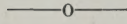

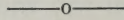

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sutton, in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Pillsbury Memorial Hall, in said Sutton, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of highways and bridges.
4. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid and raise and appropriate money for the same.
5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of state highways.
6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting.
7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the control of White Pine Blister.
9. To see if the town will vote to install four electric lights at Lake Blaisdell and raise and appropriate money for the same.

10. To see if the town will allow local societies the use of the Town Hall for the payment of the heating and lighting.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a curtain for the stage in the Town Hall.

12. To see if the town will vote to make any change with regard to the Library and raise and appropriate money for the same.

13. To see if the town will vote to accept special State Aid on the New London road and raise and appropriate money for the same.

14. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Gore road from the Gore cemetery to the Warner town line.

15. To see if the town will vote to sell the Mountain school house and appoint an agent to sell and convey the same.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

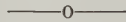

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

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To the Members of the School Board:

The annual report for the schools of the Sutton District is as follows:

The above comparison of totals shows a gain of 18 half-days in number of sessions, and a corresponding decrease in number of days lost. More pupils were registered, and the average membership was higher. The percent of attendance, however, is lower than last year. The number of tardinesses has decreased about 63%.

The number of pupils enrolled in public schools for this year was 105, making the per capita tax for December, 1929, \$210. Of these pupils 78 were enrolled in the schools of the district, and 27 in the schools of neighboring towns as follows:— New London elementary, 1; Warner elementary, 8; Claremont High, 2; Franklin High, 1; Warner High, 15.

During two and one-half weeks in October a dental clinic was held at Sutton Mills by Dr. G. A. Danforth of Manchester. Forty-two cases were treated, and three cases were treated elsewhere, so that every pupil who had defective teeth was assisted. The local Red Cross aided generously in providing funds for this work. In follow-up work by the school nurse fifteen home calls were made. This covered interviews regarding thirty-five children.

At the annual graduation exercises in June at the Town Hall the following pupils received diplomas: Mills School, Pearl Stoddard, Evelyn Johnson; North School, William Merrill, Gretta Palmer; South School, Vera West.

New and up-to-date text-books in arithmetic were purchased for grades 3-8 inclusive in all the schools.

In conclusion we thank everyone who has in any way contributed to the improvement of the schools. Though real progress has been made, there is still some room for improvement. To the parents, teachers, and members of the school board we would express our deep appreciation of their cooperation and support.
