TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year and to vote to see if Beano shall be legalized in Hancock.

No recommendation necessary.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Recommend approval of budget as printed.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Monadnock Region Association or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend \$130.00.

4. To see if the Town will vote to apply for Class IV and Class V Construction, Reconstruction or Betterment Aid as provided for in Chapter 241 of the Revised Statutes Annotated. Any town applying for such aid shall raise, appropriate or set aside an amount equal to not less than 15% of the apportionment made to it in Apportionment A. If the above aid is desired the town must raise \$841.80 and the State will contribute \$5,611.97.

Recommend favorable action.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$6,453.77 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V road within the town — Old Antrim Road — such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 83, Laws of 1951 as amended by Chapter 31, Laws of 1953, and to authorize the selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the town of Hancock.

Recommend favorable action.

6. To see what action the town will take in regard to the maintenance of the bathing Beach, raise and appropriate money for same or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend \$600.00 be raised and appropriated.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend \$150.00 be raised and appropriated.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Week or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend \$400.00 be raised and appropriated.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for the Town History Committee, or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend favorable action.

10. To see if the town will vote to support the selectmen in their agreement for the purchase of land for a new Town Dump. Raise and appropriate money for the purchase and preparation of land or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend \$600.00 be raised and appropriated.

11. To see what action the town will take in regard to installing Rest Rooms in the Town Hall, raise and appropriate money for the same or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend further study.

12. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Water Commissioners to assess a higher rate on the Town hydrants and to raise the interest rate required on Water Main Extensions.

Recommend \$30.00 per hydrant and raise interest rate to not over 4% on extensions.

13. To see if the town will vote to run a water line from end of main at Engstroms' to a point near Gay's Residence, raise and appropriate money for same or take any other action relating thereto.

No recommendation.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to improve the inlet to Norway Pond or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend \$3,500.00 be raised and appropriated.

15. To see what action the town will take in regard to the rules and regulations of Hillside Cemetery, and to raise and appropriate a sum of money to rebuild the wall along the highway.

No recommendation.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Fire Hose Reserve Fund or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend favorable action.

17. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of 1% on property taxes if paid within thirty days after date of bill, or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend favorable action.

18. To see if the town wishes to purchase a York Rake for the Highway Department, appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

Recommend favorable action.

19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Planning Board or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend \$50.00 be raised and appropriated.

20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Visiting Nurse Association or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend \$500.00 be raised and appropriated.

21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend favorable action.

22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to accept a conveyance of the former Hancock High School building and land from the School Board of the Hancock School District.

Recommend favorable action.

23. To see if the town wishes to discontinue the road from the E. Foye Brown house (on Sargent Camp road) to Route 137, near the former Cashion Farm, (not far from the Harrisville Town Line).

Recommend favorable action.

24. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to sell to Errol Simonds, a strip of land 10' wide by 100' long beside his house. The land was part of the High School Playground.

Unfavorable action.

25. To see what action the town wishes to take in regard to plowing driveways.

No recommendation.

26. To see if the town will vote to accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the use of the town or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommend favorable action.

27. To hear the reports of auditors and committees heretofore chosen or take any action relating thereto.

No recommendation necessary.

28. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

No recommendation necessary.

REPORT OF ANNUAL TOWN MEETING MARCH 12, 1957

Article 1. All necessary officers chosen.

Article 1a. The town voted (affirmatively 106—negative 20) that they wish to have Route 202 by-pass the village of Hancock.

Article 2. Town voted to appropriate the budget, estimated revenues to be deducted and the balance raised by taxation.

Article 3. Raised and appropriated \$124.00 for Monadnock Region.

Article 4. Raised and appropriated a sum not to exceed \$3,000.00 for purchase of an all wheel drive one ton pickup truck complete with snow plow.

Article 5. Raised and appropriated \$691.01 our 1957 share of TRA Nubanusit Road.

Article 6. Voted that we raise and appropriate \$600.00 for maintenance of the Bathing Beach.

Article 7. Dismissed article to extend water line on Depot St.

Article 8. Raised and appropriated \$100.00 for Fire Hose Reserve Fund.

Article 9. Voted to raise and appropriate \$500.00 to build wall and lay out driveways in Hillside Cemetery.

Article 10. Raised and appropriated \$400.00 for Old Home week.

Article 11. Raised and appropriated \$100.00 for Memorial Day.

Article 12. No action on reserve fund for purchase of Town equipment.

Article 13. The jurisdiction over the Town History Committee restored to the town through its board of selectmen thus relieving the Hancock Historical Society of any further responsibility.

Article 14. The town authorized the town History Committee to publish the 1889-1959 section of the Town History in 1959 or 1960 and raised and appropriated \$500.00 toward the cost of this publication.

- Article 15. Raised and appropriated \$150.00 for improvements in the Town Hall.
- Article 16. Voted not to have the State Tax Commission reassess the Town.
- Article 17. Voted that the Town establish a Planning Board of seven members according to state requirements.
- Article 18. Raised and appropriated \$75.00 for expenses of Planning Board.
- Article 19. The Selectmen authorized to attempt the purchase of land belonging to the New England Woodenware Co. around Juggernaut Reservoir and \$400.00 was raised and appropriated.
- Article 20. Town to allow 1% on property taxes paid within thirty days after date of bill.
 - Article 21. Town dispensed with 5% discount on water rentals.
- Article 22. Raised and appropriated a sum not to exceed \$80.00 to purchase a rotary mower for use in cemetery.
- Article 23. Voted against boxes of sand and salt mix at points of need for motorists.
- Article 24. Selectmen authorized to borrow a sum not to exceed \$20,000.00 in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 25. Authorized the Library Trustees to use the \$1,300.00 (previously appropriated toward a new furnace) for insulation, decorating and lowering ceilings. Any balance to be reserved by Trustees as a separate fund to be used toward a new furnace.
- Article 26. Article to accept land adjoining cemetery, from Lloyd Briggs for Lloyd Briggs Lot, not acted upon.
 - Article 27. Accepted gifts and legacies left in trust.
- Article 28. Continued committee to investigate brook entering Norway Pond.
- Article 29. New regulations governing the use of the Town Hall were accepted.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF

Forest Fire Prevention is Everybody's Business

New Hampshire faces a continuing challenge in its forest fire problem — 97 percent of all our forest fires being man-caused and preventable — a serious indictment of interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbor. Both the State and the towns are striving diligently to effectively meet the challenge through education of the public to the threat fire presents to our woodlands; by maintaining a well trained corps of wardens and deputy wardens in every community and by providing ample opportunity for all who wish to dispose of unwanted waste materials. Careless and perverseness, however, continue to be the big hurdles.

Thoughtlessly discarded lighted cigars, eigarettes and matches from moving vehicles, by hikers, hunters and fishermen; careless burning of debris during hazardous periods in dangerous locations; illegal burning; improperly extinguished debris, camp and cook fires — all result in serious loss of property, disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state

funds.

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and your local forest fire warden need YOUR thoughful and cooperative effort — The rules are simple.

1. Don't burn at home — use your town dump and avoid all fire

problems.

2. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fireplaces and campfires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.

3. Be sure that all lighted material — cigars, cigarettes and matches — are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in

automobiles.

4. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.

5. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning re-

quirements.

6. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

REMEMBER — the fire you prevent might be the one which could burn YOUR property.

REMEMBER—FOREST FIRE PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS and our MOST IMPORTANT UNDERTAKING.

HIGHLIGHTS OF HANCOCK 1957

This year the word "sputnik" was added to our vocabulary and to every language of our entire globe. The USSR launched an earth satellite in October and then another in November carrying a dog. Some of us were able with the naked eye to see a small blob racing across the sky. We don't and didn't know what to think about this event any more than we do about rockets carrying hydrogen bombs that can travel, some say, from continent to continent. In this bewilderment Hancock citizens were no more or no less shaken than New Yorkers, Hottentots or Eskimos.

And then, to arrange a little more backdrop for our own homey doings, it also should be mentioned that an outstandingly prosperous business year — one of a considerable series — during the fall months showed signs of being in recession. Most of us were not directly affected by this either. But a downward trend of business and sputnik left us wondering.

Another thing we wondered about more happily was the increase in the number of our citizens. No one ever heard of the Hancock Chamber of Commerce because there never was one. Yet, we continue to attract pleasant people who come here to live part time or full time. George and Phyllis Sammet took over the Inn in January. They decided to keep it hospitably open right through the year as do Leah Hill and Catherine Reaveley their places. The supervisors of the Check List, after subtracting a few, expect to add about fifty new voters who settled here in 1957.

Do you suppose this popularity happens because we're a normal sort of people in an abnormally beautiful setting? If so, it could be because we're all so different that we add up to what is certainly no Peyton Place as depicted in a current best selling book nor a dream of rural virtue as other authors paint New England villages.

What we do is we all get busy and do interesting things — these are just a few at random — such as Roy Finan carving a wooden eagle for the Hancock House flag pole, Dr. Victor Carpenter holding an annual coon supper, Debby Powers putting on a moving Christmas pageant, Paul Daly conducting an unusually well organized Memorial Day program, and Sandra Howard and Carl Cowan winning prizes as outstanding students.

Way back out of the news are things going on — like a saw blade sharpened with an artist's touch whirling on a saw rig of ancient vintage operated by Eddy Richardson. This year, added to past years, he totalled up this phase of his activities and it came to 45,423 cords of wood fed to the rig by scores of satisfied citizens. His notebook should be willed to the Historical Society. It gives his best single year's total at 2,069 cords and lists a lot of well known people

hereabouts who warm their toes and, still a very few, their houses by our abundant natural fuel.

Newsworthy things happened this year and made the front page of the Peterborough Transcript such as having a speeding car miss a turn and come in I. B. Hitchings' front door. Then Nubanusit Lake was a recurrent press favorite. Long Pond, as we used to call it, may be the site of a new State Park. Sime Sheldon and a lot of others up on the largest unspoiled lake in New Hampshire were shaken. At this point no one can know if Lloyd Briggs' offer to sell land to the State will be accepted. It might take all the money appropriated by the Legislature just for roads giving access to the so-called island with none left to develop a park, or it might not. Next year we should know if a State Park is to be just around the corner from Hancock, so to speak. Incidentally John Hill and Foster Avery offered speed boat transportation on a bleak cold October day to the Commission which is looking the Monadnock area over for the best site available.

And speaking of lakes, the level of Juggernaut Pond, the town water supply, dropped several feet during August and September. Should we still have been using the old reservoir there's little doubt but that many would have been on very short water rations indeed. Others not on the water main, and that includes everybody not along the pipe line or in the village or Norway Hill, were inconvenienced by one of the driest summers on record. The water table lowered to a point where many wells ran dry. It took heavy November rains to bring things back to normal.

Town Meeting this year was noteworthy because of the twenty-nine articles in the Warrant and the expeditious manner in which they were handled. The question of Hancock being by-passed by the rerouting of Highway 202 a few miles east of the village caused little stir and was approved overwhelmingly. The actual work will not be completed for several years. A Planning Board was approved; it is expected it will report its recommendations for the orderly development of Hancock at the forthcoming Town Meeting. Ex-Selectman and current State Representative Jules Pickering had a day off from the Legislature to take his part in purely town affairs. As has been the custom in recent years the School Meeting was held on the Saturday preceding. The general comment: "One of the quietest on record."

You can never count on school meetings being this way as School Board members Otis Wilder, Betty Strombeck or Stu Bradley would tell you. Incidentally Otis has embellished his gas station and built living quarters above. Just to show how things go, Arthur and Edie Tremblay and daughters Mary Elizabeth and Judith Ann have moved out of quarters above our well-run general store and into a brand newly built place on the Greenfield Road. Perhaps we should note in connection with these moves that so far as can be

learned there is only one really old place in town where descendents of the builders still reside and that is the Robinson place near the old Elmwood railroad station where Roger and Allen Terrill and their mother can be found from time to time.

A tear should be dropped for the passing of the Arts and Crafts Shop which for 25 years offered an outlet for delicious jams, cakes and pickles for a number of our people as well as braided rugs produced by Ruth Pierce. Started by Martha Stearns and Florence Burtt it had lost impetus. And this year there was trouble finding a place to locate the shop.

Crowding up — that's what we are. It challenges the Planning Board members to work faithfully and well to meet our needs for what will doubtlessly be called the sputnik decade and the one to follow possibly to be called the space ship decade.

Article 7: Alfred J. Dillon moved "that the same men serve as auditors this coming year as served last year."

Therefore, Herman D. Schlichting and Arthur A. Tremblay were unanimously elected.

Under Article 8, C. Stuart Bradley "Moved that the School District raise and appropriate \$36,327.00 and to authorize and direct the School Board to apply against said appropriation such income as is estimated by the School Board exclusive of state aid, and upon determination of the amount of state aid to be received by the School District during the next fiscal year, to authorize and direct the School Board to apply against such appropriation the sum to be received from state aid and with the School District Clerk certify to the Selectmen the balance as an assessment to be raised by the Town for school purposes."

Otis Wilder, Chairman of the School Board, explained how this sum was arrived at. The motion passed after a short discussion.

Mr. Bradley "moved that a vote of thanks go to Errol Simonds for eighteen years of faithful service as Treasurer."

This motion passed unanimously.

At 8:25 P. M. the meeting recessed so that the ballots for School District Officers might be counted.

At 8:56 P. M. the results were announced as follows:

For Moderator: Robert English, 57 votes.

For Clerk: Adella C. Eva, 80 votes.

E. WARRANT

SCHOOL WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of Hancock qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 8th day of March, 1958, at 4:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate, in addition to the original appropriation for 1957-58, a sum of \$1,014.00 to be made available to the school district prior to July 1, 1958 in order to meet unanticipated tuition obligations.
- 10. To see if the district will authorize the school board to enter into a contract with the Peterborough School District for a period not in excess of three years for the education of pupils in Grades 7 and 8.

- 11. To see if the district will authorize the school board to enter into a contract with the Peterborough School District for a period not in excess of three years for the education of such high school students as are desirous of attending Peterborough Consolidated School.
- 12. To see if the school district will adopt as its school check-list the Town check-list, as provided in RSA 197:12a, as inserted by Laws of 1957, chapter 57; this provision to be effective for the 1959 and subsequent annual district meetings.
- 13. To see if the School District will vote to authorize the School Board to reconvey the former Hancock High School buildings and land to the Town of Hancock.

The teaching staff remains the same as last year except for Mr. Frank P. Petronzio, who replaces Mr. Miller as Art Supervisor. Mr. Petronzio has attended the Massachusetts School of Art, the Cleveland Art Institute, and the Boston University Graduate School of Education. Mrs. Bernice Cowan replaced Mrs. Marion Warner as school nurse as of December 1, 1957.

B. PROGRAM AND METHODS

Teachers of the staff participated in a one-day workshop on reporting and home school relations conducted by Dr. Ralph Garry at the school in the spring of 1957. They also took extension courses conducted by the extension service of the University of New Hampshire and Keene Teachers College.

A school library for the children was initiated this year as well as a small professional library for the teachers.

The sixth grade participated in the school camping program at Sargent Camp this year along with other youngsters from the Supervisory Union sharing with them new things learned from nature at its source and relating them to classroom experiences.

A special program for National Education Week had Mr. Petronzio teaching a typical art lesson for the parents and Miss Therrien teaching a beginning reading lesson to them.

Grade 7 and 8 visited the Peterborough banks to learn about banking in conjunction with their arithmetic class and Mrs. LeRoy Lang spoke to the fifth and sixth grades on her trip to Mexico. This was of great interest to the children who study this in their social studies work.

The school had an innovation this year in Mrs. Bailey, a student teacher from Keene Teachers College, who assisted Miss Therrien in the primary room.

The school was completely painted on the exterior this year, and Mr. Hennessey repainted the primary room on the first floor.

Linoleum was installed on the counters and table in the seventh and eighth grade classroom, and a new slide has been provided for the playground.


