From the Selectmen's Desk--

Is 1994 over already? Time sure does fly! As ever, things were busy in the selectmen's office, and all the usual warrants, forms, licenses, permits, intents, etc. were there to be filled out, figured out, discussed, voted on, signed, and sent, on top of which, we had legislative changes affecting our town, and requiring some adjustments. New legislation is forcing Fire Departments across the state to take a hard look at their organization and decide if they wish to become a municipal department, or to remain independent. Changes in R.S.A. 289 now require towns to elect Cemetery Trustees. The form of management set up by R.S.A. 289 is very similar to that established by the Goshen Cemetery Commission, so the transition should not be a problem. The mapping and numbering for 911 is mostly done, with just a few details left for 1995. With this system in place, each dwelling will have its own number, making it easy to pinpoint an emergency call.

The VFP Workcamp was in Goshen this past summer and divided their time between trail work at Gunnison Lake with the Conservation Commission (Many thanks to Mark Burns for organizing that effort) and cleaning in and around the Pearson house.

There are already several items coming up for 1995. The Planning Board is working on a Capital Improvement Plan, and this board is most interested in working with them. We also hope that the town will see fit to purchase the Rand Pond lot, and we look forward to exploring the possibilities of that piece of property.

I would like to thank the retiring Cemetery Commission, Arthur and Elizabeth Nelson and Doris Newman, for all the work they have put in over the years in creating and maintaining maps and records of all the burials in Goshen cemeteries. This represents an enormous amount of time and effort- Thank you for a job well done.

It has been gratifying to see the many groups in town work together to make such events as the KidsFest and Old Home Day a whole town celebration. It is this spirit of cooperation that makes this little town of Goshen a Great Town.

GETTING TO KNOW YOUR TOWN
WHO'S WHO IN GOSHEN

BOARD OF SELECTMEN

The Goshen Board of Selectmen consists of three members. The Board functions as the town's executive branch and carries out all the mandates of the town meetings vote. The Board acts as a collective body. One selectman alone has no authority. Some things that the Board can do, without Town Meetings approval, are set weight restrictions, speed limits, layout of highways, and junkyard licensing.

TOWN CLERK

Town Clerk is elected at Annual Town Meeting every three years. The Town Clerk is responsible for keeping all town records, certifying actions of all town officials, collecting fees, and serving as an election official.

TAX COLLECTOR

Tax Collector is elected at Annual Town meeting every three years. A collector is responsible for collecting taxes and keeping a complete and accurate account of taxes due.

ROAD AGENT

The Road Agent is elected at Annual Town Meeting every two years. The Road Agent has charge of the construction, maintenance, and repair of the town's highways and bridges. The Road Agent is subject to the direction of the Selectmen. Other responsibilities may include rubbish collection and charge of local parks, cemeteries, and beaches.

BUILDING INSPECTOR

The Building Inspector is appointed by the Board of Selectmen. Any person who intends to erect or remodel any building shall submit the plans to the building inspector for examination and approval prior to beginning the planned construction. The Building Inspector also issues Occupancy Permits.

PLANNING BOARD

The Planning Board was created by Annual Town Meeting and consist of seven members. This is an elected position. Members must be residents of Goshen and serve a three year term. One Selectman serves as a full time voting member of the Planning Board. Responsibilities of the Planning Board include maintenance of the Master Plan, sub-division approvals, and adoption of local ordinances.

ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

The ZBA consists of five members who again must be residents of Goshen. This is an appointed position. They serve three year terms. The ZBA's primary responsibility is to approve and issue variances from the terms of the local zoning ordinances.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Goshen in the County of Sullivan in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Goshen Town Hall in said Goshen on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, 1995, at 11 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

The following four articles regarding proposed changes to the Goshen Zoning Ordinances are on the official ballot. The official copy of the amendment is on file and available to the public at the office of the Town Clerk and will be on display on the day of the meeting.

2. To see if the Town is in favor of adopting Amendment No. 1 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town of Goshen Zoning Ordinance as follows: Insert the following definition of Page 3, Subsection I, after the definition of "100 - year flood" and before the definition of "Regulatory floodway":

"Recreational Vehicle" means a vehicle which is (a) built on a single chassis; (b) 400 square feet or less when measured at the largest horizontal projection; (c) designed to be self propelled or permanently towable by a light duty truck; (d) designed primarily not for use as a permanent dwelling but as a temporary living quarters for recreational camping, travel, or seasonal use.

3. To see if the Town is in favor of adopting Amendment No. 2 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town of Goshen Zoning Ordinance as follows: Insert the following regulation on Page 8, Section VIII, Subsection e:

Recreational Vehicles placed on sites within Zones A1-30, AH, and AE shall either (i) be on site for fewer than 180 consecutive days, (ii) be fully licensed and ready for highway use, or (iii) meet all standards of Section 60.3 (b) (1) of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations and the elevation and anchoring requirements for "manufactured homes" in Paragraph (c) (6) of Section 60.3.

4. To see if the Town is in favor of adopting Amendment No. 3 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town of Goshen Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Insert the following definition on Page 2 Section 2: F 1 after the definition of "Mobile Homes":

"Recreational Vehicles" means a vehicle which (a) is built on a single chassis; (b) 400 square feet or less when measured at the largest horizontal projection; (c) designed to be self propelled or permanently towable by a light duty truck; (d) designed primarily not for use as a permanent dwelling but as a temporary living quarters for recreational

camping, travel, or seasonal use. A recreational vehicle shall remain self contained at all times and shall be fully licensed and ready for highway use.

5. To see if the Town is in favor of adopting Amendment No. 4 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town of Goshen Zoning Ordinance as follows; Amendment to Goshen Zoning Ordinance on Page 10.

The owner of any gravel pit in the Town of Goshen with a valid excavation permit shall be allowed to make use of a portable crusher for two-week periods from time to time after obtaining from the Board of Selectmen a permit to operate such crusher.

6. To receive the reports of the Town Officers of Goshen and take any necessary action thereon.
7. (By official ballot) "Do you approve of having 2 sessions for the annual town meeting in this town, the first session for choice of town officers elected by an official ballot and other action required to be inserted on said official ballot and the second session, on a date set by the selectmen, for transaction of other business?"
8. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to reschedule their total salary figure of \$7,400 equally among the Board and allow \$2,450 for each Selectman; the remaining \$50 to be added to the Administrative Assistants salary figure. (This article is approved by the Selectmen and by the Budget Committee.)
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums of money for general municipal operations:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000 (seven thousand) to repair the roof on the Town Hall and to authorize the withdrawal of that sum from the Town Hall Restoration Capital Reserve established in 1986. (This appropriation is recommended by the Selectmen and by the Budget Committee.)
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 (three thousand) to be added to the Construction & Reconstruction/ Septic & Handicap Capital Reserve established in 1994. (This appropriation is recommended by the Selectmen and by the Budget Committee.)

12. To see if the Town will vote to increase the Town Clerk's salary by \$300 (three hundred) from \$6,800 (six thousand eight hundred) to \$7,100 (seven thousand one hundred) and to add \$25.00 (twenty five) to 4155 Personal Administration to cover the towns share of FICA etc. (This article is not recommended by the Selectmen or by the Budget Committee.)
13. To see if the Town will vote to increase the Tax Collector's salary by \$300 (three hundred) from \$6,800 (six thousand eight hundred) to \$7,100 (seven thousand one hundred) and to add \$25.00 (twenty five) to 4155 Personal Administration to cover the towns share of FICA etc. (This article is not recommended by the Selectmen or by the Budget Committee.)
14. To see if the Town will vote to increase the hourly wage of the Deputy Town Clerk and Deputy Tax Collector from \$6.00 (six dollars) per hour to \$6.25 (six dollars and twenty-five) per hour. The funds needed for this increase are included in lines 4140 Election, Registration, and Vital Statistics and 4150 Financial Administration. (This article is recommended by the Selectmen and by the Budget Committee.)
15. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Town Clerk to retain 50% (fifty percent) of the income from Municipal Agent fees up to \$500 (five hundred). (This appropriation is not recommended by the Selectmen. This appropriation is recommended by the Budget Committee.)
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums of money. These sums DO NOT reflect any raise increase voted in Articles 12 and 13.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$26,500 (twenty six thousand five hundred) for a complete re-evaluation of the town and to authorize the withdrawal of \$15,000 (fifteen thousand) from the New Appraisal Capital Reserve established in 1990 and to further authorize the closure and use of the Reappraisal Fund still held by the Treasurer in the amount of \$7,808 (seven thousand eight hundred and eight) for this project, and further, to authorize the Selectmen to choose a reappraisal company to perform the reappraisal and to sign all documents and take all action as may be necessary to carry out the purpose of this vote. The balance to be raised by taxes. This will be a non-lapsing account per RSA 32:3 VI and will not lapse until the re-evaluation is completed or in three years whichever is less. (This appropriation is recommended by the Selectmen and by the Budget Committee.)

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$23,351 (twenty three thousand three hundred and fifty one) for the purchase of a new Police Cruiser and to withdraw the total in the Police Department Cruiser Capital Reserve of \$16,240 (sixteen thousand two hundred and forty) plus interest at the time of withdrawal. And to further authorize the Selectmen to sell or trade the current police cruiser and apply the proceeds to this appropriation. The balance to be raised by taxes. (This appropriation is not recommended by the Selectmen or by the Budget Committee.)
21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 (five thousand) to be added to the Police Department Cruiser Capital Reserve established in 1978 and to authorize the Selectmen as agents to expend. 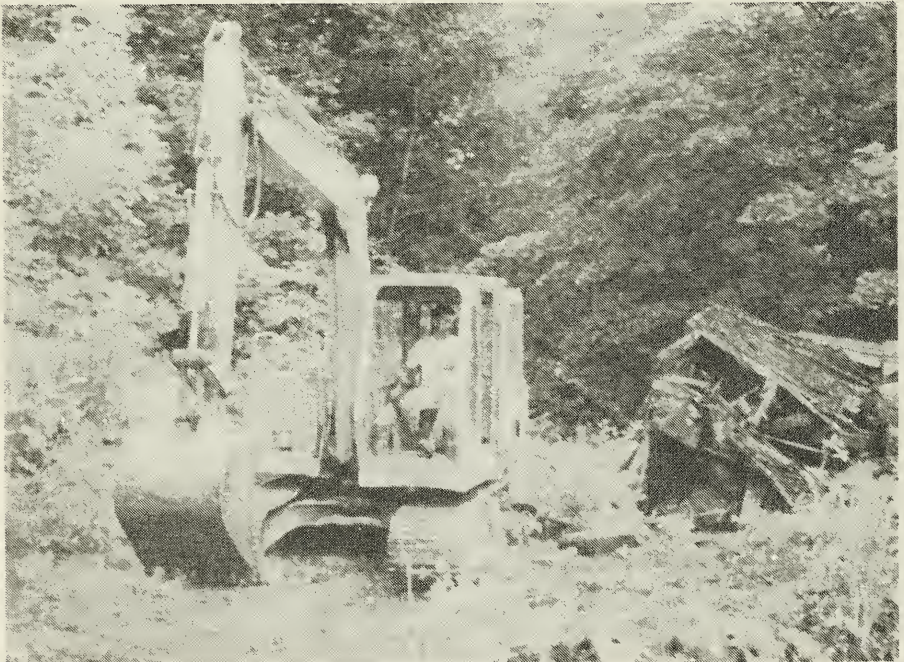

"PEARSON PROPERTY COMMITTEE"
1994 REPORT

At the 1994 town meeting, a number of people signed up to form the "Pearson Property" committee. Our purpose was to evaluate the potential of the property and develop some long range plans for its use. We met on several occasions, walking the property, looking at the house and trying to come to some sense of agreement. Although there were almost as many ideas as there were people, we did reach a consensus in several areas.

The committee agreed that the location and construction of a septic system capable of supporting the linkage of all town buildings needs to be developed and in the works before any finalized plans are made regarding the expansion/renovations of any current buildings. It is recommended that the town continue to add to the capital reserve fund created for this purpose and continue working on plans for the septic system design. The committee feels that once the septic design is in place the selectmen will be able to work on modifying the entrance to the town hall building to enable handicap accessibility. The committee also feels that the town should proceed with the development of a Capital Improvements Plan and to evaluate town needs for the future.

A decision as to whether to rehabilitate the existing house for town office use or demolish it and move towards expanding town office space by new construction is premature in light of other budgetary demands that the town is facing. Any amount of work involved with either option will take a sizable amount of money and, other than the need to address the handicap accessibility, we are in fairly good shape. The house could still be used for excess storage if necessary.

A recommendation was made that the town use any excess funds in the sanitation budget to clean up debris outside and to possibly remove the shed from the building. (This was done in October 1994.) The committee would also like to propose that some type of fencing/shelter etc. be placed around the property and that the town get proposals to re-roof the town hall building to go in the 1995 budget proposal.

The selectmen would like to thank the members of the committee for their help and recommendations. Some could only make it to one meeting and others were there for most of them. It is important to have input from a broad spectrum of the citizenry to assure that all of the "what it's" of a situation are thought out. Thanks to: Eddie Baker, Paul Barrett, Charlie Ayotte, John Scranton, Ron Kempton, Dave Stephan, Fred Smith, Lilliyann Wright, Sherri Moen, Jean Barrett, Bea Jillette, Joan Leslie, Dan Hunter, Douglas O'Clair, Ken Williams from Upper Valley as well as the International Workcamp volunteers who helped remove debris from in and around the building. We apologize if we have inadvertently left someone off the list but want to thank all involved.

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

In calendar year 1994, our three (3) leading causes of fires were No Permit, Children and Rekindles of fires where the fire was not properly extinguished.

Violations of RSA 224:27 II, the fire permit law, and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines of up to \$2,000 and/or a year in jail. Violators are also liable for all fire suppression costs.

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department and State Forest Fire Officials, contact your local Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required. This also helps to prevent unnecessary response to a controlled burn.



HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

1994 has seen increased cases of rabies in animals, particularly raccoons. The mid-Atlantic strain has reached Goshen. Several "sick looking" raccoons have been observed in the daylight hours by various citizens in town. Beyond the threat to animal populations including cats and dogs, this poses a serious risk of exposure to humans as well. Posters have been put up, the school is in the process of distributing brochures, and brochures will be available at Town Meeting.

At the onslaught of a rabies outbreak, the greatest exposure risk, incidence of sightings, dead and dying animals, etc., generally takes place over eighteen months; after which there may be a net loss of about 80% of certain animal populations.

To assist citizens with problems, (such as "what should I do if I spot a "sick looking" raccoon?", or "who should I call if I have shot a suspected rabid animal etc.), I would recommend to the Town that an Animal Control Officer be appointed in 1995.

Information brochures will be made available with the Property Inventories. If you did not get one or need extra, you may pick one up at the Town Office.

Everyone needs to be extremely careful.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for allowing me to oversee the running of your Police Department for the last year.

Residents are reminded that rabies has come to New Hampshire and there have been confirmed incidents in the town. If you see a wild animal that appears to be sick, notify the Police Department. Do not try to approach or make contact with the animal. The department has purchased equipment to destroy animals.

A change of dispatch centers will occur for the town effective 4/1/95. The number for the Police Department will be the same as the Fire Department 542-5155. This change is being made to combine services and save money. Statewide enhanced 911 will go on line July 5, 1995. Any emergency calls may use 911 and the call will be transferred to the Claremont Communications Center.

We ask the Town's support of the proposed 1995 budget. Also the warrant article for purchase of a new police cruiser. The current cruiser is a 1982 Ford Crown Victoria with a large amount of body rust and mechanical problems. The proposed purchase would be a 1995 Ford Explorer 4 wheel drive. With proper maintenance and upkeep this vehicle would last the town for several years.

GOSHEN CONSERVATION COMMISSION
1994

Last year the Selectmen and the Conservation Commission applied for a \$25,000 matching grant from the L&WCF (Land and Water Conservation Fund) toward the purchase of a small piece of shorefront property on Rand Pond. The town was awarded the money, but could not accept it because the property was no longer available as a single lot. The Selectmen and the Conservation Commission submitted the same grant application again this year, because the single lot was for sale as a firm offer. This year the top four candidates won L&WCF grants. Goshen scored fifth, which makes it still possible for the town to receive a grant if one of the four towns should default. State officials advised Goshen to keep applying, as access to water is one of the L&WCF's top priorities. They also advised that prior approval of this purchase by Town Meeting would be in the Town's favor. Because Goshen owns no town recreation land, and because shorefront property is difficult to obtain, the Conservation Commission urges Goshen voters to approve Goshen's portion of \$28,000 for the purchase of a property that may not become available again.

The Commission continues to manage the Lake Gunnison (Williamson Park (G/W) lease site at the dam. During the summer, members of the V.F.P. Workcamp burned brush and continued work on building a trail around the lake. Now, only construction of a footbridge remains to make the job complete.

The Commission has several goals in mind for the coming year.

- * Prepare a Natural Resources Inventory for the Town of Goshen.
- * Create a Conservation Fund to set aside money for the purchase of land that may be of special conservation or recreational significance to the Town. To start this fund the Conservation Commission is asking the town to designate all or part of the land use change tax for this purpose.
- * Investigate conservation easements as they may apply to the town.
- * Consider water protection issues that may concern Rand Pond.
- * Work with other boards where conservation and recreation issues should be considered.

OLIVE G. PETTIS LIBRARY
TRUSTEES REPORT 1994

The Trustees of the Olive G. Pettis Library meet quarterly on the second Monday of January, April, July and October at 6 p.m. to conduct the business of the Library. Sherri Moen is the chairman.

1994 marked the year when quarterly meetings of the Trustees were not enough to attend to the details of the events and activities planned for the year. Additional meetings were held to review and update the By-Laws, plan the Goshen Summer Fest (expanded from 1993's Kid Fest), plan a golf tournament, scavenger hunts for children and a Teddy Bear Picnic. The Trustees also took part in Old Home Day, oversaw roof repairs and participated in the Pearson Property Committee and Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) meetings.

At the Town Meeting in March Heather Downey was elected to the Board of Trustees.

For eight weeks beginning in March the librarian ran a free chair caning class on Wednesday evenings at the library. It attracted interest from surrounding towns and five women took advantage of the opportunity to learn chair caning and rushing.

In May the Trustees held a covered dish supper at the Barretts honoring Elizabeth Nelson who had retired after serving more than 20 years on the Board. Members of the Friends of the Library and family members of the Trustees were invited to attend. The chairman presented Betty with a plaque thanking her for her years of dedicated service to the Olive G. Pettis Library.

In June the Trustees helped the Friends of the Library with their annual book sale.

Roof repairs and some work redirecting the heat from the furnace were completed by Gary Dennis over the summer.

In October a new Friends of the Library group was formed. Their first event was a very successful 'Ghost Walk' held Halloween weekend at Williamson Park on Gunnison Lake. Early in December they organized and ran a Christmas Fair at the Library one frosty Saturday morning.

Librarian Jean Barrett reports that 22 new library cards have been issued to new patrons. More than 1100 materials were borrowed from the library in 1994. The children's section got the largest play with adult reference requests up significantly from 1993. VCR tapes continue to be popular and Jean is always adding quality tapes to the collection. The large print collection is another positive feature at the library. In all, thirty-six new titles were added to the shelves. A list of new books is available at the desk.

Every year our little library grows more dynamic in its outreach to the community. We are planning ahead as there is a lot that needs to be done to the physical plant to bring it up to standards. We hope that 1995 will see further progress toward our goals for the building and for the place of the library in the community.

GOSHEN HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT
1994 REPORT

The following is a report of some of the work done by the Goshen Highway Department in 1994:

The Highway Department purchased a new air compressor and steam cleaner. The engine in the road grader was replaced and the old sander was reconditioned and put back into use.

Twenty-three culverts were replaced and installed, three thousand yards of gravel was processed and applied to the town roads, and a one-half mile section of the Center Road was reclaimed.

We continued on with our ditching project, stockpiled nineteen hundred yards of sand for winter use, and the new bridge on Ball Park Road was completed.

The International Dump Truck was also reconditioned; extending its usage.

I hope to continue with the restructuring of the Highway Department and town roads.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT
1994

The Goshen Planning Board meets on the first and last Tuesday evening of the month at 7 p.m. at the Town Hall. Work meetings are held on the last Tuesday, regular meetings on the first Tuesday. All meetings are open to the public.

During the course of 1994 the Planning Board approved one lot line adjustment and two minor subdivisions. The major focus of its attention during the year was bringing Goshen into compliance with RSA 155 E - Local Regulation Excavations. The Board adopted the State regulations as its own at the February meeting.

The Board now has in place procedures for issuing permits for gravel pits and other commercial earth excavations in town.

By the end of the year four gravel pit owners were granted three year permits to operate their pits. One permit for removing loam was issued. Several pit owners attested to the fact that the material from pits on their property was being used for their own agricultural purposes, and one reclamation plan was being finalized.

The Board did its best to look at each situation individually while complying with the ground rules set by the State. A great deal of non meeting time was spent inspecting pits.

Hearings were held on zoning amendments to be voted on at Town Meeting and on subdivision regulation amendments to complete the requirements for participation in the Federal Flood Insurance Program.

The Capital Improvement Plan was a long range focus of the Planning Board in '94. After meeting with the Selectmen in August, it chaired a meeting of representatives from Goshen's Boards in late September to begin to set priorities for formulating a CIP. Members continue to work on the particulars and it is hoped that it will be ready to be presented at Town Meeting 1996.

1994 was an interesting and useful year for the Planning Board. We can always use volunteers on the Board. Our current need is for alternates. Serving on the Board as an alternate is a good way to learn on the job. Serving on the Board is a good way to be part of Goshen's future.

REPORT OF NEWPORT AMBULANCE SERVICE CALENDAR 1994

In calendar 1994, Newport Ambulance Service responded to 844 calls. This reflects a 10% increase from the 766 calls handled in the previous year. There were 34 responses to the Town of Goshen, compared to 35 calls for service in 1993.

The department's new 1994 ambulance was put into frontline service this year. It replaces a much smaller van type vehicle which has been reassigned to backup status, for joint use by the ambulance service and Newport's department of emergency management (formerly known as Civil Defense)

Newport Ambulance continues to provide emergency medical service 24 hours a day / 7 days a week with a staff of EMT-Basics, EMT-Intermediates and EMT-Paramedics. Not every shift has a paramedic on staff as most calls do not require paramedic level services. However, our in-house and mutual aid "intercept" programs can generally provide advanced life support services when requested by EMT's on the scene.

The Ambulance department wishes to thank the Town of Goshen for their continuing support.

NH/VT Solid Waste Project 1994 Annual Report

The year 1994 was one of many changes for the Project. Early in the year a new computerized accounting system was implemented to provide better tracking and reporting of financial results. A new Bookkeeper and Project Manager were hired to replace employees that left the Project. Robert Watts, the new Project Manager, came to the Project with almost ten years of experience in solid waste management in the private sector.

The Federal Bankruptcy Court had disallowed the Project's request for protection under Chapter 9 of the Bankruptcy Code, stating that the Project was not bankrupt as long as they had powers to raise money through direct assessment of the towns. The Towns were assessed and the Project paid Wheelabrator Claremont, Co. \$1.13 million in undisputed debt during the year. In addition, the judge and Vermont legislation said the Districts must pursue negotiations with Wheelabrator Claremont, Co. Those negotiations are ongoing, but three years of landfill charges were settled resulting in over \$100,000 was paid to the Project by Wheelabrator.

An old dispute was resolved during the year with the contractor that had previously operated the landfill in Newport for the Project. The Project has decided to continue to operate the landfill with its own personnel. The landfill is currently scheduled to continue operation through the remaining 13 years of the contract. The landfill is planned to be expanded in two years to allow for another 5-6 years of ash disposal.

The tipping fee for 1995 is projected to remain at about the same level as 1994. Challenges ahead are to promote reuse, reduction, and recycling of the waste stream, and at the same time meet the contractual commitment of delivering 47,500 tons of waste to the incinerator. The years ahead will probably see more items to be separated from the waste stream for economic or environmental reasons. The Project will continue to need good recycling information from the member Towns. Completing the negotiations with Wheelabrator that provide the Project Towns the ability to source separate and dispose of the residuals at the lowest possible cost is the major challenge for 1995.

VOTED TO ACCEPT THE PROVISIONS OF RSA 31:95-B PROVIDING THAT A TOWN, MAY AT AN ANNUAL MEETING, ADOPT AN ARTICLE AUTHORIZING INDEFINITELY, UNTIL SPECIFIC RECESSION OF SUCH AUTHORITY, THE SELECTMEN TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT AND SPEND, WITHOUT FURTHER ACTION BY THE TOWN MEETING, UNANTICIPATED MONEY FROM A STATE, FEDERAL OR OTHER GOVERNMENTAL UNIT OR A PRIVATE SOURCE WHICH BECOMES AVAILABLE DURING THE FISCAL YEAR. THIS AUTHORIZATION WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL RESCINDED BY A VOTE OF THE MUNICIPAL MEETING.

ARTICLE 29. VOTED TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN TO ACCEPT GIFTS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY, OTHER THAN CASH, TO THE MUNICIPALITY FOR ANY PUBLIC PURPOSE. THIS AUTHORIZATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH RSA 31:95-E SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL RESCINDED BY A VOTE OF THE MUNICIPAL MEETING.

ARTICLE 30. TO TAKE UP ANY OTHER BUSINESS AS MAY LEGALLY COME BEFORE THIS MEETING.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School District, in the towns of Goshen and Lempster, in the county of Sullivan, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School Gymnasium in Lempster, on the 4th day of March, 1995, at seven o'clock P.M. to act upon the articles set forth in the Warrant. Articles 1, 2, and 3 of the Warrant covering the election of Moderator, Member of the School Board from Goshen, and Auditor will be acted upon at three o'clock P.M., and voting will be by official ballot and checklist. The polls will remain open for this purpose from three o'clock P.M. until at least seven-thirty o'clock P.M.

ARTICLE 1.

To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 2.

To choose a member of the school board from Goshen for the ensuing five years.

ARTICLE 3.

To choose an auditor for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 4.

To hear reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 5.

To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **TWO MILLION FOUR THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED EIGHTY SIX DOLLARS (\$2,004,486)** as recommended by the school board, for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of available income estimated at **THREE HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-SIX DOLLARS (\$325,166)**. (The School Board recommends this appropriation.)

ARTICLE 6.

This addition was a late settlement with the teachers for a lump sum of money to be divided at their discretion as a one-year salary increase. THE AMENDMENT WAS SECONDED BY ROBERT C. ENGLISH. Kevin Onnela quoted a law which he said proved that the amendment was illegal. The moderator asked if anyone was willing to give a legal opinion of the matter. SAU Business Administrator Allen Damren said he had checked with the State and found that the amendment was perfectly legal. The moderator accepted this opinion and proceeded to entertain the amendment. THE VOTE TO AMEND WAS UNANIMOUS.

Chairperson Doris Adler explained that John Bonfiglio has suggested that he move to a one-half time principal, one-half time teacher position. The board had accepted this proposal and decided to give it a try. After a little discussion THE AMENDED ARTICLE PASSED BY A VOICE VOTE.

ARTICLE 6.

To see if the school district will vote to have the supervisors of the Towns of Goshen and Lempster act as the supervisors of this cooperative school district pursuant to RSA 671:17 I. (The School Board recommends this article.)

John Michaels, the supervisor the checklist in Lempster, said he felt it was a waste of effort to have the school district creating their own checklist when they could use the lists form each of the two towns. Chris Smith, the supervisor of the Goshen checklist agreed. ON A MOTION BY RANDY BELL AND A SECOND BY JOHN MICHAELS THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

ARTICLE 7.

To see if the district will authorize the school board to apply for, accept and expend, without further action of the School District meeting, money from any source that becomes available during the year, as outlined in RSA 198:20-b, provided that (1) such money is used for legal purposes for which a school district may appropriate money, (2) the school board holds a public hearing on the expenditure of such money before it is expended, and (3) the expenditure of such money does not require the expenditure of other school district funds.

MOTION MADE BY FLORENCE MICHAELS AND SECONDED BY ARTHUR JILLETTE. THE ARTICLE PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

ARTICLE 8.

To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
Given under our hands this 18th day of February, 1994

Mary Walters initiated a round of applause for the school board's presentation of a responsible school budget.

Doris Adler acknowledged the help of the Budget Advisory Committee consisting of Tim Jacob and David Keeler.

Doris Adler introduced the new Superintendent Liz Durocher.

Members of the district recognized John Hopkins' long years of service on the school board.

A citizen asked if the school could raise money to help in Claremont's lawsuit against the state. The school board had considered this but felt the school could not afford to put anything in the budget toward this cause.

ARTHUR JILLETTE MOVED TO HAVE THE POLLS CLOSED FIVE MINUTES AFTER THE CLOSE OF THE MEETING. MARY WALTERS SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

MOTION MADE BY TIM JACOB AND SECONDED BY OLIVER PINTER TO ADJOURN THE MEETING. VOTED TO ADJOURN WAS UNANIMOUS. MODERATOR JOHN WILLIAMS ADJOURNED THE MEETING AT 7:40 P.M.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of the Towns of Goshen and Lempster:

Preparing the school budget for the 95-96 school year was very difficult for the administration and the school board this year. We will have an increase in special needs services to students next year and many more students in 8th grade going to local high schools which has increased the tuition costs to your school district.

During this past school year art, music and physical education were added to the budget by state requirement. At annual school meeting last year the chairman of the school board mentioned that we would have to come into compliance by 94-95 for counseling services. This is required by Education regulation (Ed 306.17). Due to the fact that the budget needed to be increased to cover special needs and tuition costs, I negotiated with the State Education Department and received a waiver exempting the district from having to provide counseling services to students this coming school year. However, no extension of this waiver will be given beyond 95-96. Counseling services are mandated to be provided starting in the 96-97 school year.

Residents of Goshen-Lempster have every reason to be proud of their school. Students from Goshen-Lempster do very well in the high schools that they attend.

Teachers at the school provide a good academic program for students and are constantly looking for new ways of challenging students. This past year we have been implementing the new New Hampshire Frameworks Curriculum and will continue this during the 95-96 school year. The children will be tested on these frameworks in grades 3 and 6.

During this past school year teachers are being evaluated under a new evaluation system. This system will be reviewed in March and continued in the future.

The realities of this year's budget planning continue to point out that all of us must be proactive with federal and state representatives to assist the district with funding relief so that we can continue to provide excellent academic opportunities for all students.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

1994

Parents, students and staff members have been very pleased with the return of the curricula offerings of Art, Music and Physical Education in the past year; students in the fourth grade have experienced those classes for the first time. The efforts of the P.T.C., the P.P.E. and the staff to provide activities to compensate for the missing programs have been greatly appreciated.

Community members, parents and students have a great deal to be proud of in their school. Over the past year, our students have shone in a variety of accomplishments. Beyond the standard scholastic curriculum, which our teachers implement with creative and professional artistry, a multitude of activities were provided by many people from within the school and within the community. To cite all of the people and all of the experiences is not possible in the context of this report. Some of those events were:

JANUARY

Goshen-Lempster's first Winter Activity Program began with six weeks of Down Hill Skiing, Cross Country Skiing, Bowling, Ice Skating, Arts and Crafts, Woodworking, Drama, Volleyball and Rocket Model Making. One afternoon per week, between Christmas and February vacations, each student participated in a chosen activity. The program, which was sponsored in part by the P.T.C., was organized by Ms. Maxfield and Ms. Parsons.

Kerry Hague, a counselor from Women's Supportive Services, began a ten week group counseling program with eighth grade students. The program, funded by a health grant, is designed to prepare our students for responsible decision making during their high school career.

Several of Ms. Brewer's students were cited for their American History essays in a contest sponsored by the Reprisal Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. Essays were submitted by many students from surrounding schools; the topic was "Coming to America in Colonial Days". Placing first in the contest was Christie Pockett; Corrie Winterholer had the third place essay. Other students recognized for their writing were: Jacqueline Arsenault, Melodie Farrar, Alicia Koscielniak, Zachary Tirrell, Denise Walter, and Nicholas Wirkkala.

FEBRUARY

Ms. Barbara Chadwick and Mr. Philip Tirrell volunteered their time to coach basketball. The coaches and students spent many afternoons after school practicing for intramural games that were enjoyed by community members.

Mr. Ekstrom was awarded a \$200.00 grant from the New Hampshire Association for Gifted Education. The money was used to purchase computer software for students.

The Science Fair was moved to the month of February last year. The P.T.C. presented cash awards and certificates of honorable mention to those students whose projects were considered to be outstanding. Awards went to:

Two Goshen-Lempster teams went to the New Hampshire Odyssey of the Mind competition on March 19. The Division I team, coached by Ms. Heather Downey, worked on the problem entitled Furs, Fins and Feathers. Those team members were: Angela Brown, Angela Carleton, Ashley Deceauto, Josiah Downey, Matthias Downey, Jessie Gagnon, Danny Gonyea, Erica Gunderson, Julie Heath, Sharon Rissala, and Jodie Warburton. The Division II team, coached by Mr. Ralph Davidson, tackled the problem of the Mini Terrain Vehicle. Those team members were Ben Carleton, Robby Blackwood, Chris Gonyea, Justin Gonyea, and Dan Rogers.

Sculptor Emile Birch conducted classes on foil sculpture with students in grades K - 8. The project was funded in part by the P.T.C. and in part by a New Hampshire Council of the Arts grant (written by Ms. Howard, Ms. Lord, Ms. Rickard, and Ms. Scalera). The program culminated with an evening Parent/Child Workshop and student sculpture exhibit.

APRIL

Dudley Laughman, Fiddler and Country Dance Master, returned to the Goshen-Lempster School on the evening of April 7 for a Family Contra Dance. The event was sponsored by the P.T.C..

Eighth grade student Ryan Hall traveled to Keene to participate in the state level of the National Geography Bee.

Students in grades six through eight, under the direction of Ms. Ruth LeClair and with the assistance of several parents, spent many hours rehearsing and preparing a set design for the play The Crazy Paper Caper. Community members enjoyed the play on the evenings of April 20 and 21.

MAY

Members of the P.T.C. prepared an outstanding luncheon for the teachers on May 3. The effort was a tribute to our teachers on Teacher Appreciation Day.

Computers were donated to the school by James and Shirley Leland and Mr. Lincoln Barrett. The computers went into the classrooms to be used by students.

JUNE

Under the direction and organization of Ms. Rachel Tirrell, the eighth grade students conducted their class trip to Lake George, New York. While at Lake George, they toured Fort William Henry, visited the Wax Museum, rode a steamship, went rafting, and enjoyed a day at the Great Escape Amusement Park.

Eighth Grade graduation was held on the evening of June 21. Parents and guests were welcomed by the Class Salutatorian Zachary Tirrell, and the Class History was given by Third Honors student Kristie Pockett. The farewell delivery was made by the Class Valedictorian Alicia Koscielniak. Awards were presented by Ms. Brewer, Mr. Davidson and Mr. Bonfiglio. Superintendent Durocher addressed the graduating students, and School Board Chair Doris Adler issued diplomas. The Goshen-Lempster Education Association presented college scholarships to three former Goshen-Lempster graduates. They were: Corey Caron, attending U.N.H.; Shawn Howard, attending the New Hampshire Technological Institute; and Lauren Winterholer, attending Kalamazoo College. The P.T.C. conducted a reception for the graduates after the ceremony.

On the last day of school, P.T.C. President Susan Scalera presented Thank You Awards to the many community members who had volunteered their time and talents at the school over the previous school year. Also at the Awards Assembly, many students were recognized for achievements in scholarship, sports and citizenship.

Also in June, Charles "Bud" Newton announced his retirement as custodian. The members of this community are deeply grateful for the many years of service that Mr. Newton has provided to the school.

SEPTEMBER

A new school year began on August 30. New staff and students were introduced at an opening day assembly. The new year was kicked-off on the theme of "Learn to Win".

As is often the case, September brings about changes in staffing. There were two resignations: Janis Belevance (Special Education) and Todd Gregory (custodian). People who were new to the staff were: Carmen Eichhorn (Special Education), Elin Peterson (Music), Don White (Art), Christine Williams (P.E.), Paul Allen (custodian), Matt Hoyt (part-time custodian), Sharon Miller (Spec. Ed. assistant), and Andrew Coval (Spec. Ed. assistant).

As part of a health grant, Esther Tardy-Wolfe, Executive Director of the Lake Sunapee Area Mediation Program, did a follow-up training from last Spring with selected student mediators. The program utilizes students as peer mediators for other students who are involved in "minor" conflicts. Mr. Allen Abendroth is the coordinator of the program. The student mediators are: Katie Arsenault, Jill Ash, Shane Brown, Justin Gonyea, Stacy Koscielniak, Danielle Montgomery, Liz Moore, Amanda Murray, Melissa O'Clair, Renee Osgood, Sharon Rissala, Nicole Smith, and Shannon Smith.

Susan Scalera was nominated and selected for the 1994 Governor's Recognition Award for her efforts as an outstanding volunteer in the Goshen-Lempster community. Ms. Scalera received the award from Governor Merrill on board the M/S Mount Washington on Lake Winnepesaukee on September 18.

OCTOBER

Susan Scalera stepped down as P.T.C. President, and Judy Brenner and Doreen Murray were elected to the position as Co-Presidents. Jane Skeie retired as Vice President. Sharon Dalling was elected as secretary, and Chris Smith stayed on as Treasurer. Other than elections, the primary topics were the upcoming Thanksgiving Basket raffle and the annual Christmas Crafts Fair.

On October 28, the Lempster Fire Department, under the direction of Chief Philip Tirrell, presented a fire safety program to the Goshen-Lempster students. A demonstration of fire fighting equipment was held in the school yard for students in grade K through 3 by Firefighters Barbara Chadwick and Todd Gregory. A presentation for students in grades 4 through 8, including booklet and sticker handouts, was given in the lunchroom by Chief Tirrell and Firefighters P.J. Tirrell and Ken LaQuire.

The annual Halloween Parade, through the school and out into the school yard, took place on the afternoon of October 31. Parents and community members assembled outside to witness teachers and students in a variety of costumes.

NOVEMBER

The fifth annual Christmas Crafts Fair took place on Sunday, November 20. Shoppers came to purchase professional crafts at the booths in the gymnasium and student produced crafts in the lunchroom. Some of the other activities included hay rides, face painting, visits with Santa and Mrs. Clause (Mr. Jillette and Ms. Rickard), and cookie decorating. Ms. Wynne Rollins organized the food concession. Members of the P.T.C., parents and staff contributed' and enormous amount of time and effort to make the Crafts Fair a success.

DECEMBER

Ms. Patrice Brewer was named as member of the National Council for Geography Education. She was selected to represent New Hampshire at a conference in St. Louis, Missouri, to work on the Social Studies curriculum frameworks.

Ms. LeClair worked with students in grades six through eight and parent volunteers to present O'Henry's two act comedy, The Ransom of Red Chief. Many hours were spent bringing the production to the community on the evenings of December 9 and 10.

Ms. Elin Peterson and Ms. Dayle Wells prepared the students for a holiday music assembly that was presented to parents in the gymnasium on the afternoon of December 22.

The New Hampshire State Department of Education has begun to steer us into a new format of student assessment which tends to test students on a broad range of content and skills. The assessment instrument is regarded as being more difficult for students than the previously utilized standardized tests. The instrument, which assesses skill

development within the recently developed New Hampshire curriculum frameworks, consists of a variety of question components: multiple-choice, open-ended, use of manipulatives, on-demand writing tasks (assessing communication), questions of basic and high-order thinking skills, and viewing and listening activities. Today's students are living in a different world than we were accustomed to. Society has changed; families have changed; and the workplace is constantly changing. Schools must also change. The goal of the new curriculum frameworks is to encourage and guide that change.

There is an incredible amount of energy that goes into shaping a school program (energy from a staff that is motivated, and energy from community volunteers who have the unselfish urge to give). There are many cogs to the wheel that turns the daily program. Each cog is equally important: the School Board, the Central Office staff, the teaching staff, the secretarial staff, the food service staff, the paraprofessionals, the community volunteers, the support groups (P.T.C. & P.P.E.), the custodians, the transportation staff, and specialists (nurse, counselors, therapists, etc). It does take all of us, pulling together, to make education work.
