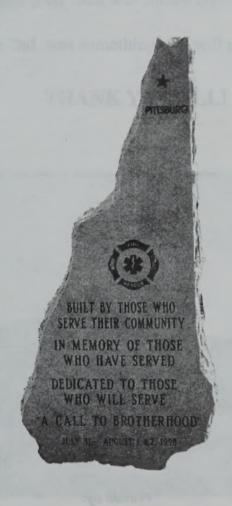

#### **TOWN WARRANT**

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE
THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 7:00 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Bremer Pond Auditorium in said Town of Pittsburg on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of one Selectman for three years; one Road Agent for one year; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one Library Trustee for three years; one Overseer of Welfare for one year.
- 2. Polling hours in the Town of Pittsburg are now 8:00 AM to 7:00 PM. Shall we place a question on the state election ballot to change polling hours so that polls shall open at 11:00 AM and close at 7:00 PM for all regular state elections beginning September 2002?
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a 1999 Police Cruiser and to trade in the 1996 Police Cruiser toward this purchase; and also to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seventeen thousand dollars (\$17,000) for this trade-in purchase, and authorize the withdrawal of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) from the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund created for this purpose. The balance of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) is to be raised by taxes. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to renovate the ambulance garage to make additional office space for the Police Department and the Town Clerk and to raise and appropriate the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for this purpose. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to be added to the Highway Heavy Equipment Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to be added to the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fourteen thousand three hundred sixty-three dollars (\$14,363) to be added to the Dump Closure Capital Reserve Fund previously established and appoint the Selectmen as Agents to Expend from this fund. This sum will be transferred from the General Fund encumbrance. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) for perambulation of the town line. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 9. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of sealing paved roads.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$661,115 which represents the operating budget. Said sum does not include special articles addressed. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Polls will not close before 7:00 P.M.

#### STIPULATION ON PETITION FOR EXPENDITURES

NOW COME the parties and stipulate and agree as follows:

- 1. It being impracticable to expend monies from the Gayle S. Carr Trust for the purchase of an ambulance, the doctrine of cy pres is hereby invoked to permit expenditure of a portion of the Carr Trust for the building of a garage to house the town ambulance.
- 2. The Ambulance and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund is to be renamed the Gayle S. Carr Trust and is to be held according to the terms of the will as a trust fund by the Town of Pittsburg Trustees of Trust Funds.
- 3. The Board of Selectmen is hereby authorized to withdraw the sum of \$30,000 from the Gayle S. Carr Trust for purposes of building a garage to house the town ambulance.
- 4. The balance of the income and principal of the Gayle S. Carr Trust shall remain in the custody of the Town of Pittsburg Trustees of Trust Funds and shall be expended in the future for the purpose originally intended by the donor.

## POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

In 1998 the Pittsburg Police investigated a total of 106 accidents. Of these accidents, 54% involved collisions with animals. There was one snowmobile fatality in 1998. We had 81 motor vehicle cases. There were 84 criminal cases. These involved several thefts and other property type violations. Together with several other agencies, we arrested a person that was involved in a very extensive marijuana growing operation. That person is currently awaiting sentencing in a federal prison. The second subject has also been identified and it is anticipated that he too will be convicted.

The one area of major concern was the dramatic increase in juvenile cases. We handled 25 juvenile cases in 1998. I feel strongly that our youths are the ones that are going to make a difference in the community and therefore in 1999, I will be concentrating on seeing this number decrease. If any of you have any suggestions on how we can help the youths of our communities, please call me and I will be happy to listen to your thoughts or suggestions.

Additionally, we responded to numerous burglar alarms and other calls for service. We did several vehicle lock outs. Property checks still remain one of our top priorities.

With the threat of rabies still lingering in the state, I want to urge all of you to make sure your pets get their rabies shots. Because of the wandering nature of some cats, it is important that you get them vaccinated. It is a state law that they have to be vaccinated.

All the members of the department not only met the mandatory minimum hours of training, but exceeded them. We will continue to try and improve on the quality of service to the community.

In closing I would like to thank the various state, local and federal agencies that assisted us in 1998. I would also like to thank the Selectmen for their support and cooperation. If any of you have concerns, questions, or comments about the department, please feel free to call or stop in and share them with me.

## **AMBULANCE CORPS REPORT**

#### REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department and State Forest Ranger, contact your local Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required before doing ANY outside burning. Violations of RSA 227-L:17, the fire permit law and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines of up to \$2000 and/or a year in jail. Violators are also liable for all fire suppression costs.

There are ten Forest Rangers who work for the New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands, Forest Protection Bureau. State Forest Rangers are available to assist communities with forest fire suppression, prevention and training programs as well as the enforcement of forest fire and timber harvest laws. If you have any questions regarding forest fire or timber harvest laws, please call our office at 271-2217.

There are 2400 Forest Fire Wardens and Deputy Forest Fire Wardens throughout the State. Each town has a Forest Fire Warden and several Deputy Wardens who assist the Forest Rangers with forest fire suppression, prevention, and law enforcement. Early in 1998 we experienced an ice storm which caused severe damage to forests of New Hampshire. This damage created a greater potential fire hazard as well as safety hazards to many areas of the State. Your local fire warden and Forest Rangers need your assistance in preventing wildfires in these hard hit areas and throughout the State. If you need assistance or information dealing with ice damaged woodlands, please call 1-800-444-8978.

The State of New Hampshire operates 15 fire towers, 2 mobile patrols and 3 contract aircraft patrols. This early detection, and reports from citizens, aid in the quick response from local fire departments. This is a critical factor in controlling the size of wildland fires and keeping the loss of property and suppression costs as low as possible.
