# WARRANT FOR THE TOWN OF GRAFTON THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 1 p.m. to 6 p.m.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grafton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in Said Grafton on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at 1:00 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

The business meeting to act on the remaining articles in the 1979 Town Warrant will begin at 8:00 p.m. at the Grafton Town Hall.

2. To see if the town will vote to hear a report of the Budget Committee and to act thereon.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow in anticipation of tax revenue.

5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to convey by quit claim deed all property acquired by tax deed or to take any other action pertaining thereto.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand three hundred ten and 21/100 dollars (\$1310.21) and thereby receive eight thousand seven hundred thirty four and 74/100 dollars (\$8734.74) from the state for Town Road Aid.

7. To see if the town will vote approval to continue printing a summary report of the Trustees of Trust Funds in the Town Report in compliance with R.S.A. 33:3 (1975) as amended by the Legislature.

8. To see if the town will vote to empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove, in its discretion, subdivisions and plats thereof, showing streets or the widening thereof, or parks, according to regulations governing the subdivisions of land within its jurisdiction which the Planning Board shall adopt persuant to RSA Chapter 36, Sections: 21, 21-a and 22 and to make it the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the

Grafton County Registry of Deeds a certificate or notice showing that the said Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of such authorization. If the article is adopted, it shall further be the duty of the Town Clerk to issue all certificates of failure when the Planning Board shall fail to take action, all persuant to N.H. R.S.A., Chapter 36, Sections 19-29 inclusive and Section 34.

9. To see if the town will vote to appropriate and authorize withdrawal from Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as setoffs against budget appropriations or other purposes, and authorize expenditure of these funds by the Selectmen as detailed below and appropriated in the 1979 budget; and to further authorize the selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amount of estimated entitlements (\$14,748 for E.P. # 10) are reduced, or take any other action thereon:

1) Town Hall Fund	\$8,000.00
(This includes construction of town offices, possible	9
repair to town hall roof, possible improvement in	
parking area, and possible land acquisition)	
2) Dump Fund	3,748.00
3) Capital Reserve Fund	3,000.00
(This Fund is for the purchase of highway	
equipment)	
Total	\$14,748,00

10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to conclude a waste disposal agreement with the Lakes Region Disposal, Inc. and to appropriate \$9,620.00 for this purpose, and carry out whatever other requirements there may be to put the proposal into action.

(The plan for a Grafton landfill could not be carried out because land that met State specifications was not available. After a good deal of research, the above agreement appears to be the most practical and economical now available to the town. The proposal is a three year contract for the transfer station which includes the rental of the compactor and the waste container, the transfer of the container to the Danbury landfill and return to the Grafton site as often as required (probably every ten days or two weeks), maintenance of the equipment, guidance on construction of the cement pad, attendant's shed, electrical needs, etc. It is planned that these one time costs and the first year's salary for the attendant will be withdrawn from the Dump Fund.) 11. To see if the town would be in favor of having the selectmen contract for a professional real property reappraisal of all property in town by the N.H. Division of Property Appraisal (Department of Revenue Administration).

(The cost would be \$22,000 to \$24,000 which would have to be appropriated in the budget. Since this reappraisal probably could not be undertaken until 1981, funds could be appropriated in the next two years. The town would be billed monthly by the State based on actual cost.)

12. To see if the town will vote to adopt the following ordinance:

1) No person, firm, or corporation shall erect, construct, move, or demolish any building or structure within the town of Grafton, N.H. without first obtaining a written approval for each building or structure from the Board of Selectmen or from the Building Registration Officer whom the selectmen may appoint.

2) Any firm, person, or corporation violating the provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$10.00 and each day's neglect to obtain such a registration shall constitute a separate offense, as provided in N.H. RSA 350:1.

3) Appeals shall be provided as in RSA 156: 4a, 4b, 4c.

(The purpose of this ordinance is to provide the town with a more current list of structures than is provided by the annual Inventory Form. As we get caught up in the growth pattern of the Upper Valley, it is essential that the task of monitoring and directing these changes be made as efficient, accurate, and current as possible in accordance with the town's Master Plan.)

#### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

Waste disposal is still one of our pressing problems, as was also mentioned in last year's report. However, we are of necessity now closer to a solution as shown in Warrant Article #10. The State did grant us another most unexpected extension on the use of the burning dump, but only to help us avoid the added expense (approximately \$3,000) of a temporary solution. We now must approve a specific plan at Town Meeting and put it into action by June 30, 1979.

The largest single item increase in our tax burden each year is our portion of the school budget. This year that increase will be about \$18,000 which will mean that each month the school system will cost Grafton over \$12,000. It is interesting to note that at this year's open meeting for the public to review and indicate its feelings on the proposed school budget, there were only six or seven Graftonites present. Bob Ferry, our representative to the school board, works hard at the job but he needs to hear from all of us. He needs to know how we feel about the school problems and issues.

As everyone must be aware by now, New Hampshire is one of the fastest growing states in the Union, and the Upper Valley, including Grafton, is not excluded from this growth - increase in population, school children, building, need for more services, greater use of available water, wood, land, and the rest. It is against existing law to try to stop this growth, but it can be directed and controlled in accordance with our Master Plan. It is one of the more important tasks of the Planning Board to look into this situation and to prepare proposals which are aimed at fitting this growth into that Master Plan. Gradually, the essential and carefully considered means are being brought to our attention. We should all be most attentive. It is our existence and way of life that is being considered.

The many reports in this booklet, financial and otherwise, are only a very small indication of the countless hours of effort produced by the people responsible. We certainly appreciate their dedication and hard work and thank them all.

#### **REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD**

The Planning Board of Grafton was created by a vote of the townspeople on Article 13 which appeared in the Warrant of 1967. Since that time there have been many appointments to the Board. These appointees and other people have contributed much toward the Board's accomplishments and deserve the gratitude we extend. The current Board would especially like to thank Margo Moran, whose term recently expired, for enthusiastically giving so much of her time and energy to direct the Board toward accomplishing the tasks empowered it.

The Planning Board has also been greatly assisted by the Tax Study Group. Appointed by the Planning Board in 1977, it has accomplished much in the short term of its existence. Special significance is given to the current list of GRAFTON TOWN ORDIN-ANCES, the compilation of which is a direct result of research of the Town records by the Tax Study Group.

During the past year the Board has been active in reviewing for approval nineteen survey plans, eight of which were subdivisions. The increasing frequency of land subdivision in Grafton indicates a need for regulations to direct the growth in accordance with the provisions of our recently adopted Master Plan. The Board is presently gathering for review subdivision regulations from surrounding towns. From this review a set of Proposed Subdivision Regulations for the Town of Grafton will be drafted and presented to the Town for review at a public hearing. The hearing is tentatively scheduled for July 21, 1979, 7:00 P.M. at the Grafton Town Hall. Public participation would be greatly appreciated.

#### **GRAFTON TOWN ORDINANCES**

## ORDINANCE FOR APPROVAL OF SUBDIVISIONS REGULATED BY NHRSA - Article 12, 1968 Town Meeting

All subdivisions which now have to be presented by the State of New Hampshire for approval under Revised Statutes Annotated must henceforth be presented to the Planning Board in the Town of Grafton for final approval.

## ORDINANCE FOR REGULATION OF ROADS ACCEPTABLE TO THE TOWN OF GRAFTON - Article 16, 1975 Town Meeting

Henceforth, the Town of Grafton will not accept any roads that do not meet the following specifications:

- 1. Minimum depth of 15 inches of gravel.
- 2. Minimum width of 12 feet of road surface.
- 3. Proper drainage and sloping rights.
- 4. Minimum of 26 feet ditch to ditch.
- 5. Minimum of 50 feet right of way.

## ORDINANCE FOR REGULATING MOBILE HOME PARKS IN THE TOWN OF GRAFTON - Article 3, 1973 Town Meeting

In the interest of stabilizing taxes and helping to prevent increases, this ordinance is proposed for the Town of Grafton. Experience has shown that an unfair tax burden is placed on townspeople for increased school and community services costs where there are no regulations governing mobile home parks and trailer parks.

1. This ordinance does not affect any existing mobile home or trailer owners, or persons who wish to install non-commercial mobile home or trailer facilities privately and for their own use. The ordinance shall apply within the limits of the Town of Grafton.

2. No firm or entity shall establish or operate a mobile home park or trailer park within the limits of the Town of Grafton without a permit. 3. Before any permits for a mobile home park or trailer park shall be issued, the Planning Board shall certify to the Board of Selectmen that the proposed mobile home park or trailer park will not be injurious or detrimental to the neighborhood in which it is to be situated.

4. Mobile home parks or trailer parks will be permitted subject to approval of application as submitted to the Planning Board. Such application shall be accompanied by a text and map describing the proposed location of the park, the lot layout, plans for water supply and sewage disposal, for garbage and trash disposal, for drainage, for street layout and construction.

5. Regarding mobile home parks or trailer parks, any plan must meet or exceed the following standards:

a. It shall be located on a minimum area of 5 acres; each lot must contain not less than 20,000 square feet and shall have a frontage of at least 100 feet on a public or private street having a width of at least 50 feet.

b. No lot shall contain more than one mobile home or trailer. No mobile home or trailer shall be placed closer than 150 feet to an existing residence.

c. Each lot shall be clearly marked.

d. Front yard setbacks shall be at least 25 feet. Rear yard setbacks shall be at least 25 feet. Side yard setbacks shall be at least 15 feet.

e. Sanitary facilities must exceed or meet all applicable standards of the State Water Pollution Board and the Town of Grafton.

f. No principal buildings other than mobile homes or trailers shall be located in a mobile home park or trailer park.

g. In all mobile home parks and trailer parks, roadways shall be well drained, gravelled, and hard surfaced or paved. All roadways shall be maintained in good condition and shall be lighted at night. Suitable areas shall be set aside for recreational purposes. 6. Definitions:

Mobile home: Any vehicle used or so constructed as to permit its being used as a conveyance and as a dwelling or a sleeping place for one or more persons and provided with running water and sanitary facilities.

Trailer or house trailer: A mobile home which does not have a toilet and bathtub and shower.

Mobile home park or trailer park: Any non-private plot of ground upon which three or more mobile homes or trailers are located.

ORDINANCE FOR MINIMUM LOT SIZE - Article 12, 1976 Town Meeting

Henceforth, lot size for dwellings shall be a minimum of two acres.

ORDINANCE FOR SPECIFICATIONS FOR DRIVEWAYS AND APPROACHES - Article 13, 1976 Town Meeting

Henceforth, new driveways and approaches must be constructed to meet the following specifications:

1. Where ditch lines exist, a 12 inch minimum drain culvert must be used to avoid breaking said lines.

2. Surfaces must at least be gravelled.

3. Driveways and approaches must be approved by the Board of Selectmen.

At the end of 1978 Grafton's Ambulance Service consists of fourteen trained persons, twelve \*EMT-A and two Advanced First Aide members.

The EMT-A's fulfilled the requirements of the following courses: A 20 hour EMT-A refresher course, directed by Dick Bradly and Lezlie Lens. Also completing the requirements of a 9 hour \*CPR refresher course directed by Mike Batten. Three members attended an Extrication course held in Canaan. Also several members participated in a blood pressure clinic with the Grafton Ambulance, which was held at the Mascoma High School.

## **REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF AND TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN**

For more than 80 years, a cooperative effort between the State of New Hampshire and local forest fire authorities has created a forest fire prevention and suppression program that is recognized as superior throughout the United States.

Since the first forest fire laws were written in 1895, the state and local community governments have worked together to prevent and combat forest fires.

Today, 249 forest fire wardens and more than 1,800 deputy wardens are appointed every three years by the State Forester to work with the members of the State Forest Fire staff in this effort. State funds are used to pay one-half the cost of forest fire suppression costs incurred by the local forest fire organizations, within pay rates established by the Governor and Council. State funds matched by local funds are used to purchase hand tools to suppress forest fires, to train local forest fire crews and in forest fire prevention work.

All outside burning, when the ground is not covered with snow, is permitted only after obtaining a written fire permit from your local Forest Fire Warden. Penalty for burning without a permit when one is required is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine up to \$1,000 or a jail term of up to one year or both.

#### **POLICE REPORT**

This report is one of the unfortunate ones for 1978. There were three accidents in one section of Route #4, the Grafton Center overpass. Two of them resulted in fatalities.

Some were apprehended for breaking and entering and for vandalism that took place this year. There were not as many complaints of minibikes and snow machines as in the past. Disturbances, complaints of personal matters, and stray dogs etc. were also taken care of. Vacant places were patrolled and checked and others assisted.

Since my appointment in May, 1978 I have received one hundred and twenty-nine calls, investigated eight burglaries, four were resolved with conviction or restitution. One was a juvenile case. Apprehended two subjects accused of burglary as they were leaving the property. Located four lost persons, acted on several assaults, assisted the chief on numerous motor vehicle accidents, checked several thefts. I have responded to a number of ambulance calls, answered beach complaints after hours, noise, and parking. I have checked out many motor bike and snow machine complaints. There were several cases of vandalism and many motor vehicle stops for violations and equipment defects. One DWI and operating after revocation case awaiting trial.

During this time I have assisted our neighboring towns at any time requested, fires, accidents, etc. Early last spring I took a police training course at Plymouth State College. At present I am attending a New Hampshire Police Standards and Training Council course at Plymouth two nights a week.

I would like to thank the people of our town for the help and cooperation given me this past year.

### **MASCOMA AREA HEALTH COUNCIL - 1978**

In its tenth year of service to the five Mascoma towns, the Health Council continues to furnish skilled nursing care, physical therapy, and home health aide services to homebound citizens. During the year, an adult health screening clinic was held in cooperation with the local Lions Clubs and monthly blood pressure screenings were held in each town on a rotating basis.

In response to a growing need for children's services in this area, a part-time pediatric nurse-practitioner is now hard at work. The Council continues to sponsor a well child clinic and dental clinic, newborn visits, and pre-school hearing and vision screening. Approximately half the funds necessary for these endeavors is provided by the state Department of Maternal and Child Health.

Although there is a charge, on a sliding scale, for some of the above, care is provided to all regardless of ability to pay, and most visits are covered by Medicare or health insurance.

Despite the pressures of inflation and a growing population, the Health Council's per capita request to the towns has remained steady.
