## TOWN WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Plaistow in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Plaistow on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,549.00 to be applied with an allotment by the State of \$1,549.00 for the purpose of completing the construction of Forrest Street.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$232.84 to be applied with an allotment by the State of \$931.36 for improvements on Class V Roads.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the purpose of decorating tree on Pollard Park with lights in observance of Christmas.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to be expended for the observance of Memorial Day.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be expended for the installation of pipe on both sides of Main Street near Duston's Store.



8. To see what action the Town will take relative to closing the Bryant Road.

9. To see what action the Town will take relative to closing that part of the Old Congregational Road connecting Main and Forrest Streets.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for a fire alarm system.

11. To see if the Town will waive and release any and all claims to the legacies to the Town of Plaistow under the will of Arthur G. Pollard.

12. To see what action the Town will take regarding the following trust funds:

John H. Noyes Fund	\$200.
Charles H. Jones Fund	100.
Walter A. Johnson Fund	50.
Cyrus D. Furber Fund	100.

The interest of same to be used for the perpetual care of lots in the Plaistow and North Parish Cemeteries.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary amount to install and maintain two electric lights on Evans Avenue, Plaistow, N. H. (By petition.)

14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the street leading from West Pine Street to Spinney Avenue, and appropriate money for the repair of same. Estimated \$500. (By petition.)

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be expended in widening and straightening the Road known as the Smith's Corner Road, running from the Newton line at Liberty Farm to Dow's Corner, Plaistow, as the said road is unsafe for automobile traffic. (By petition.)

16. To see what action the Town will take in relation to town officers' salaries and the organization of the board of Selectmen.

17. To see if the Town will adopt the provisions of Chapter 55 of the Session Laws of 1935 and pass any vote or votes necessary to carry out its provisions.

18. To see if the Town will authorize the Treasurer, upon the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

19. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

20. To see what the sense of the voters of the Town is in regards to the following questions, to wit: Is it expedient to revise the Constitution.

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Following is the report of the Plaistow Fire Department from February 1, 1936 to January 31, 1937.

The Department answered forty-five calls during the year. Seven of the calls were out of town, eight were chimney fires, nine were in dwellings, seven were in business buildings, two were automobile fires and the rest were grass and forest fires.

The total number of miles travelled for the year was one hundred and forty.

The total estimated fire loss for the year was two thousand three hundred and seventy-five dollars.

The operating expense for the year was within our budget of one thousand dollars. Two hundred and forty dollars of this money was used to buy 1½ in. hose.

The men of the department have built a new body for Engine Two. The Fire Association gave us three hundred dollars towards the purchase of the new pump for this truck.

Again, I want to thank the men of the department for their willingness to work and for their faithfulness in carrying out their duties as members of our fire department.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Plaistow:

I herewith present my annual report as Superintendent of your schools.

The statistical report is for the school year ending June 30, 1936. Following this report will be found reports by the Music Supervisor and the School Nurse.

Two changes in the teaching staff have taken place since my last report. Miss Edna Smith, principal and eighth grade teacher and Miss Ida Cushing, fifth grade teacher, resigned their positions to take effect in June. Mrs. Dorothy Bennett was appointed principal and teacher in grade eight. Miss Catherine Sullivan was transferred to grade five and Miss Hazel Gile was appointed teacher in grade four.

The enrollment for the year covered by this report was 206 or 23 less than during the previous year. The present enrollment is a little larger than it was a year ago. The school attendance averaged 94% of the membership. The average for the state was 94.75%.

Eighteen boys and girls were graduated from the eighth grade last June. All but two of these entered a high school. The Good Citizenship medal was awarded to Mildred McKenzie. The following list shows the September enrollment of Plaistow pupils in high schools:

The Home Economics course, which has for its chief aim worthy home-membership, alternates the work in foods with that in clothing. 90% of the time allowed this course is devoted to actual work in cooking or sewing. The girls have brought much of the material used in cooking from home and used the prepared food for hot lunches. In the clothing projects many useful articles are made and the repair and care for clothing taught.

The class has made in the past year 1730 cups of cocoa which have been served at lunch time. 200 of these have been paid for by the Parent-Teachers' Association and given needy children.

While the girls of grades 7 and 8 are engaged in home economics, the boys of these grades devote their time to a course in Introduction to Business. It is simple and teaches the business fundamentals indispensable in modern life. It contains units designed to develop the knowledge, skills, and proper attitudes needed for successful service at the junior level of employment.

The Parent-Teacher Association has assisted the schools by donations of money for clothing and milk, and by sponsoring a dental clinic. The Red Cross has made possible first aid material and two pair of glasses. The generous assistance rendered by these organizations is greatly appreciated.

Clubs have been organized in several rooms again this year. The second grade has an enthusiastic Reading Club, the fourth grade a Current Event Club, the fifth grade a Service Club, and the seventh grade has continued its Stamp Club. Westville enjoys its harmonica band. A Social Club has been organized in grade eight. The purpose of this club being the development of good citizenship together with correct and pleasing social behavior.

Standardized tests given during the year show that good progress has been made in the fundamentals.

Last summer a supply room was built in the attic of the Pollard School. This provides a suitable place for the storage of school supplies.

It is with sorrow that we record the death, last October, of Mr. Joseph T. Cook. Mr. Cook was a member of the School Board for over ten years. During this period of service to our schools his good judgement, independence of viewpoint and knowledge of school affairs won the respect and admiration of his associates. He will long be remembered for his sympathetic understanding, friendliness and courtesy.

For a number of years Plaistow has sufficiently recognized the value of music instruction to employ a special teacher of this subject to make the instructional work of the schools more effective. With children these days hearing so much music that appeals solely to the most elemental emotions, which need to be controlled rather than stimulated, it is of the highest importance that children be taught to appreciate and demand the

kind of music that elevates. "Music Appreciation" records for use on a portable orthophonic phonograph have been used. Schools equipped with radios have made use of the Damrosch Music Appreciation Broadcasts.

Since buildings constitute one of the important features in the educational life of our children, it is necessary that they should be clean, sanitary and warm. Our janitors succeed, I believe, in keeping our school plant in this condition. Pupils are taught to do their share in caring for the upkeep and appearance of the buildings by orderly disposal of wraps, use of hand washing facilities, and observation of other regulations.

The function of education is the development of character. Education is not a course of training for life at some future time. It is good living now. Education is not confined to the hours in the schoolroom, nor to a stated age. It is a continuous process throughout life. Therefore, it is necessary for teachers, school officials, pupils, parents, and citizens to have a clear idea of education, a theory that considers the maximum development of the individual as of the greatest importance. Such a development involves adequate teacher background and preparation, right attitude of girls and boys, co-operation of parents, and an intelligent and active interest in education by all citizens.

In conclusion I wish to express my appreciation of the fine spirit of co-operation on the part of the School Board, teachers, local organizations, and the local community.
