- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

- 3. To see if the Town will vote to empower the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expense of the Town until the taxes are paid to the Treasurer.
- *** Business meeting for Appropriations only will be called for 7:30 o'clock in the evening.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Concord Hospital.

- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Franklin Hospital.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Penacook-Boscawen Nursing Association.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for use at Rolfe Park.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Penacook Youth Center.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Community Park. (Bal. of previous appropriations \$368.50)
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to sell or convey by deed, property taken by Town in default of redemption from Tax Sales.
- 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to meet with Concord officials to evaluate the plans for a joint sewage disposal system.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Fire Departments' Chief to dispatch fire equipment and personnel to assist in fire emergencies in towns outside of Boscawen, as provided in the statutes of the State of New Hampshire, Chapter 109:3-12 and Chapter 154:24-29.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$3500. for purchase of a 4-wheel drive pick-up truck for use by the Highway Department.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to transfer any unexpended balance of money from one appropriation to another.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a dog ordinance, which will call for constant control of dogs by their owners at all times in all residential areas, either by leash, chain or enclosure: and to give the Selectmen full authority to enforce this ordinance.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindful that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

WE MUST ALL BE CAREFUL:

- 1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
- 2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
- 3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush;
 - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
 - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5:00 PM
 - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.

We, the undersigned Auditors of the Town of Boscawen, certify that we have examined, checked and verified the records and accounts of the Treasurer, Treasurer of the Library Trustees, Treasurer of the Trust Funds and Selectmen's records and find them correct. We have also examined, checked and verified the records and accounts of the Town Clerk and Tax Collector. One motor vehicle permit was unaccounted for by the Town Clerk. Errors have been corrected. The Tax Collector's books were not received in time for errors and omissions to be corrected in 1965 but will be made part of the 1966 records.

Boscawen Planning Board

The development of a Master Plan for Boscawen has been completed, and will be published shortly. This plan, two years in the making, was prepared with professional assistance at a cash cost of some \$12,000. The Town appropriated \$3,800., about \$200. was received from the N. H. Department of Resources and Economic Development, and the Federal Government through the Community Facilities Administration made a direct grant of \$8,000.

Planning for present needs and future growth has become more important than ever in an era of rising costs and expanding population. Because of increasing pressures on land resources to the south of us, coupled with improved highways, Boscawen is certain to experience greater demands on its physical and financial resources.

The Master Plan complies fully with New Hampshire Statutes which permit the exercise of local initiative in developing a plan to fit local needs. Its purpose is to serve as a guide to the orderly and economical development of an attractive community. It will require changes from time to time.

In the absence of specific action at a town meeting the Master Plan does not commit the Town in any way. It contains basic information (reports, charts, maps) on land capability, population projections, capital needs, and present land use. It can be used by the selectmen, school board, water commissioners, fire companies and others. It is also anticipated that our Master Plan will help meet the requirement for comprehensive planning which must exist in order to qualify the Town for Federal assistance in the development of community facilities such as water and sewer systems.

While the mere existence of a Master Plan has some merit, its real purpose — orderly and economical development of an attractive community — requires action to carry it out. To this end, the Planning Board proposed a zoning ordinance last February. Following two public hearings this proposal was

voted down at Town Meeting. These proceedings revealed a rather widespread misunderstanding of the proposed ordinance. But also, the Board acknowledges receipt of many valuable suggestions which have now been included in a new proposed ordinance and map. The Planning Board has had two formal meetings with the Selectmen. They have advised us that following the required public hearings, they will call a special Town Meeting to act on the ordinance.

WARRANT for ANNUAL MEETING of

Penacook-Boscawen Water Precinct

To the inhabitants of Penacook-Boscawen Water Precinct in the County of Merrimack and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Precinct affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Boscawen Town Hall in Boscawen in said Precinct on the 25th day of March, 1966 at 7:30 o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To hear the reports of the Precinct officers and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 2. To choose all necessary Precinct officers for the ensuing year.
- 3. To authorize the Precinct Commissioners to borrow money in anticipation of Precinct taxes and other revenues for the year 1966 and to issue notes therefor at such rate of interest and payable at such time, within one year, and at such place as the Precinct Commissioners shall determine.
- 4. To see if the Precinct will vote to raise and appropriate the amounts listed in the budget for 1966.
 - 5. To see if the Precinct will vote,
- (a) To authorize, in whole or in part, the construction of the improvements and work outlined under Phase I and Phase II of the Report of Coffin & Richardson, Consulting Engineers, dated February 9, 1966, including a new intake main and new pumping station at Walker Pond and a new discharge main from the proposed pumping station to South Water Street, a new main in Knowlton Road and in a proposed easement from Knowlton Road so as to connect with the existing main in Queen Street, a new 750,000 gallon standpipe in the vicinity of the existing standpipe, an underground pumping station in the vicinity of Queen Street, new mains in Raymond

Road, an underground booster pumping station on Queen Street near the standpipes, a new main to eliminate the dead-end on Elm Street, and other improvements as described in said Report;

- (b) To acquire by purchase or by the exercise of the right of eminent domain any land or easements required for said improvements;
- (c) To appropriate a sum not exceeding \$378,-600.00 for the foregoing purposes;
- (d) For the purpose of financing any appropriation made hereunder,
- 1. To authorize the Commissioners to apply for and receive in the name of the Precinct such grants-in-aid and loans for water facilities as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States of America or any agencies thereof under the provisions of Title VII of Public Law 89-117 and of Public Law 89-240 and of any other federal statute making such grants or loans available, any such application to be in the form and manner required by the United States of America and in conformity with the statute under which the same is filed;
- 2. To borrow in the name of the Precinct by the issue of serial notes or bonds in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act and amendments thereto and any other statute thereto enabling, a sum equal to the full amount of said appropriation less any funds which the Precinct may receive as grants-in-aid or loans from the United States of America or any agencies thereof as hereinabove authorized, and to authorize the Commissioners to determine the time and place of payment and rate of interest of said notes or bonds to do whatever may be necessary to the issuance thereof;
- (e) To authorize the Commissioners to make application to the United States of America or the appropriate agency thereof, in form and manner required and in conformity with Public Law 560 of the 83rd Congress and amendments thereto, and

to do whatever else may be required, for an interestfree temporary advance of funds to aid in defraying the cost of the final planning of said program of water system improvements, including the preparation of working drawings and specifications and contract documents, such advance to be repaid when said work is undertaken or started; and

- (f) To authorize the Commissioners to do all things necessary or convenient to carry the foregoing into effect, including, without limitation, the employment of engineers, the execution in the name of the Precinct of a contract or contracts for the construction of said improvements and the purchase of equipment for the same, and the purchase or condemnation in the name of the Precinct of land or interest in land.
- 6. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

Installation of new pipe during the year included 1,700 feet of six inch main, 400 feet of $1\ 1/2$ inch plastic pipe and 400 feet of 1 inch plastic pipe. Other construction and equipment added were nineteen new services, a new truck, and seven new hydrants. Four obsolete hydrants were retired.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Boscawen:

Enrollment continues to increase at the Main Street School. School enrollment studies indicated that we could expect 376 pupils to enroll in September of 1965. Our September count was 374. Several have been added to our numbers since that time.

Grade five was divided into two divisions and an additional teacher was added to our staff during the summer. We now have two divisions of each grade through grade five.

Grade six should now be divided into two divisions. However, this will require additional classroom space as well as an additional teacher. There is no classroom space available for such a division unless the cafeteria is used for this purpose.

The School Board is deeply concerned about this problem and will attempt to find a solution in the near future. Serious thought will be given to the possibility of installing a temporary partition in the cafeteria, so that a part of this space may be used for a classroom without the need to discontinue the lunch program.

With a continuing growth in Boscawen school population it appears that space will continue to be a serious problem for several years. When grades seven and eight become a part of the new cooperative school there will be some relief in the pressure but it would appear that this may be only temporary.

Extensive work has been done to improve the lighting in the classrooms of the old building. Interior painting, boiler repairs and other renovations have been made in order to make this portion of the school more suitable for classroom use. This portion of the school will continue to be expensive to maintain and to operate.

In November our eighth grade pupils participated in the State-wide testing program sponsored by the University of New Hampshire. The cost of this program was cut to fifty percent for the district through the availability of Federal funds. The test results should prove very helpful in further guidance of these pupils as they enter high school.

I welcome this opportunity to express my appreciation to the Board, the staff, and to all who have cooperated so effectively in the operation of the school.
