THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote on Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, and polls to close at six P.M., to act upon the following subjects:

I. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to derray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.

5. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the Construction of Class II roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,297.50.

6. To see if the Town w.ll vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the care of Cemeteries.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$980.00 for Street Lighting.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Northwood Public Library.

10. To see if the Town will vote a discount on such part of taxes as paid on or before July 15, 1949.

II. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Interest on Temporary Loans.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for Pine Blister Rust Control.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding 1/100th of one percent of the Town valuation, based on the 1948 assessment, to the Merrimack Valley Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven communities in the Merrimack Valley Region.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for use by the Recreation Commission.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 as a Capital Reserve Fund, to acquire and improve a beach at Northwood Lake.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purpose of acquiring land to be used as a Public Cemetery.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$503.64 for the purpose of Town Road Aid.

18. To transact any other business to come before said meeting.

LAWS RELATING TO TRUST FUNDS

Chapter 51, Revised Laws of N. H.

19. In General. Towns may take and hold in trust gifts, legacies and devises made to them for the establishment, maintenance and care of libraries, reading-rooms, schools and other educational facilities, parks, cemeteries and burial lots, the planting and care of shade and ornamental trees upon their highways and other public places, and for any other public purpose that is not foreign to their institution or incompatible with the objects of their organization.

We would suggest that persons desiring to leave a sum of money, the income of which is to be used for the care of cemetery lots, should deposit at least \$200.00

At the present rate of interest, wherever possible, those funds, the principle of which is \$100.00 or less, should be increased.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Northwood:

Beginning this year, an advance in consolidation has been made by combining at the Ridge School all of Grades VII and VIII in the district. The resulting organization is as follows:

This arrangement, in respect to the children from the Narrows, increases the time that the teacher can devote to each grade by an amount ranging from 8 % to 25%. The increased transportation is taken care of by a cooperative arrangement between the Academy and district.

During the last five years, the elementary enrollment has increased from 101 to 140, or over 38%. This year for the first time, school census enumerators in the state have been required to list children from birth to five years of age. The numbers show considerable variation from year to year, but no startling overall increase. Coe-Brown Northwood Academy showed an enrollment of 76 students at the beginning of this school year. Two workshops for elementary and secondary teachers in Supervisory Union No. 44 have been held in Barrington during the past year, one in Fine Arts (under the direction of Dr. Mildred M. Landis) March 25 and 26, and the other September 20-24 (under the direction of Miss Grace L. Felker and Dr. Lura O. Bruce) in Physical Education and Health. The directing personnel was furnished by the State Board of Education staff. Time devoted to these workshops was an allowable deduction from the required school calendar. The teachers were assiduous in their labors at the workshop, and the results have been evident in the classroom and playground activities of the pupils ever since. Teachers who took summer school or extension work this past season include Mrs. Giles (UNH), Mrs. Williams ,Concord), Mrs. Coombs (LaSalle), and (of the Academy staff) Miss King and Mr. Colter.

Dr. Hilton C. Buley came from New Jersey to succeed Dr. Edgar Fuller as State Commissioner of Education. Dr. Fuller is now executive secretary of the Council of Chief State School Officers. Dr. Arthur S. Adams is the new president of the University of New Hampshire.

Miss Edna M. Quimby, who served as a teacher in Northwood schools for more than two score years, retired under the state teachers' retirement system at the close of school in June, 1948. She had been teaching Grades V4VIII at Brookside School.

Teacher changes remind us that teacher recruitment is the responsibility of all—teachers, parents, and community leaders. Of the 300 elementary teachers now needed in the state, on y 23 candidates are expected to graduate from the N. H. teachers' colleges next June. Appropriate guidance should begin in the elementary grades, by interesting in the work any young people who show an ability to deal with people rather than things. Northwood should furnish at least one qualified elementary teacher per year to the state. Other scarce subjects are Home Economics, Trades-Industries, Mathematics and Science.

New equipment provided for the district this year includes two S. V. E. combination slide-film and film-strip projectors with screens. In addition to material available for loan or rental, a certain number of slides and rolls for use with these projectors should be purchased every year to build up a school visual library. The Supervisory Union has combined to purchase a

Maico Puretone Audiometer for discovering hearing loss, and the Massachusetts Vision Test for selecting those who should be referred to eye specialists. This equipment was recommended for purchase and use in the schools by the Health Services Division of the State Board of Education office, in consultation with a board of experts. The town Recreation Commission is also providing additional playground apparatus. All elementary pupils were taken on an educational trip to Benson's Animal Farm for a day. Such trips for enlargement of experience are a valuable feature of school life.

The Harvey Lake Women's Club has donated a wire recorder with microphone to the Academy. This equipment is available and has already been used by the elementary schools. The Club also sponsored the school dental clinic, as usual.

Mrs. Esther B. Coombs continues as musical instructor in the grades. At Coe-Brown Academy, a commercial course has been added to the curriculum, including shorthand, typing, bookkeeping, junior business training, consumer education and salesmanship. The American Council on Education strongly recommends the Armed Forces Institute courses to any persons joining those services.

Preventive measures were featured in the school health work. Clinics arranged by the School Nurse, Miss Myrtle Fletcher, and carried on by Dr. Alfred D. Mihachik and others, included a dental clinic, in which the fluorine treatment was introduced, and a toxoid clinic, at which diptheria and tetanus antitoxin were administered.

Many districts are transporting their high school pupils. Northwood is well situated for that service to be rendered. It is likely that encouragement in this direction may come from the state. A more adequate teachers' retirement law seems to be supported by practically all groups. This is embodied in the Pillsbury Bill. On the national level, federal aid to education without federal control is needed to meet the emergency in education and equalize opportunity throughout the nation. Special help is needed both from the federal government and the state toward a school building program. Industry and commerce spent 13 billions in 1948 for new plant facilities, whereas school building has been practically at a standstill for 10 years, in spite of increasing school populations. A more adequate tax program on the state level is needed, to spare the local communities an unreasonable assessment burden. Adequate scholarship aid from public resources must supplement private means in order to finance in the later college and graduate school years the kind of minds that the country needs to keep it strong for defense and prosperity.
