TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Durham in the County of Strafford, in said State qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said New Durham on Tuesday, the ninth (9th) day of March, next at twelve of the clock, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing and vote upon the following:

- A. Zoning and Land Use Ordinance
- B. Mobile Home Park Ordinance

And you are hereby further notified to meet at said Town Hall in said New Durham at seven (7:00) o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 2. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$652.00 from the Shirley Timber Fund for thee Visiting Nurse (RDHC).

ARITCLE 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to purchase a new police cruiser. If passed, \$600.00 is to be deducted from the Police Budget.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the town will vote to accept road at Chalk Pond from Tibbetts Lumber Company if it meets approval of Planning Board and Selectmen. (By Request)

ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will vote to accept Hayes Road from Old Route No. 11 past Nickerson House. (By Request.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will vote to accept Deed to water rights and dam at March Pond from Wyandotte Industries Corporation. (By Request)

- ARTICLE 8. To see if the town will vote to accept Deed to water rights and dam at Downing Pond from Robert Bickford. (By Request)
- 9RTICLE 9. To see if the town will vote to accept new road and culvert going past Maurice Leavitt's house (part of Kings Highway), and abandon old portion of road and bridge.
- ARTICLE 10. To see if the town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, the portion of Birch Hill Road from former home of William Wyatt to end, going Northwesterly.
- ARTICLE 11. To see if the town will vote to close Cameron Road from Dexter Corner Road to Chamberlin Road or Ten Rod Road, subject to gates and bars.
- ARTICLE 12. To see if the town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, the road from Town Line near Beaver Brook to portion of Devils Den Road now closed.
- ARTICLE 13. To see if thhe town will vote to accept Perambulation Line established by Douglass Woodward in 1970 as thhe town line between New Durham and Middleton over Jesse Mountain. This in cooperation with Town of Middleton.
- ARTICLE 14. To see if the town will vote to direct the Moderator to appoint a 3 member committee to investigate the starting of a public cemetery.
- ARTICLE 15. To see if the town will vote to direct the Moderator to appoint a 4 member committee to work with the Selectmen to investigate the possibilities and make recommendations to improve use of the Town Hall.
- ARTICLE 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to make minimum periodic repairs to closed roads so as to keep their identity, money to be spent in cooperation with Forest Fire Warden.
- ARTICLE 17. To see if the town will vote to accept an easement from Elmer Smith to land at Chalk Pond to be used as a Town Beach, subject to review and agreement of the Conservation Committee and Selectmen.
- ARTICLE 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as are necessary to defray the expenses of town government for the ensuing year in accordance with the recommendations of the Budget Committee.
- ARTICLE 19. To hear reports of any standing committees.

ARTICLE 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

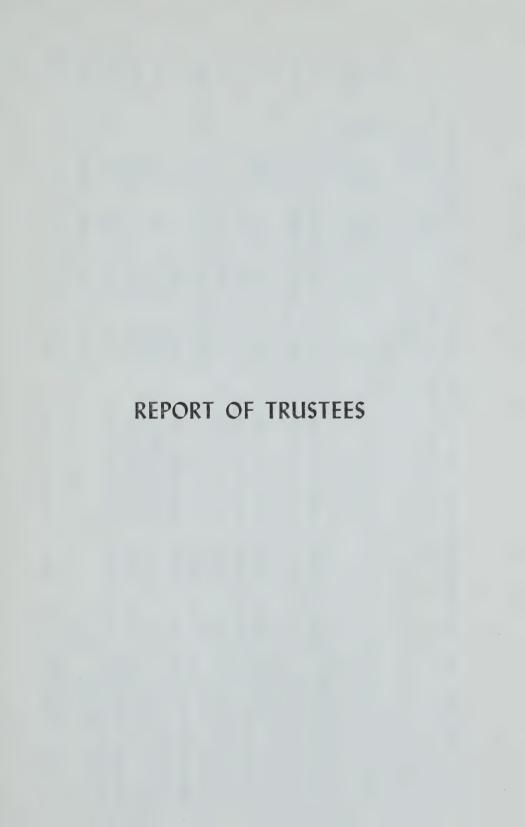

During 1970, in the performance of their duties, the officers worked 2,990 hours of which 2,6990 was on Police Duty, 150 on Health and 150 on Welfare, and traveled 30,000 miles. They answered 217 complaints, made 61 criminal and 4 juvenile investigations, covered 24 accidents, and rendered 375 aids to individuals and other departments.

They logged 1408 hours on patrol, 311 hours in office, 47 hours in Court, 187 hours on training, 327 hours on special details, 243 on aid rendered, 198 hours on complaint investigations, 193 hours on criminal investigations, 53 hours on accident investigations and 23 hours on juvenile cases.

They made 1 arrest, issued 42 summons, 237 warnings, made *1863 checkups, recommended 3 license suspensions, checked 4.741 buildings and received 987 telephone calls. On Court cases, 1 found not guilty, 1 appeal and 1 nol prossed, for a total of 40 convictions.

REPORT OF CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Throughout the stat of New Hampshire an aver-growing number of towns are establishing Conservation Commissions. Your town of New Durham joined this number last spring with the appointment by the selectmen of a three-man commission.

Since that time, your commission has held numerous meetings and plans are underway for the development of various projects designed to preserve and enhance the beauty and improve the ecology of the town.

For the sake of brevity, we shall select one project and explain what the Commission plans to do.

One very important part of our environment that should be controlled for the health and well being of everyone concerned is water. With this in mind, your commission sponsored a joint meeting with commission members from Alton, Wolfeboro, and Rochester. Mr. Sloyd Barker, environmental resource director of the University of New Hampshire, also participated. We discussed mutual water problems such as pollution and how to combat it, a joint program for testing water samples, damage to streams from silt due to construction work, and the limiting of horsepoper on motor boats.

From this meeting, we are developing several projects, the most important of which will be to work with our health officer in locating any sources of pollution in New Durham streams, ponds, or lakes.

Maps of the town have been obtained to determine wet land areas, possible snow machine trails, wilderness areas available for hiking, and other land uses that may benefit the townspeople.

The lack of proper environmental control planning can prove costly to a town. Therefore, it is the hope of your Conservation Commission, in cooperation with elected officials and other town agencies, to provide a program that will improve and protect what we now have and initiate other projects that will contribute to the ecological growth of the town.

Public meetings will be held to keep interested citizens informed of the progress of our various projects.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1970 forest fire season was a quiet one in this area, quiet in part because of your continued cooperation and favorable weather conditions.

Fires that did occur were, for the most part, caused by debris burning, children and smokers.

The elimination of these three causes of forest fires would drastically change this picture — to bring about this change we make the following suggestions:

1. When the ground is not covered with snow a permit to burn must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden. This permit covers waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, as well as garden trash and brush burning such burning is restricted by regulation to prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m. with the following exceptions:

Commercial or industrial burning is permissable at any time under normal conditions but only with the approval of the District Chief and a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.

- 2. Fires caused by children can be prevented only with the complete cooperation of parents in the supervision of their children, keep matches out of reach of children, this action will help to prevent fires and may save a life, the life of your child. Try to explain this to your child, won't you?
- 3. Forest fires caused by smokers can be reduced in number by the exercise of more care in the discarding of matches and smoking material whether from a vehicle or by a hiker. In all cases, make sure that the butt or match you discard is out, dead out. Smokey says, "Thanks for your help", and invites you to join with him in setting a good example for others in the prevention of fires and the protection of our environment.

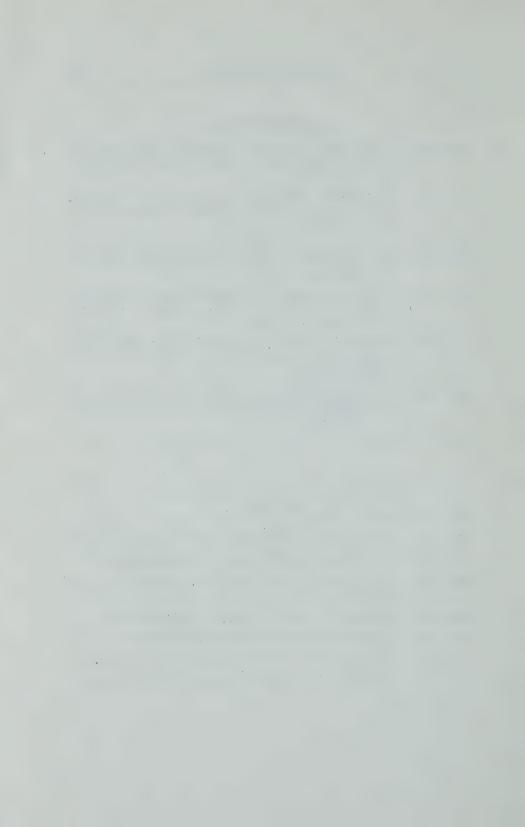
