Civil Defense Director Arthur Edgar Portions of a letter from the Attorney for the Town of Center Harbor written in conclusion of the recent court stipulation on land development.

The Town of Center Harbor already has an ordinance regulating the use of private sewers and drains and private sewage disposal, and under this ordinance no septic tank can be installed without the permission of the Selectmen.

It is my recommendation that several signs be put up in the town of Center Harbor, stating at follows: "NOTICE — BEFORE COMMENCEMENT OF CONSTRUCTION OF A PRIVATE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM (SEPTIC TANK AND LEACHING FIELD) THE OWNER MUST FIRST OBTAIN A WRITTEN PERMIT SIGNED BY THE SELECTMEN."

I also strongly recommend that there be sent to every person who owns a development, on which there will be building carried on in Center Harbor, a copy of the health ordinance with a short note explaining that this health ordinance will be enforced by the Selectmen and that if the person to whom it is sent desires any information he should call at the Selectmen's office.

I think it is also important that the health officer of the Town be a person who is willing to enforce the health ordinance and be as severe as possible.

I think it is important also to point out at this time that while the stipulation was arrived at in this particular case does solve the water pollution problem as far as this particular area on Squam Lake is concerned, the problem of cheap and unattractive and potentially polluted subdivisions, still remains, both as far as Squam Lake and Lake Winnipesaukee are concerned. It is my opinion that the only way to insure the orderly growth of lakeside property is to have the Town adopt a comprehensive plan and subdivision regulations. These subdivision regulations would not only eliminate the danger of pollution, but could also insure an orderly development with the proper types of roads and the correct size of lots. Experience in New Hampshire has shown that more and more "quick buck" developers are moving up here and that more and more people are buying into such developments. This means that if roads are not laid out properly there will be extra expense to the Town as the years go by, and a development that is embarked upon without any real planning will result in a fire hazard and eventually depress property values in the surrounding areas.

I know from experience that we have one of the finest planning departments in the country. I am sure that Mr. Randy Raymond and Mary Louise Hancock, of the New Hampshire Planning Department, would be more that happy to assist the Town of Center Harbor in working out a comprehensive plan, which will make Center Harbor the attractive summer and winter resort that it should be.

The preservation of the purity and beauty of Center Harbor and the Squam Lakes Region is a task that the people of Center Harbor, and particularly its Selectmen, should be concerned with at all times. Due to improved roads, better cars, and an affluent society, more and more people from the cities and suburban areas of Boston, New York, and other large population centers will be pushing into New Hampshire, first to live here in the summer, and then eventually to live here the year round. None of the towns on Squam Lake is immune to the population explosion of an affluent society.

Unfortunately, the record of the American people from the Atlantic Ocean to the Pacific Coast shows that we have been wanton despoilers of what nature has given to us, not because of evil intent, but because of carelessness, negligence, and lack of planning. If the waters of Squam Lake become polluted, Squam Lake will become another Pemigewasset River, and Centr Harbor and the other Towns that depend upon it as a tourist attraction will shrivel and become ghost towns. Only the People of Center Harbor and the other Towns can make sure that our children will be able to fish and swim and enjoy the clear pure waters of Squam Lake.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Center Harbor in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Center Harbor Town House in said Center Harbor on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next at two of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Highway Department which includes care and maintenance of Sidewalks, Wharf Area and Fountain.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$4,911.00 for the maintenance of the Center Harbor Volunteer Firemen's Association.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise money in the amount of \$2,500.00 Welfare and Town Poor.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for Parks and Playgrounds, including Band Concerts, and hiring of a qualified Life Guard at the Town Beach, and if so, how much.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Assistance for Class V Roads, the Town to raise \$272.82 and the State will contribute \$1,818.79.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise money in the amount of \$200.00 for aid to the Family Service Association and Lakes Region Mental Health Association.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for aid to the Laconia Hospital and if so, how much.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$166.51 which is 1/300th of 1% of the net valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region. (By Request)
- 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to negotiate for the purchase of a new Town Truck at a cost of not more than \$4,000.00 and to hire money to spread cost of said truck over a period of two years.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Care of Shade Trees and Blister Rust Control.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the use of the Planning Board.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for preliminary study and planning of a new Municipal Building.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the use of Civil Defense.
- To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower 16. the Planning Board to approve or disapprove in its discretion, new subdivisions in excess of 10 lots and plots thereof showing streets, or the widening thereof, or parks, and upon the adoption of this article, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Registry of Deeds of the County of Belknap a certificate or note showing that the said Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of authorization, as provided in Section 19, and Sections 19-29 inclusive, Chapter 36 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. If this article is adopted, it shall further be the duty of the Town Clerk to issue all certificates of failure when the Planning Board shall fail to take action as provided in Chapter 36: Sections 19, 20-29 inclusive.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.

- 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 19. To choose agents or committees in relation to any article of the Warrant and to hear reports of any here-to-fore chosen.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# Report of Forest Fire Warden and District Chief

Fire records are made by people — those who cause fires and those who control them. Your forest fire warden, deputy wardens, fire chief and firemen have, in spite of a prolonged drought, made one of the best fire control records in recent years. Despite a very dry spring, we in New Hampshire working together, have substantially reduced our fire incidence (855 in 1965 to 595 in 1966.)

This enviable record is largely due to two factors:

- 1. A closely coordinated and integrated state-town organization jointly carrying out programs of forest fire prevention, training and suppression with dedicated personnel.
- 2. Your appreciation of our forest fire control program and your individual effort in practicing fire prevention.

Statistics show, however, there is room for improvement. Major problems are still with us; (1) the careless disposal of cigarettes; (2) the householder's carelessness in burning rubbish; (3) the failure of woodlot owners and contractors to completely extinguish brush fires; (4) failure to extinguish camp fires; (5) unsupervised children playing with matches.

New Hampshire has 4,399,000 acres of woodland to be protected. In 1966 we experienced 595 forest fires on this area and restricted acreage burned to 395 acres — a fine testimonial to the efficiency and dedication of the men who make up our forest fire control organization.

- 1. If you must burn you will need a permit. Permits are not issued between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. except on rainy days. Permits are not needed when the ground is covered with snow. To minimize risk the best way to dispose of rubbish is at your authorized town or municipal dumping area.
- 2. Be sure all discarded smoking material is out.
- 3. Don't leave a live camp or cooking fire.
- 4. Most important Instruct your children that matches are not play things.
