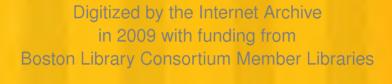

## TOWN WARRANT

## The State of New Hampsrire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dorchester in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dorchester on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at seven of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To chose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate money to maintain town cemeteries.

4. To review and establish salaries of Town officers.

5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$456.62 to secure from the State \$3,044.12 to be expended for Town Road Aid.

7. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance and Town Poor.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 for the Forest Fire Department.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$15.00 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money to add to the Capital Reserve Fund for repairs on the Town Hall.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money to add to the Capital Reserve Fund for the Replacement of Snow Removal Equipment.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for Civil Defense Activities.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 for Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital.

15. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, or Committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.

16. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Dorchester qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the Eighth day of March 1960, at seven o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see what action, if any, the Town wishes to take in regard to the sale of the Cheever School building. 10. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# EXPLANATION of SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent of schools as per the following quotation: "*Reports*. Each superintentendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report showing the total salary paid to the superintendent, which report shall show in detail the amount derived from the per capita tax and the amount paid directly by each school district in the union."

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30th. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union No. 48 during 1958-59 received a salary of \$7,000 which was made up as follows: \$3,500 paid from the per capita tax and \$3,500 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$1,100 for travel within the union was also prorated as stated above.

The table below shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district.

Superintendent's salary for 1958-59 based on the above figure is reconciled as follows: \$3,500 paid by various districts, plus \$3,500 from State per capita tax, equals \$7,000 superintendent's basic salary.

# SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

My annual report as your Superintendent of Schools will necessarily be short because as you know the schools that Dorchester pupils attend are not under my jurisdiction. In so far as I can determine from talking with the Superintendent in that area, there are no serious problems involving them.

You doubtless are aware of the fact that the Dorchester school population is at an all-time low and some members of your school district as well as myself have been approached concerning the problems involved in becoming an unorganized school district. It is my opinion that this would be a good step for you to take. Under such a system, the school district would vote to become unorganized. It would then not be necessary to have a school board and the State Department of Education would pay the tuition of, and transportation of, all of your school children. In other words, such a step would eliminate your total school budget which seems to me might be an important item in your economy, and your children would have the same educational opportunities as they do now. I believe it is a question of finances entirely. I can tell vou that two towns within my area who have such a system -Ellsworth and Waterville - have always been happy with the arrangements and on any future date that you decide to organize, a vote of the district would take care of this matter.

If you would like more information concerning this, myself or the State Department of Education in Concord would be glad to give you the full details.
