### TENTATIVE TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Tamworth in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Tamworth Town House in said Tamworth, on Tuesday, the thirteenth (13th) day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:
- 4. Town officers' salaries. \$2,700.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 5. Town officers' expenses. \$750.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 6. Election and registration expenses. \$150.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 7. Expenses town hall and other buildings, including \$25.00 for the Garden Club and painting town hall. \$500.00 has been approved by the Finance Committee.
- 8. Clerical work. \$500.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 9. Police department. \$200.00 has been approved by Finance Committee.

- 10. Fire department, including firemen's insurance, forest fires and red network. \$2,300.00 approved by Finance Committee.
  - 11. Printing. \$500.00 has been approved.
- 12. Insurance and bonding. \$1,000.00 has been approved.
- 13. Civil defense. \$150.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 14. Health department, including hospitals. \$2,-000.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 15. Vital statistics. \$50.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 16. Town dump. \$500.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 17. Summer highway maintenance. \$12,000.00 approved by Finance Committee. This is broken down as follows: Roads, \$4,500.00; tarvia, \$5,000.00; bridges. \$1,900.00; bushes, \$600.00.
- 18. Winter maintenance. \$7,500.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 19. Street lighting. \$1,500.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 20. General expenses of highway department. \$2,-000.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 21. Town road aid. Town's share, \$849.13; approved by Finance Committee. (The State's share is \$5,662.42.)
- 22. Libraries. \$450.00 has been approved, including the amount required by law.
- 23. Town needy. \$2,500.00 approved by Finance Committee.

- 24. Old age assistance. \$4,500.00 has been approved.
- 25. Memorial Day. \$50.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 26. Aid to soldiers and their families. \$100.00 has been approved.
- 27. Recreation. \$750.00 has been approved. \$300.00 for Tamworth Outing Club and \$450.00 for Red Cross Swimming Transportation.
- 28. Cemeteries. \$500.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 29. Damages and legal expenses, including damage by dogs. \$200.00 has been approved.
- 30. Social security. \$250.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 31. Interest of all kinds. \$500.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 32. Payment on long term note. \$2,000.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 33. County tax. \$6,000.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 34. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$213.45, which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town, for the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the region. Not approved.
- 35. \$905.00 to be paid to the Trustees of Trust Fund to reduce amount of principal used by the town. Approved by Finance Committee.

- 36. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 37. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to dispose of any town property acquired through tax collector's deed.
- 38. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time of assessment on April 1st.
- 39. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting and to vote at what hour to close the polls.

### FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

#### DANGER FROM FIRES IN WOODLANDS

WOODLAND LITTER, WHEN DRY, IS HIGHLY INFLAMMABLE AND FIRES CAN QUICKLY GET OUT OF CONTROL. WE REQUEST YOUR COOPERATION TO CONTROL ALL FIRES SO THAT LIVES AND PROPERTY MAY NOT BE ENDANGERED OR DESTROYED, AND FORESTS BE KEPT GREEN TO FURNISH THE NATURAL BEAUTY WE ALL ENJOY AND TO GROW TIMBER WE WILL NEED.

#### WHAT IS "WOODLAND"?

The term "woodland" is defined by law to include, "cut-over land, slash and such other land as bears a sufficient amount of wood growth, wood, weeds, grass, or other growth as to be likely to be burned over."

WHEN IN THE WOODS, YOU ARE EXPECTED TO EXERCISE CAUTION IN THE USE OF FIRE AND TO REMEMBER THAT

#### IT IS UNLAWFUL TO

Throw down lighted matches, cigarettes, or other burning substances from vehicles or otherwise.

Burn brush, rubbish, grass or other materials when the ground is not covered with snow, without written permission from the Forest Fire Warden.

Kindle a camp or cooking fire on land of another without permission from the owner or his agent.

Leave an open fire burning unattended.

Fail to report a forest or brush fire that is out of control.

#### VIOLATORS ARE SUBJECT TO THESE PENALTIES

Anyone letting a fire escape from control, whether or not he has a permit to kindle the fire, is liable for the costs of extinguishing the fire.

Anyone found guilty of dropping inflammable ma-

terial in or near woodland shall be fined not more than \$25.00.

A person failing to report an uncontrolled brush or forest fire is liable to a fine of not more than \$10.00.

For kindling a fire in woodland of another without permission of the owner, or for kindling any fire without a permit when a permit is required, a person may be fined not more than \$200.00, or imprisoned 60 days.

#### DAMAGES

Every person who shall set fire on any land, that shall run upon the land of another, shall pay to the owner all damages done by such fire.

#### BE SURE—GET A PERMIT

Incinerators should be tight, with a close mesh screen, and be on clean ground.

Open fireplaces used to burn rubbish are classed as incinerators.

Always clean a space about any open fire to prevent its spread.

Never burn in dry, windy weather.

Have incinerators inspected by the Forest Fire Warden and get his written permit.

#### TAMWORTH SCHOOL DISTRICT WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the Town of Tamworth qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 7th day of April, 1956, at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received

from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for use for payment of the salary of the cook for the school lunch program.
- 10. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance on the school buildings and their contents.
- 11. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for grading, seeding and otherwise preparing the grounds at the new school.
- 12. To see if the district will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the district the benefits of Title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapters 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$48.00 to defray the district's share of the cost thereof.
- 13. To see if the district wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.
- 14. To see if the district wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis.
- 15. If a plan for Social Security Coverage is adopted, to see if the district will authorize the School Board to execute on behalf of the district the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry

into effect the plan and to see if the district will designate the District Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

- 16. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to make application for and accept in the name of the School district for educational purposes such funds or grants-in-aid as may be obtainable from the State or Federal government or any department or agency thereof, or any other source.
- 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Tamworth:

During the school year 1954-55 the teachers in the Tamworth School were as follows:

Mr. Ronald Corkum	Principal
Mrs. Elizabeth Brady,	Grades 7 and 8
Mr. Aaron Barnard,	Grades 5 and 6
Miss Margaret King,	Grades 3 and 4
Mrs. Dorothy Remick,	Grade 2
Mrs. Ethel Berry,	Grade 1

For the current year the staff remains the same except that Mr. Barnard was succeeded by Mrs. Carolyn Pulsifer. Mrs. Pulsifer came here from the Woodsville Union where she had been Music Supervisor. With the occupation of the new school building on January 3, 1956 the classes were reorganized. Mr. Corkum now teaches grade 6, Mrs. Pulsifer teaches grades 4 and 5, and Miss King teaches grade 3. The other grades are taught by the same teachers as last year. In these times of a critical shortage of teachers Tamworth is most fortunate in having such a competent teaching staff.

During the year 1954-55 the Tamworth School enrolled 168 pupils with an average daily membership of 159. The enrollment as of January 3, 1956 was 172. The census returns of September, 1955 indicate that there will be little change in the elementary school population during the next three years unless new families move into town.

There were 58 high school pupils enrolled at Kennett High School, one at Brewster Academy, and one at Fryeburg Academy, a total of 60. Enrollment for the current year is as follows: Kennett High School 65, Brewster Academy 1, and Fryeburg Academy 1. The current tuition rate is \$290.00, and will be \$305.00

per pupil next year. Of this current high school group 19 are seniors. The present eighth grade has an enrollment of 22 which will bring next year's high school enrollment to about 70. The present enrollment is nearly three times the high school enrollment as of January 1, 1946. This enrollment should remain fairly stable until 1961.

The school suffered a serious loss in the passing of Mrs. Rosalind Nystedt, R. N., who served so conscientiously and effectively as school nurse. Her unselfish interest in the welfare of the members of the Tamworth School is most sincerely appreciated. Mrs. Thelma Roberts is now serving as school nurse.

With the passing of Mr. Lawrence D. Hayford the community lost an active and effective member of the school board. Mr. Hayford was serving the second year of his current term.

Mr. Charles N. Behr, Jr., was appointed to the school board to serve the remainder of the current year.

Under the sponsorship of the P. T. A., the school lunch program is serving an exceptionally fine menu. Allocation of surplus products by the Federal Government through the State Distribution Agency are in generous quantities and wide variety. The preparation of the food is under the direction of Mrs. Maurice Nelson.

The chief project of interest in the school district has been the construction and occupation of the new school building. Construction progress was followed closely by all concerned, and it was with great pleasure that teachers and pupils officially occupied the building at the opening of the winter term January 3, 1956.

Moving from the old building was a difficult task and occupied the entire week of the Christmas vacation. The project was very efficiently organized and effected by Principal Ronald Corkum and the staff with a great amount of the heavy work contributed by several of the older boys. Mr. Behr and others contributed the use of trucks and otherwise gave very valuable assistance. Custodian William Hidden worked long hours installing shelves, basketball goals and cleaning and otherwise preparing the building for occupancy. The splendid cooperation of so many people is an outstanding example of coordinated community effort and civic duty.

Tamworth may well be proud of this fine, modern building. Its many educational advantages were apparent to the teachers and pupils as soon as they held their first classes there. The enthusiastic comments of visitors from neighboring communities, and elsewhere, is most gratifying.

It is difficult to express adequately my deep appreciation of the constant and willing cooperation of the large number of people during the past two years who have made this building possible. As I have been closely associated with all phases of the building project from its inception I am, perhaps, in a position to understand more fullly than anyone else the amount of time and effort that has been contributed by the members of the School Board and Building Committee to the development of this new building and its accompanying facilities. Many others, too numerous to mention, have given valuable assistance. I believe Tamworth is an outstanding example of a community having so many people whose sense of obligation as citizens goes far beyond the call of duty.
