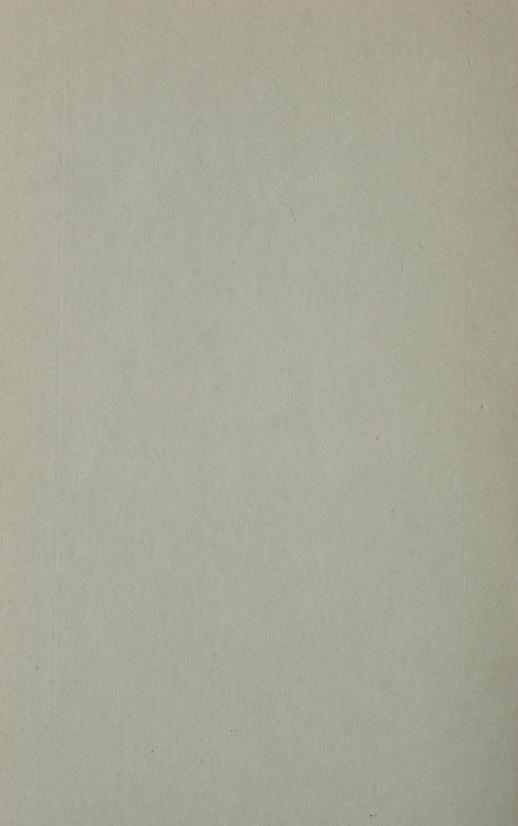

- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the continuance of the Fire Department, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the Elliot Community Hospital or take any action in relation thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$149.56 for Town Road Aid, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$32.00 for the Monadnock Region Association, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$230.00 for Old Age Assistance, or take any action in relation thereto.

- 9. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to the Wright Grove, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept Cemetery Funds or take action in relation thereto.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 12. To see what action the Town will take in purchasing land for a new cemetery, or raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action in relation thereto.
 - 13. To hear the reports of the Town Officers.
 - 14. To allow accounts.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SCHOOL WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the school district of the Town of Surry qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall of said district on the Sixth day of March, 1956, at 8:00 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board, and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officer or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or other officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose agents, auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation, of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the district the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act. (Old Age and Survivors' Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14.00 to defray the district's share of the cost thereof.
- 10. To see if the district wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.
- 11. To see if the district wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis.
- 12. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the district will authorize the school board to execute on behalf of the district the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the district will designate the School District Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- 13. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to negotiate a tuition contract with the Keene School District.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Surry:

I herewith submit my annual report as your superintendent of schools:

The additional teacher authorized by the district at the annual meeting last March has meant a considerable improvement to the school. The reduction in the number of pupils in each room and one less class per room has enabled teachers to have more time for regular class work and also, more time for individual assistance.

Mrs. Ruth Connors now has grades 1, 2 and 3. Mrs. Eleanor Scripture, an additional teacher, has grades 4, 5 and 6. Mr. Walter Goodnow has grades 7 and 8 in a room formerly used as a lunch room. Storm windows were installed in this room, new electric lights, writing and bulletin boards. The room is not an ideal classroom, however, it has been put in good condition to give service to the pupils of Surry.

The cooking, serving and storage area for the school lunch was reorganized to allow for cafeteria-type service. Thanks to a donation of new serving trays from Mr. and Mrs. Vincent Wilber, the pupils get their food on these trays, cafeteria-style, and take them to their rooms.

The Surry teachers are attending the monthly teacher meetings of the Supervisory Union No. 60. Miss Annette Eveleth, State Director of Health Services, discussed the use of the recently published Health Guide at the December meeting. Other meetings this year were used to prepare for the three-day Guidance Workshop held in October. Subsequent meetings are planned to follow-up the recommendations developed at the Workshop.

State Aid to Surry was less this year than was anticipated, principally because a new method was used to compute equalized valuation. The figure formerly used was adjusted valuation which was \$461,405.00 in 1954. The equalized valuation figure used this year was \$918,804.00.

The Parents Club continues to be of assistance to the school. The jungle-gym is a source of pleasure on the playground; the new duplicator is an aid to the teachers in preparation of materials to be used by the pupils and the continuance of financial support of the school lunch program means more assurance of healthy bodies for the children of Surry.
