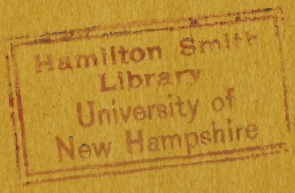

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Thornton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said Thornton on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid Construction and make appropriation for the same.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Libraries above what the law requires.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the care of Town Poor and make appropriation for the same.
8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
9. To see if the town will vote to allow 3% discount on taxes paid before September first.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Cemeteries.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$42.48 for the White Mountain Region Association.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise money for improvement of Mill Brook Road.

13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Fire Protection due to the war emergency, and make appropriation for the same.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to provide watchmen and police protection due to the war emergency.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the use of Town Health Officer and Board of Health due to the war emergency.

16. To see if the town will vote to give a sum of money to the Laconia Hospital Association and make appropriation for same.

17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to fight the White Pine Blister Rust and make appropriation for the same.

18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the New Hospital Fund.

19. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road in Thornton Gore, known as the Johnson Road from Frank Reardon's line to the old Johnson place so-called.

20. To see if town will vote to discontinue the road known as Barnard Road from the Main highway on East Side River to old Barnard place.

21. To see if the town will vote to charge 10% interest on poll taxes not paid by December 1st, of each year during which the tax was assessed.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
