## TOWN MEETING WARRANT

### The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Landaff in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Landaff on Tuesday the thirteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for TRA highways and raise and appropriate money for the same.
4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Lisbon District Nursing Association.
5. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
6. To see if the town will vote a discount of 2 per cent on property taxes paid on or before July 1, and 1 per cent September 1.
7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30.40 to the White Mountain Region

Association, being 10 cents per \$1,000 (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation of the town for the previous year, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other towns of the region.

8. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of the Landaff School District:

I herewith submit my eighth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The total enrollment in Blue School last year was 32, the average membership 27.4 and the percentage of attendance 92.89. There were 18 pupils attending Lisbon Elementary School and ten attending Lisbon High School.

The enrollment in Blue School this year is 25. Fifteen pupils are attending Lisbon Elementary School and 13 are attending Lisbon High School. This is eight less than reported last year at this time.

Mrs. Helen Currier has begun her second year's work as teacher in the Blue School. The work is progressing very well. Mrs. Currier is interested in the school and the children and is giving them a good education.

Children who attend Lisbon school are receiving equally good instruction and it appears to me that you have a better educational system under the present arrangement than as though you were trying to run two or three one-room schools. The cost is less and the results are better.

Children of Blue School are receiving hot lunches. The lunches are prepared by Mrs. Clifton Patten. Milk is served with the lunch. The same program is carried out in the village school.

The Blue School is very well equipped now. Playground apparatus is adequate. The heating system is satisfactory. Pure, clean running water and sanitary flush toilets have improved the living conditions immensely.

The repairs were carefully carried out during the past summer under the guidance of your school board and Mr. Jack Davis. A lot of thought and effort was put in this project and it was only through the careful supervision of Mr. Davis and the board that the project was kept within the budget of \$1,500.00 provided.

A few new book shelves are needed. New steps should be provided and one side of the roof needs shingling.

We have been very well pleased with the services of Mr. Warren Carr as janitor of the Blue School. He is able to make minor repairs and attend to other custodial details that children are unable to do.

I think you have provided the essentials for a good education. These are a competent, well-trained teacher, a healthful environment and good materials with which to work.

My appreciation is extended to the school board. I have found them cooperative and interested in the welfare and education of the children at all times.

The community of Landaff is to be commended for supporting its educational program. I am glad to announce that the recommended appropriation for the coming year will be about \$1,000.00 less.
