In "Dublin Days, Old and New", my father wrote as follows about sugaring in the Dublin of bygone days: "After a long, monotonous winter, spring, with its milder weather, is always welcome. It was particularly pleasing on the farm, for it ushered in the maple sugar season.

"A sugar lot of average size generally sets from five hundred to a thousand buckets. The required fuel was usually cut in four-foot lengths and piled in the shed adjoining the sugar house during the summer. Considerable waste wood of inferior quality could be used for this purpose.

"There were years when snow was deep in the woods and roads were plowed with oxen and sled in advance. A rock maple produces the sweetest and most sap. One bucket is sufficient for a tree of small size, but there were giant maples five and six feet in diameter in the lot to which five and six buckets could be set.

"It was necessary, at times, to boil all night long in order to keep up with a good run. Eggs cooked in the boiling sap always tasted a little better than usual. Maple syrup sold for a dollar a gallon, soft pail sugar for ten cents per pound, and fancy two-ounce cakes for twelve and fifteen cents per pound.

"Abbott Burpee, who lived on the eastern slope of Monadnock, had one of the earliest sugar lots in town and always planned to bring newly made cakes of sugar to the village on Town Meeting day."

ABSTRACT OF THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

held at the Town Hall, Dublin, N.H., Tuesday, March 6, 1973

C. Robertson Trowbridge, Moderator, presiding

Polls opened at 11:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. as advertised.

7:00 P.M. — Meeting called to order and polls closed. Motion carried to count ballots at end of business meeting. Motion carried to waive reading of warrant articles before proceeding.

Invocation by the Reverend Noel Sokoloff.

Pledge of Allegiance led by Selectman John J. McKenna.

Resolution to Rescue Party of Christopher Fitch. Accepted.

Resolution to Nellie A. Crossley, Bookkeeper. Accepted. Mrs. Crossley was also presented a plant.

Vote of thanks to John J. McKenna for six years as a Selectman.

1:30 A.M. — Results announced. Oaths of office administered.

Findings of Articles follows in order.

Article 1. *Officers Elected*: Town Clerk-Tax Collector, 3 years, Anita J. Crowell; Town Treasurer, 1 year, Nellie A. Crossley; Selectman, 3 years, Glen H. Hipple; Highway Agent, 1 year, Clarence Babneau; Trustee of Trust Funds, 3 years, Philip F. McLellan; Library Trustee, 3 years, Nellie A. Crossley; Water Commissioner, 3 years, Elliott S. Allison; Cemetery Committee, 3 years, Glen H. Scribner; Member of Planning Board, 6 years, Thomas P. Wright; Member of Board of Adjustment, 5 years, Frederick P. Woodward; Conservation Commission (2 members), 3 years, Paul A. Miller, Nancy F. Perkins; Conservation Commission, 2 years, Marsha M. Niemela; Conservation Commission, (2 members), 1 year, Virginia A. Marston and James C. Haddock.

Article 2. *Officers Chosen*: Measurer of Wood & Bark, Elliott S. Allison; Memorial Day Committee, Brian Barden, Kenneth Clukay, Robert Blanchette.

Article 3. Moved that the Reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees be accepted as printed. Carried.

Article 5. Moved that the Town authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of any Real Estate acquired by Tax Deed. Carried.

Article 6. Moved that the Town accept certain Trust Funds, as follows: For perpetual care of cemetery lots — Kuja Lot \$200.00; C.E. McKeen Lot \$200.00; Parsons Lot \$200.00; Thomas P. Wright Lot \$200.00. Carried.

Article 7. Moved that the Town accept the Budget as printed in

the 1972 Annual Reports, and that the Town raise and appropriate the necessary sums for each item. Motion amended by John J. McKenna to reduce the Police Budget from \$15,500.00 to \$12,500.00. Amendment failed. Original Motion carried.

Article 8. Moved that the Town discontinue that portion of the East Valley Road from the barn presently owned by Otto A. Koskela, to the Jaffrey Town line, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:1. Carried.

Article 9. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,100.00 for the purchase of a traffic monitoring radar set for the Police Department. Carried by a standing vote — 116 Yes 96 No.

Article 10. Moved by Judson D. Hale that the Town dissolve the Recreation Committee, as defined by the 1971 and 1972 Town Meetings. Carried.

Article 11. Moved that the Town authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Committee, in coordination with Study Committees from other towns, to study the feasibility of a Town Manager type of government for three or more towns, and to report thereon at the 1974 Town Meeting. R.S.A. Chapter 37 applies. Carried.

Article 12. Moved that the Town become a member of the Regional Planning Commission, now organized and named the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. Carried.

Article 13. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$561.00 as Dublin's share for the studies and operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission for 1973. Carried.

Article 14. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$650.00 to provide Blue Cross, Blue Shield and Major Medical Insurance on a single person basis to full-time employees of the Highway Department, including the Highway Agent, and to the full-time Police Chief. Motion amended by Nellie A. Crossley to increase the amount to \$1,420.00 and family plan basis. Amendment failed. Original Motion carried.

Article 15. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$3,200.00 for painting the exterior of the Town Hall. There was a gracious gesture by Marathon House to do the job for \$500.00 plus cost of the paint. Motion amended by T. Gordon Hutchinson to reduce the amount to \$1,500.00. Amendment failed. Original Motion carried. The Marathon House offer will be considered with the other bids.

Article 16. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to help support the Meeting Place, located in the basement of the Town Hall. Carried.

Article 17. Printed on the ballot. Are you in favor of the Amendment to the Dublin Planning & Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Dublin Planning Board concerning a moratorium until not later than April 1, 1974 on certain types of construction or development in the town of Dublin. Carried on the ballot 221 Yes, 112 No.

Article 18. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,300.00 to install 8 dry fire hydrants and move the location of one presently installed, these to be located as listed in the Town Warrant. Carried.

Article 19. Moved that the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Committee of 3 to investigate the proper procedures for adopting the Municipal Budget Act and incorporate their findings in the Warrant for the Town Meeting of 1974. Carried.

Article 20. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for the purchase of 1,000 feet of fire hose for the Fire Department. Carried.

Article 21. Moved that the Town vote to reopen the presently abandoned extension of the Dooe Road, from the point of its junction with the Valley Road, southeasterly for a distance of approximately 900 feet, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800.00 for such road rebuilding project. Motion failed by standing vote. 88 Yes, 94 No.

Article 22. Moved that the Town accept the Ordinance for the Conservation and Protection of Waters and Wetlands as amended by the Conservation Commission's special proposed amendments, and an amendment made by Glen H. Hipple to change the wording of Section VII Penalty from "The holder of a permit" to "Any person". The amendments carried. An amendment to refer this Article to the Planning Board for further consideration failed by standing vote — 91 Yes, 100 No. Original Motion also failed.

Article 23. Moved that the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State & Local Assistance Act of 1972, the total amount, including interest, available in 1973, estimated at \$11,750, for use as set-off against budgetted appropriations for Town Maintenance, Summer and Winter. Carried.

Article 24. Moved by Glen H. Hipple that the Town authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Committee of 5 to investigate methods and procedures of property appraisal by the N.H. State Tax Commission, and by other private or commercial appraisers or appraisal firms, to review with Dublin Selectmen their methods of appraising town property, to determine in the Committee's opinion the need for, or the lack of a need for, an appraisal of the land and buildings

in Dublin, and to make recommendations thereto for consideration by the Selectmen and by an Article in the Town Warrant for action by voters at Town Meeting in 1974. Carried.

Article 25. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to be placed in Capital Reserve for a solid waste disposal system. Carried.

Meeting adjourned at 11:50 P.M. for counting of ballots.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Dublin qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Dublin Consolidated School auditorium at 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, March 5, 1974 to act on the following subjects:

Polls will be open at the Town Hall from 12:00 noon to 7:00 p.m.

Article 1. To bring in your ballots for the following officers:

One year Terms

Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, one (1) member Conservation Commission

Three Year Terms

Selectmen, Trustee of Trust Funds, Water commissioner, Library Trustee, one (1) member Cemetery Committee, two (2) members Conservation Commission.

Five Year Terms

One (1) member Board of Adjustment, one (1) member Planning Board

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Planning and Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board, (Ballot Question)

Article 3. To express your opinion on an informational ballot regarding a Dublin by-pass. (Ballot Question) By Petition

Article 4. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

Article 5. To hear Reports of agents, auditors, committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of any Real Estate acquired by tax deed.

Article 8. To see if the Town will accept certain Trust Funds as follows:

For Perpetual Care of Cemetery Lots

Florence M. Pierce Lot	\$200
Sagendorph Lot	200
William McDevitt Lot	100

Article 9. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and

appropriate to defray Town charges and for other purposes mentioned in the Town Budget.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of the former Old Marlborough Road from the corner of the Charcoal Road westerly through land presently owned by Mr. T. Newbold and The Kingdom, Inc. to the point where it rejoins the present Old Marlborough Road, in accordance with R.S.A. 238:1.

Article 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new Police Cruiser to replace the present vehicle, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 as the Town's share for the purchase of a 4 frequency Motorola Portable Radio, L.E.A.A. matching funds being \$1,140.00.

Article 13. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to reopen and rebuild the presently abandoned extension of the Dooe Road from the point of its junction with the Valley Road southeasterly to the Peterborough Town Line, said abandoned extension now closed "subject to gates and bars" as voted at the Annual Town Meeting of March 10, 1970, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 14. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to employ an independent appraisal firm to perform a complete re-evaluation of all land and buildings in the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 15. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to cut trees and brush, and grub stumps, for initial preparation of approximately one half acre on the southern border of the present cemetery, adjacent to Route 101, in order to allow future expansion of the cemetery land available for gravesites, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 16. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the purchase of a replacement for the present Road Grader, such sum to be raised by authorizing the Selectmen to issue long term notes, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept Boulder Drive, in the Norman R. Davis Subdivision, as a Town Road, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee of three (3) to investigate the proper procedure for adopting the Municipal Budget Act, and incorporate their recommendations in the Warrant for the Town Meeting of 1975.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of the horse-drawn sleigh-hearse and the wagon-hearse formerly used by the Town and stored for many years in the cemetery shed, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to join with other communities in a solid waste disposal facility, or how else to comply with the July 1, 1975 deadline for open dumps, and to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from Capital Reserve such sums as are necessary, and to borrow on long term notes such additional sums as are required, to initiate action on Solid Waste Disposal plans, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 21. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to repair the present sidewalk on the south side of Route 101 in the vicinity of the former V Lawn Inn, and to extend it from its present ending at the Parsonage to the entrance to the Women's Club Beach, such sum to be raised by authorizing the Selectmen to issue long term notes, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund of the total amount, including interest, available in 1974, estimated at \$9,700, for use as set-off against the budgeted appropriation for "Town Maintenance — Summer and Winter", or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 23. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Capital Reserve.

DUMP COMMITTEE REPORT

The bottle recycling project has been temporarily suspended because our barrels were being stolen from the dump. The only way to solve this is to have an attendant at the dump whenever it is open, and the money for an attendant can be raised only by a vote at Town Meeting. Furthermore, it is not easy to crush and transport a relatively small amount of glass. Manual crushing by volunteers is risky and unreliable. Mechanical crushers are expensive, perhaps \$1,000 or more, and require supervision and maintenance. Once the glass is crushed and sorted, it brings about \$20.00 per ton at the plant. Given the exponential increases about to occur in shipping costs, it appears profitable to truck crushed glass only on a large scale. Perhaps the best thing for Dublin to do is to link recycling to trash disposal. The S.W.N.H.R.P.C. is recommending that Dublin and Jaffrey develop a joint landfill in Jaffrey. If both towns approve this, they could combine and process their recyclables at the landfill site. This would be more efficient and less expensive than going it alone, but such a project will not materialize overnight, and agreement on a common landfill will almost certainly have to precede a joint recycling program.

REPORT OF THE DUBLIN FIRE DEPARTMENT

The department was called upon 37 times during 1973. This year, only one serious building fire occurred in town. However, resusitator calls and automobile accident rescue calls have increased — a most unpleasant but necessary function of the department. The town dump also received its usual spray from the department nine times during the extremely dry spell this fall. Some people still think that it's all right to complete the disposal of their own trash by setting fire to it after depositing it in the dump. Setting fire to the dump or any part of its contents carries stiff penalties to the offender if caught!

Twenty-one oil burner permits were issued during the year. Many building inspections were made especially to those capable of being occupied by over fifty persons (the Town Hall!). Inspection of numerous wood stove installations were made at the request of the worried homeowners not always sure of their capabilities as heating engineers. So far, except for several chimney fires, we have experienced no problems from the auxiliary heating systems hastily installed this past fall. These systems have saved oil for almost every place except the fire station. Even with a new burner installed in the furnace — the cost of heat goes up — and we're not ready to heat the fire station with wood yet!

To prepare for the usual fires incurred during cold weather, fire drills are being held twice each week — Sunday mornings and Monday evenings to give each member a chance to keep up to date with our extensive equipment used in the prevention and supression of fires.

A total of 3500 feet of 4" supply hose is now rolled on the reel of the hose truck. This hose was purchased by the Dublin Fire Company. Funds were raised by it's members for this purpose. This vehicle is the best equipped modern hose truck in the country.

The additional 1000 feet of 2" hand line has been purchased and added to the two front line trucks. This hose was a special item in the 1973 Town Warrant.

The dry hydrant project has yet to be completed due to an extremely late delivery of the hydrants to us from the manufacturer due to component shortages (so we were told!). This project will be completed in the spring. Current value of this hose is over \$12,000.00.

We ran a little short of funds this year as usual. We were hit with the replacement of several pieces of unreparable radio equipment, several nozzles — required by the State Board of Underwriters — a new oil burner and a serious increase in prices of all items used in

the department. An example of these increases is 39.2 cents for oil — from less than 20c last year — 4" hose is \$3.45 per foot or \$345 per roll as it comes 100 feet at a time. This is up from \$1.95 per foot two years ago and on it goes — everything costs more money — much more money.

However, if we didn't enjoy this type of work, we probably wouldn't do it, so you won't hear any complaints from me or the members of the department concerning their duties as firemen.

I would like to thank the men for their concern and valued talents that enable us to have a good fire department. Thank you for your continued support.

Last summer Holly Moore volunteered her services. She did so much to help us and we all enjoyed her.

The Dublin Extension held several of its meetings in the Gowing room, open to the public. One meeting of fun and interest was cheese tasting, when as many as fifteen cheeses were placed on a most bountiful table for our approval.

One of the most important goals of our library is to help enrich the lives of the children by more use of the library. This year we

made better progress by sharing our films with both pre and elementary classes. Mimeographed lists of books relating to the films were given to the teachers for distribution. Before showing the film at the school, I have brought books for the children to see, and have given brief annotations. We are most pleased with the visits to the library for books.

During the summer a reading achievement program was held. Awards were presented, and the party ending this event was held on the library lawn, where about forty persons made and ate all the ice cream sundaes they wanted!

Improvements include new lighting fixtures in the stack room, a dehumidifier for the Gowing room taking out as much as thirteen pints of water daily. The new wall entrance is a great improvement and our patrons feel much safer using this approach to the building.

The trustees held four business meetings. As your librarian I attended three district meetings and workshops. Especially helpful to me were meetings to preview films, study better cooperation between school and library, and laws governing public libraries in New Hampshire. One benefit our patrons receive by our affiliation in the Statewide Library Development Program is the Statewide Library card. This enables a patron in good standing to use over a hundred libraries in the state.

Eventually the library will have to have a new leech bed for its sewage, for health and environmental protection to its land. The cement in the retaining wall appears to be crumbling from the rear. It has been suggested that this area be filled with earth, (when free), sloped and landscaped, with a walking ramp to the lower level of library land and back exit. Years ago a road ran behind the town hall on Church street west to behind the library. It was used for maintenance services. In years to come it would be well to consider the merits of a new road so that patrons unable to do the stairs will have access to the Gowing room.

We are making every effort to conserve energy and the taxpayers dollars, in inflated prices for light, heat, books and supplies.

*DUBLIN PLANNING BOARD
1973 ANNUAL REPORT*

The Dublin Planning Board had a busy and productive 1973, the main achievement being the preparation and presentation of a completely new zoning ordinance. Dublin voters are encouraged to vote "yes" on the ballot question concerning zoning during town meeting day in 1974. The membership of the planning board fully endorses the proposed ordinance.

In other activities, the board conducted 13 hearings on subdivision applications. Eleven were approved, one was denied, and no action was necessary on one. Hearings were also held concerning work on Parsons and Burpee roads, two Scenic Roads.

It was determined in 1973 that the legal requirements for conducting hearings on subdivisions were in excess of the \$10 application fee. As a consequence a change in the fee can be anticipated in a future change to the land subdivision regulations.

Of importance to the town — in addition to the zoning ordinance to provide orderly growth in Dublin — is the handling of subdivisions. Norman R. Davis' project and the roads he constructed are examples of what the board considers good planning. Boulder Drive, in the Davis subdivision, is also a subject matter for town meeting 1974.

The real need not only in Dublin but throughout New Hampshire is good land use planning. For this reason, the Dublin Planning Board has consistently used the services of and fully endorses The Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. The board urges your attention, understanding and continued support of the work of the commission.

Robert B. Allen and Thomas P. Wright are Dublin's representatives on the board of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. Allan J. Fox and Richard A. Hammond are alternate representatives.

REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Conservation Commission has several different tasks; we have to record and map the Town assets in land, water, trees, animals, and people; we act to protect these assets; we work with other Town, State and Federal government bodies; we try to acquire land or the rights to use land for the public to enjoy; and we try to help people singly or in groups, who are interested or concerned about conservation.

We helped the Dublin Girl Scouts with two projects this year.

On April 28th the Scouts carried out their Anti-litter Drive. On May 26th the girls planted several trees on public property. We helped choose the trees and sites. The State gave the trees.

Mrs. French and Mrs. Anable head the paper collection drive, using the Church garage. We voted \$50 to repair the shed.

Sixteen young people worked hard to pay their way to Camp Union this Fall. They earned \$300 by projects such as clean-up at the Cemetery. The Garden Club donated \$80 and we paid the balance of \$170.

We believe we must encourage and support these local efforts.

The Conservation Commission has taken a keen interest in the hard work of the Dump Committee. One of our members has suggested a bicycle path through Town and serves on that Committee. We have enjoyed working closely with the Planning Board on soil maps, zoning plan and subdivision hearings. By a new State law, a planning board member is a member of our Commission. This year Allan Fox served from October. This has been very helpful. Several members of the Commission visited Concord, attended hearings and studied the proposed State Highway Action Plan. As a result, some changes were made in these rules that will apply to the future planning of New Hampshire Highways.

The Commission spent much time this year on the 101 By-pass plan. We attended State hearings. We gave data asked for by the State for its impact study. We held several joint meetings with Keene, Harrisville and other town conservation commissions. We met with and offered help to both the No-East-West Highway and the Re-locate 101 Committees. As a Commission, we see a need to get all the facts out before the public. We urge you to study this new road plan, which may have a major effect on Dublin. We are ready to help all who wish to get involved.

The Commission and its lawyer spent many hours this year drafting a deed for land on Howe Reservoir. The owner plant to give the Town rights to use the land for recreation and a nature preserve. We

think our careful efforts to define these rights will encourage other good citizens to make similar gifts.

This year a new law gave us important new powers. In order to build a dam, encroach on wet-land or such, you must get a permit from Concord. Now that application is sent to the Conservation Commission. We may hold public hearings and make comment before that application can be acted on by the State. Concord more and more expects local boards and citizens to detect and report the breaking of wet-land, septic tank, pollution and other rules and laws. Please call us if you see any building, grading or digging you think might harm Dublin. You are our Town's best guardians.

REPORT OF THE BICYCLE/WALKING PATH COMMITTEE

On July 30th, 1973 the selectmen appointed a 14 person committee to study the possibilities of a bicycle/walking path up Dublin Hill, to help insure the safety of the young people in Dublin traveling to and from school, the center of town and the lake.

The committee discussed all type of safety measures including traffic signs, lights, crosswalks, alternate bike routes, relocating sidewalk to the north side of Route 101, relocating 101, as well as our focal point, the feasibility of an expanded bicycle/walking path up Dublin hill.

Several committee members took a study trip to Lincoln, Massachusetts to look at their facilities. A special thanks to Emily Anable and the Lincoln town officials for so much work and cooperation.

While the committee was very much in favor of such a project the odds are pretty well stacked against a bicycle path, for the following reasons.

1. *Easements* The town would need easements from all property owners boardering any proposed path.

2. *Grade* The grade of the hill almost prohibits young people from riding bicycles up the hill at all.

3. *Costs* Even on a conservation basis an eight foot bicycle path 1/2 mile long would cost the town in excess of \$30,000, with not much chance of any federal or state funds because of the grade of the hill.

I wish to express my thanks to all of the members of the committee for their work on various projects as well as Police Chief Robert McLean for his help on crosswalks, traffic controls and lights.

The committee does heartly recommend an extension of the present sidewalk on the west end of Main street up to Lake road and the Women's Club beach, and that the existing sidewalk on lower Main street be put in proper repair to its end.

. We have also suggested additional crosswalks and lighting to the Selectmen and the Police Chief who are studying feasibility.

LISTING OF RESIDENT TAX PAYERS of the TOWN OF DUBLIN NEW HAMPSHIRE

Taxes Taken April 1, 1973

In 1971 the Legislature passed a "Resident" tax bill under which a \$10.00 "Resident Tax" replaces the former Poll Tax and Special Head Tax totaling \$7.00.

Under the new law (RSA 72 and 76 as amended by Chapter 476, laws of 1971) a tax of ten dollars (\$10.00), known as the "Resident Tax", shall be assessed on every inhabitant who was at least twenty-one years of age but not yet sixty-five years old as of April 1, 1973. Widows of veterans are exempt from this tax, regardless of age. Veterans are not exempt.

Payment of this tax is due before registering a car or getting a fishing, hunting, or driver's license, unless the tax is legally abated.


