To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madison in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madison on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$143.46 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 4. To see if the Town raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars (5,000.00) to be used in its entirety during the year 1959 for the purpose of preparing and tarring the road known as East Shore Drive, beginning at a point located by the stake at the Southwest corner of the Rand Property and extending Easterly and Northerly as far as the appropriation will cover the cost of same.

- 5. To see what action the Town wishes to take regarding use, repair or sale of Recreation Hall. Raise and appropriate a sufficient sum to carry out the vote of the Town.
- 6. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regards to widening Winter Road.

### FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

Dear Mr. & Mrs. & Family:

Once again our region is covered with snow and the forest fire hazard has disappeared, but to your local forest fire warden it is just a time to check over his equipment and check the causes of the fires he has had. We know that our biggest cause of forest fires are careless people burning rubbish, brush or debris without a permit or in an unsafe place. When this fire gets away from them and help is needed to put it out they then plead that they did not know a permit was required for the incinerator or this type of burning. Well, the old saying, ignorance of the law is no excuse, fits in here very well. The forest fire laws have been in the newspapers, on the radio and on television and are on some posters, and there should be no excuse for not knowing a permit is required for all outdoor burning. In this year's report we are going to quote the law of the State of New Hampshire in regards to permits, this is found in Chapter 233 - Section 35 revised laws, State of New Hampshire. Permits

No person, firm or corporation shall kindle or cause to be kindled any fire or shall burn or cause to be burned any material, and no city or town shall kindle or maintain a fire or a public dump in or near woodlands, pasture, brush, sprout, waste, or cutover land or where fire may be communicated to such lands, except when the ground is covered with snow, without first obtaining a written permit from the forest fire warden of the town where the burning is to be done unless the same is in the presence of the warden or his agent.

Liability for fires without permit.

Any person causing or kindling a fire without permit of the forest fire warden when such permit is required and any person by whose negligence or the negligence of his agents any fire shall be caused, shall be liable in a civil action for the payment to the town or the state or both, of the expenses incurred by the forest fire warden or his deputy warden in attending or extinguishing such fire.

### Penalties

38 Any person violating any provisions of section 35 shall be fined not more than two hundred dollars or imprisoned not more than sixty days.

- 9. Resolved that the Madison school district petition the State Board of Education to become a member of a cooperative school district which may include in addition to this district the following districts: namely Brookfield, Effingham, Freedom, Tamworth, Ossipee.
- 10. To elect two representatives of the district to serve on an interim committee to prepare a financial budget for the operation of the proposed cooperative school district.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and accept in the name of the school district for educational purposes such funds or grants-in-aid as may be obtainable from the State or Federal Government or any department or agency thereof, or any other sources.
- 12. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$102.00 as the district's share of the operating cost of New Hampshire Educational Television station WENH-TV.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Madison:

During the school year 1957-58 the teachers in the Madison School were: Principal John DiSanto, grades 6-8; Mrs. Martha Kelley, grades 3-5; and Mrs. Edith Plant, grades 1 and 2. At the close of the year Mrs. Kelley retired after serving well and faithfully in the Madison School for sixteen years. Mrs. Plant and Mr. DiSanto resigned to accept positions elsewhere.

In September, 1958 the school opened with three teachers new to the school. Mr. Frank Richardson serves as principal and teaches grades 6, 7, and 8. He is a graduate of Keene Teachers' College, has taught one year and served in United States Coast Guard for the past four years. Mr. Richardson's home is in Conway, N. H. Teaching grades 4 and 5 is Mrs. Ruth Chick, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers' College, with several years teaching experience. In the primary room is Mrs. Linnie Giles of Freedom. Mrs. Giles is a graduate of Plymouth Teachers' College, and has had several years teaching experience. Madison is fortunate to have such a competent, experienced teaching staff.

The school health services continue under the competent direction of Mrs. Rebecca Sanborn, R. N. In addition to the regular examinations conducted by the nurse, pupils participating in vigorous activities are examined by a physician with Mrs. Sanborn's assistance. Complete medical histories of all pupils are being made by the nurse. These will be kept on file and will follow the pupils as they go on to high school or are transferred to some other schools.

Total enrollment last year was 63 pupils. In September, 1958 the school opened with the same number of pupils. There were 29 pupils enrolled at Kennett High School where the tuition rate was \$340.00 At the beginning of the current year there were 23 pupils enrolled at Kennett High School, and the tuition rate is \$350.00.

Excellent nourishing meals have been served by the school lunch program. A comparatively small amount of surplus foods was received by the schools. Through some miracle performed by Mrs. Margaret Ward, in the kitchen, the program finished without a deficit.

During the current year several of the districts of this supervisory union have conducted a Cooperative School Study. On the study committee representing Madison, besides the three members of the school board, are Adm. Andrew Bisset, Mr. Robert Chick, and Dr. James Andrews. All these committee members are to be highly commended for their faithful attendance of the many committee meetings and for their contributions to the study. Adm. Bisset is general chairman of the study. A report of the study has been published.

The cooperation of the school board, teachers, and citizens is sincerely appreciated.
