Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see if the Town will appropriate and authorize the Selectmen to use the income estimated to be \$6,735.00 from:

Article 3. To see what sum of money, in addition to the amount already appropriated under Article 2 of this warrant, the Town will raise to defray Town Charges.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate, to be used together with and in addition to the Class V Allotment, \$2,734.39 (Duncan Money, so-called), for the Summer maintenance of Highways and Bridges.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the Winter maintenance of Highways and Bridges.

Article 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$478.21 and apply for Class-V Assistance, TRA so-called. State of New Hampshire to furnish \$3,188.08.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund already established for the purchase of fire equipment.

Article 8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to reduce existing long term notes.

Article 9. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to help support the Sullivan County Community Service.

Article 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.

Article 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the use of the Alstead Dump for the ensuing year.

CHIEF AND WARDEN'S REPORT

The year 1966 was exceptionally free from trouble for both the Fire Department and the Forest Fire Section. This means, primarily, that the Townspeople were very careful. They were particularly co-operative in getting rubbish fire permits. No such permit is required when snow covers the ground; but I wish to thank the residents for calling me up even under these conditions, because it saves the expense of investigating the smoke.

Except for a few small chimney fires, the only fire calls we had were for the new High School. One of these was of a serious nature, where a man was lucky to escape with his life; and the damage was expensive although it involved material that was virtually fireproof. We answered one Mutual Aid call where our tanker hauled five loads of water to assist Charlestown at the Rawson house in Hemlock.

During the summer we took advantage of the State Fireman's training program. Deputy Chief Harry Hammond taught a course on "Tactics", which resulted in a certificate of the Department and 13 individual certificates for the participants.

During the year, the Connecticut River Mutual Aid System came into being. Along with Westminster, Walpole, and Alstead who are also members of the Keene system we joined this new organization. That gives us protection on our North flank; and automatically adds Charlestown to the protective force for the Fall Mountain High School. This new group has headquarters in Springfield, Vt. and reaches as far as Cornish, Felchville, and Ludlow.

The Chiefs of the seven departments involved in the protection of the Fall Mountain High School met at the school on August 21 and went over the lay-out under the guidance of Walter Smith, Jr. A plan was drawn up for the protection of the school. At a meeting this spring in Charlestown, it was decided to activate the plan this coming summer using the actual apparatus assigned to the project.

Drills were held each Thursday evening throughout the year and there were some members that made nearly all of them. We would be happy to welcome more people to these fire drills. We would also be willing to schedule special drills to assist those people who find Thursday night inconvenient.

Fire Record For 1966

Fire records are made by people—those who cause fires and those who control them. Your forest fire warden, deputy wardens, fire chief and firemen have, in spite of a prolonged drought, made one of the best fire control records in recent years. Despite a very dry spring, we in New Hampshire working together, have substantially reduced our fire incidence (885 in 1965 to 595 in 1966).

This enviable record is largely due to two factors:

1. A closely coordinated and integrated state-town organization jointly carrying out programs of forest fire prevention, training and suppression with dedicated personnel.
2. Your appreciation of our forest fire control program and your individual effort in practicing fire prevention.

Statistics show, however, there is room for improvement. Major problems are still with us: (1) the careless disposal of cigarettes; (2)

the householder's carelessness in burning rubbish; (3) the failure of woodlot owners and contractors to completely extinguish their brush burning fires; (4) failure to extinguish camp fires; (5) unsupervised children playing with matches.

New Hampshire has 4,399,000 acres of woodland to be protected. In 1966 we experienced 595 forest fires on this area and restricted acreage burned to 395 acres . . . a fine testimonial to the efficiency and dedication of the men who make up our forest fire control organization.

1. If you must burn you will need a permit. Permits are not issued between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. except on rainy days. Permits are not needed when the ground is covered with snow. To minimize risk the best way to dispose of rubbish is at your authorized town or municipal dumping area.

2. Be sure all discarded smoking material is out.

3. Don't leave a live camp or cooking fire.

4. Most important—Instruct your children that matches are not play things.
