WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING
TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.

March 12, 1968

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of Strafford, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, A.D. 1968 at 11:00 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers:

A town clerk for the ensuing year.

A selectman for the ensuing three years.

A treasurer for the ensuing year.

A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Two auditors for the ensuing year.

A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow up to the sum of \$30,000.00 in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the town will vote to raise \$361.64 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,410.93 to be contributed by the state.

ARTICLE 5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to be used in cooperation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, within the confines of the town.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the bicentennial celebration.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of improving Class V roads and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purpose thereof.

ARTICLE 9. To see what action the town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.

ARTICLE 10. To see what action the town will take on selling the fill from the town gravel bank located on the north side of Pudding Hill Road to Capital Shopping Center, Inc. The removal of the fill to start at a point 25 feet from edge of road and leave a slope of 2:1. Approximately 215,000 cubic yards for a sum of \$6,500.00 with payments prorated on a monthly basis.

ARTICLE 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

RECORD OF TOWN MEETINGMarch 14, 1967

ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

For Town Clerk for the ensuing year voted the Moderator should cast one vote for Lucile D. Hutchins. This being done, Lucile D. Hutchins was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Selectman for the ensuing three years, Kenneth Wolcott had 26 votes, Harry Cheney, Jr. had 56 votes. Harry Cheney, Jr. was declared elected for the ensuing three years.

For Treasurer for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for John W. Printy, and this being done, John W. Printy was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Dorothy S. Dugan, and this being done, Dorothy S. Dugan was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Auditors for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk cast one ballot for Enid V. James and Barbara Houston, and this being done, the two named were declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Trustee of Trust Funds for three years. Georgia Armitage was elected as Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. Voted that the Selectmen choose and appoint all other necessary town officers.

ARTICLE 3. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow up to the sum of \$30,000.00 in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 4. Voted to raise the sum of \$325.72 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,171.49 to be contributed by the State.

ARTICLE 5. Voted to raise and appropriate the county tax.

ARTICLE 6. Voted No. To see if the town would raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.

ARTICLE 7. Approved the article for the Town to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, within the confines of the town.

ARTICLE 8. Approved the article for the Town to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Oyster River Home Health Association.

ARTICLE 9. Voted a budget of \$17,005.72 for the current year.

ARTICLE 10. Vote on articles of amendments to the Zoning Ordinance as recommended by the Planning Board.

ARTICLE 11. A tribute was given on the death of Dr. George MacGregor. James Colprit spoke on the upcoming 25th Anniversary of the Madbury Volunteer Fire Department.

We were reminded that 1968 would be a Bicentennial year for Madbury.

ARTICLE 12. There being no other business to come before the meeting, it was declared adjourned.
