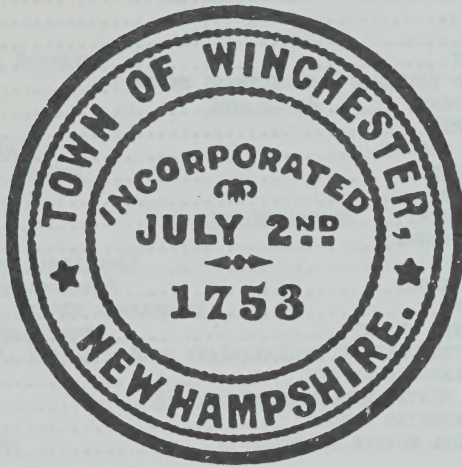

SELECTMEN'S REPORT - 1982

The Board of Selectmen wish to thank all the taxpayers and Town Officers for their cooperation during the past year. Selectmen hold regular hours on Wednesdays from 7 PM to 9 PM. Other times may be arranged by calling 239-4951 if these hours are not convenient. The Selectmen's Office is now open Monday through Friday from 7:30 AM to 3 PM.

We again call your attention to the numerous forms available in the Selectmen's Office to be used by the taxpayers for property taxation. The only form that is mailed out is the Inventory of Taxable Property. All other forms must be obtained at the Selectmen's Office. The law states that an Inventory form must be filled in, signed and returned to the Selectmen's Office before April 15th. If an Inventory form is not filed, there is no legal basis for the Board of Taxation or the Court to consider an application for abatement. Also a late return of the Inventory form will be assessed a penalty.

Veteran's Exemption

Permanent applications are available in the Selectmen's Office. We call your attention that, if a person eligible for exemption changes his domicile or a veteran's wife becomes a widow during the year, a new permanent application must be filed with the assessing officials.

Exemptions for Certain Elderly People (C.E.P.)

These forms are for persons who qualify for reduction in their tax bills. These forms must be completed and in the Selectmen's Office on or before April 15, 1984. If there is no completed form on file, we cannot grant the Elderly Exemption. As of April 1, 1984, the three categories of exemptions are from ages 65 to 74, 75 to 79, and age 80 and over. It is your responsibility to complete a new exemption form if you change categories.

Intent to Cut Timber

Every owner including State, County or municipality or public agency shall, prior to each cutting operation, file with the Selectmen a notice of intent to cut.

Assessment of Open Space

No owner of land shall be entitled to have a particular parcel of his land classified for any tax year under the provisions of this chapter unless he shall have applied to the assessing officials on the form approved by the Board and provided by the Tax Commission.

Permits

Any person, firm, corporation, municipality, public agency or institution desiring to operate, maintain, offer for rent, lease or tenancy a site, lot, field, tract of ground for location of any new building, trailer park, trailers or mobile homes or other similar conveyance, or place of abode for shelter shall obtain a written operating permit from the Board of Selectmen. Where applicable, it would be necessary to have received and to show proof of having received approval for construction granted by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission for

the construction of any septic tank system before a building permit or permit to park a trailer or mobile home shall be issued.

House Trailers

Whenever a person moves a house trailer or mobile home into a city or town for the purpose of establishing a residence in said city or town, or whenever a person purchases an existing house trailer or mobile home with the intent of residing in the same at the existing location he shall within fifteen (15) days of placement of the trailer or mobile home or within fifteen (15) days of the purchase of same, register with the Assessors of the city or the Selectmen of the town where he shall reside. Whoever fails to comply with the provisions of this section shall be guilty of violation 72:7B (1973:152).

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Being your Town Manager since November 1, 1982, has been a pleasurable experience to date. Since assuming the duties of the Town Manager I began assessing the Town's needs, and setting some goals for myself and the direction I feel the Town should go in to benefit the people of Winchester.

My first goal was to establish a proper budget format, purchase order system, and accounting system which is necessary for any municipality to operate efficiently. This line-item budget, which is roughly 100 pages long, itemized expenses in each department. The budget was presented to each Budget Committee member, and two are available for your viewing, one at the Conant Library, and one at the Thayer Library in Ashuelot.

Another goal I set was to somehow build Winchester's tax base. One cannot argue that taxes are high in Winchester. This I believe is a direct result of the lack of industry in town. Industry absorbs a high percentage of the tax rate and takes the property tax burden off the homeowner. It is time now that Winchester takes hold of its own destiny and promotes the town internally rather than relying only on outside regional organizations. As a result, Article 19 was inserted by the Board of Selectmen at my request. The article asks for \$1,000.00 to fund a pamphlet which will both characterize a community which is nice to visit and live in as well as show Winchester's potential for industrial expansion. The appropriation would also cover the cost of advertising Winchester in various trade journals to further help promote industrial expansion. I also intend to start a Chamber of Commerce to serve as a liaison between the town and potential industrial developers.

Thirdly, I would like to do something about Winchester's staggering welfare aid. As a result I have begun work on establishing a work program in town to require eligible welfare recipients to work for their aid. These jobs would include such things as sweeping roads and raking lawns. I hope to have this program established by June 1, 1983.

Finally, most towns in the area are currently benefiting from the Meals-On-Wheels program. After I received a few calls from some interested citizens, I looked into establishing this service in Winchester. After contacting Home Health Care and Community Services and doing some research in Winchester on the need of the program, it was decided that the town qualifies. Currently thirteen individuals have been confirmed as being eligible for the service. Winchester's contribution to the program is \$1,000.00 (Article 15), which I believe is money well spent.

I feel the town is very fortunate to have the dedicated people it has working for it. Of course, any help I can be to any citizen, I will be more than happy to assist you. All you have to do is ask. The town government is there for your benefit, don't be afraid to use it.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to continue the following regulations for granting discount on all taxes other than Resident Taxes:

1. All taxes of the tax payer for previous years must have been paid in full.
2. The full amount of the current year's taxes including the Resident Tax must be paid in full in order to claim discount.
3. A two percent (2%) discount will be allowed for payment of bills within ten days from date of mailing of bills.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize prepayment of taxes computed on previous years assessment including partial payments. Also, to authorize the tax collector to accept early payments on both real estate and resident taxes.

2. Conclude negotiations and adopt a treaty with the government of Canada that will commit both nations to the same goal.

The record of the vote on this article shall be transmitted to the New Hampshire Congressional Delegation and to the President of the United States.





AUDITORS' REVENUE SHARING COMPLIANCE OPINION

Board of Selectmen
Town of Winchester
Manchester, New Hampshire 03470

We have examined the combined financial statements of the Town of Winchester, New Hampshire for the eighteen months ended June 30, 1982, and have issued our report thereon dated December 14, 1982. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as considered necessary in the circumstances.

In connection with our examination, we also (1) performed tests of compliance with the Revenue Sharing Act and regulations as detailed in the "Commentary on the Audit Requirements of the 1980 Amendments to the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act" issued by the Office of Revenue Sharing, U.S. Department of the Treasury, and (2) compared the data on the appropriate Bureau of Census Form RS-8 with the unaudited records of the Town of Winchester.

In our opinion, for the items tested, the Town of Winchester complied with the aforementioned provisions of the Revenue Sharing Act and regulations except for the following matters:

- A. No detailed record of revenue sharing payments was maintained
- B. Public participation requirements:
 - 1. Public Notice of Budget hearing was not published ten days prior to the hearing date as required
 - 2. Notice of Availability of Enacted Budget was not published
 - 3. Notice of Availability of Use Report was not published
- C. No asset record is maintained of fixed assets purchased with revenue sharing funds with a cost greater than \$1,000 as required

We have examined the financial statements of the various funds and account groups of the Town of Winchester for the eighteen months ended June 30, 1982 and have issued our report thereon, dated December 14, 1982. As part of our examination, we reviewed and tested the Town's system of internal accounting control to the extent we considered necessary to evaluate the system as required by generally accepted auditing standards. Under these standards, the purpose of such evaluation is to establish a basis for reliance thereon in determining the nature, timing and extent of other such auditing procedures that are necessary for expressing an opinion on the financial statements.

The objective of internal accounting control is to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance as to the safeguarding of assets against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and the reliability of financial records for preparing financial statements and maintaining accountability for assets. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that the cost of a system of internal accounting control should not exceed the benefits derived and also recognizes that the evaluation of these factors necessarily requires estimates and judgement by management.

There are inherent limitations that should be recognized in considering the potential effectiveness of any system of internal accounting control. In the performance of most control procedures, errors can result from misunderstanding of instructions, mistakes of judgement, carelessness or other personal factors. Control procedures whose effectiveness depends upon segregation of duties can be circumvented by collusion. Similarly, control procedures can be circumvented intentionally by management with respect to the estimates and judgements required in the preparation of financial statements. Further, projection of any evaluation of internal accounting control to future periods is subject to the risk that the procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions and that the degree of compliance with the procedures may deteriorate.

Our study and evaluation of the Town's system of internal accounting control for the eighteen months would not necessarily disclose all weaknesses in the system. Such study and evaluation disclosed the following conditions which we believe are weaknesses

BUDGETARY CONTROLS

On March 5, 1982, the Board of Selectmen requested approval from the Commissioner of Revenue Administration for emergency authority to overexpend its budget by \$27,000 under RSA 32:10. This request was subsequently denied. At June 30, 1982 the general fund expenditures exceeded its appropriations by \$104,872. Fortunately, actual revenues exceeded revenue estimates by \$146,011 which negated the overexpenditure effect on fund balance. We recognize that it was extremely difficult to accurately budget for an eighteen month period. If actual revenues had not exceeded revenue estimates, the Town could have faced a fund balance deficit which could have an adverse impact on the town's financial condition and ability to borrow funds.

It appears that current budgetary reporting system needs revision to enable the Town Manager and the Board of Selectmen to respond to possible projected budgetary deficits in the future. Therefore, we recommend that the current budgetary system be reviewed by the new Town Manager and the Board of Selectmen. When projected budget estimates predict an overexpenditure, they should review the budget for possible reductions in other areas or be prepared to call a special town meeting for the purpose of appropriating additional funds to comply with the Municipal Budget Act.

SEWER EXTENSION EXPENDITURES

Our examination also disclosed that approximately \$203,000 was expended for extension of the current sewer system without an appropriation, a violation of state statutes (RSA 32:10). We understand that the entire cost of sewer system expansion was funded by grants from the Farmer's Home Administration of the U.S. Government. However, the Municipal Budget Act requires towns operating under RSA 32:10 to budget all revenues and expenditures on a "gross basis" except as provided under RSA 31:95-B which permits towns to expend monies that become available during the year without an appropriation if a public hearing is held prior to acceptance of these funds. It is our understanding that these funds could be anticipated prior to the adoption of the budget and could have been budgeted as an appropriation and revenue estimate.

We recommend that all future grants be properly budgeted as a revenue estimate and appropriation to comply with the Municipal Budget Act.

CUSTODY OF SEWER FUNDS

Our examination disclosed that the Town Treasurer does not have custody of sewer operating funds as required by RSA 41:29. We recommend that sewer funds be immediately turned over to the Treasurer to comply with state law. It is our understanding that the sewer commissioners and the Treasurer are in the process of implementing this recommendation very shortly.

SEWER ACCOUNTING RECORDS

The Sewer Commissioners do not maintain a cash receipts journal for sewer operating funds. In addition, this cash disbursements journal was not maintained in a proper form by date, payee, check number, amount and purpose to provide a good audit trail. It was necessary for the Selectmen's secretary to prepare a detailed cash receipts journal and a revised cash disbursements journal which reconciled with cash records before we could complete the examination. This represented a duplication of effort which is unnecessary. In the future, a detailed cash receipts journal and a detailed cash disbursements journal should be maintained by the Sewer Commissioners to substantiate their sewer system's financial activities.

APPROVAL OF WATER DEPARTMENT'S EXPENDITURES

The invoices which were selected in our audit sample of the Water Department indicated an absence of written approvals on the paid invoices. We recommend that all future bills be approved by the Superintendent before payment. He should be responsible to verify receipt of goods, quantities, unit prices and condition of goods received.

THAYER LIBRARY CASH FUNDS

Our examination disclosed a savings account and certificate of deposit which had not been previously reported by the library trustees. In addition, the library trustees periodically receive a distribution from a private trust held by a local attorney on behalf of the library which was not disclosed.

We recommend that the Treasurer of the Thayer Library report all cash funds in the Annual Town Report. We also suggest that the Trustees make arrangements with the custodian of the private trust to obtain a yearly distribution from the Trust instead of the current sporadic payment it has received in the past.

OTHER

The recommendations on administration and operational matters not directly related to internal accounting control, as listed below, were developed from our observation of the Town's operations during our examination. They are not the result of a special study.

MODERNIZATION OF ACCOUNTING SYSTEM

We suggest that the Town review the possibility of purchasing a "one-write" cash disbursements/payroll system designed for governmental units. We believe that the implementation of this type of system could eliminate some of the duplication of records currently maintained. In addition to general cash disbursements, a "one-write system" could be useful for disbursements in both the Water and Sewer Departments. There are currently several vendors who have systems which would be applicable to your needs. We are available to assist you to review systems which are currently available if desired.

SEWER OPERATIONSA. Budgeting

A detailed budget was prepared for sewer operations. Effective management requires that actual operations be compared to anticipated operations. In order to accomplish this objective, the budget should be compared to actual and material variances from the budget be analyzed on a periodic basis.

B. Cash Investments

We noted that excess cash was invested in a 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ % savings account. We recommend that the investment policy be reviewed to attempt to maximize return of these investments in higher yielding accounts in the future.

C. Abatements

The Sewer Commissioners abated \$6,558 of sewer fees, permits and penalties during the year 6.77% of total fees committed to the tax collector. This appears to be a higher percentage than other similar sewer operations. We recommend that more care be taken in the preparation of future sewer warrants to the Tax Collector.

D. Sewer Expansion Projects

Sewer expansion projects should be accounted for in a separate capital projects fund rather than through the General Fund.

E. Sewer Fund Plant and Equipment

A detailed breakdown of sewer fund plant and equipment is not available. We strongly urge the Commissioners to undertake the task of identifying fixed assets purchased or constructed since it's inception by major category. The Commissioners should consult with the project's consulting engineer for assistance. This information will be useful for the future should the Town want to make the sewer system truly self-supporting.

REVENUE SHARING COMPLIANCE

Our compliance audit disclosed several items of non-compliance with the public participation requirements of the revenue sharing act as follows:

- A. Budget Hearing Notice did not include the summary of proposed budget as required.
- B. Hearing notice was not published timely as notice was published only eight days prior to the hearing instead of the required ten days.
- C. Notice of Availability of the enacted budget was not published as requested.
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In addition, the following record-keeping requirement was not adhered to:

- A. No permanent record of fixed assets with a cost of more than \$1,000 is maintained as required. The record should contain date acquired, description, cost and record of final disposition.

While this violation should not require repayment of revenue sharing funds expended, it is extremely important that future compliance be mandated in order to show "good faith" to the Office of Revenue Sharing in complying with their regulations.

Please contact us when you receive notification from the Office of Revenue Sharing concerning this compliance audit.

HIRING OF POLICE BY OUTSIDE PARTIES

During the course of our audit, we noted that outside private individuals who hire police officers for private duty pay these officers directly. When on duty, these police officers represent the Town of Winchester. The Internal Revenue Service has taken action against other communities who operate in this same manner. Under existing federal laws, private duty police officers should be paid by the Town and not by the private individuals requesting these services. We recommend the following:

- A. All police officer's on private duty be required to submit a separate time card for each assignment stating name of officers, individuals requesting services, and hours of duty.
- B. A duplicate bill would be prepared by the Police Department stating the date, time, name of officer and amount. The amount of charge should recover salaries plus a reasonable amount for overhead. Payment would be made directly to the Selectmen's Office.
- C. The duplicate copy of the bill be submitted weekly to the Selectmen's Office who would be responsible for follow-up if the bill is not paid promptly.

ANNUAL AUDIT

This audit was made to comply with federal revenue sharing audit requirements. In the past, the Town has utilized the services of elected Town Auditor's who perform nothing more than a cursory review of financial data which should not delude you to believe a complete audit was conducted.

We strongly recommend to you that an annual audit be done annually by a knowledgeable outside Certified Public Accountant. The benefits of an audit are many-fold including possible reduction in financing rates, expert review of financial operations to disclose such errors and provide a consultant which the Board or Town Manager may call upon on a year-round basis. Most communities of your size have continuing annual audits conducted by Certified Public Accountants.

CONCLUSION

The length of this commentary letter might lead someone to a negative connotation about the Town's financial operations. However, the purpose of this letter is to provide constructive recommendations to Town Officials for improvements in the future. This is the first time that the Town of Winchester has been audited by Certified Public Accountants who are familiar with New Hampshire state laws and current operating practices within the State.

We did note many positive aspects of Town management and procedures which are not mentioned in this letter due to the nature of a letter of this type. In fact, we want to commend the dedicated efforts of all Town Officials for their efforts in attempting to carry out their difficult and many times complicated responsibilities and duties for little or no compensation.

We would like to acknowledge the assistance extended to us by Town personnel, especially Mr. Arnold B. Conway, Treasurer, Mr. Ralph Royce, Trustee of Trust Funds, Mary Johnson, Tax Collector and Mrs. Irene S. Ethridge, Selectmen's secretary. It would have been more difficult to complete this audit without their help.

ANNUAL REPORT - 1982

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

1. Despite a bad economy and unemployment which contributed to crime elsewhere, your Police Department can report a reduction in the rate of burglaries from a high of 44 in 1980 to a low of 12 in 1982.
2. Professional links with County, Border Town and State have been reinforced and have never been better. They have played a role in cutting back thefts, vandalism, mischief, drug and juvenile problems.
3. Our Highway Safety Project has resulted in a dramatic reduction in fatalities and injuries. Despite an increase in fatal accidents State-wide and in many areas of the country, we did not have a single fatality in 1982.
4. Special Officers are the backbone of a small Police Department. Our well-trained and certified officers are a credit to Winchester. As a vital component of our efforts to achieve effective collective police action regionally, many of our specials serve in the various neighboring Towns to achieve concerted result-getting police work.
5. Great credit for our achievements in the Crime Prevention Program and Highway Safety Project must go to Sherman Tedford who, with full training and certification, is performing with professionalism and dedication as our Full time Officer.
6. A noticeable population increase, coupled with the slowed economy has meant more domestic disputes and alcohol-related problems. Our Department faces them with compassion and professionalism, but this means that our manpower needs are escalating.
7. Linkage to Traffic Safety efforts and a Residence and Business Premises Check Procedure plus more efficient scheduling and management of our resources have held costs down and given to our taxpayers the best possible return on their tax dollars.
8. Your Police Department's achievements in effective crime and traffic control programs have had welcome recognition from Federal and other agencies. We are proud that our programs of preventive action are earning this endorsement.
9. We want to increase our "crime stopping" efforts further through even more patrol work, especially in the outlying areas where citizens deserve the highest police profile we can afford to give them. It means that we must rely even more on the moral and financial support of our taxpaying citizens.

The Summer Day Camp went very well last year. The staff included Joyce Beauregard, Cathy Gardner, Ruth Harrison, Mary Lou Brown and Ted Ryll. Included in the activities at the Center were daily arts and crafts, competitive sports, archery, lawn games, story sessions at the Conant Public Library and a seven week series of Walt Disney feature films shown throughout the summer.

The most emphasis in the summer day camp was put into the water safety program held daily at the Town Beach. With the aid of donations from community groups the Center was able to supply free bus transportation from the day camp to Forest Lake for any child wishing to enroll in the Red Cross lessons. Mary Lou Brown was the instructor with the help of Ruth Harrison. Nearly 80 children participated in the swimming classes and we encourage more to do so this coming summer.

Pee Wee League Baseball did very well last summer with six teams on our two diamonds. The Kiwanis Club of Winchester deserves a hearty thanks for the contribution of team shirts and caps for the ninety players. Our gratitude also goes out to the dedicated volunteers that provided their time and energy with the coaching staff. We are proud to report that the Winchester Pee Wee Allstar beat the Hinsdale Allstars for the third year in a row.

September the bowling season was under way again. Included in the groups using the lanes were the Tuesday Morning Womens League, Tuesday Couples League, Wednesday Womens League, Thursday Senior Citizens Group, Thayer Special Ed, Friday Open Bowling and Saturday Morning Childrens Bowling. Also using the lanes were the Hinsdale VFW League and various special groups such as the Girl Scouts and Brownies.

Ceramics have been popular at the Center. The Wednesday evening adult group consistently attracted a large turnout. The children seem to find interest in the ceramics program with a very large group in attendance. Thanks go to Mike Harrison, Cathy Gardner and Joyce Beauregard for maintaining this popular program.

We are very happy to have the Cub Scouts meeting at the Center again. Late in the year the Board of Trustees voted to sponsor a new Boy Scout troop in town. The old Canteen area has been designated as the new scouting area to be used for meeting purposes etc. We are hoping for a very productive program.

With regards to the energy situation, two purchases were made that will benefit future budgets for many years. A new high-efficiency oil burner was installed to help cut down the massive amounts of fuel needed to heat the bowling alley. In November the house was completely insulated with blown-in material. It should be noted that \$2,000.00 for the insulation work was raised by the Board of Trustees at no cost at all to the taxpayers or Trust Fund.

Trustee members were fairly active in planning and executing activities at the Center to raise money. A series of nostalgia nights, Christmas in July, Harvest Dinner, Christmas Bazaar and several 1-20 clubs were worked on. With the state of our present economy, any extra fund-raising projects can always be well used.

Home rentals for weddings, anniversaries, etc. were very frequent. A major contribution to helping meet our financial obligations was the rental of our basement on a steady basis. The upstairs floor of the house was rented as office space to the District Nurses and the Winchester Star newspaper. In June the Winchester Bible Baptist Church began renting the auditorium every Sunday for their services.

A number of functional and cosmetic projects were undertaken to improve the facility. A new sidewalk was put in to the front of the house, the floor of the Senior Citizen's room was sanded and refinished, and the parlor was perked with new paint and paper. These improvements will provide a nicer atmosphere for groups meeting at the building.

In the area of physical recreation we offered two new classes this past year. An aerobic dance exercise class was held in the spring and in the fall a very popular Karate class was added. A more subtle form of physical well being was offered in the spring and summer months in the form of the Conway Diet Workshop. We are encouraging persons with program ideas to come forth and present them.

At the ending of 1982 we are all looking forward to a new beginning in 1983. The Board is working on many new projects and ideas for the coming year. Finally, thanks are in order to the people of Winchester who support the E.L.M. Community Center.

REPORT OF WINCHESTER REVITALIZATION COMMITTEE

REPORT FROM THE SOUTHWEST REGION PLANNING COMMISSIONERS

Winchester, as a member of the Southwest Region Planning Commission, is one of a growing number of communities which have recognized and support the benefits of regionalism in their areas. As evidence of this growth in recent years, in 1974, 142 of the 234 local governments in the state were members of regional planning commissions, while today 201 can be counted as member towns.

As membership in regional planning commissions has grown, so have the areas of involvement and responsibility. Regional planning commissions provide a diversity of services to local governments which is not, has not, and can not be provided by any other agency, or array of agencies, federal, state or local, at comparable cost. These services are basically "one on one" at the local/grassroots level and have had the advantage of fostering trust and credibility within the arena of local home rule. Historically, the regional planning commission has responded to the needs, desires, and problems of local governments both on an individual and regional basis.

The Southwest Region Planning Commission's relationship with its member communities is enhanced by Commissioners who are a representative cross section of lay personnel (City Council Members, Selectmen, State Representatives; together with members of local boards and commissions and citizens at large, appointed by and accountable to their Boards of Selectmen or the Keene City Council).

The Southwest Region Planning Commission is an "in place" agency, familiar with its area, with a proven and demonstrated capability for assessment and implementation of local and regional policies, programs and plans as they affect local governments.

Some of the value Winchester specifically gains through its membership in the Regional Planning Commission is as follows:

- o Continued monitoring of the town's development in light of the projections and recommendations of its recently completed Comprehensive Plan.
- o Technical assistance in planning, zoning and development matters, including review and recommendations for change of zoning and subdivision regulations, and review of conformity of subdivisions proposals with local land use controls.
- o Access to seminars and workshops regularly conducted by the Regional Planning Commission to help towns keep abreast of new and changing conditions and court decisions concerning planning and development matters.
- o Access to review, evaluation and interpretations of new legislation at both the federal and state levels. Assessment of its impact on member towns, and recommendations concerning appropriate actions to be taken.
- o Involvement with the Regional Planning Commission in responding to the State's new solid waste legislation recommending initiatives to be taken by communities, in a collective or regional

manner, to deal with solid waste management. This legislation has significant impact and implication on how local towns must deal with solid waste management and disposal within a specific time period.

- o Assistance in the development of applications to obtain federal funds to assist the town in its economic development program.
- o Opportunity to take advantage of the Regional Planning Commission's circuit riding administrative assistant program, computer capability, and newly organized collective purchasing program which will join several towns together for bulk purchasing in order for each to reap substantial gains over independent purchasing.

THE WINCHESTER OFFICE

OF

MONADNOCK FAMILY AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

The Winchester District Office of Monadnock Family and Mental Health Services is located at Kulick's Mall in Winchester. It provides counseling services to the residents of Winchester, Richmond, and Hinsdale. The office is staffed by five professionally trained counselors and a part-time psychiatrist.

Counseling services are provided to adults, adolescents, children, and for family and marital problems. The staff provided over 400 hours of free service to teachers and students in the Winchester Schools. Included in our school-based services were a communication and cooperation group for elementary students, regular assistance in developing programs for students with behavior problems, an apprenticeship position and a peer counseling training program for high school students. We also provide advice and assistance to other community services.

Last year three hundred and eighty-four (384) residents of Winchester used our services. We have a local Citizens Advisory Board to assist us in planning our services.

Under the management of Home Health Care & Community Services, home health care services were provided to the residents of Winchester in 1982. Aided by town funds provided through the Winchester District Nursing Association as well as Medicare, Medicaid, other insurances and client fees, this new agency has continued to offer these critical services in a professional and efficient manner. The services available to all town residents on a personal, in-home basis include skilled nursing, homemaker/home health aides, speech therapy, physical therapy, occupational therapy and medical social work.

This past year was a happy and productive one for the Winchester nurse, Colette Schwartz, R.N., who gave birth to a daughter early in 1982. Affiliation with the new agency made it possible for Colette to take a leave of absence and to return to work this fall. During her leave, the nursing duties were assumed for approximately six months by Judy Dodier, R.N.

WIC clinics, Child Health Program clinics and blood pressure screenings previously offered by the Winchester District Nursing Association have continued to be offered to the community on a regular basis. In 1983 we look forward to new services including work with the Winchester School District as well as with other civic minded groups exploring the possibility of additional community services.

As a result of participation with Home Health Care & Community Services, the administrative costs associated with service delivery have dropped below 20%, or 20 cents for every dollar. The funding restrictions imposed as a result of Federal and State budget cuts may have a dramatic impact on home health care and therefore, it has become essential to monitor and control costs. It is our commitment to make every effort to accomplish this and to develop as well, new resources so that we can continue to provide these essential services to the Winchester community.
