bursting in the Gas house. Damage small. Firemen out promptly.

Jan. 15th, 1869, Fairbanks's steam mill was discovered to be on fire about 11 o'clock in the evening. The Department were promptly on the ground and did all that men could do, but the fire made such rapid progress that their efforts were only crowned with success in saving the Engine and surrounding

buildings. M. Fairbanks loses the building, saw mill, grist mill and sash and blind machinery, in all about \$40,000, insured \$22,675. E. Kendall loses in pails and boxes \$3000. Insured for \$2000. E. Murdock, manufacturer of pails, loss \$2000, no insurance. T. Sherman, manufacturer of sash and blinds, loss \$2000, insured for \$1000. D. Buss loses in machinery \$300, no insurance. J. & A. II. Grimes and A. II. Freeman lose in grain and meal \$50.

Feb. 21st, D. W. Buckminster's house was discovered to be on fire about noon and an alarm was given; the Department were prompt, and prevented the fire from burning the building; damage large. Insured.

The Deluge, Neptune, Niagara Engines and Hose carriages and entire equipments are in excellent condition. The committee have bought a new Hook and Ladder Carriage named Washington, when the new ladders are done it will be a splendid carriage and will add greatly to the Department. It will be necessary to purchase at least two thousand feet of leading Hose the ensuing year; it may be necessary to change the size of Hose to fit the Hydrants which will be the fire steamer size, two and a half inch. Our Hose being smaller than is in general use.

A detailed statement of the expenses of the Fire Department are given elsewhere by the selectmen and it is not necessary to report it here.

I cannot close this report without acknowledging my deep obligations to the Assistant Engineers, officers and men, of the Department, and bear testimony to their efficiency upon all occasions connected with their duty as firemen.

## State of New-Hampshire.

To the inhabitants of the Town of KEENE. in the County of Cheshire, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Keene, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a moderator to preside in said meeting.
- 2. To choose a Town Clerk.
- 3. To vote for Governor. Councillor, Senator, Railroad Commissioner, County Treasurer, Register of Deeds, and County Commissioner.
- 4. To vote by ballot for one person, an inhabitant of the Third Congressional District in this State, as a Representative in the Congress of the United States for the term of two years, from and after the third day of March, A. D. 1869.
- 5. To determine how many Representatives the town will send to the State Legislature.
  - 6. To choose one or more Representatives to the General Court.
- 7. To see if the town will adopt an act of the legislature of New Hampshire, approved July 1, 1868, entitled "An act to annex the town of Roxbury to the town of Keene," or take any action in relation thereto.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to re-affirm and re-adopt an act entitled "An act to establish the City of Keene," approved July 1st, 1865.
- 9. To choose Selectmen and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to expend any part or the whole of the Literary Fund for the support of Schools.
- 11. To see what method the town will take to repair highways and bridges the ensuing year.
- 12. To raise money for the support of schools, defray town charges, and to build and repair highways and bridges.
- 13. To see in what manner the town will direct the Selectmen to apportion the school money.

- 14. To see if the town will vote to pay members of the Fire Department a sum in addition to that allowed by law.
- 15. To see what sum of money the town will raise to defray the expenses of the Fire Department.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to have the street lamps lighted and to raise money for that purpose.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to put up additional lamp posts and to raise and appropriate money for that purpose.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay the town debt, or interest.
- 19. To see what action the town will take in relation to any indictment now pending against the town, or in which they have an interest.
- 20. To see what action the town will take in relation to the highway and railroad crossing near South Keene and northerly of the railroad stone bridge, and appropriate money therefor.
- 21. To hear the report of the water committee and take any action thereon, or in relation to the town water works.
- 22. To see if the town will take any measures to secure a safer egress from the Town Hall in case of a sudden alarm of fire, or any occurring accident.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to purchase leading hose, and appropriate money therefor.
- 24. To see whether the town will vote to pay for new uniforms for Neptune Engine Company No. 2, and raise money therefor.
- 25. To see if the town will vote to raise money to widen and straighten Elm Street as laid out by the Selectmen the past year.
  - 26. To allow accounts.
