BARTLETT - HART'S LOCATION

TUITION AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2001, by and between the Bartlett School District of Bartlett, County of Carroll, State of New Hampshire, hereinafter referred to as Bartlett; and the Hart's Location School District of Hart's Location, County of Carroll, State of New Hampshire, hereinafter referred to as Hart's Location.

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, Hart's Location is desirous of having its pupils, grades K through 8, attend school in Bartlett, and has authorized its School Board to enter into a long-term tuition agreement providing for such attendance, and

WHEREAS, Bartlett is maintaining a school system which includes grades K through 8 and its School Board has authority to enter into a tuition contract to receive pupils from Hart's Location and is willing to receive Hart's Location pupils and afford them a course of instruction to be given in the Bartlett School System, and

WHEREAS, Hart's Location and Bartlett are mutually aware of the educational and financial advantages to be enjoyed by both school districts through their association together under a long-term tuition contract, particularly in terms of the long-range improvement of the educational environments and most efficient use of the tax resources in both communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual provisions and undertakings set forth, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Tuition Arrangement</u> – Hart's Location shall send all of its pupils, grades K through 8, with the exceptions hereinafter noted, to Bartlett for schooling and shall be responsible for the transportation methods and expenses in connection with such attendance, and Bartlett shall accept said pupils and be responsible for their education on the same terms and conditions, providing them with the same opportunities for education and cultural advancement and improvement as is the case with pupils residing in Bartlett. Special Education costs, in addition to those included in the regular tuition calculations, will be the responsibility of the Hart's Location School District.

2. <u>Attendance Commencement and Term</u> – Attendance of Hart's Location pupils in the Bartlett School system pursuant to this agreement shall commence at the inception of the school year 2001-02, and shall continue for an original term of three (3) years.

3. <u>Termination Notice – Automatic Renewal</u> – This contract shall be automatically extended on a year-to-year basis at the end of the original term unless written notice of termination is given by either party to the other. Such notice shall specify the last school year for which the contract shall be effective, which shall be at least the third full school year following the school year shall be considered as beginning September and ending August 31 of the following year.

4. Tuition Rate – The rate of tuition shall be determined annually and shall be the estimated cost of Bartlett's current expenses for grades K through 8 in average daily membership, as estimated, for the year immediately preceding that for which the charge is made. The fiscal year is July 1 to June 30. A rental charge of two (2) percent shall be included in the tuition rate and shall be calculated in accordance with the provisions of RSA 194:27 as it may be amended. The tuition rate shall be estimated by the Bartlett School District not later than December 31 of each year preceding the year the charge is made and the Hart's Location School District shall be notified at that time.

5. <u>Tuition Payments – Time of Making</u> – Tuition payments, calculated by multiplying the applicable per pupil tuition rate by the actual number of Hart's Location students attending the Bartlett School, shall be made on December 15th and June 15th of each year.

6. <u>Assigned School – Exceptions</u> – Bartlett shall be deemed the assigned school for Hart's Location pupils in grades K through 8 for the purpose of school attendance laws.

7. Joint School Board Meetings – The School Boards of Hart's Location and Bartlett shall meet jointly at lease annually and as many other times as the Boards mutually deem advisable while this contract is in effect, which meetings shall be presided over, alternately, by the Chairman of each Board.
