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

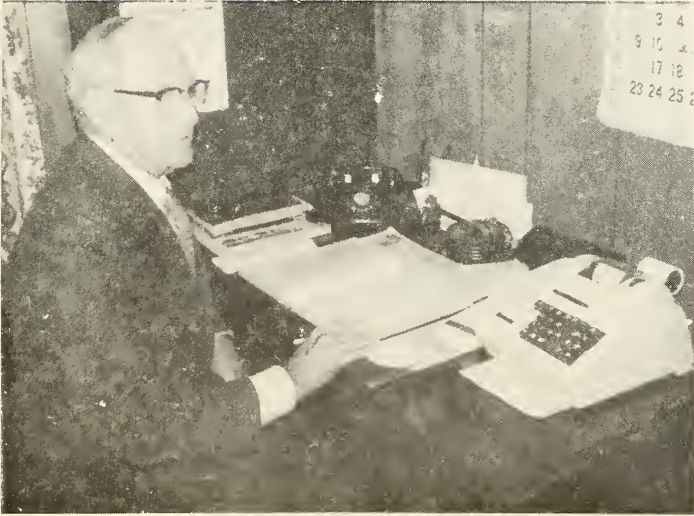

ARTHUR BUTLER BROWN

Born August 17, 1897

This issue of the Sandwich Town Report is dedicated, with affection and gratitude, to Arthur B. Brown, who has served our Town so faithfully and so well for thirty years.

Arthur was born in Fremont, N.H., graduated from U.N.H., and in 1923 moved to Moultonborough. His long record of public service began in that town where he served as Road Agent, Moderator, and for six years as Selectman. He moved, on a permanent basis to Sandwich in 1947, where he continued his devotion to public service unabated. He served as Selectman, 1949-1954; as Moderator, 1958-1968; and as Treasurer, 1967-1975. In addition to these town duties he served also, 1958-1972, as one of the three Carroll County Commissioners, the last two years as Chairman. He also served as Chairman of the State County Commissioners Association for two years.

Even a partial list of the many other ways Arthur has served Sandwich and its townspeople is impressive. At various times, and often for several years he has served as Chairman or Director of the Sandwich Chapter of the American Red Cross, Trustee of the Sandwich Historical Society, officer or member of the Old Home Week Association, Chairman of the Dr. Robert Quimby Memorial Fund, ("The Doctor's Committee"), and Chairman of the Speakers and Entertainment Committee of the Sandwich Fair Association. He is a Past Master of the Sandwich Grange, Past Master of the Red Mountain Lodge, F&AM, Past Patron of the Bearcamp Chapter, O.E.S., District Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of New Hampshire, F&AM and Past Grand Patron of the Grand Chapter of New Hampshire, O.E.S.

To this fine citizen the Town of Sandwich extends its deepest respect and its sincerest thanks for a multitude of tasks superbly done. May he enjoy many more years in our midst as a friendly, helpful neighbor, well content in the knowledge that he has contributed several times his share in making Sandwich the fine town it is in which we live.

SANDWICH TOWN WARRANT

1975

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

CARROLL, SS

The following is a copy of the warrant as it appeared in the 1974 Annual Report showing the disposition of each Article as voted at Town Meeting.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sandwich, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the 4th day of March next from 2:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. for the casting of ballots, and at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, March 5th, 1975 at the Sandwich Central School, to act upon the following articles.

(EXPLANATION, Article 1 relating to the election of Town Officers will be taken up on Tuesday and polls will be open until 7:00 p.m. A second session to consider all other business will be held March 5th at 7:30 p.m. as per vote of Town to accept provisions of RSA 39:2-a.)

1. To elect by official ballot all necessary town officers for the ensuing year. *This action was taken.*

2. To see if the Town will determine by vote the salaries and or other compensation of its Officers and Agents. *Amended to increase the salary of the check list supervisors from \$75.00 to \$125.00 per year and to increase the salary of the forest fire warden to \$100.00 per year. Voted in affirmative with these amendments.*

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes, the same to be paid from revenue of 1975. *Voted in affirmative.*

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector Deed or Deeds and as agents of the Town give Deed or Deeds thereof. *Voted in affirmative.*

5. To see if the Town will authorize the prepayment of taxes and authorize the Tax Collector to accept payments in prepayment of taxes as provided for in RSA 80:52-a.
Voted in affirmative.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums of money for:

- (a) Memorial Day Observance, \$125.00
- (b) Old Home Week Observance, \$300.00
- (c) Maintenance of Notch and Dale Roads, \$841.00
- (d) Town's share for Social Security, \$4,000.00
- (e) Town Road Aid (TRA), \$1,212.05, the State contributing \$8,080.34
- (f) Town Dump and Forest Fires, \$250.00
- (g) Lakes Region General Hospital, \$200.00 and Huggins Hospital, \$200.00
- (h) Care of Cemeteries, \$500.00
- (i) Town Welfare, \$4,000.00
- (j) General Government, \$19,465.00
- (k) Town Dump Maintenance, \$4,200.00
- (l) Town Beaches, \$1,600.00
- (m) Insurance Premiums and Town Officers' Bonds, \$9,500.00
- (n) Street Lighting, \$1,800.00
- (o) Payment of Interest on Temporary Loan, \$2,500.00
- (p) Planning Board, \$350.00
- (q) Lakes Region Planning Commission, \$926.00
- (r) Conservation Commission, \$200.00
- (s) Concord National Bank, Concord, N. H., Custodian of the Library Trust Funds \$312.68
- (t) Fireworks display on July 4th \$250.00
- (u) Care of stray animals, \$200.00
- (v) Lease of Emerson parking lot, \$200.00
- (w) BiCentennial Observance, \$500.00

This article was voted as stated in the warrant.

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$266.20 to assist the Carroll County Mental Health Service, Inc. 1975. This article by petition.
Amended "subject to what the county delegation does later on". Voted in the affirmative.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act for use as a set-off against the following debt service incurred for "priority expenditures" since January 1, 1972. Purpose: 1974 Fire Truck Note (principal) Amount: \$6,000.00. *Voted in the affirmative.*

9. To see if the Town will vote to rescind that part of Section A, Article 6 of the 1968 warrant for a full time police officer. This article by petition. *Voted in the Negative by secret ballot, 128 no to 77 yes.*

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$21,199.00 for a full time Police Chief as previously voted by the Town and for support of the Police Department and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, accept, and expend any and all state and federal aid relative to the Police Department. *Amended to read: Such sums to be applied against the appropriation of \$21,199.00 and to authorize the Selectmen to accept and expend any gifts applicable to the Department, such gifts to be spent in accordance with the wishes of the donor. Voted in affirmative.*

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of Town Highways for both summer and winter. The sum recommended by the Selectmen is \$88,400.00 with \$5,000.00 to be put into a special account to be used for Special Bridge Projects, and to see if the Town will vote to put into the Capital Reserve Equipment Depreciation Fund 50 percent of the money received from the rent of Town equipment and the other 50% into the Highway Department to be used at the discretion of the Selectmen.

Note: Suggested Budget Breakdown as Follows: Summer Maintenance \$16,000.00 Winter Maintenance \$22000.00, Tarvia \$10,000.00, Bushes \$1,500.00, General Expense of Highway \$15,550.00, Culverts \$1,200.00, Road resurfacing \$7,250.00 Oil \$3,000.00, Bridge Maintenance \$1,900.00. Employees benefits \$5,000.00. The Highway Subsidy Fund of \$15,046.00 to be applied to Tarvia and resurfacing. *Voted in the affirmative.*

12. To see if the Town will vote to continue to plow driveways. Suggested fees to cover actual full costs to be set at \$15.00 for a driveway up to 90 feet in length and 21 cents for each additional foot and to use the money raised in fees in accordance with this article. Any balance remaining from these fees shall be put into the Capital Reserve Equipment Depreciation Fund. *Voted in the affirmative.*

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$38,973.00 for maturing town notes and interest due the Meredith Trust Co., the Meredith Village Savings Bank, and the Concord National Bank in the year 1975.

Library amended to \$26,048.33 bringing grand total to \$58,081.33. Voted in the affirmative.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,674.00 to pay the balance due on the new Town Garage. *Voted in the affirmative.*

15. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the balance of the Special Appropriation (Article 1) granted at the special Town Meeting of December 14, 1973. The \$23,000.00 authorization is not needed for the completion of the Town Garage (Original authorization \$65,000.00) (This article per request of the Auditors) *Voted in the affirmative.*

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint three firewards with such powers and duties as are set forth in New Hampshire RSA Chapter 154. This article by petition. *Voted to pass over article.*

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,800.00 for the support of fire protection for the Town of Sandwich. *Amended to read "for support of the Sandwich Volunteer Fire Department. \$14,800.00 amended to \$17,000.00. Voted in the affirmative.*

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$260.00 for installation of dry fire hydrants. NOTE: There is a carry over of \$1,343.00 in this account from 1974. *Voted in the affirmative.*

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the purchase of 1,000 feet of 4 inch fire hose. *Voted in the affirmative.*

20. If Article 18 is not voted in the affirmative to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,650.00 for the purchase of 1,000 feet of 2 1/2 inch fire hose. *Voted to pass over the article.*

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 to complete the work on the Whiteface Fire Station and grounds. This article by petition. *Voted in the affirmative.*

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be put into the Special Town Equipment Fund. *Amended that no monies would be appropriated to put into the special Town Equipment Fund but that any balance unexpended at the end of 1975 from the Moses Hall Fund be put in the Special Equipment Highway Fund. Voted in the affirmative.*

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for ambulance service. *Voted in the affirmative.*

24. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Department of Revenue Administration to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to raise and appropriate up to \$1,300.00 for such purpose. *Voted in the affirmative.*

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,000.00 for State Road Improvement. The State contributing \$10,000.00. *Vote in the affirmative.*

26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,700.00 to defray Damages and Legal Expenses and Town Line Work. *Voted in the affirmative.*

27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the updating of valuations on new buildings, construction, and new property transfers. *Voted in the affirmative.*

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$350.00 for the revision of property maps in reference to new property transfers. *Voted in the affirmative.*

29. To see if the Town agrees to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program by directing the Board of Selectmen to complete the eligibility application and submit the required information to the Federal Insurance Administration. *Voted in the affirmative.*

30. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting. *Voted in the affirmative.*

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sandwich qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the 2nd day of March next from 2:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. for the casting of ballots, and at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, March 3rd 1976 at the new Town Garage to act upon the following articles.

(EXPLANATION, Article 1 relating to the election of Town Officers will be taken up on Tuesday and polls will be open until 7:00 o'clock. A second session to consider all other business will be held March 3rd at 7:30 p.m. as per vote of the Town to accept provisions of RSA 39:2-a).

1. To elect by official ballot all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see if the Town will determine by vote the salaries and or other compensation of its Officers and Agents at the following rates:
 1. Selectmen \$750.00 per year plus \$4.00 per hour for special work such as assessing, bookwork etc and \$.18 per mile for mileage in connection with such special work.
 2. Town Treasurer \$700.00 per year plus expenses.
 3. Deputy Treasurer \$100.00 per year plus expenses.
 4. Tax Collector \$1200.00 per year plus expenses provided that Article 5 is voted in the affirmative. If Article 5 is not voted in the affirmative the salary to be \$700.00 per year plus expenses.

5. Deputy Tax Collector \$100.00 per year plus expenses.
6. Town Clerk \$500.00 per year plus expenses and Auto Permit Fees.
7. Highway Road Agent \$100.00 per year plus regular hourly rate.
8. Moderator \$4.00 per hour for service rendered at Town Meeting and all other Town, State and National Elections.
9. Ballot Inspectors \$3.00 per hour.
10. Supervisors of Checklist \$125.00 per year plus \$3.00 per hour for additional work incurred.
11. Treasurer of Trust Funds, \$450.00.
12. Forest Fire Warden, \$100.00.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes, the same to be paid from revenue of 1976.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector Deed or Deeds and as agents of the Town give Deed or Deeds thereof.
5. To see if the Town will authorize the Tax Collector to collect taxes semi-annually per RSA 76:15a. "A partial payment of the taxes assessed on April first in any tax year computed by taking the prior year assessed valuation times one half of the previous year tax rate; provided, however, that whenever it shall appear to the Selectmen or assessor that certain individual properties have physically changed in valuation they may use the current year appraisal times one half the previous year's tax rate to compute the partial payment. Partial payment of taxes assessed under this section shall be due and payable

on July first of the present tax year. A payment of the remainder of the taxes assessed on April first, minus the payment due on July first of that year shall be due and payable December first. Interest at the rate of six percent shall be charged on all taxes not paid between July first and December first. Interest charged after December first shall be in the amount prescribed in RSA 76:13."

6. To see if the Town will vote to replace the present street lighting in the Town with that recommended by the Selectmen.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums of money for:
 - (a) Memorial Day Observance, \$125.00.
 - (b) Old Home Week Observance, \$300.00.
 - (c) Maintenance of Notch and Dale Roads, \$841.00.
 - (d) Town Share for Social Security, \$4,800.00.
 - (e) Town Road Aid (TRA), \$1,197.96, the State contributing \$7,986.38.
 - (f) Town Dump and Forest Fires, \$250.00.
 - (g) Lakes Region General Hospital \$200.00 and Huggins Hospital \$200.00.
 - (h) Care of Cemeteries, \$500.00.
 - (i) Town Welfare, \$4,000.00.
 - (j) General Government, \$23,800.00.
 - (k) Town Dump Maintenance, \$4,200.00.
 - (l) Town Beaches, \$2,300.00.
 - (m) Insurance Premiums and Town Officer's Bonds, \$10,300.00.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,900.00 for a full time Police Chief as previously voted by the Town and for support of the Police Department and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend any and all state and federal aid relative to the Police Department such sums to be applied to the appropriation of \$20,900.00.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of Town Highways for both summer and winter. The sum recommended by the Selectmen is \$106,500.00 with \$5000.00 to be put into a special account to be used for Special Bridge Projects, and to see if the Town will vote to put into the Capital Reserve Equipment Depreciation Fund 50 percent of the money received from the rent of Town equipment and the other 50

percent into the Highway Department to be used at the discretion of the Selectmen.

NOTE: Suggested budget breakdown as follows: Employees Salaries \$52,800.00, Winter rental of equipment and maintenance \$5,200.00, Summer equipment rental and maintenance \$5,000.00, Tar \$8,000.00, Bushes \$800.00, Culverts, \$1,200.00, Road resurfacing - Sand - gravel - screen rental \$6,000.00, Oil \$3,000.00, General Expense of Highways \$16,000.00, Bridge Maintenance \$1,000.00, Blue Cross and Life Insurance \$2,500.00. The Highway Subsidy Fund of \$14,904.54 to be applied to Culverts, Tarvia and Resurfacing.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$17,000.00 for the support of fire protection for the Town of Sandwich.
11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Board of Fire Wards as provided in N.H. RSA 154:17, consisting of three members, to be appointed for three year terms commencing in March 1976, one to be appointed for three years, one for two years, and one for one year, thereafter for three years.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 for installation of dry fire hydrants.

NOTE: There is a carry over of \$934.00 in this account from 1975.

13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to purchase a new loader with the old loader to be used as a trade-in, and for the purpose to raise an appropriated sum not to exceed \$25,000 and to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts for such purpose; and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the balance required on the credit of the Town, issuing serial notes therefore on such terms and conditions as the Selectmen may determine.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$20,000.00 to have the Town revalued and to authorize the withdrawal of \$8,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 and \$2,000.00 from current revenue in 1976. The balance to be raised in 1977.
15. To see if the Town will vote to continue to plow driveways. Suggested fees to cover actual full costs to be set at \$15.00 for a driveway up to 90 feet in length and \$.21 for each additional foot and to use the money raised in fees in accordance with this article. And any balance remaining from these fees shall be put into the Capital Reserve Equipment Depreciation Fund.
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$29,677.00 for maturing town notes and interest due the Meredith Trust Co., the Meredith Village Savings Bank, and the Concord National Bank in the year 1976.

17. To see if the Town will vote that Bennett Street be closed, subject to gates and bars, from a point shortly beyond the Y on Bennett Street, where the Noss land abuts on both sides, to the Jose Bridge. This Article by request.
18. To see if the Town will vote to transfer any balance unexpended from the \$2500.00 voted for the Whiteface Fire Station in Article 21 of the 1975 warrant after the Whiteface Fire Station is completed, to the Central Fire Station for use in building protection over the doors at the station.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be put into the Special Town Equipment Fund.
20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for ambulance service.
21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be used for the maintenance of the present float, any balance remaining to be carried forward to 1976 to be used for the replacement thereof.
22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1350.00 to have an audit made. The selection of the auditing firm to be made at the discretion of the Selectmen.
23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,000.00 for State Road Improvement, the State contributing \$10,000.00.
24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2000.00 to defray Damages and Legal Expenses and Town Line Work.
25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the updating of valuations on new buildings, construction, and new property transfers.
26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$350.00 for the revision of property maps in reference to new property transfers.
27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$114.00 for the support of the Inter Lakes Day Care Center. This article by request.

ANNUAL REPORT
SANDWICH CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Conservation Commission was involved in two main projects during 1975. The joint effort of the Sandwich Conservation Commission and the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests culminated in the purchase of a key parcel of land in Sandwich Notch. The 70 acre parcel of land was purchased from Elizabeth P. Peaslee of Sandwich and Richmond, Virginia. The land once owned by Col. Lewis Smith, a 19th century farmer, is located opposite the Beede Falls Town Park. It will eventually be turned over to the Town of Sandwich.

The Conservation Commission would like to take this opportunity to thank Mrs. Peaslee for keeping the property off the open market long enough for the Forest Society to purchase it. Her willingness to help protect this unique area from development is most admirable.

The Conservation Commission hopes to announce the purchase of several additional parcels during the 1976 Bicentennial Year.

Our second project is the sponsorship of a tree planting project as part of our contribution to the Bicentennial celebration. The purpose of this planting is to restore the roadside beauty of the community. To date, approximately 60 trees have been ordered. The success of this project is due to the generous contribution by the Quimby Trust. Additional help in promoting this project has been provided by the Town Club and the Sandwich Land Use Forum.

The Conservation Commission would like to express its gratitude to all those individuals who have contributed to the success of these projects.

SANDWICH PLANNING BOARD

1975 ANNUAL REPORT

The calendar year of 1975 has been an active one for the planning board. Mrs. Eva Fellows' term expired 12-31-74 and she was replaced by Robert Delgado. Vaughan Harmon resigned to make way for a younger member and Kerry Peaslee was then appointed. Both retiring members put in many hours at meetings and in the field. They did a wonderful job and are greatly missed.

A number of small subdivisions were presented during the year. We did have one subdivision of thirty-two lots that was approved. The board rejected one subdivision and withdrew a previous approval of a waiver granted to the same lot. We also turned down a waiver on another lot to extend a building too close to the lake.

The board spent a lot of time on researching the National Flood Insurance Program. At a special Town Meeting the town voted to adopt it. The board then went to work on the Building Code for the flood prone areas which has been completed but too late for placing in this year's warrant. This matter will be presented shortly.

During the fall and winter we have had special meetings to work on the Town Master Comprehensive Plan, which will be required if we should have another disaster or need for federal help.

We are presently updating our subdivision and zoning regulations, which should be ready for presentation to the town soon.

Your planning board members are volunteers and put in many hours attending out-of-town meetings and traveling around town for on-site inspections at their own expense. They deserve your gratitude, your praise and your support.

We are pleased to report there were no serious structural fires in Sandwich this past year. We are indeed fortunate and wish to urge continued caution on the part of all the residents of the town so that we may be able to sustain this record. Prompt notification of the department of any emergency is also essential to keep losses small.

With the greatly increased use of wood stoves and fireplaces we urge our residents to have their chimneys checked this Spring and cleaned if necessary so as to avoid a possible chimney fire.

The four inch hose authorized to be purchased at the last town meeting was delivered and tested in the Spring. We have used this hose a number of times since but fortunately only for drills. We were able to purchase 1100 feet of this hose with the money appropriated.

Those who attended our Mutual Aid drill during Old Home Week were able to witness a demonstration of relay pumping through the four inch hose from the Town Hall pond to the Central Fire Station.

During a rerating inspection of your department by the Insurance Services Office of New Hampshire (the former Board of Fire Underwriters) we unfortunately suffered a major pump failure on Engine 1 from the Whiteface Station. We took this engine to Farrar Company, from whom we originally purchased it for repairs. It was out of service for several weeks and we were fortunate to have the old college Mack to cover the Whiteface Station while it was gone. The pump was completely rebuilt, tested and is now back in full service. We had to keep a very tight budgetary control because of this unexpected expensive repair and hence we had to put off purchasing various items we had been scheduled to acquire. We are pleased to report that even with this repair we were able to stay within the funds appropriated.

In closing, on behalf of the department I wish to extend my sincere and grateful thanks to the Selectmen for their cooperation and assistance, to all the officers and men of the department, the Sirens, the Junior Fire Department, and finally to the members of the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Association, all whom have given so freely of their time at no cost to the town.

REPORT TO TOWNS
SANDWICH

Upon the recommendation of town selectmen and city councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forest and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assists all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wildfire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey Bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city.

SANDWICH POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

1975

This past year has been a busy one for the Sandwich Police Department. The Department work load increased over 33% in 1975. Despite a decrease in active members within the Department the remaining officers did an excellent job of making sure the necessary police coverage was provided.

Although there was a significant increase in activity, the Department was successful in closing a large number of its cases. The arrest of a Lewiston, Maine man lead to the solving of many burglaries which occurred in one evening. The arrest of a Meredith man solved many of our camp breaks.

Much training was received by members of the Department in 1975. Most of the training was at no cost to the town.

Once again, the policy generally prevailed that no club or civic organization payed for policing at any of their functions requiring a police officer.

The Cadet program finally got going in early August. An extremely worthwhile project, it is hoped the town will proceed with the program in 1976. The cost to the town is \$86.00.

The Sandwich Notch has required its own policeman due to the tremendous use it now receives.

It is impossible to give a full accurate report in the Annual Town Report. It simply would take too much space.

For all who have contributed to the Department's success, especially the cadets, thank you, but most of all, a special thanks to those men of the Department who contributed more than their fair share to make the Department's operation for 1975 a success.
