TOWN MEETING 1958

Minutes of the Annual Town Meeting of the Town of Nelson

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator and the Warrant was read and the following articles were acted upon.

Article 1—"To choose all necessary town officers." The following were nominated for the office of Selectman to serve for the three year term.

Kenneth Balchreceived 47 votesWinston Frenchreceived 19 votesWilliam McIntirereceived 12 votes

Mr. Kenneth Balch having won the necessary majority was sworn into office by the moderator. Mr. Francis R. Donovan was elected unopposed to serve for the one year term vacated by Mr. Rodger Tolman and was sworn into office.

The following officers were elected and sworn into office by the moderator, the clerk having cast one ballot for their election.

Town clerk—Mrs. Priscilla T. Walter Treasurer—Mrs. Florence Tolman Tax Collector—Frank E. Upton, Sr. Fire Chief—Joseph Dobson Civil Defense—Kenneth Balch Trustee Trust Funds—Helen Towne Trustee Library—Mrs. Elizabeth Bergh Sexton—Winston French Auditor—Sidney Partridge

A motion was made to have a three minute discussion of the 1957 Road Agent's report before voting for the road agent was made and questions were asked of the Selectmen regarding the bookkeeping of the road agent and the report as a whole in the Town Report.

A motion was made to defer election of the road agent until after Article 15 was taken up was voted down by unanimous yeas and nays. The following persons were nominated to serve for one year as road agent:

Arnold Miner received 44 votes
Frank Upton, Jr. received 10 votes
Edward Savage received 32 votes

Mr. Arnold Minor having won a necessary majority of votes were duly sworn into office.

The following persons were nominated to serve as Constable for the town for one year:

Frank Upton, Jr. 30 votes received Lewis Tompkins 40 votes received Ted Murdough 2 votes received

.Mr. Lewis Tompkins having the majority necessary was sworn into office.

Mr. Frank Upton, Jr. was elected to serve as Police Officer for the ensuing year and was duly sworn into office.

Article 2—The Town voted to raise the amount of \$8,135.00 to defray Town Charges.

Article 3—The Town accepted the article as read and raised the amount of \$468.28 for the support of the State T.R.A.

Article.4—Highways and Bridges maintenance—Discussion of plowing driveways was discussed by Mr. Islin and Mr. Corey who doubted the legality of plowing private driveways and the amount of time necessary and cost to the town. A motion was made by Mr. Huber and voted to see what the opinion was as to whether we should continue discussion of plowing driveways under Article 22 "Other Business." It was voted to postpone discussion at this time and to decide on the amount to be raised for road maintenance during 1958. The article asked for \$8,500.00 and was amended to read \$9,800.00 by a motion made by Mr. Donovan. The amendment was made and increased to help defray a deficit caused by the extremely muddy and snowy weather we have had making it necessary to go over the appropriation. The amount of the deficit was \$1,300.00 from Jan. 1 to Mar. 1. 1958.

Article 5—The town voted to raise the amount of \$300.00 to purchase metal culverts

Article 6—The town voted to raise the amount of \$600.00 for the purchase of calcium chloride.

Article 7—The town voted to give the selectmen the right to borrow money on the credit of the town in anticipation of taxes.

Article 8—The town voted to raise the sum of \$100.00 for the support of Old Home Day and \$50.00 for the support of Memorial Day.

Article 9—"Monadnock Region Association." This article was discussed at length by Mr. White, Mr. Raymond Huber and Mrs. Elizabeth Bergh who were against raising any money and Mr. Francis Tolman who told of some of the things the association had done for the community. A motion was accepted as follows "To defer discussion of the article until Article 22 "Other Business."

Article 10—The town voted to raise the amount of \$120.00 for the support of the Elliot Community Hospital.

Article 11—The town voted to raise the amount of \$400.00 for the maintenance and improvement of the Nelson Cemetery.

Article 12—The town voted to raise the sum of \$250.00 for Civil Defense purposes.

Article 13—The town voted to raise the sum of \$150.00 for the construction and maintenance of fire trails and water holes.

Article 14—The town voted to authorize and instruct the board of Selectmen to sell at public auction to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the town by tax collector's deeds and to execute, acknowledge and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.

Article 15—"To purchase new equipment." The article was read and Mr. Huber spoke on the findings of a committee chosen at the town caucus to see about purchase of Town road equipment. There was a great deal of discussion as to the necessity of new equipment at this time and of the necessary repairs on the old grader. A motion was made "That we do not purchase additional road maintenance

equipment at this time." 69 votes were cast with 35 necessary for choice. 26 voted nays and 43 voted yeas, therefore the article was voted down, and the motion carried.

The second part of the same article to raise the amount of \$2,000.00 to cover necessary repairs and purchasing spare parts was then taken up for discussion and a motion was made as follows: That a committee to investigate the purchase of road equipment, road grader, trucks, etc. consisting of road agent, Frank Upton, Jr., Edward Murdough and Raymond Huber, submit written report to Selectmen not later than January 15, 1959, so it may be incorporated into the Town Report .Amended "to look into equipment used in other similar towns." Amended "the road agent to be chairman of the committee." The amended motion to read as follows: "A committee to investigate the purchase of road equipment, road grader, trucks etc., and to look into equipment used in other similar towns, consisting of the road agent, Frank Upton, Jr., Edward Murdough and Raymond Huber and the road agent to act as chairmen of committee. The committee to submit written report to the Selectmen not later than January 15, 1959 so it can be incorporated into the Town Report." This motion was accepted as read.

A motion was then made to reconsider Article 15 Section A. This was voted down of a vote of 22 to reconsider and 35 against reconsideration.

Article 16—The sum of \$800.00 was raised for the maintenance of the Fire department.

Article 17—The sum of \$1,300.00 was raised to complete the Fire House project.

Article 18—This article was accepted and amended as follows: "To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 to add to the Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawal either from the principal of accumulated interest may be made except for the purchase of new road equipment and by a vote of the Town."

Article 19—Pertaining to Zoning—A committee was appointed by the chairman of the board of Selectmen to look

into zoning as it would apply to this town and present the facts to the next annual town meeting. The committee is as follows:

Article 20—The following motion was accepted as read: To raise the amount of \$200.00 for the start of a program of repair and renovation of the interior of the Town Hall and to elect a committee of five to work with voluntary help, to accept any and all donations for this project and to give a report on progress at the next annual Town Meeting. The committee is as follows:

Mrs. Hallie Robinson Mr. Albert Quigley Mrs. Janet Tolman Mr. John Johnson Mr. Carl G. Norling

Article 21—This article was passed over leaving the repair of the apron of the Leonard's garage up to the Selectmen, any expense to come out of Town Charges.

Article 22—"Any other business"—The following motion was unanimously accepted as follows and presented by Mr. Newton F. Tolman: "That the Town of Nelson shall prevent the establishment of a State Park within said Town of Nelson, employing whatever reasonable and proper legal methods may be available; and that the Selectmen be instructed to send a copy of this Motion of Judge Jason Sawyer of Jaffrey, Chairman of the Monadnock Region State Park commission, within one week of this date."

An explanation of the benefits and necessities of mutual aid by Mr. Kenneth Balch in fire fighting and protection by other towns.

The following motion presented by Mr. Newton F. Tolman was accepted by a vote of 25 to 21 and 24 necessary for choice: "That the following action be taken to apply to

all public roads in the Town of Nelson not now in this year 1958 surfaced with bitumenous materials; in other words all public roads known as gravel or dirt roads. That no such road nor any part of such road aforementioned, shall be tarred or otherwise re-surfaced with any type of material not previously in use on said read, unless such re-surfacing shall have been approved by a majority vote at the annual Town Meeting, And that, furthermore, such a vote shall not be in order, unless it is first approved by a majority of the landowners who own property abutting along the road in question, or who own land which cannot be reached except by traveling the road in question. And that, furthermore, any such alterations of the above-mentioned character, shall not be acted upon at a town meeting unless the proposed alteration shall have been described in a separate article in the Town Warrant. This whole motion to remain in effect until rescinded by a majority vote and an Annual Town Meeting."

A motion by Mr. Francis Donovan pertaining to the right of way in Monsonville was accepted as follows: "If the State Right of Way Commission takes a right of way to Granite Lake, that lies within the boundaries of the Town of Nelson, said Town, will assume no responsibility in the maintenance or policing of such right of way."

The issue of plowing driveways was reopened and the following motion was accepted and voted 23 to 22 with 23 necessary for choice "That the town discontinue plowing private driveways with the use of Town equipment without proper compensation, such compensation, to be arrived at by Selectmen and road agent."

Article 19 was then taken up and the motion to raise a sum of money for the Monadnock Region Association was passed over and no money was raised.

The motion was made to adjourn the meeting, seconded and voted.

REPORT OF SELECTMEN

The amount and frequency of snowfall during the early part of 1958 necessitated almost continual road work, a fact which was the cause of excessive expenditure for winter maintenance.

Renovation of the interior of the Town Hall was delayed temporarily when it was discovered that the north side of the roof was in poor condition, and this section was repaired and re-shingled. The committee responsible for the renovation is to be commended for the excellent results obtained.

The cemetery driveway has been partially completed but considerable work on this project remains to be done.

A right of way for public access to Granite Lake has been established at a point nearly opposite the Fire Station. This location was opposed (without success) by your board, principally because of the hazardous situation which will be created by a concentration of traffic in the area.

Town lines and corners have been re-established with the co-operation of the Selectmen of Harrisville and Roxbury.

Approximately twenty-five private drives were plowed with town equipment and the fees for this work were credited to winter maintenance.

Assessed value of taxable property increased from \$941,540 in 1957 to \$980,776, a gain of \$39,236.

The balance sheet shows that again there has been a small improvement in the financial position of the town as at the beginning of the year there was a deficit of \$385.03 and at the close of 1958 a surplus of \$1,255.90, a net gain of \$1,640.93.

Due to lack of space in this volume the report of the committee appointed to study the question of zoning has been printed separately, and copies are available on request.

In accordance with an action taken at the Town Meet-

ing held in 1950 a planning board has been appointed. The existence of such a board should be of considerable advantage to the town by focusing attention on needed improvements or undesirable conditions.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 for Old Home Day, and \$50.00 for Memorial Day.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$96.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$130.00 for the support of the Elliot Community Hospital.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for the maintenance and improvement of the cemetery.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$250.00 for Civil Defense purposes.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the construction and maintenance of fire trails and water holes.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell at public auction to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by tax collector's deeds and to execute, acknowledge and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$563.49 for the purchase of a road rake.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$4,200.00 for the purchase of a truck.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$5,000.00 for the purchase of a tractor.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,000.00 for the repair and maintenance of the grader now owned by the Town.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue and sell bonds or negotiate notes in the name of and on the credit of the Town, under Chapter 33, Revised Statutes Annotated, of New Hampshire, and any amendments relating thereto. and delegate to the said Board of Selectmen authority to fix the time and place of payment of the principal and interest of said bonds

or notes; the interest thereon, and the principal of each bond or note.

- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 for the maintenance of the Fire Department.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to make the following roads or sections of roads subject to Gates and Bars:
 - 1. Road #70 from the property of Mrs. Irene Tompkins southwesterly to the Sullivan Town Line.
 - 2. Road #83 northerly from the Teppema property.
 - 3. Road #80 from road #64 southerly to the Harrisville Town Line..
 - 4. Road #81 from road #67 southwesterly to the Roxbury Town Line.
 - 5. Road connecting roads #66 and #81 near the property of Mr. and Mrs. Cornelius P. Trowbridge.
 - 6. Road #82 from road #66 westerly to the Roxbury Town Line.
 - 7. Road #50 from a point near the house belonging to Mr. Joseph Skinner southeasterly to the Harrisville Town Line.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 to add to the Reserve Fund. it being understood that no withdrawal either from principal or accumulated interest may be made except by vote of the Town for purchase of new road equipment.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 to add to the Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawal either from principal or accumulated interest may be made except by vote of the Town for purchase of new equipment for the Fire Department.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 for the repair and renovation of the interior of the Town Hall.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,400.00 for the purpose of employing tax commission ap-

praisers to assist the Selectmen in their assessments by revaluing all improved land and buildings.

27. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR

The year of 1958 has seen no radical changes in the local Civil Defense organization.

Your director wishes to advise that less than half the money appropriated by the town at the last meeting has been expended by this department. A close contact has been maintained with the State Civil Defense Agency and thru their good offices several items have been obtained under the matching funds program that have added to the efficiency of your local unit. The new siren mounted on the fire house in Munsonville was purchased partly with funds supplied thru the C.D. appropriation and will serve as an attack warning system as well as a fire alarm. Your director feels that an additional siren should be purchased and installed in either Nelson Village or the Tolman Pond area to serve as a warning device. If such an installation is made it would be necessary to have a means of operating same in the event of an emergency. Your director would appreciate the advice of interested persons in that area as to the best location for such an installation so that the greatest area will benefit.

As always your director has enjoyed the greatest cooperation from State Headquarters—the Fire Department and the Selectmen. It will be noted that again in the 1959 budget this department has requested an appropriation of \$250.00 and it should be pointed out that while last years appropriation was not fully expended your C.D. unit feels it advisable to have such a sum available so that it will be possible to take advantage of supplies available thru the State Civil Defense Agency.

REPORT OF EQUIPMENT COMMITTEE

A study of road equipment of and for the town of Nelson together with a full report is hereby submitted.

Some one hundred questionaires, drawn up by the committee, were sent to road agents of towns comparable in size and road types to the town of Nelson. These questionaires requested information as to miles of dirt road, type of trucks or graders used, and choice of agents as to preferred equipment.

This committee received 56 replies from the questionaires sent out. Below is a compilation of the information received.

46 towns out of 56 have trucks

32 towns out of 56 have trucks and graders.

17 towns out of 56 have trucks with 4 wheel drive.

23 towns out of 56 have othertypes of equipment.

Prices of various types of equipment follow: Model 88L Austin Western grader with trade in \$16,800.00 Model 118 Gallion grader without trade in 20,000.00 4 wheel drive International truck with plow and dump body, 1 Ton cap. 5,000.00 4 wheel drive Dodge power wagon, new 1957, equipped as above, 1 Ton cap. 4,200.00 4 wheel drive G.M.C. truck equipped as above, 2 Ton cap. 6.667.00 4 wheel drive Jeep equipped as above 4.900.00 Model 841 Ford tractor w/pneumatic tires equipped with loader and draw bar 4.019.00 4.670.00 Model 4401 John Deere tractor equipped as above Same as above but demonstrator 3,600.00 York pull rake 663.49

After careful study of the foregoing information your committee makes the following recommendations:

1. That the Town purchase a 4 wheel drive, 1 Ton Truck with plow and dump body.

- 2. That the Town purchase a tractor with pneumatic tires equipped with loader.
- 3. That the Town apply rental of \$100 for York rake toward the purchase price of same, leaving a balance due of \$563.49.
- 4. That the Town raise \$2,000.00 for repairs on present equipment.
- 5. That the Town of Nelson vote to set aside in a special fund, all money paid to the town for rental of road equipment. Further that this fund shall be used for the purchase or maintenance of road equipment only, and that it shall require a 3/4 vote of the selectmen and road agent, or a majority vote of the Town's Annual Meeting, in order to expend any money from said special fund. It is further recommended that this fund shall be called "Road Equipment Fund."

REPORT OF THE NELSON FIRE DEPARTMENT

Nelson has again been fortunate in 1958 that no serious fires have occurred.

Your fire department answered 8 calls during the year including chimney fires, automobile fires, and automobile accidents. As usual the town dump required the services of the department twice. It might be of interest to point out that the large dump fire occurring in the fall was of such proportions and the wind direction and velocity were so great that Mutual Aid help was called for with the following departments responding with men and equipment—Keene. Harrisville, and Sullivan. In addition Captain Miley of the Salvation Army was on the scene with hot coffee which was most appreciated. This, I feel, is an example of the way that Mutual Aid works—a request for help via the radio and an automatic response by the several departments. Another interesting fact is that while Harrisville and Sullivan were at the fire scene with their men and trucks Mutual Aid had moved equipment and men from other towns into their fire stations so that their towns would not be without fire protection, such service is certainly cheap at \$5.00 a year.

The major new piece of equipment secured in 1958 is the Emerson Resuscitator which is in the custody of the department and is stored in the fire house available for any emergency where artificial breathing apparatus or oxygen is required. This valuable machine was secured thru the efforts of interested summer residents for the most part plus funds raised thru suppers.

The new floor installed with money appropriated by the town has been installed and with the new furnace has served to insure prompt response of the equipment at any time.

Drills and meetings have been held regularly with good attendance and it is the feeling of your Chief that the efficiency of the men has improved greatly. Several members attended the fire school conducted at Meadowood Department during the summer and much valuable information was secured thru practice and observation.

Thru the cooperation of the State Civil Defense Administration and the New Hampshire Distributing Agency several pieces of equipment have been obtained for which the department wishes to express its thanks.

Thanks also to Chief Walter Messer of the Keene Fire Department for his help and advice in enabling us to set up our warning siren and the pull box located on the outside of the station.

The department and equipment are to be inspected shortly by the Board of Fire Underwriters who will give recommendations which we hope when acted upon will enable residents of the town to secure a more favorable fire insurance rate.

May I again, as Chief, thank the townspeople for their cooperation and offer the services of the men and equipment to them at any time—it is your department and it stands ready to serve you.

AUDITOR'S CERTIFICATE

I hereby certify that I have examined the accounts of the Selectmen, Trustees of Trust Funds, Town Treasurer, Town Clerk, Road Agent, and Library Trustees. My examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as I considered necessary in the circumstances, including this year an audit of War Service Exemptions to Veterans for the years 1958 and 1957 which disclosed in my opinion several inconsistencies and irregularities including one illegal exemption. A written report was made to the selectmen recommending among other things that a supplementary tax warrant be issued to cover the illegally granted exemption. No action was taken by the selectmen on this report.

A partial audit was made of the "Annual Assessment Record Book" or "Blotter" including a comparison of individual items with the Tax Collector's Warrant. The selectmen were advised of one omitted assessment which was subsequently billed. Your auditor was unable to make a more complete examination due to the repeated refusals and lack of co-operation of the selectmen in making available supporting details not shown in the Record Book or "Blotter" even though said details are by statute considered to be public records; and in addition, these audits were, according to the Tax Commission's Office, within the jurisdiction and authority of your town auditor.

Except as noted, receipts have been properly accounted for; payments duly approved and recorded, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

school board to enter into a tuition contract with Keene School District for tuition at Keene High School at the rate of \$458 per pupil or to other approved high schools.

- 10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 to be used as matching funds for Federal aid under provision of the National Defense Educational act, for use in science and mathematics.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 as the district share of support for educational TV channel WENH.

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE NELSON SCHOOL DISTRICT March 8th, 1958

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 p.m. by the moderator, Francis W. P. Tolman, in the Nelson Town Hall with approximately sixty-two people present. After the reading of the warrant, the articles were acted upon as follows:

Article 1. Francis W. P. Tolman was elected Moderator for the coming year with one ballot cast by the Clerk.

Article 2. Mrs. Eleanor J. Upton was elected Clerk for the ensuing year with one ballot cast by the Moderator.

Article 3. Robert E. Robinson, acting chairman of the School Board, made the following motion due resignations of Mrs. Gale Forssen and Mrs. Harold King during the past year: Motion: "That we elect by separate ballot three members of the School Board to serve as follows:

a member for a three year term, expiring March, 1961 a member for a two year term, expiring March, 1960 a member for a one year term, expiring March, 1959."

The motion carried by voice vote and was acted upon as follows:

Article 4. Mrs. Irene Tompkins was elected Treasurer for the ensuing year by one ballot cast by the Clerk.

Article 5. Mr. Robinson read suggestions made at the School Caucus, January 24th, 1958, on raising Board salaries.

Motion: "That the salary of the School Board Chairman be raised from fifty dollars to one hundred dollars; the Treasurer's, from twenty-five dollars to fifty dollars; the Board Secretary's, from thirty dollars to sixty dollars and the Third Member's, from twenty-five to fifty dollars."

The motion carried unanimously by voice after an amendment was withdrawn to be made into the following motions:

Motion: "That the salary of the Clerk be raised from five dollars to ten dollars." Passed unanimously by voice vote.

Motion: "That the salary of the Auditor be raised from five dollars to twenty dollars." Passed unanimously by voice vote.

The Moderator declined a suggested raise in his salary. (Nelson does not have a Truant Officer).

Article 6. As there were no reports to be heard from the Auditor, Building Committee or Officers chosen, this article was passed over.

Article 7. Sidney F. Partridge was elected Auditor for the coming year with one ballot cast by the Clerk.

Article 8. Mr. Robinson reviewed the new budget after the Moderator had read the article.

Motion: "That the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,813.00 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town."

Raymond Huber's suggestion that each item of the budget be discussed seperately was approved by the Moderator.

As No. 6 will be taken up under Article 9 and discussion was becoming too involved, the following secondary motion was made by Mr. Huber:

Secondary Motion: "That we now terminate discussion and revert to the original motion." Passed by voice vote. The original motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Article 9. Mr. Robinson gave a detailed report on his finding with the comparison of teaching and industrial salaries and wages. Springfield, Mass., had been used as it compares favorably with Keene, N.H., industrially except on a larger scale. From these facts the School Board suggested a salary schedule starting a new teacher at \$3,200.00 with a \$200.00 raise each year until a maximum of \$4,200.00 was reached. Only on merit factors would a teacher's salary go above the maximum of \$4,200.00

Motion: Moved and Seconded: "That the district indorse the salary schedule which has been proposed by the School Board." The motion was passed by voice vote.

Article 10. This article, pertaining to the employment of a "helping teacher" by the Union was included in the warrant upon the request of the superintendent, Dr. Charles Bowlby.

Motion: Moved and Seconded: "That we pass over this article."

A written ballot was requested—and granted by the Moderator. The results were as follows: Yes—14 votes, No—34 votes, Total—48 votes. Necessary for choice—25 votes, therefore the motion was lost.

A discussion under this article finally ended with the predominent feeling that due to our unstable teacher situation at present, Nelson's share of \$135.00 for the helping teacher was worth spending. This help will be available only if a majority of the districts within the Union vote in favor of this article.

Motion: Moved and Seconded: "That the article be accepted as read." This motion carried by voice vote.

Article 11. As Marlboro has a new and enlarged capacity high school and is in the same Union as Nelson, this article was put in the warrant to encourage the enrollment of high school students there at a lower tuition fee than Keene High School. The majority felt that our students should continue to go to Keene.

Motion: Moved and Seconded: "That the School Board be authorized to enter into tuition contracts with the Keene School district for the education of High School pupils." The motion carried by voice vote.

Article 12. "to take up any other business which may legally come before this meeting."

Motion: Moved and Seconded—"That the matter of a fence at the Munsonville School be left up to the School Board." Passed by voice vote.

Mrs. Priscilla Walters inquired as to feeling of those present concerning the problem of only one pupil in the eighth grade next year. The opinion of the meeting was in favor of sending this student to Keene Junior High School and recommended the same to the School Board.

Mr. Partridge suggested that the School Board consider the Nature Study Programs made available to the schools through the Audobon Society.

Motion: Moved and Seconded: "That this meeting adjourn." Unanimously passed by voice vote.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL SUPERINDENTENT

The present school year finds the Nelson School District elementary pupils under the instruction of two capable teachers, both of whom are experienced in multiple grade teaching. Mrs. Louise Bergeron taught for nine years in rural schools and in addition is well acquainted in the community. I hope she will find it possible to be with us for a long time to come. Mrs. Brooks has recently returned to teaching and is giving the upper grade pupils a sound elementary preparation. Mrs. Barbara Holden of Keene is a certified music teacher who, while not interested in full-time work, was willing to carry on the music program on a limited basis.

The school board has taken commendable action in correcting inadequate sewer facilities at the school and making some desirable interior alterations. Action is still desirable on extending playground areas, waterproofing the basement and installing some folding door mechanism to permit the use of the activities room and upper grades classroom as a combined auditorium.

Mr. Staples is keeping the building in excellent condition and Mr. Murdough is to be commended for his enterprise in providing the community with a modern, safe school bus. Prospects for the return of our teaching staff seem good at this time and since the success of the elementary program depends largely upon them, prospects for the coming year seem good.

The first year's experience with a helping teacher has been successful and particularly so for Nelson where both teachers needed assistance and guidance in getting the years work underway. The helping teacher is arranging a schedule which will permit him to assist with the science program at regular intervals as well as offer help in other areas.
