

#### STIPULATION FOR FINAL DECREE

It is hereby stipulated and agreed, subject to the approval of the Court, that the following decree may be entered.

It is ordered, adjudged, and decreed as follows:

1. The re-establishment of the boundaries of the town highway in issue by the Selectmen of Center Harbor by certificate dated October 7, 1964, recorded in the Office of the Secretary of State November 24, 1964, and in the office of the Town Clerk of Center Harbor November 27, 1964, is hereby approved and confirmed, except as to that portion of the right of way of such highway now occupied by the marine railway and winch house of the Winnipesaukee Steamship Co., Inc. All of such highway, except the excluded portion, shall be a Class V highway to be maintained by the Town of Center Harbor.

2. The portion of the right of way of such re-established highway which is now occupied by the marine railway and winch house of the Winnipesaukee Steamship Co., Inc., shall be deemed a Class VI highway to be kept open for public travel by pedestrians only, over the footbridge hereinafter provided for and to the width of such footbridge only, as if it were a highway subject to gates and bars and subject to all the provisions of R.S.A. 234:18.

3. Winnipesaukee Steamship Co., Inc., and its successors in title, shall construct on or before June, 1966, and continuously maintain in safe condition a footbridge for pedestrian travel over its marine railway, connecting with each end of the re-established Class V town highway. Such footbridge be at least four (4) feet in width, shall be railed on each side, and shall have two or more ascending steps and two or more descending steps. Travel on such footbridge may be suspended for periods not exceeding twenty-four (24) hours at a time when boats are being moved over said marine railway.

4. Winnipesaukee Steamship Co., Inc., shall remove on or before May 1, 1966, all debris and materials from the right of way of such highway which are not affixed to the marine railway and winch house.

5. The Town of Center Harbor may construct and maintain a sewer line within the limits of the highway right of way under the said marine railway and winch house, with all rights and privileges sufficient to conform to minimum standards for Federal aid; provided that such winch house and marine railway shall not be removed in the process of such construction or maintenance. Municipal water lines may be constructed under such railway, and licenses for poles and wires may be issued to go over such railway, so long as the same do not interfere with the operation of such railway and are within the limits of the highway right of way.

6. Upon the abandonment of such marine railway and winch house, the portion of the highway right of way occupied by it may be reclassified as a Class V town highway without any award of damages to Winnipesaukee Steamship Co., Inc., or its successors in title. The marine railway and winch house shall be deemed abandoned if it is not used for an uninterrupted period of three (3) years, periods of national emergency excepted, by Winnipesaukee Steamship Co., Inc., or its successors in title, or if it is dismantled with intent not to rebuild.

7. The Town of Center Harbor shall maintain and enforce "No Parking on Either Side" signs and "Dead End Street" signs at both ends of the re-established Class V Highway.

8. Winnipesaukee Steamship Co., Inc., shall erect and maintain a short fence to hinder trespassing by pedestrians and bicycle riders around the northerly end of its winch house.

9. No damages or costs of court shall be awarded to either party in this action.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Center Harbor in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Center Harbor Town House in said Center Harbor on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at two of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Highway Department which includes care and maintenance of Sidewalks, Wharf Area and Fountain.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$3,400.00 for the maintenance of the Center Harbor Volunteer Firemen's Association.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise money in the amount of \$2,500.00 for Welfare and Town Poor.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for Parks and Playgrounds, including Band Concerts, Hunter Safety and hiring of a qualified Life Guard at the Town Beach, and if so, how much.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Assistance for Class V Roads, the Town to raise \$274.68 and the State will contribute \$1,831.20.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise money in the amount of \$100.00 for aid to the Family Service Association.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for aid to the Laconia Hospital and if so, how much.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$160.16 which is 1/300th of 1% of the net valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region. (By Request)
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$375.00 for new equipment.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to require that building permits be obtained from the Selectmen for all building construction and all alterations of existing buildings in excess of an estimated cost of \$200.00. Said premits to cost the sum of one dollar. Violators of the above regulations may be fined a sum of not more than ten dollars.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to require that a permit be obtained from the Selectmen to locate either a house trailer or a mobile home in Town of Center Harbor, said permits to cost the sum of one dollar. Violators of the above regulations may be fined a sum of not more than ten dollars.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$750.00 for the sale of a parcel of land 356' x 269' (approximately 2.2 acres), exclusive of water rights, formerly known as the Coe Pasture, to Rob Roy Macgregor, said parcel, a piece of hillside, lies at the northeast corner of the James S. Macgregor property, and is bounded on two sides by it. It is agreed that no building on, or other use of the land is to be made that would in any way interfere with the flow, or pollution of water in wells at the easterly side (foot of hill) of the parcel. Such water rights, if ever relinquished by the Town, are to revert to the property owner. (By Request)
- 15. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$250.00 to help defray the costs of Fireworks and Christmas Lighting. (By Request)
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

- 18. To choose agents or committees in relation to any article of the Warrant and to hear reports of any here-to-fore chosen.
- 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# Report of Forest Fire Warden and District Chief

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindful that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

### WE MUST ALL BE CAREFUL:

- 1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
- 2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
- 3. To safely despose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush;
  - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
  - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5:00 P.M.
  - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.
